#### **Revised Constitution**

#### -OF THE-

#### MAHONING COUNTY AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY

#### ARTICLE I

The Association shall be known as the Mahoning County Agricultural Society.

#### ARTICLE II

The Society is organized exclusively for charitable, educational, and scientific purposes under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or corresponding sections of any future federal tax code and shall promote improvements in agriculture, livestock, domestic arts and industries in Mahoning County.

AMENDED DATE: November 2022

#### ARTICLE III

Any person who has reached the age of 18 years and is a resident of Mahoning County, may become a member of this Society by paying 50 cents annually for a membership certificate.

#### ARTICLE IV

- **Section 1.** Each membership certificate shall bear the day and year it begins and shall expire on January 1st of the following year and shall bear the signature of the holder thereof. Only those persons who present such certificates and whose names appear on the membership list of the Society shall be qualified to vote at the annual election of the Society or to hold office therein.
- **Section 2.** Beginning December 15 of each year, agricultural membership certificates for the following year shall be placed on sale and their sale continued at least 30 hours each week until the Fair convenes. Then memberships will be on sale until 12:00 noon each day of the Fair, ending the last day of the Fair at 12:00 Noon. Notice of the time and place of such sale shall be published in the annual Premium List and in a newspaper of general circulation in the county.

#### ARTICLE V

Section 1. The Board of Directors of the Society shall consist of individuals residing in townships located entirely within Mahoning County. The Board shall consist of seventeen (17) members, no more than two (2) of whom shall be from anyone (1) of the following geographical territories: Austintown Township, Beaver Township, Berlin Township, Boardman Township, Canfield Township, City of Youngstown, Coitsville Township, Ellsworth Township, Goshen Township, Green Township, Jackson Township, Milton Township, Poland Township, Smith Township, and Springfield Township. No more than two (2) of the geographical territories listed above may have three (3) members elected or appointed to the Board of Directors. The maximum number of Directors serving on the Board shall remain at 17. The two (2) geographical areas may change as new Directors are either elected or appointed to the Board.

For purposes of this Article, any municipality or incorporated area located within the original territory of a township shall be considered part of that township.

- **Section 2.** Directors must be residents of the county and shall serve until their successors are elected and/or appointed by the Board of Directors. No Director elected or appointed shall be an employee of the Mahoning County Agricultural Society.
- **Section 3.** Any individual first elected or appointed as a Director of the Society after January 1, 2005, must retire on or before December 31 of the calendar year in which that individual reaches the age of 75. All Directors elected or

appointed before January 1, 2005, shall remain in office without the mandatory retirement age applying to them.

AMENDED DATE: November 2022

- **Section 4.** The tenure of office of Directors shall be three years and so arranged that as nearly as possible the terms of one-third of the members shall expire annually.
- **Section 5.** All vacancies occurring by reason of refusal to serve, resignation, removal from the county or death, may be filled by the Board of Directors until next regular election, at which time a Director shall be elected for the unexpired term.
- **Section 6.** A member of the Society, desiring to become a Director must file with the Secretary at least seven days before the annual election of Directors is held, a petition signed by not less than ten members of the Society. Only candidates who have met this filing requirement shall be eligible for election as Directors. Those filing requirements shall be announced in the annual Premium List and at least twice in one newspaper of general circulation in the County.

Petitions shall be furnished by and must be procured from the Secretary.

- **Section 7.** The election of Directors must be by ballot and voting by proxy will not be permitted.
- Section 8. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
- **Section 9.** All members of standing committees must be Directors, Honorary Directors, Ex-Officio Members, or Officers and shall be appointed by the President, subject to the approval of the Board.
- Section 10. Directors who retire from the Board after not less than five years' service may be elected an Honorary Director of the Society, with all the powers of an elected director of the Society except the right to vote when recommended for such membership by the Executive Committee and approved by not less than three-fourths of all the members of the Board.
- **Section 11.** Directors shall receive such compensation as the Board of Directors may determine, not to exceed the limit established in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Ohio Department of Agriculture Section 901-5-09.
- Section 12. As determined by the Board from time to time the Society may use moneys provided by the state, county, or another source, to acquire alcoholic beverages (beer and wine) and obtain a liquor permit to sell the beverages at an event that is open to the public and conducted on the Society's fairgrounds and retain the revenue derived from such sales. AMENDED DATE: November 7, 2018

#### ARTICLE VI

- Section 1. The Officers of the Society shall be President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer. The President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer shall be elected by the Board of Directors. The Fiscal Officer and Fair Manager shall be appointed by the Board of Directors and shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Directors.
- **Section 2.** The Officers shall post bonds in an amount approved by the Board of Directors, but not less than \$5,000 each. Notwithstanding the above, bonds shall not be required for Officers insured by the Society for theft coverage as members of the insured class of the Society's insurance coverage.
- Section 3. The Treasurer, Secretary, and Chairman of the Grounds Committee may receive compensation for their services.

