

# RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE NATRONA COUNTY FAIR ASSOCIATION

# 1. GENERAL RULES

- A. The Fair Board and the Fair Manager reserve the right to interpret these rules and regulations and to settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard thereto, arising out of and not covered by them. "Fairground" and "facility" means any lands, buildings, or structures under the control of the Board of Trustees of the Natrona County Fair Association.
- B. In the event of conflict of general and special rules, the latter will govern.
- C. As used in these Rules & Regulations, the term: "Fair" means and refers to the 2022 Central Wyoming Fair and Rodeo. In certain context, it may refer to a previous or future Central Wyoming Fair and Rodeo.
- "*Fair Board*" means the Board of Trustees of the Natrona County Fair Association.
- "Fair Manager" means the person who has been appointed to that position by the Fair Board.
- "*Fair Week*" means the time-period designated by the Fair Board for the Central Wyoming Fair.
- "Exhibitor's Handbook" means and refers to the book in which these "Open Class Rules and Regulations, Guidelines and Suggestions" are published.
- "Open Class" means and refers to an article submitted to the Fair for display-purposes-only or for judging in one of the 13 Departments described in this Open Class section of the Exhibitor's Handbook. "Open Class" excludes 4-H and FFA exhibits and entries.
- "Concessionaire" means a person, corporation, or organization of any type that has contracted with the Fair Board for concession space or the right to sell articles on the Fairgrounds.
- "*Exhibitor*" means and refers to the person submitting an Exhibit.
- "*Exhibit*" means and refers to an article submitted to the Fair for display-purposes-only in one of the Open Class Departments. Ribbons, merchandise prizes, cash, and other awards will not be made for articles submitted to the Fair for display-purposes-only.
- "Class" The term "Article" and "Exhibit" may be used interchangeably.
- "*Entry*" means and refers to an article submitted to the Fair for judging in one of the Open Class Departments.

"*Entrant*" means and refers to the person submitting an entry. An Entrant must be a permanent resident of the State of Wyoming (any county) at the time his or her Entry is submitted to the Fair.

"Superintendent" means and refers to the person in overall charge of the Open Class. The 2022 Open Class

Superintendents are Dee Dee Loomer and Diane Sanders. Please refer all questions, complaints, and protests to them. Mrs. Loomer and Mrs. Sanders may be reached through the Natrona County Fairgrounds office, 307-235-5775.

# 2. CONDUCT OF PERSONS ON FAIRGROUNDS

#### A. Parking Vehicle Admission

- (1) No vehicle shall be admitted on to the Fairgrounds unless the vehicle has a valid pass located in the windshield area of the vehicle and in full, clear view, during Fair Week.
- (2) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with the other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a police officer, no person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle:
  - (a) In fire lanes
  - (b) On the midway
  - (c) In any place which unduly interferes with the free movement of traffic or parking of other vehicles
  - (d) In any place where the Fair Board has prohibited, regulated or restricted parking for the welfare of the general public or for the proper use of the fairgrounds.

Any person violating these provisions is guilty of misdemeanor, the penalty for which is a fine not more than \$100.00, and shall be subject to removal and impoundment by the police or sheriff and the person violating these provisions shall pay the actual cost of such removal and impoundment. (See 31-5-502 W.S. 1977, as amended.)

- (3) The Fair Manager shall issue passes that permit a vehicle entry through designated gates during Fair Week. Passes are categorized as follows:
  - (a) Official Pass Entry through any gate. Parking privileges granted. (Board members)
  - (b) Midway Commercial & Grandstand Food Passes - Entry through the West gate. Parking privileges granted.
  - (c) Industrial Bldg. Commercial Exhibitors -Entry through the 13<sup>th</sup> Street gate. Parking

privileges granted.

- (d) 4-H & FFA Pass Entry through the 13<sup>th</sup> Street gate. Parking privileges granted. Drive thru to 4-H Area, including buyers for 4-H Livestock Sale and breakfast.
- (e) Rodeo Pass Entry through the West gate. Parking privileges granted.
- (f) Delivery Pass Entry permitted through West gate. No parking privilege granted except when parked to make an actual delivery.
- (g) Beer and program sellers gate admission and parking privilege through West gate.
- (4) The Fair Manager shall limit the number of passes available. No person has a right to a pass.
- (5) Those vehicles that do not have a pass as specified in subsection (3) above, shall enter the South Gate and park in the main parking lot when assigned if space is available. A charge for parking in the main parking lot shall be set by the Fair Board by minute action and the amount shall appear in the Premium Book.

