This department is subject to all BCF General Rules, General Exhibitor Rules and all Junior Exhibitor Livestock and Animal Division Rules in addition to those listed for the department.

GENERAL:

- 1. Goats will arrive on Tuesday, August 6th between 9:00 am and 12:00 pm and will be housed in Barn A.
- 2. Milkout will be at 4:00pm the evening before the show. All does in milk must be checked.
- 3. Exhibitors are required to dress in white in the show ring.

4. Classes may be combined or divided, and class order may be changed at the discretion of the Superintendent and/or the judge.

5. The All-Goat Costume class will be held Friday, August 9th at 4:00 pm.

6. Record books—Exhibitors record books must be completed to date and available for display. There must be records on each animal shown.

8. Barn A will be closed daily, to the public and exhibitors, from 9:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. for the safety and welfare of livestock and exhibitors while at the fair.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Only exhibitors enrolled in the 4-H Dairy Goat Project are eligible to enter classes under Dept. 500.
- 2. Each individual goat may only be used as a project goat in one project. For instance, if an exhibitor owns two dairy goats, he/she can show one as his/her dairy goat project goat and one as his/her utility goat project goat, but the same goat cannot be entered in both departments.
- 3. Registration in breed associations of animals is not required; goats will be shown in breed class most closely representing breed type.
- 4. All goats must have an official USDA Scrapie Eradication Program Identification tag with the following exception: Registered goats may use a legible registration tattoo or microchip (EIDs) with registration papers in place of the scrapies tag. Registration papers must be provided for verification. Illegible tattoos or non-readable microchips must be replaced with a scrapies tag.
- 5. Dairy Goats entered in the Boulder County Fair must have been previously identified by the last Thursday of April of the current year using the species <u>Animal Identification Form and uploaded</u> <u>on 4-HOnline</u> enrollment or through their FFA advisor. This form must be on file at the Boulder County Extension Office by the posted deadlines each year. By submitting this form, the member is declaring they have ownership of the animal and are providing primary care of their project or is an official Lease-An-Animal 4-H project. The Animal Identification form does not replace the online entry of fair classes, however, is in addition to the entry. The only exception is for babies born after April 25th, in which case the dam must have been owned by the exhibitor by April 25th. See Rule 5a.

a. For dairy animals born after April 25th, the member will need to provide a hard copy printed animal identification form with updates to the Extension office and FFA advisor as they are completed. All animals planned to be shown at the Boulder County Fair must have forms completed and turned in prior to July 7th. The members must own the dam as of April 25th, of the current year and listed as their project animal on the animal identification form provided by April 25th.

6. All animals must be disbudded or dehorned.

7. The senior doe winning "Best in Show" from previous Boulder County Dairy Goat Show will not be allowed to show in any regular breed classes, but may still show in milk contest, group classes, showmanship and to challenge the Best in Show Senior Doe from current show.

REGULATIONS:

1. This is not an official ADGA show, but ADGA rules are applicable for the Dairy Goat division.

PREMIUMS:

Superintendents have the right to use their discretion to hold or refuse prize money.

Goat Showman within each age division will be eligible to compete in the Large Animal Round Robin. See Department 999 Large Animal Contest for complete rules. **TO ENTER GO TO DEPARTMENT 1000,** SHOWMANSHIP DEPARTMENT

SHOW13. Senior Dairy Goat Showmanship Exhibitor (youth ages 14 – 18 yrs.)
* Novice Dairy Goat Exhibitors who are in their first year showing in Dairy or Utility goats will have a chance to show before the Junior Class of Dairy showmanship. Registration for Novice will be at the check in.
* Dairy Goat Pee Wees will have a chance to show before the Junior class and can sign in the day of the show.

CHAMPION CHALLENGE

CLASS #22: Will consist of Best in Show Senior winners from previous Boulder County Fairs and the current Best in Show Senior winner to compete for the Supreme Dairy Goat. (Only enter this class if you won Best Senior Doe in Show during a previous fair.)

GROUP CLASSES – all breeds compete together

CLASS #:

- 23. Dam & Junior Daughter dam and her Junior (not milking) daughter, limited to one entry per exhibitor
- 24. Dam & Senior Daughter dam and her Senior (milking) daughter, limited to one entry per exhibitor
- 25. Two Best Females Senior &/or Junior does owned by one exhibitor, may NOT cross enter with Dam & Daughter, limited to one entry per exhibitor
- 26. Dairy Herd Three females, all in milk, owned by one exhibitor

WETHERS & PET GOATS

CLASS #:

27. Wethers - All breeds compete together, limited to two entries per exhibitor; wethers must be under the age of twelve months old.

28. Pet Goat – All breeds compete together, limited to one entry per exhibitor; may be a dry doe or wether over 12-month-old.

MILKING COMPETITION

CLASS #29: Open to any age milking doe. Weighed milk will be taken in a group setting on Milking Competition date and time. In addition to the weighed milk, a sample of milk will be taken at both the preliminary milking and weighed milking. This sample will be sent to a lab to determine the butterfat, protein, and somatic cell count on does' milk. A card with the results will be mailed to exhibitors.

DAIRY & UTILITY GOAT DEPARTMENT SPECIAL CONTESTS/AWARDS:

(No pre-entry required, sign up at check-in.)

Junior Dairy & Utility Goat Herdsmanship Award:

To encourage neat and attractive exhibits, an award will be given to one outstanding herdsman. Herdsmanship is the responsibility of the exhibitor ONLY. Exhibitors are expected to feed, water, bed and care for their animals and keep their pen area orderly, neat, and clean. Inspections will be made periodically while the dairy goats are at the fair. Someone other than the dairy goat team will do judging.

The following criteria may be used:

- Sportsmanship
- Cleanliness of pens
- Cleanliness of animals
- Neatness of aisle in front of pens
- Promptness in entering show ring
- Courteous at all times
- Regularity of feeding and watering
- Respect and care of facilities
- Presentation of information to the public

4-H/FFA Dairy & Utility Goat Educational Poster Contest:

1. Pre-entry is not required. Entries are due at goat check-in.

2. Poster size must be standard poster board 22" x 28", either white or colored.

3. Poster content to be any information regarding dairy goats that would be educational in nature and dealing with any subject that represents dairy & utility goats in a positive way.

4. Entries must be labeled with exhibitor's name, 4-H club, and age on the back of poster, do NOT put any personal information on the front of the poster.

5. There will be two age classes: 8-12 & 13-18.

6. Prizes will be awarded to all participants.

All Goat Costume Class

1. Costume Class is open to everyone. Wethers and does of any age and any breed, and any age youth may enter.

- 3. Goats and Exhibitors should be in costumes with a common theme.
- 4. Costume design is left up to the originality of the exhibitor.
- 5. Ribbon or prize will be awarded to everyone.