#### ARTICLE VII

**Section 1.** The annual meeting of the Society for the election of Directors shall be held in Canfield the first Wednesday in November in each year, between the hours of 12:00 Noon and 4:00 P.M. Notice of the time and place of this election shall be published at least twice in a newspaper of general circulation in the County.

Section 2. The annual meeting of the Society for the revision of the Premium List shall be held the first Saturday in January or within 20 days thereof.

**Section 3.** The annual meeting of the Directors for the election of Officers shall be held in November after the election of Directors.

#### ARTICLE VIII

Upon the dissolution of this organization, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for public purpose.

#### **BY-LAWS**

#### ARTICLE I

- **Section 1.** The annual election of the Society shall be held on the first Wednesday in November, at 12:00 noon.
- Section 2. All person's residents of Mahoning County and holding a membership certificate shall be entitled to a vote at the annual election.

#### ARTICLE II

- **Section 1.** The President shall preside at all meetings of the Society and the Board of Directors.
- **Section 2.** In the absence of the President, the Vice-President shall perform such duties as are assigned to the President.
- Section 3. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of all meetings of the Society and of the meetings of the Board of Directors, conduct the correspondence of the Society, notify the Directors of the meeting of the Board and cause to be published the time and place of meetings of the Society, keep a correct account of all monies received and disbursed by the Society, prepare the annual report to the State Board of Agriculture and submit the same, and perform such other duties as may be required.
- **Section 4.** All monies received by the Society shall be deposited by an appointee of the Board to the credit of the Mahoning County Agricultural Society in a bank to be designated by the Directors annually, and all obligations of the Society shall be paid by check signed by any two appointees of the Board.
- **Section 5.** To the fullest extent allowed by law, the Society will indemnify its directors, officers, and employees against whom an action, claim or proceeding is brought or threatened, as a result of said individual's good faith performance of the duties on behalf of, or at the direction of the Society, and in all cases in which the action, claim or proceeding is covered, in whole or in part, by a policy of insurance. This indemnification will be against, and is limited to, expenses, including attorney fees, judgments, penalties, fines, costs, and amounts in settlement actually and reasonably incurred in connection with the action to the proceeding.

For indemnification to be provided, the Board member, officer or employee of the Society must have acted in good faith and in a manner that he or she reasonably believed to be in the best interest of the Society; and with respect to criminal action or proceedings, said individual must have had no reasonable cause to believe that his or her conduct was unlawful.

Indemnification pursuant to this policy will not take place for a breach of duty to the Society, an act or omission not in good faith, or that otherwise involves intentional misconduct or a knowing violation of the law; a transaction from which the individual derived an improper personal benefit; or an act or omission that is grossly negligent or for an individual seeking indemnification under this policy who fails to provide timely notice of any action, claim or proceeding, or who fails to fully and completely cooperate with the society in defending the action, claim or proceeding.

This indemnification will be made only as authorized in a specific case upon application by a Board Member, officer, or employee and, after determination that an indemnification is proper in the circumstance and that the individual has met the applicable standards of conduct set forth herein.

**Section 6.** As determined by the Board from time to time the Society may use moneys provided by the state, county or another source, to acquire alcoholic beverages (beer and wine) and to obtain a liquor permit to sell the beverages at an event that is open to the public and conducted on the Society's fairgrounds and retain the revenue derived from such sales.

#### ARTICLE III

The Rules and Regulations of the Ohio Department of Agriculture pertaining to County and Independent Societies shall govern the Mahoning County Agricultural Society.

#### ARTICLE IV

This Constitution and By-Laws may be altered or amended by a majority of the membership present and voting at the annual meeting for the election of the Board of Directors. Notice of any proposed alteration or amendment to the Constitution and By-Laws shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the County not less than three or more than ten days before it is to be voted upon.

Amendments to the Constitution or By-Laws may be proposed by -

- (A) A majority of the Board of Directors at a regular meeting voting in favor of placing the amendment on the ballot, or
- (B) Filing a petition with the Secretary of the Society at least fourteen days prior to the annual election of the Board of Directors. Said petition must set forth the proposed amendment and must be signed by not less than 25 members of the Society.