#### B. Admission

- The charge for admission to the Fairgrounds during Fair Week shall be set by the Fair Board by minute action.
- (2) The charge for admission to the grandstand during Fair Week shall be set by the Fair Board by minute action.

#### See pages 10-11 for prices.

#### C. Alcohol

- No alcohol shall be brought on to the Fairgrounds unless prior authorization is obtained from the Fair Manager.
- (2) No person shall consume any alcohol while on the Fairgrounds unless such person is within the grandstand area, in the infield, or in an area designated by the Fair Board.

#### D. Offensive Conduct

- (1) No person shall possess, while on the Fairgrounds, or bring into the Fairgrounds, any guns, knifes - having a blade longer than three (3) inches, numb chucks, or any other lethal weapons – excepting only knives displayed on the premises for sale, and are sold in sealed packages - labeled "not to be opened on fairgrounds," or "for delivery off the fairgrounds premises."
- (2) No person shall engage in fighting, use of obscene and abusive language, or conduct himself or herself in a disorderly manner while on the Fairgrounds.
- (3) Ropes shall not be used except in the care of

livestock, as part of an exhibit or in direct competition.

- (4) ALL SOUND, SUCH AS ANY KIND OF MUSIC, BROADCASTING, DEMONSTRATION OF EQUIPMENT, OR VOCAL INVITATION TO SEE OR BUY, MUST BE CONTROLLED AND CREATE NO DISTURBANCE TO OTHERS. IF COMPLAINTS ARE MADE AND ARE VALID, BOOTH BUYER WILL BE ASKED TO LEAVE IMMEDIATELY.
- (5) DISSEMINATION OF INFORMATION AND MATERIAL.
  - (a) NO CONCESSIONAIRE, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF ANNOUNCERS IN THE GRANDSTAND AREA, WORKERS OF THE CARNIVAL AND HIRED ACTS FOR THE FREE STAGE SHALL USE ANY VOICE PROJECTION SOUND CONTROL DEVICE.
  - (b) DISTRIBUTION OF **ADVERTISING** MATERIAL OR MATTER OF ANY KIND. NATURE, OR DESCRIPTION, INCLUDING SPECIFICALLY, BUT NOT EXCLUSIVELY, political campaign cards, dodgers, flyers, political "newspapers," hand bills, buttons, pins, caps, banners, display cards, ribbons, or any and all other forms of media or political advertising of any political party or group by concessionaires, exhibitors, patrons attending annual exhibitions on the fairgrounds, political parties or by any other person or persons whomsoever, shall be, and the same here is. PROHIBITED on the fairgrounds unless such distribution shall be within and from the assigned and designated space as shall have been first duly authorized by the Fair Board upon application thereto.
  - (c) Advertising material or matter of any kind, nature, or description shall be on the counters or display areas in designated spaces and shall not be handed out unless a Fair patron requests such material.
  - (d) The distribution in any manner of advertising material having a gummed or adhesive backing such as labels, lapel badges, car bumper or window stickers, etc., whether such distribution shall be from a contracted or concession space or not, shall be prohibited upon the Fairgrounds. Persons or organizations found distributing such materials may immediately forfeit all space rights, and, in addition, may be held financially responsible for any and all damages done as a result of these materials being affixed to Fairground property.

- E. Animals
  - (1) No dogs, cats or other pets of any type whatsoever are permitted on the fairgrounds unless such animal is there for exhibit purposes or involved in lawful competition (except in case of a "seeing eye dog".)

