RULES & REGULATIONS

FRIDAY, JANUARY 28 *thru* SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 5

ENTRY TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. ALL BREED ENTRIES must be calved after January 1, 2020 and prior to June 1, 2021.
2. A copy of registration papers should accompany your entries, but ORIGINAL and/or a COPY of the REGISTRATION PAPERS MUST be provided. All cattle entered must be accompanied by a registration number.
3. Entry must be received by November 15 with complete data or entry will not be accepted or cataloged.
4. All animals must meet their breed requirements for performance, genetic defect, pedigree, fitting, DOB, and health as set forth by their individual rules.
5. Breeds are limited to a total consignment of 65 head. If necessary, cuts will be made at the discretion of the BHSS Livestock Committee, consultation with respective breed representatives, and based on consignor's preference of entry.
6. No miniatures will be allowed in any breed.
7. The Black Hills Stock Show reserves the right to reject any or all entries.
8. **Angus, Charolais, Hereford, Red Angus, and Simmental breeders will be limited to 3 head, two of which can be bulls and all must be registered at time of entry deadline.**
9. All animals must be owned by the consignor six months prior to Nov. 15. **ALL Angus & Simmental entries must be first owners.** *Please note—animals must be entered as registered.
10. The Black Hills Stock Show Office must be notified of any livestock leins.
11. When providing check for payment, consignor authorizes Black Hills Stock Show to use information from check to make a one-time electronic fund transfer from your account or to process the payment as a check transaction.

SHOW/SALE TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

12. CHECK-IN time for all animals is 11 a.m. at the scale in the back of Rushmore Hall (new 2022). All animals MUST be checked in the day prior to Show/Sale day.
13. ARRIVAL SCHEDULE: Livestock may be stalled in the barn no earlier than 6 pm two days prior to your respective Show/Sale day and no later than 7 p.m. on the day of their Show/Sale day. (Please see Barn Arrival Schedule in breed rules...there have been changes for 2022)
14. The following will be required for check-in no later than 12 p.m. on the day before the Show/Sale.
 - I. **Proof of Registration** or other acceptable certificate for each animal. Any animal without proper registration certificate will not be allowed to enter the Show/Sale ring. **NO EXCEPTIONS!!!** ***Please note—registration number MUST be provided on the entry form.
 - II. **Current health certificate**, see Health & Brand Requirement section for specific information that should be provided to your veterinarian. The Black Hills Stock Show® follows State Import Regulations. Questions pertaining to Health Certificates should be directed to the SD Animal Industry Board at (605) 773-3321.
 - III. **Brand Inspection** (if applicable), see Health & Brand Requirement Section, Rule 26 for specific information.

SUBSTITUTIONS:

15. Following the entry deadline, the Black Hills Stock Show office will allow substitution at an additional charge of \$35.
16. **Bulls must be substituted for bulls and heifers substituted for heifers, owner for owner.**
17. Any additional or updated information regarding animal entered will be at the expense of the consignor. Announcements will be made at the auction block.



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HEALTH AND BRAND REQUIREMENTS:

18. All cattle entering the Show/Sale from outside of South Dakota shall meet the South Dakota Livestock Import requirements including a current health certificate, permit, individual animal identifications, and certain tests and treatment depending on the state of origin.

19. All cattle entering the Show/Sale from within South Dakota shall have a current health certificate with individual animal identification.

20. Any animal infected with communicable diseases, including ringworm, warts and lice, will not be accepted for the Show/Sale.

21. All females shall be officially calfhood vaccinated for Brucellosis with the vaccination tattoo listed on the health certificate.

22. All heifers **15 months** or younger must be open and declared open on the health certificate.

23. All heifers, **16 months and older**, must be bred and declared bred on the health certificate, and guaranteed bred by the consignor (Excluding individual breed rules).

24. All bulls **13 months and older** shall be semen tested within 25 days prior to the Show/Sale and have a satisfactory result declared on the health certificate. **All bulls 18 months or older MUST have a negative trich test per law. Younger bulls only if a virgin must be marked so on the health certificate.**

25. Additional animal disease testing may be performed at the discretion of the consignor if they anticipate the need to meet certain special post sale interstate or international shipping requirements or to enhance marketability. Please provide copies of these test results.

26. Brand Inspection—Livestock coming from a brand inspection state into South Dakota must have a market clearance or local inspection. Proof of ownership must be available. All livestock sold or leaving the brand area of South Dakota must have a brand inspection certificate or market clearance prior to leaving the Stock Show.

Questions pertaining to Brand Inspection should be directed to the SD Brand Board at (605) 773-3324.

SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS:

27. Screening of all animals will be done by a panel under the direction of the Black Hills Stock Show® Livestock Committee. Screened animals will not be allowed to enter the sale ring and all entry fees will be forfeited. Screened animals must be immediately removed from the barn by the owner. Any animal not shown will be considered screened.

28. Cattle will be ear tagged with lot number at check-in time. Please note new 2022 check-in time 11 a.m. day before Show/Sale day.