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS

#### **Please Read Carefully**

#### **ENTRIES-PREMIUMS**

- 1. Entries designated to compete for premiums must be registered with the proper department.
- Entries must specify the Exhibitor's Name and Address, County, Department, Class, and Item Number, as specified in the Premium List. Entry forms are located online at our website for your convenience. Premium Book entries may be submitted online @ www.canfieldfair.com.
   Exceptions: Antique Equipment, Floral and Special Entries.
- A list of entries in the Livestock Departments are encouraged to submit their entries online by the August 1<sup>st</sup> deadline.

- 4. If mailing, a list of entries (not articles) for all departments must be postmarked by the appropriate department deadline. And mailed to:
  - Canfield Fair Entry, P.O. Box 250, Canfield, Ohio 44406.

#### Please note some of these deadline dates are new.

- 5. Enclose entry fee (SHOWN UNDER EACH CLASS) and \$2.00 to cover office fees.
- 6. Entry tag showing number and class (available in building) must be attached to the entry competing for premiums and delivered to the Superintendent of the proper department by dates and times specified under each Department listing.
- 7. Special take in dates and/or instructions for Farm Products see page 76; Jr. Gardens see page 80; Pumpkins/Squash see page 81; Grain, Hay, and Honey see pages 87, 90 and 92. Floral entries refer to flyer located on our website: www.canfieldfair.com
- 8. Persons exhibiting livestock must furnish pedigree of the same to the Superintendent in charge of the Class or Department in which said stock is entered.
- 9. Owners of stock must be prepared, if called upon by the Judge, to give certificate of registration.
- 10. NEW 2024 All horses/ponies are <u>required</u> to have proof of Rhino (EHV)/Flu vaccine within 12 months of the closing date of Canfield Fair Veterinarian highly recommends within 6 mos. of fair closing date.
- 11. No stock above the age of one year shall be permitted to enter the ring for exhibition unless manageable under halter and in the care of some competent person.
- 12. Owners of animals entered for competition and not exhibited in the ring in the class in which they are entered, will be charged \$10.00 per day for the use of stalls.
- 13. Department "B" Classes 15 to 27 inclusive will be exhibited in the Cattle Arena and exhibitors must hold themselves in readiness to exhibit their stock at the hour appointed by their classes or division thereof. A disregard of this rule will subject the exhibitor to forfeiture of premium.
- 14. All FRUIT, SEEDS and VEGETABLES must be grown by the exhibitor; otherwise, any and all premiums will be forfeited.
- 15. Managers will be in attendance at the hall on the grounds to arrange exhibits and suitable persons will be stationed in the halls to protect the articles during the fair.
- 16. EVERY ARTICLE MUST REMAIN ON DISPLAY IN THE BUILDINGS AND ALL LIVESTOCK IN THE STALLS, UNTIL MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 2<sup>nd</sup> (TIME TO BE DETERMINED) OR FORFEIT ALL PREMIUMS AWARDED.
- 17. All exhibits must be removed by noon SEPTEMBER 3, 2024.
- 18. Premium cards or ribbons have no value as to the payment of premiums as premiums are paid only by the records of the Judges' books.
- 19. All premiums must be claimed prior to November 1st, or they will be deemed forfeited to the Society.
- 20. THE DECISION OF JUDGES IS FINAL.

#### PROHIBITED.

"NO PERSON SHALL BE PERMITTED TO MAKE SOLICITATION OF ANY NATURE ON THE FAIRGROUNDS EXCEPT IN CONTRACTED CONCESSION OR COMMERCIAL RENTED SPACES. NO PERSON WILL BE PERMITTED TO POST OR DISPLAY SIGNS, DISTRIBUTE HANDBILLS OR ADVERTISE MATERIAL OR SELL OR DISTRIBUTE FREE, ANY MERCHANDISE, EXCEPT PERSONS UNDER CONTRACT."

