NO

EXCEPTIONS. The Chowchilla Fair suggests submitting your entries early to avoid any unforeseen incidents.

* LOCAL RULES *

Entry Deadlines: Entry forms are being accepted online or in the Main Office of the Fairgrounds for Departments 1 -4. Departments 5 - 25 must be submitted online. Horse entries close on Friday, March 18, 2022 at 11:59pm.

Large Market Animal entries close Friday, April 1st at 11:59pm

All other entries close on Friday, April 15, 2022 at 11:59pm.

Late Showmanship entries will be accepted until Sunday, May 1st at 11:59pm online only, for a \$25 fee. We strongly encourage exhibitors to submit their entry forms prior to this date.

If mailing entry forms the form along with fees, must be postmarked by the closing date. No late entries will be accepted.

Checks: If paying for passes, entry fees, etc. by check, please include a phone number on the check and the exhibitor's name in the memo line.

Return checks: There will be a \$25.00 fee on checks returned by the bank. Redemption of returned checks must be made by cash or money order. If an exhibitor has an outstanding balance, owed to the Chowchilla Madera County Fair, they will not be allowed to exhibit.

Credit Cards: There will be a 3% charge on all credit card charges.

Replacement Checks: There will be a \$50 fee for replacement of a lost or damaged premium/auction check. Request for a replacement check must be made in writing and should include exhibitors name, as much additional information as possible (check number, check amount, etc.), and must be signed by the exhibitor and parent/guardian if under the age of 18.

Receiving of Still Entries: Check the Still Exhibit Schedule for dates, times and locations.

Leader/Advisor Signature Procedure: Due to the online 2 entry program our process to obtain 4-H leader and FFA advisor signatures is as follows: after entry closing date a list of all (livestock and non livestock) entries for each club and chapter will be emailed to the 4-H Community Leader/FFA Advisor. There will be a one page sheet for the leader/advisor to certify that all entries are valid projects and eligible to exhibit at the 2022 Chowchilla-Madera County Fair. This signed sheet MUST be mailed, faxed, or emailed back to the fair by Wednesday, May 4th.

Exhibitor Handbook: All departments are grouped together (i.e. Adult, Open Jr., 4-H, etc.). There is a Special Competition section, which is open, unless specified, to all exhibitors regardless of age or organization.

Any Other: Fair Management reserves the right to create classes from an "Any Other" class when a specific varieties' entries are in excess of five (5). These changes will be noted & adjustments will be made for the 2023 show. These procedures are intended to maintain industry standards and accommodate changing trends and varieties.

Responsibility: The responsibility for proper entry of exhibits rests with the exhibitor.

<u>Sweepstakes:</u> Awarded under specified divisions, based on the following scoring guidelines: 1 st place = 5 points; 2 nd place = 3 points; & 3 rd place = 1 point. Top three placing exhibitors will receive sweepstake monies.

<u>Judging:</u> The judges' decision is <u>final</u>. Divisions & classes are specified as to which judging system is used to place the entries. They can be judged in two ways:

American System is the judging process that ranks exhibits against one another and awards only one (1) first, one (1) second. etc.

Danish System is the judging process to compare each exhibit on its own merit against the scorecard or recognized standards and awards as many first placing, etc. as merited.

Best of Show/Outstanding Awards: The judge chooses the best or most outstanding entry to receive this award.

<u>Amateur:</u> A person who engages in an event or activity as a pastime rather than a profession. (Does not apply to junior organizations or horse shows).

<u>Professional:</u> A person who engages in an event or activity as livelihood rather than as a hobby.

<u>Placing:</u> Placement of Ribbons *does not* guarantee correct placing in judging. Only the official placing on the judging sheet constitutes the final placement.

Where there is only one (1) exhibitor in a class, the first prize, if any merited, will be awarded so far as there are worthy entries. Where entries are not worthy of first prize, judges may, at their discretion, award a prize or prizes of such grade as the animal or entries deserve.

<u>Pets:</u> No dogs or pets will be allowed on the fairgrounds, except service animals and those that have been entered as an exhibit.

<u>Applicable:</u> All rules, state & local, apply to exhibitors, parents, leaders, participants, etc. whether or not he/she has read them.

