Association of Connecticut Fairs QUILT CONTEST

Sponsored by The Association of Connecticut Fairs and The Durham Agricultural Fair Association, Inc., "The Durham Fair"

WHO MAY ENTER: This contest is open to all residents of Connecticut; men, women and juniors. If entered by juniors, they will be judged with all adult entries.

HOW TO ENTER: Any quilt that is entered at any participating fair that is a member of the Association of Connecticut Fairs is automatically competing in the local contest. Contestants may enter the contest at as many member fairs as they wish until they win first prize. They will then represent that fair in the state contest. The state contest is held at the annual Association of Connecticut Fairs Fall Meeting.

JUDGING: The Association of Connecticut Fairs will furnish judges' score sheets to each fair. The contestants will receive these sheets at the end of the contest. Judging will be based on overall appearance, workmanship and originality. Decisions of the judges are final.

LOCAL CONTEST: The winner of the quilt contest will receive a blue ribbon from The Association of Connecticut Fairs and will become eligible to submit their entry to the state contest. In the event a fair receives only one entry in the contest and that entry is worthy of first prize, the Association rosette must be awarded to that entry.

STATE CONTEST: The state contest will be held at The Association of Connecticut Fairs Fall Meeting (check www.ctagfairs.org for date and location). Each fair must contact the winner of their local contest and provide information about reservations and other contest info. The Association of Connecticut Fairs does not contact the contestants.

The following prizes will be awarded in each category:
1st Place: \$50.00 2nd Place: \$35.00 3rd Place: \$15.00

Categories:

1. Hand-Applique
2. Patchwork - Machine Quilted
3. Patchwork - Hand Quilted

Contest Rules:

1. All work must be completed by an individual quilt maker.
2. Work can be pieced by hand or by machine but applique must be done by hand.
3. Quilts must be either hand or machine quilted, no hand tied quilts.
4. Applique quilts must consist of at least 50% applique.
5. Quilt perimeter must measure a minimum of 216 inches.
6. Quilts may not be made from pre-cut quilt kits.
7. No wall hanging quilts.
8. A quilt can only compete in the Association of Connecticut Fairs Quilt Contest once.

Association of Connecticut Fairs PHOTO CONTEST

The theme for the annual photo contest is "Connecticut Fairs". This contest is a mail in contest. The contest winner is chosen from the group of finalists at the Fall Meeting of The Association of Connecticut Fairs.

The photos submitted should show general scenes around our member fairs. Photos must have been taken after September 30, 2013. The photos entered do not have to be exhibited at any member fair to be eligible.

Association of Connecticut Fairs BAKING CONTESTS

Each year The Association of Connecticut Fairs sponsors baking contests open to the public at participating member fairs. Separate contests for Junior and Senior divisions baking a specific recipe are held. An Apple Pie Baking contest is also held.

WHO MAY ENTER: The contest at each participating member fair is open to all men, women and juniors who are residents of Connecticut. Commercial, industrial or professional bakers are not eligible.

Divisions: Juniors (ages 7 to 15 as of July 1st) and Senior

HOW TO ENTER: Any Connecticut resident entering a contest at any participating member fair is automatically entered and competing in the local contest. Contestants may enter the contest at as many fairs as they wish until they win first prize. They will then represent that fair at the state baking contest. Please submit entries to both the local and state contest on disposable plates. The Association of Connecticut Fairs and the member fairs are not responsible for the return of plates, trays or containers.

JUDGING: Judging will be based on appearance, flavor and texture. The Association of Connecticut Fairs will furnish judges' score sheets to each fair and the contestant will receive these sheets at the end of the contest. Additions, deletions or substitutions in the recipe are not permitted and will result in disqualification. All decisions of the judges are final.

LOCAL CONTEST: The winner of the local contest will receive a blue ribbon from the Association of Connecticut Fairs and will then become eligible to submit their entry at the state contest. In the event that only one entry is received at the local contest and that entry is worthy of first prize, that entry must be awarded the first place ribbon.