#### JUDGES

- Judges will familiarize themselves with the Premium List pertaining to the department they are to judge.
- 2. Judges will note the time of judging and arrange to start promptly at the scheduled hour.
- 3. No person can act as Judge or Clerk in any class in which he or she may be an Exhibitor.
- 4. Judges will make awards only on entries which are worthy of premiums. Entries not deemed worthy of premiums, where there is no competition, will be so reported, and any entry which deserves special commendation, the judges will so report. Decision of Judge is final.
- 5. No premiums are to be awarded to unsound animals, or to cows that have not produced a living calf for 18 months. (This will not apply if they are with calf at time of exhibition.) Judges on animals will have regard to symmetry, early maturity, size and general characteristics of the animals they judge. They will make proper allowance for age, feeding and other circumstances of the character and condition of the animal. They are particularly required not to give encouragement to over-fed animals for breeding purposes.
- Judges in all classes are particularly requested to report to the Manager of their department any attempt to influence or interfere with their decisions.
- 7. If it be ascertained that any exhibitor has made or caused to be made any false statements to, or has in any manner directly or indirectly, interfered with any of the judges, such exhibitor shall be excluded from all competition and shall forfeit all premiums, if any be awarded.
- 8. If any disrespect be shown on an award or toward the judge by the exhibitor, or his agent, he shall forfeit all awards made him, and the Superintendent in charge shall report the same to the Secretary upon return of any class book, which will be received only from him or her, and make any explanation required.

#### MEMBERSHIPS

Membership certificates for the current year may be purchased at the following places at the time designated:

ADMINISTRATION BUILDING (#20) on the Fairgrounds, Monday through Friday, from 9:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. until the Fair starts. During the Fair, membership will be on sale from 9:00 A.M. to 12:00 Noon.

Membership certificates may also be purchased from any officer or member of the Board of Directors of the Society.

\*All sales will end at 12:00 Noon on the last day of the Canfield Fair (Monday, September 2<sup>nd</sup>).

NO PERSON SHALL SECURE OR PAY FOR MORE THAN ONE MEMBERSHIP AND THAT MEMBERSHIP SHALL BE FOR HIMSELF OR HERSELF.

#### DIRECTORS

A member of the Society desiring to become a Director must file with the Secretary at least seven days before the annual election of Directors is held, a petition signed by not less than ten members of the Society. Only candidates who have met this filing requirement shall be eligible for election as Directors. Petitions shall be furnished by the Secretary.

#### MISCELLANEOUS

- 1. Golf carts or similar equipment are not permitted on the grounds without written approval of board.
- 2. Trailer Park sites, with or without electricity, must be rented. Reservations must be made with the Fair Secretary.

- 3. Exhibitors and concessionaires are requested to refrain from driving in congested areas between the hours of 10 A.M. and 10 P.M. Special gate stickers will be issued to permit automobiles and trucks to enter the gate nearest their exhibits.
- 4. Every species of gambling, either for money or goods, is absolutely prohibited. No intoxicating liquors of any kind or beer will be permitted to be brought upon or kept upon the grounds. The Superintendent shall reserve the right of cancellation at any time for reasons satisfactory to himself, of all contracts made with Concessionaires, and persons found violating this rule shall forfeit their privilege money.
  - 5. Police are required to report promptly at the time and place designated by the Superintendent of Police. Policemen seeing intoxicated persons or hearing any person using profane language will escort such persons from the grounds. Failure to do so will be cause for discharge.
  - 6. Police and fire protection will be provided both day and night, and all possible efforts will be made to prevent loss or damage to all exhibits and to protect all persons and property on the grounds, but the Society, its officers and employees assume no responsibility for loss or damage to exhibits or other property, or injury to persons while on the grounds.
  - 7. Under no circumstances will any person or firm be permitted to place advertising matter of any kind upon any building, tree, pole or other place on the grounds. No person or firm will be allowed to distribute advertising matter of any kind on the grounds without a written permit from the Secretary.
  - 8. No person will be allowed to show outside the Fairgrounds on the public highway any curiosity for pay or set up for profit any ride or refreshment stand of any kind, within the distance described by law, and under penalty of the law.
  - 9. Exhibition buildings will open 9 A.M. and remain open until 11 P.M.
- 10. Concession space will be rented for the sale of any commodity permitted by the Board or by the Fair Manager and it is urged that reservations be made as early as possible.
- 11. Riding of motorcycles, motor scooters, go-carts, golf carts, horses or ponies is prohibited on the Fairgrounds, except by permit from the Fair Board. Bicycles are permitted only outside the inside fence. Dogs must be kept on leashes and are not permitted on the midways at any time.

#### 901-19-31 Responsibilities of, and assistance to, Junior Fair exhibitors

- (A) A junior livestock show exhibitor shall be responsible for the continuous care, grooming, and preparation of the livestock entered in the junior livestock show.
- (B) An exhibitor may receive assistance in the care, grooming, and preparation of the livestock entered in the junior livestock show, provided that the assistance shall be limited to explanation or demonstration provided by the following:
  - (1) Family members;

(C) Any person not specified in paragraph (B) of this rule who provides assistance to a junior livestock show exhibitor shall register in writing with the sponsor. The responsibility to register rests with the exhibitor. An assistant may register for more than one exhibitor. Failure to register constitutes grounds for disciplinary action against the exhibitor. Assistance shall be limited to explanation and minimal demonstration.

