

CA Letter From Trevor



Grand Valley State University Research on The National Cherry Festival

The National Cherry Festival (NCF) conducted a two year study to learn more about the NCF General Visitor (GV) and their experience at the NCF and in Traverse City. In 2014, benchmark data was received regarding their experience. Data gathered in 2015 further evaluated the reliability of 2014 findings, the consistency in the delivery of the visitor experience, and the impact of operational changes made by NCF from 2014 to 2015.











RESEARCH OBJECTIVES: Specifically, at the end of the 2015 study, NCF would learn...

- 1. A demographic and geographic profile of visitors.
- 2. Visitor travel behaviors.
- 3. The importance placed on visitor attributes/experience.
- 4. The satisfaction placed on visitor experiences.
- 5. The differences between local and out of town visitors.
- 6. Visitor spending patterns at the NCF and in TC during the festival.
- 7. The differences between first time and returning visitors.
- 8. Existing differences between types of visitors and festival satisfaction. (age, gender, length of visit, family status, etc.)











METHODOLOGY

In both 2014 and 2015, the sample population included emails generated each day at the festival gathered through research volunteers greeting guests, and asking for an email address to forward a survey link via Survey Monkey to them. In 2015, an incentive of a NCF water bottle was given for each individual participating. Email addresses were transferred to an Excel document from the hand written emails provided. Each individual wrote his/her own email address, indicating their voluntary participation in the survey research. Subsequently, email addresses obtained from the Festival of Races, Bayside Concert Series, and NCF Ambassadors were also asked about their festival experience. Each was emailed a letter from Trevor Tkach with a link to a corresponding Survey Monkey questionnaire on two occasions. They were emailed the first request approximately one week after the festival experience, and the second request to non-respondents was sent approximately another week after the first request. Respondents were asked questions regarding their festival experience, travel behaviors, and demographic/geographic background, and if applicable, about their own festival experience (as a visitor).

When asked "what type of influence did the NCF have on your perception of the Traverse City area", respondents indicated a positive increase of 11% over 2014 findings. Listening Jour Results

After the 2015 celebration, The National Cherry
Festival conducted a listening tour to get feedback
from the community on how the Festival was received.

Festival officials heard attendees thoughts about how the 89th annual event went and what they'd like to see at the 90-year celebration.

Tour dates were September 16 and September 30 and took place at Central High School and Central Elementary.

Some great discussions were had over various aspects of the Festival, but one topic came up repeatedly and that was to bring back the Heritage Parade.

Now, we've begun working on a grand celebration filled with cherries and tradition – all part of the 90th National Cherry Festival in 2016.

The National Cherry Festival is attended annually by about a half million people. In 2015 we were able to share our love of cherries with countless folks coming to Traverse City to enjoy the festivities by way of a NATIONAL PURE MICHIGAN SOCIAL MEDIA partnership and initiatives and through DOZENS OF NATIONAL BLOGGERS. Millions were exposed to the Festival by being included in hundreds of media features, from print to digital; radio to television throughout the Country. EVERY DAY WITH RACHEL RAY again featured the Festival and the health benefits associated with cherries. And the Festival was included in MIDWEST LIVING MAGAZINE'S 'BEST OF THE MIDWEST'. In addition, the National Cherry Festival was also featured in PEOPLE MAGAZINE in two weekly editions this year. One issue featured MARIO BATALLI showing some love for the National Cherry Festival.