29. Cattle may be removed from the livestock barn for tie-outs after 6 p.m. NO cattle will be allowed in the barn over night.

30. There will be VERY limited room for fitting chutes in Rushmore Hall, space is not guaranteed along the North Wall.

SAFETY REQUIREMENTS:

31. To minimize consignor's liability for any damage or injury by loose animals, it is required that **bulls have nose leads at all times in The Monument, including in the show and sale ring.**

32. Animals must be under control at all times. Wild or uncontrollable animals will be disqualified and asked to leave the facility immediately.



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EXPENSES:

33. The Black Hills Stock Show office will deduct 4% of the total sale price.

34. Livestock consignors at the previous year's Black Hills Stock Show® consignor meetings vote on approved expenses such as breed auctioneers, breed advertising, state breed associations and other approved expenses.

35. All catalog fees must be paid for at time of entry. Catalog fee for bulls is \$135 and females is \$115 before NOVEMBER 10th. November 11th-15th entry fee goes to flat \$200/hd. \$25 from all female fees will go to the Black Hills Gold Youth Futurity Show prize money. Your entry fee per animal, submitted with entry, is in addition to expenses.

36. All animals receiving a bid of \$4,000 or more, but not sold, will be automatically charged a 12% sales commission, plus expenses listed in Rule 34. All animals receiving a bid of less than \$4,000, but not sold, will be automatically charged an 8% sales commission, plus expenses listed in Rule 34. All animals that do not receive a bid will be charged a 4% sales commission of a \$1,000 selling price, plus expenses listed in Rule 34.

SALE RULES AND REGULATIONS:

37. All Animals offered for sale, will be sold without reservation to the highest bidder. A check to the Black Hills Stock Show® shall be written for each animal that enters the sale ring. **A minimum of 50% interest must sell on all animals sold.** Possessions will be negotiated between buyer and seller.

38. Terms of every sale are cash with settlement to be made with the Sale Clerk at time of sale. **CONSIGNORS AND/OR REPRESENTATIVES SHOULD BE PREPARED TO PAY THE TOTAL PRICE IN THE ABSENCE OF THE BUYER.**

39. The Black Hills Stock Show® will make checks payable to the registered brand holder of the animal.

40. All disputes as to bids will be settled from the auction block. After the sale, disputes will be settled by the Black Hills Stock Show® Livestock Committee.

41. The buyer will assume all risk on animals as soon as they are declared sold.

42. After an animal is sold, it will be led from the Sale Ring to its tie. Sold animals must be removed from the barn prior to 6 p.m. Stalling is available at the Central States Fairgrounds. Consignors should make proper arrangements with buyers for care of the animals. Sold animals CANNOT be removed from the building until they receive a **load-out slip**.

43. The Consignor is responsible for transferring registration of animal.

44. Heifers will show first and sell last.

45. Each consignor accepts the responsibility of guaranteeing his own cattle to be in sound condition and have the privilege of giving additional guarantee on cattle at the time of sale in the ring. The Black Hills Stock Show® acts only as an agent for the consignors in the sale and does not assume any responsibility for the animal's future usefulness. All guarantees are strictly between the buyer and seller.

46. Changes regarding information in the catalog will be announced from the Auctioneer's Block and such announcements will take precedence.

BLACK HILLS STOCK SHOW MANAGEMENT:

47. The Black Hills Stock Show® General Halter rules will take precedence over Individual Breed rules.

48. The Black Hills Stock Show® Management reserves the right to final and absolute decision regarding any issue involving the livestock show or sales. Final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and the right to settle and determine all matters, questions or differences in regard hereto, or otherwise arising out of, or connected with, or incident to, the Show and Sale shall be reserved to the Black Hills Stock Show® Management.

49. The Black Hills Stock Show®, the Management, The Monument, or anyone helping with the Show/Sale assumes no responsibility for accident or injury. The Black Hills Stock Show® Management/Personnel or The Monument Management/Personnel will not be responsible for any injury or loss of any animal or accident thereby.

50. The Black Hills Stock Show® is a member of the North American Livestock Show and Rodeo Managers Association.



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ANGUS:

January 31, **SHOW: 9 A.M., SALE: 1 P.M.**

1. A single Angus consignor is limited to three (3) consignments, 2 of which can be bulls. All Angus bulls must be weighed prior to the Show and Sale.
2. All Angus cattle are to be genetic defect free from all known defects, which are listed in the Suggested Sale Terms and Conditions published by the American Angus Association. Carriers will be disqualified from the show and sale. All scratches and/or substitutions will be at the discretion of the Breed Representatives and with the approval of the Black Hills Stock Show® Livestock Committee.
3. There will be a limit of 45 bulls and 20 females.
4. **All Angus entries must be first owner.**
5. Consignors are required to assist the buyer in transporting cattle to the fairgrounds pending further travel arrangements.