#### 901-19-32 Breed shows or classes

This is an optional rule

Unless otherwise modified by a mandatory rule, the rules of the breed association shall be accepted grooming practices for that particular breed's show or class.

#### 901-19-33 Prohibited grooming practices

#### 901-19-34 Outstanding market project competition

This is an optional rule.

An exhibition may provide for an outstanding market project competition in one or more classes. The competition may include an evaluation of the livestock, demonstration of the exhibitor's showmanship abilities, or a skillathon or interview judging. The skillathon or interview judging may include demonstration of the exhibitor's knowledge of quality assurance principles, as set forth in an industry publication or in a publication such as the "caring for animals" handout or by viewing the "Caring for Animals Video" available from a county extension office.

#### 901-19-35 Recognition of disciplinary actions

This is an optional rule.

- (A) Disciplinary action by a sponsor against a person for a violation of Sections 901.70 to 901.76 or Chapter 901-19 of the Administrative Code shall be given full faith and credit and shall be honored at all exhibitions.
- (B) A person who has been convicted of violating Sections 901.70 to 901.76, inclusive, of the Revised Code shall be prohibited from participating in any exhibition for a minimum period of three years.

#### 901-19-38 False, deceptive, or unacceptable practices

#### 901-19-39 Ownership Requirements

#### LIVESTOCK TAMPERING AND/OR MISREPRESENTATION

TAMPERING AND/OR MISREPRESENTATION as to breeding, age, ownership, custody and any other irregularity in showing will be considered fraud and deception. To maintain a high degree of confidence and integrity in the livestock shows, the agricultural society reserves the right to disqualify any animal fitted in an unethical manner and disqualify the exhibitor and the exhibitor's assistants who fitted the animal involved.

Unethical fitting shall include any cutting or tearing of the hide, cutting or tearing underneath the hide or removal of tissue in any attempt to alter the shape or appearance. It shall also include attempts to disrupt or change normal dental development, dyeing or coloring hair, adding artificial tailheads, switches, polls, hair and heels, as well as any attempt to change the conformation and degree of firmness, by administration of fluids or air internally or externally in a liquid, solid, or gaseous state. Transparent grooming materials only may be used.

## THE USE OF CLENBUTEROL AND OTHER UNAPPROVED DRUGS IS PROHIBITED.

All exhibitors, their immediate family and any other parties involved in the unethical fitting and showing of an animal will be barred from exhibiting or showing at this fair and will forfeit all premiums, prize money and awards won in any junior fair and/or open class divisions.

SHOULD FRAUD OR DECEPTION, AND PROOF, AS DETERMINED BY THE AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY, BE DISCOVERED AFTER THE ANIMALS HAVE BEEN SHOWN AND PRIOR TO THE SALE, such animal(s) shall not be permitted to sell. The animals placing next in line at the show shall move up.

SHOULD VIOLATION BE DISCOVERED AFTER THE SALE, all sale money shall be returned to the buyer and the animal, carcass or carcass value shall be returned to the exhibitor. All placings in show will stand. No animals will move up. Any carcass suspected of being tampered with or suspected of containing drugs will be detained until the investigation is complete.

IF THE CARCASS IS CONDEMNED at the packing plant for any reason, it shall be grounds for disqualification in the on-foot and carcass division of the show. Additionally, all premiums and sale money shall be forfeited and the loss of the animal be incurred by the exhibitor.

#### **RULE VIOLATIONS**

In the question of a rule violation, the following due process will be used:

The exhibitor and/or parties involved will be questioned by Fair officials. If it is felt a violation has occurred, Fair officials will make recommendations to the designated committee of the agricultural society which is appointed to that particular department. After the committee hears the allegations and/or evidence, they will decide if the case should be brought before the full Board of Directors

In the decision of allegations being brought before the Board, all parties involved will be notified of a meeting date with all parties having the right to present their views and/or evidence. Upon hearing the case, the Fair Board will make a ruling.

When satisfactory evidence has been obtained by the Fair Board that any of the livestock rules have been violated, the exhibitor and/or exhibitor's family may be barred from showing in any future agricultural fairs. The minimum number of years for disbarment is three (3) years before the right to a review. In case any premium shall have been awarded to animals shown in violation of this rule, the Fair Board will require the exhibitor to refund *all* premiums, trophies, awards, ribbons and sale money under each violation. Unless fraud and/or deception are involved, all championship placings stand.