STATE CONTEST: The state contest is held as part of the Fall Meeting and Convention of the Association of Connecticut Fairs. Entries for the state contest are accepted until 11:00 a.m. on the day of the judging (contact your local fair or visit www.ctagfairs.org for the date and location). Contest winners are announced at the Fall Meeting. Each fair is responsible for contacting their contest winner and providing them with information. The Association of Connecticut Fairs does not contact individual fairs or contest winners in regards to contest and banquet reservations nor does the Association of Connecticut Fairs cover the costs of attending the awards banquet. **NO BANQUET RESERVATIONS FOR CONTEST WINNERS WILL BE ACCEPTED AT THE DOOR.**

ADULT BAKING CONTEST

Citrus Chiffon Cake with Citrus Glaze

7 egg whites - at room temperature
1/2 cup vegetable oil

1/2 teaspoon Cream of Tartar	1/2 cup orange juice
1/4 teaspoon salt	1/4 cup lemon juice
1 1/2 cups sugar - divided	2 tablespoons orange zest
2 1/4 cups King Arthur Cake Flour	1 teaspoon lemon zest
1 tablespoon baking powder	5 egg yolks

Preheat oven to 325 degrees F.

In a large bowl, with mixer at high speed, beat egg whites, cream of tartar and salt until soft peaks form. Beating at high speed, gradually sprinkle in 1/2 cup sugar, 2 tablespoons at a time, beating well after each addition until sugar is completely dissolved and whites stand in stiff peaks. In another large bowl, sift cake flour, 1 cup sugar and baking powder. Add vegetable oil, orange juice, lemon juice, orange zest, lemon zest and egg yolks. Beat until well blended and smooth, occasionally scarping bowl with rubber spatula. With rubber spatula or wire whisk, gently fold egg-yoke mixture into beaten whites. Pour batter into ungreased 9.5 or 10 inch angel food tube pan.

Bake cake 1 hour or until golden and top of cake springs back when touched with fingers. Invert cake in pan on funnel; cool completely in pan. Carefully loosen cake from tube pan. Place on aluminum foil covered cardboard.

Citrus Glaze - Ingredients

1 cup confectioner's sugar	1 teaspoon lemon zest
5 teaspoons orange juice	1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
1 teaspoon orange zest	1/8 teaspoon salt

Combine ingredients for Citrus Glaze in a small bowl. whisk until blended and smooth. Spread glaze on top of cake, letting some glaze run down side of cake. Submit on aluminum foil covered cardboard.



JUNIOR BAKING CONTEST

Maple Raisin Oatmeal Bars



Crust

- 1 cup King Arthur All-Purpose Unbleached Flour
- 1 cup quick cooking oats
- 1/2 cup packed brown sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 6 tablespoons butter, melted
- 3 tablespoons orange juice
- Cooking spray

Filling

- 1 1/3 cups raisins
- 3/4 cup sour cream
- 2 tablespoons maple syrup
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- 2 tablespoons King Arthur Unbleached Flour
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/2 teaspoon grated orange rind
- 1 large egg white, beaten

Directions

1. Preheat oven to 325 degrees F.
2. To prepare crust, combine flour, oats, brown sugar, salt, baking soda and cinnamon in a medium bowl stirring well with a whisk. Drizzle butter and orange juice over flour mixture, stirring until moistened. Mixture will be crumbly. Set aside 1/2 cup of this oat mixture. Spray 11 x 7 inch baking dish with cooking spray. Press oat mixture into the bottom of the baking dish.
3. To prepare filling, combine raisins and remaining ingredients in a medium bowl. Stirring well. Spread raisins mixture over prepared crust. Sprinkle reserved oat mixture evenly over filling. Bake at 325 degrees for 40 minutes or until edges are golden. Cool completely in pan.

Yield 24 servings. Submit 6 square servings on a white paper plate.