Exhibit Duration: All exhibits must stay in place for the duration of the fair, unless otherwise stated in the Exhibitor's Handbook.

<u>Eligibility:</u> Open to all residents, students and 4-H Club Members of Madera, Merced, and Mariposa Counties and extended areas which include Sierra Joint Union & Firebaugh/Las Deltas School Districts unless specified otherwise in department/division rules.

<u>Vehicles:</u> No vehicles are allowed on grounds that do not have the proper credentials. Vehicles found on grounds without proper credentials will be subject to towing. **NO EXPCEPTIONS!**

Exhibits: Any exhibits in the opinion of the judge(s) or Fair management not deemed worthy or are inappropriate may not be judged or displayed.

<u>Awards:</u> All premium checks must be cashed within 90 days of issuance. Checks will not be mailed, it is the responsibility of the exhibitor to pick-up their premium/awards.

<u>Changes:</u> The Fair, board members, and management reserve the right to change anything regarding departments, etc. as they see fit.

<u>State Rules:</u> State rules for CA Fairs for judging as prescribed by the Division of Fairs & Expositions are published online at: <u>www.cdfa.ca.gov/fe</u>. State rules apply to all entries of this Fair & are incorporated in here by reference.

Fair's Liability: All entries are entered at the exhibitor's own risk. The Fair Management shall not be responsible for accidents or losses that may occur to any of the exhibitors or participants or exhibits at the show, & all persons, exhibitors or participants exhibiting in or participating in Fair sponsored activities, including families and/or guardians for all of the above, agree to indemnify the State of California, The Chowchilla-Madera County Fair (CMCF), Madera County, their officers, board members, agents, employees & volunteers harmless from any and all claims, liabilities, losses, costs, damages, & attorneys' fees arising out of the willful acts or omissions of the officers, board members, agents, employees, or volunteers of the Fair. The exhibitors shall hold the management harmless & indemnify against any legal proceedings arising from any accidents or loss. All entries are accepted with the under-standing that the State of California, The CMCF, Madera County, & their officers, board members, agents. employees & volunteers shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage that shall arise to any entry, exhibitor, family/guardians, or equipment on exhibit. Each exhibitor & family/ guardians shall be solely responsible for any loss of damage done to another, or occasioned by or arising from any animal or article exhibited by him/ her, & will indemnify the State of California, The Chowchilla Madera County Fair, Madera County, their officers, board members, agents, employees & volunteers against all legal proceedings there to. The Chowchilla-Madera County Fair & its affiliates assume no liability or responsibility not herein expressed.

The two approved methods of canning are: boiling-water canning for high-acid foods, steam-pressure canning for low-acid foods. An appropriate amount of headspace for the product canned should be allowed. Leave 1/4-inch headspace for soft spreads and pickled foods (except sauerkraut); ½-inch headspace for fruits, tomatoes and sauerkraut; 1-inch headspace for vegetables. Product pieces should be uniform in size and packed snugly but allow for circulation of liquids. Liquids should cover the product, keeping within the headspace guidelines. Liquids should be clear and free from cloudiness and small particles.







Any Club/Chapter/Independent Exhibitor who fails to enter the competition and deliver a finished project will be fined \$100.00. The fine is to be paid by the conclusion of the 2022 Chowchilla-Madera County Fair. Any fines not paid by the conclusion of the fair will result in that Club/Chapter/Independent Exhibitors ineligibility to participate in the 2023 Fair. NO EXCEPTIONS

What's Happening in Livestock!!!!

NEW THIS YEAR:

2022 Chowchilla Fair Livestock Auction Check Release Policy: There will be one auction check issued that will include the proceeds from the sale and any bumps received. **There will be no resale checks issued.** Checks will be mailed beginning 45 days after the end of the Fair, on June 30, 2022. Checks will not be mailed until the buyer has paid in full. Checks will be mailed to the address listed when registering on Blue Ribbon.