- B. Exhibitors are limited to a total of three (3) items only to exhibit in Category 1 & 2 combined. Exhibitors are any person or immediate family, or organization. Any exhibitor/application can be denied by Director-In-Charge. Category 1 - Tractors Category 2 - Gas powered

#### \*\*NEW\*\* RULES for WEDNESDAY - Gates open 8 A.M.

- All Teams are to enter the Fairgrounds at Gate #3 located on Fairground Blvd. Use cross-over and unload in
  the infield then proceed to Barn #32 (Outside shed rows only). Those wishing to stay overnight must go
  to Administration Building #20 for parking pass and admission tickets. All horses must be out of stalls by
  8 P.M. Thursday. Stalls must be cleaned, or a fee will be deducted from winnings and/or a bill sent.
- 2. It is requested that all teams weigh in at scale located at the blacksmith's shop east of Barn #32 from 2:00 to 3.00 P.M. on the day of pull. Weighing done on loose leads.
- 3. Drivers will be allowed two helpers in hitching, but in no case, will the helpers be allowed to touch the horses or speak to them. No profane language will be permitted. Drivers shall not touch or whip the horses. Violation of this rule disqualifies the team for the contest. THIS RULE APPLIES TO HORSES ANYWHERE ON THE GROUNDS.
- 4. Helpers must remain back of hooking point before command or signal to start the pull. Emergency heading for any reason will warrant unhooking, corrections made, then hitched by regular procedure.
- 5. Drivers of teams must keep their teams in view of the judge of the contest at all times. They must be ready to pull in regular order. Canfield Pulls will allow two (2) minutes for hitching time after clearance of the sled by prior puller or an authorized delay by the track judges. Unnecessary delay will result in loss of pull.
- 6. The distance of the pull shall be 27 feet for horses.
- The distance between side boundaries shall be approximately 15 feet. Crossing the boundary disqualifies the pull in progress.
- 8. First and second pulls shall be in the direction indicated by the judge. If the owner unhitches after the first pull, he indicates he is passing up his second pull. The third and final pull may be taken in either direction, if adequate length for a completed pull.
- 9. The third and final pull MUST be in line with the order that all teams originally pulled.
- 10. The use of open bridles is prohibited. Use of unusual harness or hitch may be prohibited by the judge.
- 11. Any forward movement of the sled after the driver gives a command to pull will be counted as a pull and the measurement recorded. In case of breakage the team is entitled to another pull.
- 12. A whistle signal will be given when the team has made the full distance or when forward movement of the sled stops or when an error has been committed.
- 13. Random drug testing.
- 14. There will be no instant replay view from any camera. Judge's decision will be final.



- 1. Teams enter Fairgrounds at Gate #3 on Fairground Blvd. to designated crossover. Teams may unload in track infield then proceed to the registration station, where entries will be completed.
- 2. It is requested that all teams enter/register from 4 P.M. to 5 P.M. on day of pull.
- 3. All teams must be properly handled and under control at all times during the contest.
- 4. The pulling contest will be conducted under the Central Ohio Draft Pony Pulling Club, LLC (CODPPC) Rules and Regulations.

#### CENTRAL OHIO DRAFT PONY PULLING CLUB, LLC RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Rules of entry at all CODPPC sponsored pulls shall be as follows \$5.00 per entry per pull; \$20.00 for membership and \$10.00 for insurance per year.
- 2. All drivers must be a member to drive including helper on lines.
- 3. All ponies must have CODPPC cards at time of pull. Classification of ponies will be light/small 52" and under, heavy/large 56" and under.
- 4. Only CODPPC cards will be honored. If a pony is sold a new card will be made out to the new owner. Ponies do not have to be remeasured. Any person who tries to violate this rule in any way will, along with the pony involved, be barred from any association event for a period of one year from the time of infraction.
- Anyone will be allowed to pull or pass first load. When pulling together 56" class can pass 2<sup>nd</sup> load.
- 6. All teams must cross the first official load to receive payback.
- 7. Ponies can only pull in one class per event. No split teams.
- 8. No open bridles permitted.
- CODPPC reserves the right to test any pony at any time. If ponies are tested, all monies will be held and monies will not be paid until negative tests are back.

