Dear BCFA Family,



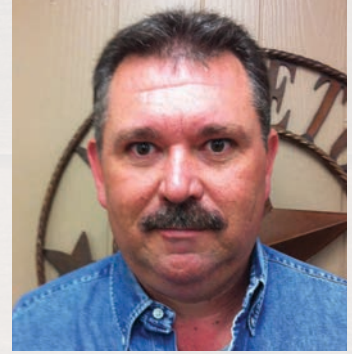

HISTORY OF BRAZORIA COUNTY FAIR

Back in 1910, several of Brazoria County's civic leaders decided the area needed a forum for educating farmers and homemakers by recognizing those who were most outstanding in each area of endeavor. They visualized an event that would provide competition, entertainment, enjoyment, and an opportunity to get together with friends. They wanted to provide a standard of excellence toward which county residents could work, to encourage continued improvement of the equality of life in the area. Thus, was born the first Brazoria County Fair.

Those early leaders would probably be astounded at the evolution of the fair since that first one in 1910. They could hardly have envisioned 120-acre fairgrounds dotted with permanent buildings including a huge, covered arena, the site of a multi-faceted, nine-day annual event attracting almost a quarter of a million people.

Through the earliest years' fairs, held on the block where the present count courthouse stands, were much less formally organized than those of today, they accomplished many of the goals sought by their leaders.

Visitors entered by climbing over a stile in the fence to compete in events and enjoy entertainments of all kinds. In 1911, when a man's horse was a source of great pride, the largest cash prize – a whopping \$10 – was offered for the best stallion entered, with lesser cash award for the best mare, colt, jack, and pair of mules.

An eight-inch breaking plow was offered by Harris-Badge Hardware Co. of Brazoria to the resident entering the best hog – either sex and any breed. Those who wanted to exhibit their poultry were warned that they must furnish their own pens. Other areas of competition included homemade carriage harness, cooking range, homemade broom, and butter and cheese.

Women could win a barrel of flour if they entered the best loaf of bread or angel food cake or Dixie biscuits. They also vied to concoct the best kumquat jelly, mango pickles, quince, and citron preserves. The woman who submitted the best sample of embroidery would win a \$5 corset offered by Mrs. F.M. Price, whose husband owned and operated an early Angleton dry goods store. Other handiwork categories included glove and handkerchief cases, shaving pad, hair receivers, hairpin receivers, and opera bags.

Exhibitor of the winning oil painting was to receive a pair of ladies' shoes, also given by Mrs. Price. Other cultural events included two talent shows and a show by the Oliver Music Co., all held at the local school. For the under two set, a baby show offered cash prizes from Mrs. F. Kiber for the prettiest girl and finest boy.

Dr. H.H. Harrington, agricultural superintendent for the Brownsville Railroad and former superintendent of the Texas Experiment Stations and president of Texas A & M College, was scheduled to be present throughout the fair to help area residents with their agricultural problems.

Then, as now the fair began with a parade. This was followed by a baseball game between renowned teams on Wednesday, and by all kinds of other amusements on Thursday. Other attraction, including

a cowboy parade, wild horse riding and a first-class merry-go-round and other amusing side shows attracted residents from all over the country, encouraging both the railroads serving Angleton to offer special rates to the Brazoria County Fair for shipping animals or for passenger fares during that week.

On Friday afternoon, one of the highlights of the early fairs took place. This was described as “an old-time Texas tournament, where knight errantry and chivalry will be displayed, as in the good old day for the cavalier”. From Brazoria and surrounding counties, young men “and old ones, too, if they choose...” who are good riders and have good horses” were invited to enter the tournament. The winner would receive “a beautiful crown which he will, in public, place upon the head of a young lady of his choice, at the grand county ball that night”.

History of the “modern” Brazoria County Fair begins in 1938, when Angleton Jaycees took over operation of several of the annual events. Although no fair organization officially existed that year, Jack Phillips of West Columbia recalls that “a little exhibition of livestock was held...and the ladies showed their jams and jellies” on the courthouse lot. Phillips, who has missed only one Brazoria County Fair since 1938 (until his death in 1994) – he was attending the Olympics in Mexico City during the 1968 fair – served as president of the fair in 1957, 1967, and 1968.

After formation of the Brazoria County Fat Stock and Fair Association, the group bought a 20-acre fig orchard south of Angleton for use as a fairground. By 1947, another 30-acres had been added to the site, and throughout the years, more land has been bought and paid out as it became available.

The fair was canceled for three years during World War II, and the property was leased to the U.S. government as the site for a U.S. Signal Corps radar unit. After a little more than a year, however, the government decided to utilize the facilities as a prisoner of war camp. A high fence topped with rows of barbed wire was placed around the property, with guard towers built at the corners. German war prisoners were moved to the site. At one time, 200 of Rommel’s crack North African Troops were among the prisoners housed there. Those who wanted to work for small wages, helped area farmers in cotton or rice harvesting and other chores, several of these former prisoners have visited Angleton in recent years, bringing their families to see where they were incarcerated and where they waded through muddy rice fields or stooped for hours to pick cotton.

With the war’s end, the grounds were returned to the fair association for use and in the years since, in good times and bad, in economic slumps and following devastating hurricanes, the fair has grown and expanded to the point that it is now the largest county fair in Texas. But despite its tremendous growth and changes, the Brazoria County Fair is still a place where residents from various parts of the county gather to compete in agricultural and homemaking and leisure-time pursuits, to recognize and encourage excellence, to visit friends, and to enjoy themselves in a family atmosphere.
