Date: Saturday, October October 23, 2021, Time: 10 am

Place: Brazoria County Fairgrounds Arena

Entry Time: Books open day of event.

Entry Fee: \$120 per man

Rules

1. Must be a Brazoria County Resident. You must have been a resident for at least the last 180 days.
2. You must be able to show driver's license for proof of residency. If you enter and cannot show proof of residency, you will lose your fees and/or winnings.
3. There will be three (3) ropings: 8.5 with a 4.5 cap, 10.5 with a 6 cap, and 12. Enter one (1) draw two (2) or draw all three (3). You may enter up to three (3) times per roping for \$120 per man. Roping is a four (4) header progressive after one (1).
4. All classifications will be verified.
5. Average winners of the 8.5, 10.5 and 12 will be awarded champion header and heeler belt buckles.
6. Roper substitutions will not be allowed. If you fail to attend, you will forfeit your fees.
7. Personal medical releases will be approved by the committee only.
- 8. All entries must be paid in full and in cash. Absolutely no checks.**
9. There will be no cut off in the first round.
10. USTRC rules will be in effect. Collared shirts with at least three buttons, jeans, and boots - will be in effect. No T-shirts, golf shirts, etc. cowboy hat or no hat.
11. All decisions of the flagman are final.
12. Any discrepancies will be addressed to the chairman.
13. All decisions will be the final ruling of the chairman.
14. Any inhumane treatment to horses and/or livestock will be grounds for ejection from the roping and/or Fairground premises with loss of fees.

15. Contestants must have current Coggins certificate for each horse brought onto the fairgrounds.

16. All participants must comply with the Brazoria County Fair Association General Rules and Regulations printed in this Catalog unless otherwise specified.

17. Unsportsmanlike conduct of any contestants, parents and/or family members will not be tolerated. Any unsportsmanlike conduct may result in disqualification from competition and/or withdrawal of titles.