All checks must be cashed within six (6) months of the issue date. If a reissue is required, there will be a \$50.00 fee per check deducted. All reissue requests must be made in writing and must include the exhibitor's name, as much information regarding the check as possible (check number, amount, etc.) and signed by the exhibitor and parent/guardian if under the age of 18. The Fair Board of Directors encourages exhibitors to send Thank You notes to all buyers and bump bid supporters.

Entry Requirements:

Hogs: Ear notches must be submitted with entry. Market hogs must be tagged prior to entering the grounds on Monday, May 16th. Tags will be available for pick-up by leaders/advisors May 09, 2022 - May 15, 2022.

Goats and Sheep: Scrapie tag must be submitted with entry. Staff will tag sheep and goat at the scale.

If ear notches or scrapie tags do not match the animal being weighed, the exhibitor will not be allowed to show.

Livestock Rules and Information

All 4-H Clubs, FFA Chapters and Independent Exhibitors are required to enter the 4-H Club, FFA Chapter and Independent Exhibitor Competition!

<u>ALL Livestock entries</u>: will only be accepted through our online entry program. There will be a link to the online entries form at www.chowchillafair.org.

Horse show: is Saturday, April 9th with entry closing date Friday, March 18th.

Livestock Schedule:

- Tack ONLY can be brought in on Sunday, May 15th from 12:00 pm to 7:00 pm. Items left at your own risk, no security available Sunday night
- Small Animal Shows: Pygmy Goats & Dairy Goats will be held Tuesday, May 17th at 6pm. Rabbit & Poultry will be held Friday, May 20th. Rabbits & Poultry will be live pick-up only. Auction begins at 7pm.

The exhibitor agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the fair, the county and the State of California from and against any liability, claim, loss or expense (including reasonable attorneys' fees) arising out of any injury or damage which is caused by, arises from or is in any way connected with participation in the program or event, excepting only that caused by the sole active negligence of the Fair. The Fair Management shall not be responsible for accidents or losses that may occur to any of the exhibitors or exhibits at the fair. The exhibitor (or parent or guardian of a minor) is responsible for any injury or damage resulting from the exhibitor's participation in the program or event. This includes any injury to others or to the exhibitor or to the exhibitor's property.

- No livestock scales allowed on the Chowchilla Fairgrounds
- No tents, canopies, etc. allowed under the pavilions
- No soliciting buyers on grounds at the Chowchilla-Madera County Fair

Animal Heatlh Rules For All Species: Veterinarians and veterinarian assistants provided by the Fair shall check all livestock at designated time periods on the day of arrival for signs of communicable disease, external parasites, unsightly disease conditions, and any wounds, open or closed, that may be contagious. They may also conduct a visual survey and have the right to enter any pen or tie

area to inspect an animal. The exhibitor shall be present during the designated time period for questioning and animal handling. Any animal found to be in an unsafe or unsightly condition will be quarantined in a designated area and then dismissed from Chowchilla Madera County Fair facilities as soon as possible. The County Fair veterinarians' decision will be final. Specific health conditions that may warrant quarantine and/or dismissal include but are not limited to the following: active ringworm, warts, sore mouth, infectious scours or dysentery, pinkeye, lice, mites, foot rot, infectious pneumonia and abscesses which are balding showing hair separation, open, draining or still scabbed. Animals having surgical sites resulting from abscess removal are unacceptable if they have sutures (stitches), scabs or are draining. Animals that are lame or injured will also be dismissed at the direction of the County Fair veterinarian. Lesions are considered active until skin is normal and hair regrowth is evident. Healed skin conditions may be sufficiently unsightly to warrant dismissal. Fractious animals deemed to be a safety hazard may also be dismissed.

YQCA: As a reminder, exhibitors are required to participate in the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals program annually. A field has been added as an Exhibitor Requirement option within the Online Fair Information screen in Blue Ribbon. The system will not allow an exhibitor to complete the entry without entering the YQCA Certificate Number. YQCA website site: http://yaca.org/

Entry Closing Date:

Horse: March 18th at midnight

Large Market Animals: April 1st at midnight

Small Market Animals: April 15th Late Showmanship Entries: May 1st

Entries submitted or paid for after the deadline will not be accepted.

Late entries for Showmanship, other than Horse Showmanship, will be allowed online only until Sunday, May 1st for a \$25 fee. We strongly encourage exhibitors to submit their entries prior to the closing date.