#### F. Penalty (SEE STATUTES 6-6-301 THRU 6-6-307)

- (1) Any person violating the regularly adopted Rules and Regulations of the Fair Board of whose presence is otherwise prohibited by law may be subject to ejection from the fairgrounds and may forfeit any fees paid to the Central Wyoming Fair, upon refusal to leave peaceably upon request. (See 6-6-303 et seq., W.S. 1977, as amended.)
- (2) No person, acting alone or in concert with others, shall go into or upon facilities owned by or under the control of the Fair Board and obstruct or disrupt by force, violence, or other conduct which is in fact obstructive or disruptive, activities conducted therein or thereon or uses made thereof under the authority of the Fair Board. Obstructive or disruptive conduct includes restricting lawful:
  - (a) Freedom of movement on or within a facility.
  - (b) Designated use of a facility.
  - (c) Ingress or egress on or within a facility (See 6-3-01 thru 6-6-307 et seq., W.S.1977, as amended.)
- (3) No person within or upon facilities of the Fair Board shall refuse to desist from a course of conduct or to remove himself from the facilities upon request by an authorized representative of the Fair Board after having been notified that the conduct or presence of the person is contrary to or in violation of established policies, rules or regulations of the Fair Board and incident to the maintenance or orderly and efficient purposes for which acquired or designed. (See 6-6-306 et seq. W.S. 1977, as amended.)
- (4) Any person(s) violating paragraph 2 or 3 above is guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$750 or by imprisonment in the county jail for a period not to exceed sixty (60) days, or both. (See 6-6-305 **PENALTY PHASE** et seq. W.S. 1977, as amended.)
- (5) County Laws and fines will be adhered to while present on Fairgrounds.

## 3. EXHIBIT RULES

#### A. General

- (1) Competition is open to Wyoming residents only.
- (2) Any articles that have won prizes at the Central Wyoming Fair should be for display-purposes-

only, but shall not be submitted to the 2022 Fair for judging.

- (3) Articles exhibited in any department must be the work of the exhibitor. Exhibitors entering borrowed or purchased articles, as their own handiwork will forfeit all rights to participate. Articles copied from works of others must be so identified, and the name of the creator and title of the original work must be submitted with the article. FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THIS REGULATION WILL BE CONSIDERED AN ATTEMPT TO DEFRAUD AND SHALL BE REASON SUFFICIENT TO PERMANENTLY EXCLUDE THE GUILTY PARTY FROM THE USE OF THIS EXHIBITION. THIS RULE APPLIES TO ALL.
- (4) The Fair Board shall establish entry fees each year by minute action. The amount of the entry fee for the current year shall appear in the prize book for the current year.
- (5) All entry fees shall be paid in cash, by cashier's check, by certified check or money order. Any check returned by the bank for any reason shall result in automatic cancellation of eligibility.
- (6) All exhibits entered in competition are subject to all Fair Rules and Regulations. Specific rules for each class shall be listed under the class heading in the prize book. All exhibits within a class shall be subject to the specific rules for that class published in the prize book.
- (7) Should any individual enter an animal or exhibit in a name other than that of the bona fide owner, or attempt to perpetrate a fraud by misrepresentation of any fact, the entry thus made shall not be allowed to compete for or receive any prize, and stall or pen fees shall be forfeited.
- (8) Except where specifically provided by these rules or specific rules no exhibit or animal shall be accepted for judging that has been entered in a previous Central Wyoming Fair.
- (9) If any exhibitor attempts to interfere with the judges in the performance of their duties, by letter, act, or otherwise, he or she will be excused from the competition and will forfeit all prizes and ribbons awarded to them.
- (10) Any exhibit or animal, which has been erroneously entered, may, at the discretion of the Manager or Supervisor, be transferred to the proper class previous to the judging. If such classes have been judged, they shall not be rejudged.
- (11) Any exhibit removed before official deadline without permission from the Manager or Supervisors, disqualifies that exhibitor for any

prize and may disqualify that contestant's future showing privileges.

- (12) No person other than those in the Fair Organization shall be allowed to see entries or have access to the entry books until such time, as the entries have been closed.
- (13) The fair board shall not be responsible for any loss or damage which may occur to stock or exhibits on the fairgrounds.
- (14) The Manager, Supervisors, and Superintendents reserve the right to reject unworthy entries of any nature by refusing them exhibit space.
- (15) Exhibitors in departments where coupon entry tags are used shall present coupons to the Superintendent of the department for the return of their goods.
- (16) Entries and Exhibits, which have not been picked up by 8:00 pm on July 19, 2022, may be picked up at the Fair office during normal office hours until 3:00 pm on July 29, 2022 after which they will be disposed of in a manner to be determined in the sole discretion of the Manager, Central Wyoming Fair and Rodeo. If you cannot pickup your Entry or Exhibit during the times listed above, please make other arrangements with the Manager, Central Wyoming Fair and Rodeo before 3:00 pm on July 29, 2022.
- (17) If an exhibitor does not have his exhibit in place according to department rules, his reservation will be cancelled, unless special request has been received and approved by the Management.
- (18) Exhibitors may enter more than one item per Class.
- (19) All group entries shall be entered individually as well as collectively.
- (20) After exhibitors have been provided with exhibition space, should there still be available pens, stalls or display space, they may be rented by owners of stock, machinery or commercial commodities for sale purposes, rental to be fixed by the Manager, provided the approval and sanction of the Fair Board has been obtained.
- (21) <u>DEFINITIONS</u> (Categorizing classification of entrants in these classes is an effort to make it fair for everyone entering. We rely on you to determine your classification based on the following definitions.)
  - (a) PROFESSIONAL (Division 1) means and refers to the group of Entrants ("Professionals") who—during each of the five calendar years prior to 2022 —derived 10 percent or more of their gross income from selling goods or services (including