CHAROLAIS:

February 1, **SHOW: 9 A.M., SALE: 1 P.M.**

1. Charolais breed may be limited to 65 head; limited 50 bulls and 3 entries per consignor, 2 which may be bulls.
* Consignor is to designate preference and alternate.
2. No adhesive will be allowed in the halter show.
3. In order to improve the quality of cattle at the show, the State Association Promotion Committee recommends the following guidelines for Charolais Cattle:
 - Bulls need yearling weights of 1,050 lbs.
 - After one year, bulls must gain (50) pounds per month.
 - Heifers need yearling weights of 750 lbs.
 - Bred heifers should weigh 1,000 lbs.

1. Hereford consignors are limited to three (3) consignments, two of which can be bulls.
2. Limit of 60 entries: 45 bulls 15 females.

1. All bulls consigned to the Show and Sale, which are 13 months of age must be semen tested and so identified on health certificate.
2. Red Angus consignors are limited to three (3) consignments, two of which can be bulls.
3. Registered Red Angus 1A (100%) will only be eligible for the Show and Sale. Category must be noted on the individual Entry Form.
4. No adhesive on legs.

GELBVIEH:

February 3, SHOW: 10 A.M., SALE: 2 P.M.

1. All heifers born between January 1 and May 1, 2020 must have been bred to have a Balancer or Purebred calf prior to August 16, 2022.
2. Consignor cannot enter more than 5 head. Consignors must prioritize 1,2,3,4 or 5. If the numbers exceed 50 head, breed representatives will cut 4th and 5th entry.
3. Bulls or heifers registered as Balancers and Purebreds will be shown separately. Both Balancers and Purebreds will compete for overall championship.
4. No adhesive used on show day.

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LIMOUSIN:

February 4, SHOW: 9 A.M., SALE AT 1 P.M.

Eligibility Requirements: Limousin Cattle with an Orange registration certificate, must be a minimum of 75% Limousin for females and bull, Lim-flex cattle with a purple registration certificate must be a minimum of 50% for females and bulls. All entries must be sired by a bull that is register by the North American Limousin Foundation, Limousin and Lim-flex cattle will be shown together.

1. All yearling bulls must have minimum of 205 days adj. weaning weight of 550 pounds and an average daily gain of 2.6 pounds and a 365 day adj. weight of 1,000 pounds. There is a limit of 50 bulls in the Sale.
2. Bulls must have been calved before April 15, 2020 and have a minimum 205 day adj. weight of 550 pounds. There is a maximum 105 pound birth weight rule for both sexes.
3. Open females calved from August 1, 2020 to April 15, 2020 must be guaranteed by the seller to be bred and to conceive a calf early enough to calve by or before the female is 32 months of age. Bred females born August 1, 2020 must be safe in calf to calve by or before 32 months of age as documented by a veterinarian certificate and guaranteed by the seller. All bred females must sell with specific breeding date or a pasture-exposed date not to exceed 45 days.
4. All cattle will sell under the standard guarantee endorsed by the North American Limousin Foundation.
5. No adhesive on legs
6. EPDs will be provided to the judge before the show.

MAINE ANJOU:

1. Maine Anjou entries will be limited to 65 head total with maximum of 45 bulls and 20 heifers.
2. All entries must be registered in the American Maine Anjou Association.
3. Bulls must be 25% or more Maine and females 25% or more Maine.
4. Must exhibit Maine Anjou color characteristics; no roan or smokie colored cattle.

1. All cattle must be registered in the ACA Herdbook. Cattle may not show or sell without an application for registration.
2. All cattle that show and sell must be sired by a bull that is registered within his respective breed association or another recognized breed. In the event the sire is not registered in the ACA Herdbook, the dam will be required to be registered with the ACA.
3. Cattle must be black but may contain white color characteristics on the face/head and behind the navel.
4. Cattle must be polled or scurred, with heads not tampered.

2. All cattle need to have a green trait status at time of sale and **all cattle must be registered with the American Simmental Association at the time of entry.**
3. **All Simmental entries must be first owner.**
4. No adhesive on legs for show.

SUPREME ROW RULES:

1. Each Grand Champion animal of every breed shall be stalled on Supreme Row from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. each day following their respective breed sales.
2. All Grand Champion Bulls and Females of each breed MUST STAY ALL WEEK until Saturday, February 5 after the Supreme Row Parade.
3. It is the responsibility of the consignors and/or buyer to care for the animal during its stay on Supreme Row.
4. All consignors must wear the sponsor's Hubbard Jackets when judged and again when paraded in the main arena at time of announcement of winner.
5. Judging for Supreme Row animals will commence at 6:00 p.m. Saturday, February 5, 2022 in Rushmore Hall. **Heifers will show first then bulls.**
6. Supreme Row Judging will be done by a panel of 3 judges ranking all animals in the pen from first to tenth. Animal with the lowest average will be deemed Supreme champion.
7. Awards, sponsored by Hubbard Feeds, Inc. will be presented on the following scale:
 - Supreme Champion Female: \$3,000 to the consignor
-\$2,000 to the buyer
 - Supreme Champion Bull: \$3,000 to the consignor
-\$2,000 to the buyer



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