We strongly encourage exhibitors to submit their entries prior to the closing date. We cannot stress enough that late entries will not be accepted, no exceptions! If you are submitting your entry fees by mail they must be post marked no later than April 10th and mailed to Chowchilla-Madera County Fair Attn: Entry Fee Dept. P.O. Box 597 Chowchilla, CA 93610. Even if your entry is submitted on time, if your payment is not received or post marked your entry will not be accepted.

Entry Payments: If you do not wish to pay for your entries online you may complete the entry submission online and then mail the payment along with a printout of the entries to the Chowchilla Madera County Fair, P.O. Box 597 Chowchilla, CA 93610. Payment MUST be post marked no later than the entry closing dates.

Checks: If paying for passes, entry fees, etc. by check, please include a phone number on the check and the exhibitors name in the memo line. There will be a \$25.00 fee for any returned checks.

Credit Cards: There will be a 3% processing fee on all credit card payments with the exception of Fair Exhibit Entry Fees.

Leader/Advisor signature procedure: Due to our online entry program our process to obtain 4-H leader and FFA advisor signatures is as follows; after entry closing date a list of all (livestock and non livestock) entries for each club and chapter will be emailed to the 4-H Community Leader/FFA Advisor. There will be a one page sheet for the leader/advisor to certify that all entries are valid projects and eligible to exhibit at the 2022 Chowchilla-Madera County Fair. This signed sheet MUST be received by the fair no later than Wednesday, May 4th. A Youth for Quality Care of Animals certificate for each exhibitor must accompany this form.

Club/Chapter & Independent Exhibitor Competition:

All 4-H Clubs, FFA Chapters and Independent Exhibitors will be required to enter the competition. See Page 7 for more details.

Any Club, Chapter or Independent Exhibitor who fails to enter the competition and deliver a finished project will be fined \$100.00. The fine must be paid by the conclusion of the 2022 Chowchilla-Madera County Fair. Any Club, Chapter or Independent Exhibitor with an unpaid fine at the conclusion of the fair, will not be allowed to participate in the 2023 Chowchilla-Madera County Fair. Maximum number of breeding and/or feeder animals which may be entered by an exhibitor: Beef – 12 Head, Dairy Cattle- 14 Head, Swine – 12 Head, Sheep – 15 Head, Dairy Goats – 12 Head, Boer Goats- 12 Head

Maximum number of market animals shown by an exhibitor is 1 per specie.

Pens will be assigned per club/chapter depending on space availability. You CANNOT request amount of pens wanted. Management reserves the right to allocate pen space.

ALL Market Ready/Market Acceptable Animals will be allowed to sell at the Livestock Auction on Saturday, May 21st regardless of their weight. There will be a maximum weight paid according to species:

Maximum weights are as follows:

 Swine: 280 lbs.
 Beef: 1300 lbs.

 Sheep: 150 lbs.
 Goats: 110 lbs

Pass Policy: Large animal livestock exhibitors, with the exception of Pygmy Goat and Dairy Goat exhibitors, who submit and pay their entry fee will be given one admission wristband for the duration of the Fair. Wristbands will be given to the leaders to distribute to the exhibitors. Wristbands must be securely placed on the exhibitor's wrist and worn for entry beginning Wednesday, May 18th. Replacement of damaged wristbands will only be issued in exchange for the damaged wristband. If the exhibitor looses their wristband, they will be required to pay regular gate admission. Wristbands are good for fairgrounds admission only, not valid for admission into grandstand events.

Horse, Pygmy Goat, and Dairy Goat exhibitors participating in Master Showmanship, and all Small Animal livestock exhibitors will be issued a one day pass. Passes will be issued ringside on the date of the show for those Horse, Pygmy Goat and Dairy Goat Showmanship and passes for Small Animal exhibitors will be available for pick-up by the advisor/leader On Sunday, May 15th from Noon - 7:00pm or Monday, May 16th from 8:00am - 5:00pm. Advisor/Leader/Parent Passes: Adult wristbands will be sold for \$25.00 beginning April 15th in the Fair Office. Wristbands must be worn to enter the fairgrounds beginning Wednesday, May 18th. Wristbands are good for fairgrounds admission only, not valid for admission into grandstand events.