teaching) which were closely related to the subject matter of any Class in a Department. [An Entrant who would be a Professional in one Department almost certainly would not be a Professional in most other Departments.]

- (b) ADULT (Division 2) refers to those who have not previously won prizes and do not derive income directly from visual art. The Open Class generally does this for pleasure and has had little or no training. "One who engages in a pursuit, study, science or sport as a pastime rather than as a profession...suggest[ing] not so much lack of skill but avoidance of direct remuneration."
- (c) SENIOR CITIZENS (Division 3) means and refers to the group of Entrants (Senior's) who are 62 years of age or older at the time their Entries are submitted to the Fair. A Senior who also is a Professional may enter the Professional Division in the Department(s) for which he or she is a Professional. Α Senior may enter the Open Division in any Department. A Senior who also is a Person with a Disability may enter the Handicapped Division. A Senior, for the purpose of exhibits, shall be any person 62 years of age or older, who does not now and has not in the past owned, operated, conducted, taught in or been employed by any shop, studio, or business and who is not and has not been at any time financially involved in any phase or form of business commercially for profit. MAY NOT ENTER ANY OTHER CLASSES.

3. Juniors	Grades 6-8
4. Seniors	Grades 9-12

Youth Classes are listed separately in all Departments. If not listed separately, YOUTH and prizes will correspond as listed in specific Departments. Entry Tags must be marked "YOUTH."

(d) HANDICAPPED – means and refers to the group of entrants ("Persons with a Disability") who have an impaired physical and/or mental ability to perform all of the work required in order to submit an article to the Fair for judging in one or more of the Open Class Departments. ("Impairment"). For the purpose of this Fair, shall be a person who is legally handicapped with such physical or mental disability as to hinder or would be at a disadvantage in the completion of an item. . Each article submitted to the Fair for judging must be the work of the Entrant. However, Persons with a Disability who enter Handicapped may receive reasonable assistance from others to help compensate for their Impairment. MAY NOT ENTER ANY OTHER CLASSES.

(21) ENTRY TAG means and refers to the tag (furnished by the Fair) that is to be completed by the Entrant (or by his or her representative) and securely attached to each Entry. Entry Tags may be obtained from the Natrona County Fairgrounds office before the opening of the Fair or from a Fair employee when and where the Entry is submitted to the Fair. [Entrants are encouraged to obtain their Entry Tags early, and to complete them at home: The yellow copy is retained by the Entrant, and the white and buff copies are kept by the Fair.

- (22) Entrants may submit their Entries via the U.S. Postal Service, United Parcel Service, Federal Express or by other carriers provided that these Entries are received 24 hours before judging begins for the Department in which the Entries are made and ALL transportation charges must be PRE-PAID; otherwise the exhibit will be refused. These Entries must include correctly completed Entry Tags. If articles are to be returned by parcel post or UPS, they will be sent C.O.D. No checks, stamps, or cash will be accepted for the purpose of returned articles.
- (23) If there is a TIE in SWEEPSTAKES or JUDGE'S CHOICE RIBBONS, both will receive a ribbon and, if money is awarded, the money will be divided among the winners.
- (24) Entrants may enter any Division for which they are qualified. However, in any one Department, all Entries must be in the same one Division. For example, if qualified, an Entrant may enter the Handicapped Division in the Floriculture Department and the Adult Division in the Needlecraft Department, but he or she may not enter both the Handicapped and the Adult Divisions in the Floriculture Department.

## 4. JUDGING OF FAIR EVENTS / OPEN CLASS

A. Exhibits in the Exhibit Hall shall be judged on the

days and times as posted in the prize list.