#### HITCHING AND COURT

- 10. The distance between the boundary lines shall be 15 ft. Teams must stay inside the boundary or pull will be disqualified. Any pony that steps on or over the rope loses the pull even though the driver says whoa. (NO EXCEPTIONS).
- 11. The distance for each pull will be 14 ft. Distances less than 14 ft. will be used to determine placings. The chain will be fastened to the center of the rear of the sled. Second or third best distance will count in case of a tie.
- 12. There will be no heading or flagging of ponies on first or third pulls. Ponies can be headed on the second pull if they are already hooked on the sled.
- 13. The first and second pulls shall be in the direction indicated by the judges. The third pull can be taken in either direction, providing there is room in the court. If the driver unhitches after the first pull it indicates he is passing the second pull.
- 14. The direction of the sled will not change after adding weight.

- 15. Any forward movement of the sled after the driver gives the command to pull will be counted as a pull, and the measurement recorded. A whistle signal will be given when a team has made the distance or when the forward motion of the sled stops. If a driver or helper breaks a rule or regulation while a pull is in progress, a whistle signal will be given and the pull will be disqualified.
- 16. If a team has a break down or gets tangled up on the first or third pull, they must unhitch, go outside the boundaries (ropes) and straighten things out. They will come back in at the end of the round.
- 17. There must be a first-place winner determined by pulling the sled. A pull can't end with all final teams passing.

#### DRIVERS INFORMATION

- 18. All teams must be properly driven and handled. No pony shall be mistreated in any way. No profane language shall be permitted. The enforcement of this rule shall be up to the judges of the event and their decisions will be final. Violation of this rule during pull or elsewhere in fairgrounds may disqualify the driver and team from the contest.
- 19. Three tries to get hitched to the sled will be counted as a pull.
- 20. Drivers will be allowed two helpers to hitch, but the helpers will stay clear of the ponies and sled after the command to pull is given.
- 21. Drivers will be allowed a helper on the lines.
- 22. Each team will have only one driver, except in case of injury or illness.
- 23. Each team will have one minute after he hitches to the sled to get it in motion. He will have one-minute rest between first and second pull.
- 24. Drivers, when at all possible, shall keep their teams in full view of the judges. The judges shall use their own judgment in enforcing this regulation. They must be ready to pull in their regular order. Unnecessary delay in getting to the sled can result in the judges disqualifying that team.
- 25. If a team runs away at an event, free from driver and helpers, the team is sent to the trailer and disqualified.
- 26. All decisions of the judge are final. Any unreasonable argument with any judge can result in disqualification of the team and driver from the event

#### MEASURING

- 27. Ponies will not be allowed to be measured with the harness or collar on.
- 28. All ponies that are five years old (full mouth) or older shall be issued a CODPPC lifetime measuring card. Any pony under five will be issued a CODPPC temporary measuring card.
  - A. A 4'x8' sheet of plywood will be used for measuring.
  - B. Allowance for shoes will be from the ground up.
  - C. 5 minute set up time or less, once stick is set 30 seconds to set stick.
  - D. You will have two chances at each event per class to measure a pony.
  - E. Stick set at where mane begins and goes straight down.
  - F. No excessive leaning of pony by discretion of measuring committee.
  - G. All 4 heels must touch measuring board.
  - H. Only measure man can hold measuring stick.
  - I. All ponies measure in same direction at each event.

- 2. **Submit Entries online** @ www.canfieldfair.com or use Horse & Pony Entry Form located under the "Get Involved" tab on our website and mail to: Canfield Fair PO Box 250 Canfield, OH 44406. \*Paper Entries will be charged a \$10.00 administrative fee.
- 3. All horses/ponies must be stabled on the fairgrounds by 8:00 P.M. on Tues., Aug. 27<sup>th</sup> and remain until Monday evening, Sept. 2<sup>nd</sup>, time TBD, **or forfeit all premiums**.
- NO ENTRIES will be accepted after the August 1<sup>ST</sup> deadline or after sufficient entries to fill all stalls have been received. NO ADDING or CHANGING classes will be allowed after the deadline. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 5. NO hay or straw furnished.
- 6. Exhibitors must pick up numbers between 5:00 8:00 P.M., Monday, August 26<sup>th</sup> or 1:00 6:00 P.M., Tuesday, August 27<sup>th</sup>. Numbers are to be returned to the Draft or Pony Palace office when you are finished showing.
- 7. Barns and stable areas must be kept clean and swept at all times. Stable areas are to be clean by 10:00 A.M. each day of the Fair.
- 8. Horses and ponies from out of state must have evidence of a negative coggins test and a health certificate. This does not apply for Ohio-owned horses.