All gates will operate as paid admission gates beginning Wednesday, May 18th. Anyone without a wristband or pass will be required to pay admission to be admitted on grounds. NO EXCEPTIONS!

Large Animal Receiving

In order to alleviate traffic issues seen in past years on large animal arrival day we will have one entrance and two exits designated as one way traffic in order to allow easy unloading and removal of vehicles from the fairgrounds. All vehicles will enter gate 2 (Electronic Sign) and proceed to their appropriate barn. Once unloaded you can then exit the barn area through either the livestock parking" or "RV" gates. We ask that you unload and remove your vehicles from the barn area in an appropriate amount of time. Please do not leave vehicles around the barns unattended as they will be towed.

<u>Large Animal Release:</u> Tack and animals will be released on Sunday, May 22nd at **11:00 am**. No vehicles allowed on grounds or tack removed before this time. The livestock gate will not allow any vehicles through on Sunday morning. If you need to drop off feed for your breeding animals please drop off enough on Saturday morning to last through Sunday as well.

Small Animal Receiving

Dairy Goats and Pygmy Goats will be received Tuesday, May 17th 7:00AM—4:00PM. Rabbits and Poultry will be received between 5:00 AM – 7:00 AM on Friday May 20th through the "livestock parking" entrance. All exhibitors showing these species will be allowed to drive on grounds during this time period. They will be directed to the proper show area, allowed to unload, then vehicles must be removed and parked in designated parking areas.

Small Animal Release: All non-sale animals will be released at the conclusion of their individual show.

Independent Junior Exhibitors:

Independent junior exhibitors not affiliated with any organization can enter appropriate FFA or 4-H classes. Independent exhibitors must be at least 9 years old or in the 4th grade by January 1, 2022. Fair management can establish a separate class if there are sufficient entries. Juniors who have been 4-H or FFA members within 60 days prior to the Fair are not eligible to compete in that project as Independent Juniors (120 days for market cattle and horse) or enter project(s) under a different organization. Independent exhibitors must notify Fair management of livestock entries 60 days prior to fair (120 days for market cattle and horse). Call Fair Office for requirements of independent exhibitors. ALL Independent exhibitors shall provide insurance coverage.

Ownership Requirements:

Feeders, registered and commercial breeding animals must be owned by the exhibitor 15 days prior to the opening of the Fair. Market animals, hog, sheep and goats, must be owned 60 days (120 days for cattle & 30 days for Rabbit) prior to May 16, 2022.

Animal Care & Fitting:

Exhibitors are expected to properly water and feed all animals including those sold in the Jr. Livestock Auction until the day they are removed from the grounds. All exhibits must stay in place for the duration of the Fair. The Fair is an educational experience and, as such, exhibitors shall fit and groom their own animals for show. Exhibitors may receive limited assistance from their parents, other exhibitors, and Leaders and/or Advisors only. Exhibitors may not remove their animals from the fairgrounds prior to 11:00 a.m. May 22nd, unless authorized in writing by the Livestock Superintendent. Exhibitors found in violation of this rule will have their premiums withheld. Release of tack and feed will only be permitted on Sunday, May 22nd after 11:00 a.m. with a release form received from the livestock office.

Eligibility Areas:

Junior exhibitors must be a resident, student or 4-H Club Member of Madera, Merced or Mariposa counties or the extended area, which includes Sierra Joint Union & Firebaugh/Los Deltas School Districts.

All State & Local Rules Apply:

It is the intent of the Division of Fairs and Expositions and of Fairs that the quality standards established for market animals be maintained. Therefore, classifications will be subject to change in the event there are changes made in Federal Grading. To create adequate competition as required by the Department of Fairs and Expositions, in the event that any one class has less than 3 entries, it may be combined with another class, which is considered similar by the Fair staff. Any exhibit, in the opinion of the judge, not being worthy of judging shall not be judged for premiums. All discrepancies must be cleared before judging can take place.