- B. The judges shall report to the Central Exhibit Office before entering upon and completing their duties.
- C. A judge shall not be permitted to serve in a class in which he may be competing for a prize, or have any ownership of any animal or article entered in such class.
- D. Judges shall not award prizes to unworthy exhibits. It is the intention of Fair Board that no prizes are offered any animal or exhibit, which is non-deserving. This rule shall be strictly adhered to whether there be competition or not—first, second, third, or no prize, according to the merit of the exhibit.
- E. Judges shall not make any award other than those specified in the prize list, without the written consent of the Fair Manager.
- F. Judges shall report to the Superintendent and exhibitor or exhibitors who in any way, whether in person or by agent, interferes with them during their work, or shows any disrespect to them. The Superintendent shall, at his discretion, demand the exhibitor to withdraw from the competition. Due to space limitations, judging in all departments is closed to Entrants and to the general public except as expressly noted under the various Department headings. NO OPEN JUDGING IN ANY DEPARTMENT. JUDGES OPEN TO QUESTIONS FOR ONE HOUR AFTER JUDGING IS COMPLETED IN MOST DEPARTMENTS, AT DISCRETION OF JUDGES.
- G. The judges shall take special care after making the awards to see that the same are properly entered in the award books, and when so done, shall sign each award sheet in the space provided.
- H. All judges' books shall be returned to the General Superintendent's office immediately after the judging is completed.
- I. THE JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL.

# 5. PRIZES FOR FAIR EVENTS / OPEN CLASS

- A. The Fair Board shall establish the amount of prize money each year by minute action. The prize money available for the current year shall appear in the prize book for the current year.
- B. In classes, which there is no competition (only one exhibitor) only one cash prize shall be awarded. No exhibitor is entitled to receive cash awards in more than three such classes.
- C. Prizes shall be paid in cash at the fairgrounds under seating area in the Grand Stand on Friday - July 15, Saturday - July 16, from 10:00 AM to 6:00 PM and on Monday - July 18 after the close of the fair week from 3:00 PM to 8:00 PM any prize money under \$3.00 unclaimed after the cash payoff will be forfeited. Certain awards are made by the Fair and others are made by third parties. Individuals, organizations, and businesses are encouraged to contribute awards of cash and/or merchandise.

Please contact the Central Wyoming Fairgrounds office at (307) 235-5775 before November 1, 2022 to make an award for next year.

- D. No checks will be written for an amount under \$3.00. Checks for prize money not collected, \$3.00 and over, will be mailed by November 1<sup>st</sup> of the current year.
- E. PAYMENT WINDOW FOR CASH PAYMENT OF PRIZES SHALL BE FROM THE INSIDE GRANDSTAND TICKET WINDOW.
- F. Errors in cash awards must be brought to the attention of the Superintendent before 8:00 pm on Monday July 18, 2022. Please check your records carefully; the Fair wants every Entrant to receive all of the awards that they have earned. (For cash prizes only.)
- G. Checks will be mailed on or before November 1, 2022 to Entrants who do not pick up their cash awards prior to 8:00 pm on July 18 except that no checks will be written for less than \$3.00—these "small amount awards" will be forfeited. All checks must be cashed by December 31 of the year in which issued. Checks presented after this time shall not be honored. Checks cashed after December 31, 2022 will not be honored.
- H. The Fair Board does not guarantee the payment of special prizes offered in the Prize Book by merchants or private parties. Those prizes are usually secured by the Fair Board with a promissory statement signed by the donor and are accepted by the Fair Board in good faith and must be contested for under those conditions.
- I. In the event of any conflict between these general Rules and Regulations, Guidelines and Suggestions and the <u>more specific</u> Rules and Regulations, Guidelines and Suggestions set forth under the various Department headings, those under the various Department headings shall govern and control. Should you have any problems with interpretation, please consult the Superintendent.
- J. Color or awards shall be as follows: 4-H/FFA only:

# 6. PROTESTS/OPEN CLASS

- A. The Fair Board will consider it a great favor if visitors will report any mistreatment or extortion by any Fair employee or concessionaire. Do not wait until the Fair is over to file a complaint. Do it immediately.
- B. Protests pertaining to eligibility shall be submitted in writing at least eighteen (18) hours prior to the beginning of the judging. Protests for any alteration or tampering must be submitted in writing immediately at the conclusion of the class judging. All protests shall be accompanied by \$100.00 cash or certified check (refundable if protest is sustained). Three unrelated individuals who have specific knowledge of the facts and are willing to appear at an official inquiry shall sign the protest. Such protests must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal and be delivered to the Fair Manager within the time period stated.
  - Depending on the basis of the protest, interested parties may be duly notified and given the opportunity to submit evidence.
  - (2) The decision may be withheld until complete investigation is made.
  - (3) An appeal of the decision shall take the form of a formal complaint as provided for in Section VII and thereafter the Rules of Practice and Procedure for Contested Case Hearings shall govern.
- C. All other protests shall be made to the Superintendent of the department the exhibit is entered in or if there is no Superintendent, then to the appropriate Supervisor.
- D. No form, of informal complaint is prescribed, but in substance, it must contain a clear and concise statement of all of the facts involved, the name and address of the complainant, the name of the party against which complaint is made and a request for the relief sought.
- E. In the event of failure to bring about satisfaction of the complaint in this manner, the complainant may proceed under Section VII, Rules of Practice and Procedure for Contested Case Hearings.
- F. No complaint or appeal that judges overlooked an entry shall be considered.
- G. Judging procedures shall not be interrupted for protest investigation.

## 8. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS

- A. General Statement of Policy
  - The Fair Board may provide for a carnival, rodeo, entertainment, parade, security, first aid, fire protection and the like directly or by contract with

an independent contractor. All rights, duties, liabilities shall be governed by contract, resolution of the Fair Board and all rules promulgated by the Fair Board.

(2) At all times the Natrona County Sheriff's Office shall be the chief of security and all other law enforcement agencies and private security agencies are under his jurisdiction.

# 10. WYOMING ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS ANIMAL CARE & WELFARE POLICY STATEMENT

The Wyoming Association of Fairs recognizes that an integral part of good animal husbandry practices includes comfort and sanitation, which will benefit both producers and consumers. These practices will improve efficiency and profitability for the producer and provide a healthy, wholesome product to the consumer at a reasonable price.

The Wyoming Association of Fairs firmly believes animals are a vital part of human existence and deserve our protection and compassion. Humans have an inseparable relationship with all parts of the natural world. Furthermore, humanity is answerable to another set of laws and concepts that is uniquely a product of human society. Animals cannot be subject to those laws and concepts and therefore do not have the rights of humans.

Man is responsible for providing adequate food, water, and shelter for animals. Management practices must be a nature to promote health, reduce stress, and protect the animal from unnecessary injury and pain. The Wyoming Association of Fairs endorses animal control procedures including neutering and responsible ownership to prevent uncontrolled population expansion. Practices utilized to prevent injury to other animals and humans or to promote good health or improve production efficiency are necessary to prevent pain and suffering and are a vital part of proven animal management.

The Wyoming Association of Fairs represents a coalition of individuals who support prudent and humane use of animals for food, clothing, enjoyment, and biomedical research. Carefully controlled use of such animals contributes greatly to improving the health and welfare of both humans and animals.

The Wyoming Association of Fairs recognizes that, in our modern industrial society, animals must be transported for marketing, slaughter, pasture, breeding, show, and enjoyment purposes. The Wyoming Association of Fairs supports humane transportation and handling of animals. This includes contact with hazing devices and appropriate facilities for processing and loading animals to avoid stress.

The Association supports permanent animal identification to establish rightful ownership, avoid theft and to track and recognize diseased and/or contaminated animals.

All animals use other animals for their existence. The responsible human use of animals is natural and appropriate.

The Wyoming Association of Fairs adopted this policy statement on January 27, 1994. We believe this to be a true, honest statement of our feeling on Animal Care.

## **11.ORGANIZATION**

#### A. Fair Board:

The board consists of five members appointed by the Board of County Commissioners, Natrona County, Wyoming. The ultimate responsibility for the Fair rests with the Fair Board. The Fair Board shall control, maintain and manage the Fairgrounds and conduct agricultural, industrial and other fairs and exhibitions, and expend monies from the County Fair fund for the purposes specified. Each member is placed in charge of one of five areas of responsibility as set out below:

- (1) Rodeo and Entertainment
- (2) Carnival and Concessions
- (3) Parking and Admissions
- (4) Maintenance and Security
- (5) 4-H, Youth Exhibits and Open Exhibits

#### B. Fair Manager:

The Manager for the Fair Board has the overall authority of the management of the Fair.

