#### **BACKGROUND:**

The Texas Department of Agriculture awarded the City of Gonzales funding for CDBG Sidewalk and Infrastructure for safety and ADA compliance. As a condition of this award, the City of Gonzales and its contractors must demonstrate, to the greatest extent feasible, economic opportunity generated by CDBG funds and other HUD assistance, most importantly employment, is directed to low- and very low-income persons, particularly those who are recipients of government assistance for housing, as well as residents of the community in which the federal funds are spent. The HUD benchmark for Targeted Section 3 Workers is 5% of total labor hours worked. Failure to achieve these benchmarks requires additional justification by the state, which may necessitate additional information from the City of Gonzales.

#### **POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:**

This is consistent with current policy.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

The match for the grant is \$50,000 and is reflected in the current fiscal year budget



#### **BACKGROUND:**

Gonzales County has applied for and received funding from the Housing and Urban Development under the General Land office Community Development Block Grant Program-Mitigation grant and desires to install a radio communications tower located off FM 532, approximately 655 feet east of CR 341, next to the Water Plant in the city limits to improve emergency communication within areas of Gonzales County. The City will accept all improvements resulting from the County's contract with the GLO and the county shall maintain these improvements.

#### **POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:**

Chapter 791 of the Government Code provides that Interlocal Cooperation Contracts increase efficiency and effectiveness of local governments by authorizing them to contract, to the greatest possible extent with one another and with agencies of the state.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

Within the Interlocal Agreement the funding for the construction of the communications tower on City property will be through the Housing and Urban Development under the General Land office Community Development Block Grant Program-Mitigation grant. Continuous and further maintenance and improvements to the tower will be the responsibility of the County once the project is completed.

#### **STAFF RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff respectfully recommends the council take the action they deem necessary.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 2022-127**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GONZALES, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE INTERIM CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE AN INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN GONZALES COUNTY AND THE CITY OF GONZALES TO INSTALL A RADIO COMMUNICATIONS TOWER LOCATED OFF OF FM 532 FOR EMERGENCY COMMUNICATION; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

- Section 1. The City Council of the City of Gonzales hereby authorizes the Interim City Manager to execute an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between Gonzales County and the City of Gonzales as attached in Exhibit A.
- Section 2. The recitals contained in the preamble hereof are hereby found to be true, and such recitals are hereby made a part of this Resolution for all purposes and are adopted as a part of the judgment and findings of the City Council.
- Section 3. All resolutions or parts thereof, which are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Resolution shall be and remain controlling as to the matters resolved herein.
- Section 4. This Resolution shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and the United States of America.
- Section 5. If any provision of this Resolution or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be held to be invalid, the remainder of this Resolution and the application of such provision to other persons and circumstances shall nevertheless be valid, and the City

Council hereby declares that this Resolution would have been enacted without such invalid provision.

Section 6. It is officially found, determined, and declared that the meeting at which this Resolution is adopted was open to the public and public notice of the time, place, and subject matter of the public business to be considered at such meeting, including this Resolution, was given, all as required by Chapter 551, Texas Government Code, as amended.

# INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF GONZALES, TEXAS AND GONZALES COUNTY REGARDING THE USE OF TEXAS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM-MITIGATION PROJECT FUNDING TO INSTALL A RADIO COMMUNICATIONS TOWER LOCATED OFF FM 532

This Interlocal Agreement Between the City of Gonzales, Texas and Gonzales County regarding the use of Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) under the General Land Office Community Development Block Grant Program-Mitigation Program to install a radio communications tower located off FM 532 (the "Agreement") is entered into between the City of Gonzales, Texas, a Texas municipal corporation (the "City"), acting by and through its City Council, and Gonzales County, a political subdivision of the State of Texas (the "County"), acting by and through its Commissioners Court, pursuant to authority granted under the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Chapter 791, Texas Government Code, as the same may be amended from time to time, to be effective as of the date on which the last Party signs this Agreement (the "Effective Date"). The City and the County are collectively referred to herein as the "Parties" and are each a "Party".