- 9. All horses/ponies are <u>required</u> to have proof of Rhino (EHV)/Flu vaccine within 12 months of the closing date of Canfield Fair. Veterinarian highly recommends within 6 mos. of fair closing date.
- 10. Please read "Notice to Livestock Exhibitors", page 16-18.
- The Mahoning County Agricultural Society reserves the right to reject any entry and/or make changes.

#### RULES GOVERNING SHOWING OF DRAFT HORSES AND PONIES

- 1. Exhibitors are hereby notified that any act of discourtesy, or disrespect by them, their riders, drivers, groomers, trainers and/or agents to the Judges, Stewards, Announcers, or any other Show Official or Staff shall cause the forfeiture of all premium money won and that they may be asked to leave the show grounds.
- 2. Handler and assistant in all halter and performance classes must be suitably dressed. No tank tops, shorts, or short skirts.
- 3. Youth/Jr. Exhibitor, 18 years and under, <u>MUST</u> wear an approved helmet in all performance classes.
- 4. All entries shall be ready well in advance of class time to avoid delays.

- 5. To protest a class, you <u>MUST</u> have an entry, show proof of registration in the class and a <u>fee of \$50.00 must be deposited with the Director in Charge</u>, or his secretary, within one hour after the protested class has been judged. A receipt will be issued. Protests will be resolved within 24 hours and witnessed by a neutral party.
- 6. **STALL RENT** of \$10.00 a day will be charged if entries are made and not shown.
- 7. First and Second place horses and ponies must compete in the championship classes.
- 8. Youth under the age of 14 are not permitted to show stallions in halter classes.
- The show will be Governed by the Draft Horse Pony Staff in accordance with the Mahoning County Agricultural Society.

#### **RULES GOVERNING HITCH CLASSES**

- 1. Mares, Gelding and Stallions are eligible for all hitch classes.
- 2. In all hitch classes, horses and ponies shall be shown hitched to a suitable vehicle.
- 3. Hitch classes with 4 or more draft horses and 3 or more ponies may be made up of animals owned by one or more exhibitors.
- 4. No more than two persons shall be permitted on box or wagon while in show ring. **EXCEPTION**: Costume Classes.
- 5. Any driver in hitch class age 14 years old and under (for draft horses) and 12 years old and under (for ponies) must be accompanied by an adult.
- 6. All entries shall be ready well in advance of the class time to avoid delays. Hitches not ready when class is called will have 6 minutes maximum from the time the first exhibitor enters the ring.
- 7. Hitch classes will be judged on the following:

\*Performance 60% \*Equipment 20% \*Conformation 20%

#### RULES GOVERNING PONY DIVISIONS

Exhibitor must meet USDA requirements available on our website. Exhibitor must have record of farm origin to correspond with USDA tag/tattoo. These records should be maintained by exhibitor for 5 years. This record is kept to monitor Scrapie, which is a disease which can be found in sheep and goats. This Scrapies identification system has been mandated by the USDA. Rules will be strictly enforced. Sheep/Goats without official USDA identification (tag and/or tattoo) will not be permitted to exhibit. To obtain Official Herd Scrapies identification Tags/Tattoo registration, first contact herd of origin. If not available, contact USDA Scrapies Identification at 1-866-873-2824 or 614-856-4735.



Exhibitors are to furnish all other feed, feed pan, water bucket, cleaning equipment, show equipment, and a tack box. It is highly recommended that a lock is provided for the tack box. See Livestock Health Requirements.

Purebred animals may be exhibited in Open Class, without entry fee, provided the entry blank is filed with the Open Class Superintendent of the respective department by the specified due date.

## **General Guidelines**

- 1. All project animals are to be in place by 8:00 p.m., **Tuesday**, **August 27**, **2024**, except Junior Fair Dairy animals, which must abide by Open Dairy check-in times.
- 2. Exhibits will be released Monday, September 2<sup>nd</sup>, time to be determined.
- 3. Exhibitors are to check in at the Junior Fair Office, except for Junior Fair Dairy exhibitors who should check-in at the Open Dairy Office. Current health papers must be stapled to the animal's pen immediately. (Check Livestock Health Requirements & Junior Fair Guidelines.)
- 4. Junior Fair Entry Sheets are due to the Canfield Fair Office by Tuesday, July 12th.
- 5. All livestock exhibitors are asked to help provide an attractive and educational display for the general public. Please keep your animals and area clean at all times.
- Junior Fair members must show their own project animal. Exceptions are noted in the Junior Fair Guidelines. For specific Junior Fair schedule and guidelines, see the Junior Fair Premium Book.
