- Exhibitors are strongly encouraged to use shavings in lieu of straw. Shavings will be sold during the fair.
- If your bedding pack exceeds ten inches, you will be docked points in herdsmanship.

All animals shown as purebred must exhibit registry papers. All breeds will follow the show standards set up by that breed.

All cattle must be entered and exhibited in owner's name.