#### C. Supervisors:

The County Agricultural Extension Agent shall act as supervisor in charge of all 4-H Youth Exhibits. The Fair Board shall appoint a supervisor to be in charge of all open class exhibits.

#### D. Superintendents:

- (1) There shall be two types of Superintendents: A 4-H Youth Educator and an Open Class Superintendents. All Superintendents will be under the jurisdiction of the supervisors and will be governed at all times during the Fair by requirements to fully insure smooth functioning of all departments.
- (2) The superintendent will have charge of all assistants in his department and shall at the close of the Fair file with the Supervisor a full summary of their work with recommendations.
- (3) It shall be the duty of each Superintendent to inform the judges of his department of the rules and regulations governing awards and to urge them to read carefully the rules before entering

their work.

- (4) Each Superintendent is charged with caring for and posting the judge's books of his department. He must see that all awards are duly and properly listed therein, as it is only upon this record that the prizes can be paid. The Judge and the Superintendent of the department immediately after the judging must sign each sheet.
- (5) The Superintendent in charge must check the entries shown in the award of his department, so that it will show what articles or animals were passed upon by the judges.
- (6) Where awards are made in purebred livestock, the Superintendent in charge must see that the name, registry number, etc., of the animals awarded prizes are noted in the Award Book.
- (7) The superintendents will check and furnish the Supervisors with a list of Exhibitors and entries and furnish the Supervisors with a list of Exhibitors and entries in his department.
- (8) The Superintendents of each division will have charge

of the stalls or display spaces in his department. Rearrangement of stalls and spaces will be under his supervision.

# **12. THE PRESS**

The working members of the press are most cordially invited to attend the Central Wyoming Fair and Night Rodeo and are requested to report to the Manager of the Fair at once upon their arrival. The press will be provided with every facility for obtaining the reports of judges' awards, daily programs, special orders and announcements, official decisions, and all fair matters of interest or value to the public.



# RULES

**NOTE:** Entries for Floriculture Products will be accepted from 7:30 AM until the 12:00 (noon) deadline on Monday, July 11, 2022

1. Replacement of flowers will be allowed after all flowers have been judged and they must be at the fairgrounds between 7 AM and 10:30 AM

The Superintendent shall have the right to refuse entry of plants or cut flowers which have been grown in a professional or commercial greenhouse, or when determined it has not been cared for by the exhibitor for a length of time. Potted plants must be in the possession of the exhibitor for at least 90 days prior to changing, and need continuous care; therefore, potted plants are not barred from re-entry if they have been previously exhibited at the Central Wyoming Fair.

Entries in this Department are open to anyone except for a commercial grower or a member of their immediate family.

There are no entry fees, and reasonable care will be given containers, but in no case will the Fair be responsible for loss or damage. Containers need not be expensive. Fair officials will not be responsible for breakage or loss of any containers or accessories.

All flowers must be grown by exhibitor, and as nearly as possible be ready to exhibit when brought in; however, there will be a work table provided to finish arrangements. The exhibitor must arrange flowers. Cut flowers must be shown with foliage, or naturally attached to specimen. Remove leaves that would be under water. No leaf dressing of any kind is acceptable.

All flowers will be judged for freshness, cleanliness, and arrangement. Containers will be furnished by the Fair in Class 1 **OR** containers supplied by the exhibitor must be clean, undecorated, clear glass of appropriate size for the specimen.

The Superintendent reserves the right to remove the exhibits or parts of exhibits, which have become unsightly.

Superintendent shall have full authority in arrangement.

Only the designated number of stems is permitted or entry will be disqualified.

#### Exhibitors may enter more than one item per Class.

Articles will be awarded first, second, third or no prize, according to individual merit.

#### THE JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL.

Prize payment schedule is on page 8.

Exhibitors may pick up their exhibits from the Department Superintendent on Monday, July 18 between 3 PM - 8 PM Exhibitor or authorized person should present the claim ticket portion of the entry tag to obtain release of exhibits and prize checks. Lacking such claim ticket, person picking up items will be asked to sign the slips retained by the Superintendent of the Department. Exhibits left in the building with no instructions for return will be held at Central Wyoming Fair Office until picked up by the exhibitor, but no longer than **July 29**.

#### NO OPEN JUDGING IN ANY DEPARTMENT.

**IMPORTANT INSTRUCTION TO EXHIBITORS:** Select flowers that are coming into full bloom - Not flowers that are already in full bloom.