#### WITNESSETH:

**WHEREAS**, Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code, as amended, titled Interlocal Cooperation Contracts, authorizes contracts between political subdivisions for the performance of governmental functions and services; and,

WHEREAS, County has applied for a grant from the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) under the General Land Office (GLO) Community Development Block Grant Program-Mitigation Program to install a radio communications tower (Project); and,

**WHEREAS**, the Parties intend to locate the Project off FM 532, approximately 655 Ft. east of CR 341, next to the Water Plant owned by the City and located within the City of Gonzales, as depicted in Exhibit A; and,

**WHEREAS**, if the GLO awards such grant to County, the Parties shall work cooperatively to complete the Project; and,

**WHEREAS**, both the City and the County have determined it is in their best interest to, enter into an Agreement to detail the rights and responsibilities of the Parties during the completion of the Project; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Project will be for the benefit of the public, including residents of both the City and the County; and,

**WHEREAS**, the governing bodies of the Parties have each approved the terms and conditions of this Agreement and duly posted meeting held in compliance with Chapter 551 of the Government Code.

**NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, the sufficiency of which are acknowledged, and subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, the Parties agree as follows:

#### I. Responsibilities of the County

- 1.1 endeavor to execute its grant recipient responsibilities in a timely and efficient manner
- 1.2 act as the repository of all receipts and documentation pertinent to the performance under the grant and furnish copies of same to City upon request
- 1.3 serve as the primary contact in all matters pertaining to the grant and Project and act as the conduit for information between the Parties and HUD/GLO
- 1.4 procure a grant administrator for the Project and be responsible for all required reporting to HUD/GLO
- 1.5 procure an engineering firm through a Request for Qualifications for the Project's final engineering
- 1.6 cooperate with the City to coordinate any engineering and construction activities on property owned and controlled by the City
- 1.7 provide pre-bid project design, bid alternates, change orders, project redesign, or additions to the contract scope to the City Engineer for review and written approval prior to consideration by the County
- 1.8 be responsible for receipt and payment of Project related invoicing through the County Auditor
- 1.9 assign full ownership and control of the completed Project to the City following the acceptance of the Certificate of Construction Completion
- 1.10 provide for the maintenance of the Project after installation

#### II. Responsibilities of the City

- 2.1 upon request, provide the County with any City information related to the property necessary for the County to comply with the grant terms and conditions
- 2.2 accept ownership of Project improvements located on City property upon completion and assignment from the County
- 2.3 budget and appropriate the necessary funds for Project cost overruns that are approved in writing by the City

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#### III. Funding of Project Expenses From Available Funds of Parties

3.1 This Agreement shall only require funding of the Project from available funds of the Parties that have been budgeted for such purpose as required by Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code.

#### IV. Binding Effect; Benefiting Parties

- 4.1 This Agreement shall bind and benefit the respective Parties and their legal successors, but shall not otherwise be assignable, in whole or in part, by either Party without first obtaining the written consent of the other Party.
- 4.2 This Agreement inures to the benefit of and obligates only the Parties. No term or provision of this Agreement shall benefit or obligate any person or entity not a Party to the Agreement. The Parties shall cooperate fully in opposing any attempt by any third person or entity to claim any benefit, protection, release, or other consideration under this Agreement.

