4. Viewers' Choice will be awarded to one adult entry and one youth entry in each **section**, as merited by show officials.

5. Entry tag should list exhibitor's name, contact phone number, and entry name, including variety name (i.e. Mouse Ears Hosta, not just Hosta).

6. One entry per class per exhibitor except where noted.

7. Youth entries will be displayed and judged separately from adult entries.

- * Entries must be displayed in clean, see-through containers furnished by exhibitor.
- * There should be no leaves in water.
- * Unobtrusive wedging material may be used.

* Exhibitors may have more than one entry per class provided each entry is different type of plant (e.g *Class 300 - zinnia entry, marigold entry, salvia entry or <u>different</u> variety WITH variety name listed on entry).*

- Class 300 Annuals grown for bloom (enter the bloom)
- Class 301 Annuals grown for foliage (e.g. coleus)
- Class 302 Roses (may have multiple entries as long as each is different variety)
- <u>Class 303</u> Perennials grown for bloom <u>and must be blooming</u>, (e.g. daylily, coneflower, hibiscus); NOTE: daylily entry should have bloom and buds
- <u>Class 304</u> Perennials grown for foliage (e.g. single stem sedum or single leaf hosta)
- <u>Class 305</u> Corms, bulbs, tubers (1 stalk) (e.g: one stalk canna or gladiolus or dahlia, etc.)

<u>Class 306</u> Herbs (1 stalk or stem)