Official Dress: Exhibitors will be in uniform while exhibiting their animal. Half uniform (uniform top and jean bottoms) will be acceptable at the award ceremony.

The official dress code for Independent exhibitors shall be white pants and white shirt. 4-H members are required to wear white pants, white dress shirt (long or short sleeve), 4-H hat, and tie/scarf. FFA members are required to wear the official show uniform of FFA: white pants, white dress shirt (long or short sleeve), and an official FFA jacket with tie/scarf.

Re-Weigh Policy: If an exhibitor wants a re-weigh of their market animal it must be requested while the animal is at the scale. The animal will be removed from the scale, the scale will be zeroed and then the animal will be placed back onto the scale. Once animal is taken from the scale no reweighs will be allowed.

Trailer/Camper: Dry camp sites will be \$100.00 for the week of fair. Dry camp sites are across the street from the fairgrounds at the school farm. Camp sites will be assigned on a first come first serve basis. All spaces must be pre-paid before arrival. Trailers may arrive on Sunday, May 15th between 9:00 am – 5:00pm and Monday, May 16th between 8:00am - Noon. You must make arrangements to place your trailer during the stated time frame, no exceptions. Sites will be assigned as you pull in, so if you want to camp with other people you must arrive together. Campsites are limited and fill up quickly so be sure to pay for you site early. Application for campsites can be found under the Exhibitor tab at www.chowchillafair.org. Kids must be supervised by an adult at all times.

Livestock Parking Pass: Livestock parking passes will be sold for \$50.00. The pass will only admit the vehicle on grounds. All persons in the vehicle must be wearing a wristband. Anyone without a proper admission pass will be asked to exit the vehicle before the vehicle is allowed on grounds. Livestock Parking area is near the Beef & Dairy barn, Madera County Ag Boosters/ Associated Feed Pavilion. Passes for this area will be required Tuesday, May 17th - Saturday May 21st.

Registered Paperwork Check in:

Any Registered animals exhibiting at the Fair must have their Registered papers turned in by Tuesday, May 17, 2022 at 5:00pm. NO LATE REGISTERED PAPERS WILL BE ACCEPTED. The exhibitor will be scratched from the class if

Registered papers are not received. NO EXCEPTIONS. NO copies will be accepted. No faxed copies will be accepted unless they are sent directly from the breed association to the Fair at 559-665-3720. Errors may disqualify your animal.

Cannot Show/Sale Letters:

It is required that every animal will be shown by its owner. If for some reason the owner cannot show or sell his/her animal, a letter must be mailed to the Board of Directors and received no later than Friday, May, 6th. Letters must be approved by the Board and on file in the Livestock Office stating the concern, Junior Exhibitor that will substitute for owner, signed by the exhibitor, parent, and the leader/advisor.

Clean Pens and Award:

Pens and stalls should be cleaned by 8:00 a.m. daily. The winning club/ chapter will receive a plaque and will be able to choose their stall location for 2023.

On Grounds Vehicles:

No vehicles will be permitted on grounds. Wheelbarrows will be available near the gates to haul in feed/bedding etc. Any vehicles found on grounds without proper permits will be subject to towing. Sunday May 17th vehicles will be allowed on grounds at 11:00am - 1:00pm for the livestock release.

No Pets Allowed on Grounds:

No pets, with the exception of those entered as an exhibit or as a service animal, are allowed on grounds May 15th through May 22nd, including the livestock pen areas and show arenas.

Replacement Checks: There will be a \$50.00 fee for replacement of a lost or damaged premium/auction check. Request for a replacement check must be made in writing and should include exhibitors name, as much additional information as possible (check number, check amount, etc.), and must be signed by the exhibitor and parent/guardian if under age 18.

All Species: Don't forget about entering the educational Panel Displays for clubs and chapters to show their hard work! Show Fair patrons the importance of how to raise a breeding or market animal. The division is right after the showmanship section. Be creative!!

Pens/Stalls are not to be used as tack pens/tack stalls. The Chowchilla Madera County Fair reserves the right to reassign unused pens/stalls as needed. Pens not being used to confine livestock are considered unused and can and will be used as needed by the Fair/Livestock Staff.