If a flower is to remain fresh throughout the exhibit period, it must be cut no later than the day before it is to be exhibited. It is generally recognized that afternoon - especially cutting in late afternoon, when the greatest amount of sugar has ascended into the leaves and blooms - as well as a "hardening off" process will help insure a winning entry.

Flower stems should be cut cleanly at an angle with a sharp knife or pruning shears and plunged into deep, hot water: 110 degrees Fahrenheit is ideal. It is a good practice to carry a bucket of water to the garden and to place each cut specimen in the water at once.

Following cutting and hot water treatment, specimens should be placed in a cool, darkened room. After several hours, when the water has come to room temperature, add ice to the water and leave the flower material undisturbed overnight. Flowers prepared in this way improve their substance and will hold their freshness longer.

NOTE: For special awards in artistic arrangements, be sure to relate your materials and designs to the overall theme.

- DEFINITIONS
- Bloom: One individual flower
- **Collection:** A group of specimens, minimum of 5, judged for cultural perfection.
- **Display:** An exhibit of plant material grown for horticultural perfection, staged in an artistic manner.
- Scape: A bare, leafless flower stem, arising from the

ground. Example: Daylily.

- **Spike:** A lengthened flower cluster, in which flowers are practically stem-less. Example: Gladiolus, Snapdragon.
- **Spray:** A group of florets on a branched stem, each on its own stalk.
- **Stalk:** The stem or axis of a plant, especially a non-woody one.
- **Stem:** The major supporting structure in plants, to which buds, leaves, and flowers are attached at regular intervals at points called nodes.

# RULES FOR CANNING

The following guidelines must be followed to insure proper food preservation methods that then insure proper food safety.

All foods entered must be the product of August 2021 through the present date.

All canned fruits, vegetables, meats, pickled products and jelly products must be prepared following the recipes and procedures, including the proper adjustments for altitude, from one of the following approved sources:

#### PPROVED FOOD PRESERVATION SOURCES:

Ball Blue Book Guide to Preserving, 37th edition - 2020 all Complete Book of Home Preserving- 2020 edition Ball Canning Back to Basics- 2017 The All-New Ball Book of Canning and Preserving-2016 So Easy to Preserve, 6th edition - 2020 Complete Guide to Home Canning, USDA revised 2015 Preserving Food in Wyoming - 2018 Preserving Food in Wyoming- Meats- 2011 and other up-to date Extension publications

Canning directions and recipes dated prior to 1994 should not be used. Mass media and blog recipes, unless from Extension or other approved sources, should not be used.

•All canned foods must be exhibited in clear standard Mason jars, either quarts or pints.

•No colored jars can be used.

•Jelly and fruit spread products must be exhibited in regulation 1/2 pint or pint jelly jars that are sealed without paraffin.

•Two-piece metal canning lids (flat lid and band) must be used on all jars.

•Jars must be exhibited with the canning rings on. •All jars, lids and screw bands must be clean and free of any residue or rust. Any jars showing leaks and/or spoilage will not be judged and will be disqualified.

All canned foods MUST be labeled by attaching a Food Preservation label to the side of the jar with the following information:

### 1. Name of Product

2. Process Method-Boiling Water or Pressure (circle

process used)

- 3. Processing Time
- 4. Altitude Processed at
- 5. Pounds Pressure; Dial Gauge or Weighted Gauge (circle type of gauge used)
- 6. Style of Pack-Raw or Hot (circle style used)
- 7. Date Processed
- 8. Source of recipe & page number of recipe
- 9. Attach copy of recipe to the label and entry tag

If Food Preservation label is not attached to a jar, that jar will be disqualified from judging.

Jellies, jams, preserves, marmalades, conserves, syrups and butters may be opened and tasted during judging. Dried foods can be opened and tasted. Due to potential hazards of food-borne illness, judges WILL NOT open any other canned food entries including canned fruit, tomatoes and tomato products, canned vegetables, canned meat, pickles and relishes or condiments.

#### OPEN CLASS FOOD PRESERVATION DIVISIONS AND CLASSES

In Open Class divisions exhibits entered in any one class will be placed according to individual merit within the group based on the American System of Judging. Only one Blue Ribbon (first place), one Red Ribbon (second place) and White Ribbon (third place) can be awarded per class. Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons will be awarded where exhibit merit is warranted.