Withdraw from Auction: After a market animal (Non-Champion) has qualified for sale, it may be withdrawn only by payment of a fee.

Exhibitors with more than one market animal qualified for sale must designate which animal is to be sold by Noon, Thursday, May 19, 2022. Exhibitor will not have to pay withdrawal fee, but no refunds will be issued on entry fees. If exhibitor has not designated which animal they wish to sell by the deadline management will designate the sale animal. A written withdrawal form with exhibitor name, weight tag, ear tag number and species must be completed at the livestock office.

Exhibitors Responsibilities: It is the exhibitors' responsibility to maintain and care for animals, pens, and stalls until animal is gone. Failure to deliver sale animals to the shipping area as specified by the Fair management will result in withheld premiums and sale proceeds. Brand Inspection fees and meat promotion deductions, where required, will be withheld from Exhibitors auction checks. SELLERS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANIMALS REJECTED AT ANY PROCESSING CENTER DUE TO THE PRESENCE OF DRUG RESIDUES. SELLER MAY BE LIABLE TO THE BUYER FOR AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO THREE TIMES THE PURCHASE PRICE AND MAY ALSO BE LIABLE FOR ATTORNEY'S FEES AND CIVIL PENALTIES (Food and Ag Code Section 14363).

Auction: All large market animals sold through the Junior Livestock Auction must be marked custom (slaughter), resale or resale Friends of the Fair. To help defray the auction costs and maintain a contingency as required by the Division of Fairs and Expositions, the Fair will charge a 8% commission of the gross sale, with the exception of the dairy replacement heifers being charged 6%. BUYERS WITH OUTSTANDING ACCOUNTS AS OF DECEMBER 31, 2019 WILL NOT BE ELIGIBLE TO PURCHASE AT THE 2022 AUCTION. It shall be expressly understood that the Chowchilla-Madera County Fair acts only as an agent for the consignors, and assumes no liability, legal or otherwise.

All market rabbit auction lots will be live pick-up only. Only Market Ready Animals will sell.



1st through 7th Ribbons Only. Entries in Master Showmanship must have been winners in individual classes of showmanship. All Advanced Showmanship winners must compete in Master Showmanship. Rider must be the sole rider or have a long-term lease on the horse. The horse cannot be in training by a professional trainer. Rider must have a minimum of 120 days possession prior to showing. All Stallions will be excluded, as will all other horses considered by the Management to be unsafe among exhibitors. No tie downs, mechanical hackamores, draw reins or martingales allowed with the exception of Gymkhana classes. Horses 4 years old and younger may be shown in hackamore or snaffle bit. No horse may be shown in any one class by more than one contestant. COACHING AND INSTRUCTIONS BY LEADERS OR OTHER ADULTS GIVEN TO A CONTESTANT DURING THE JUDGING OF A CLASS WILL RESULT IN THE ELIMINATION OF THAT CONTESTANT. Show Management reserves the right to combine classes due to entry numbers. A properly fitted equestrian helmet that is ASTM/SEI approved is required for all classes (including halter and showmanship classes). All riders must wear a helmet anytime they are around a horse. Helmets will be inspected. Horses entered in this event may be subjected to random drug testing at the discretion of the Fair management, High points are one horse and rider combinations.

NOTE:

- Trail must be ridden Western NOT English.
- No Dogs around the arena.
- No Parking around the arena.
- All high point awards horse & rider combo.
- Must compete in showmanship to be eligible to receive any high point awards.

Chaps are optional. Official 4-H or FFA show uniform is required (NO EXCEPTIONS) for Showmanship and may be used in all other classes except English. The classes will be divided as follows:

OWNERSHIP OR LEASE:

The official ownership date is the date shown on the receipt of sale unless the animal was bred by the exhibitor.

Any corrections due to clerical error must be made before the start of the show. This will be a ONE-DAY, CARRY CASE SHOW. Rabbits will remain in carry case except for judging. Exhibitors are responsible for getting their animals to the judging table on time. Exhibitors shall not state ownership of any animal to the judge. All rabbits are entered at owner's risk; the Fair, fair employees, judges and show personnel are not responsible in any way for loss, injury or death of entries.