#### V. Governmental Functions; Liability; No Waiver of Immunity or Defenses

- 5.1 Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary herein, this Agreement is a contract for and with respect to the performance of governmental functions by governmental entities.
  - 5.1.1 The services provided for herein are governmental functions, and the City and the County shall be engaged in the conduct of a governmental function while providing and/or performing any service pursuant to this Agreement.
  - 5.1.2 The relationship of the County and the City shall, with respect to that part of any service or function undertaken as a result of or pursuant to this Agreement, be that of independent contractors.
  - 5.1.3 Nothing contained herein shall be deemed or construed by the Parties, or by any third party, as creating the relationship of principal and agent, partners, joint ventures, or any other similar such relationship between the Parties.
- 5.2 Each Party reserves and does not waive any defense available to it at law or in equity as to any claim or cause of action whatsoever that may arise or result from or in connection with this Agreement. This Agreement shall not be interpreted nor construed to give to any third party the right to any claim or cause of action, and neither the City nor the County shall be held legally liable for any claim or cause of action arising pursuant to or in connection with this Agreement except as specifically provided herein or by law.
- 5.3 Neither Party waives or relinquishes any immunity or defense on behalf of itself, its Commissioners, Councilmembers, officers, employees, and agents as a result of the execution of this Agreement and the performance of the covenants and agreements contained herein.

#### VII. Severability

7.1 If any provision of this Agreement shall be deemed void or invalid, such provision shall be severed from the remainder of this Agreement, which shall remain in force and effect to the extent that it does not destroy the benefit of the bargain.

#### **VIII. Entire Agreement**

8.1 This Agreement is the entire agreement between the City and the County as to the subject matter hereof and supersedes any prior understanding or written or oral agreement relative to the subject matter hereof. This Agreement may be amended only by written instrument duly approved and executed by both Parties in accordance with the formalities of this Agreement.

#### IX. Governing Law; Venue

9.1 All Parties agree that this Agreement shall be construed under the laws of the State of Texas, and obligations under the Agreement shall be performed in Gonzales County, Texas. In the event that any legal proceeding is brought to enforce this Agreement or any provision hereof, the same shall be brought in the State Courts of Gonzales County, Texas. The Parties agree to submit to the jurisdiction of said court.

#### X. Term of the Agreement

- 10.1 The term of this Agreement shall begin upon approval by the governing bodies of the Parties and full execution by the designated officials or upon receipt of the Subgrant Contract award by County, whichever is later.
- 10.2 This Agreement shall terminate when the grant is administratively closed by General Land Office.
- 10.3 Either Party may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other Party.
- 10.4 Early termination of this Agreement by a Party may not relieve a Party from obligations assumed herein.

#### **TYPE AGENDA ITEM:**

#### **BACKGROUND:**

As per the City of Gonzales Personnel Policy Section 5.07 the City of Gonzales may provide Longevity Pay to regular full-time employees. The financial situation of the City will be reviewed each year in October to determine if a recommendation to pay longevity pay will be made by the City Manager. If the City Manager determines that financial resources are not available, no action will be taken regarding longevity pay. If the City Manager determines financial resources are available, he will make his request to City Council at the regular November Council meeting. Subject to annual approval by the City Council, Full-time employees will receive payment on an annual basis at the rate of \$5.00 per month for each year of service, up to a maximum of 25 years. If approved and appropriated by Council, Longevity pay will be paid annually to all active qualified employees.

During the budget process the Council appropriated within each department Longevity Pay for all Full-time employees.

The total amount of longevity for full time employees this year is \$46,380.00 across all funds. The least amount to an individual is \$65.00 and the maximum is \$1,500.00. The average is approximately \$459.20. Currently, the city has 6 employees with 25+ years of service (maximum \$1,500.00).

#### **POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:**

This is an annual Council decision and upholds the City's policy for transparency.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

The total amount of longevity for full time employees this year is \$46,380.00 across all funds.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

In 2021, the Gonzales County created the position of Election Administrator for the County which now provides the opportunity for the City to contract annually for all of the City of Gonzales elections. The City of Gonzales will hold an election for the purpose of electing Council Member District 3 and Council Member District 4 on the uniform election date of May 6, 2023. To eliminate confusion regarding the elections, City Staff feels it is in the City's best interest to contract with the County for the May 6, 2023 election, any resulting runoff election, as well as all city elections. Contracting will provide uniformity for all elections across all entities.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

The estimated cost to the City of Gonzales varies on the actual cost for the equipment and the amount of time the election workers spend on their required duties (hourly rate of pay for election workers). The City has budgeted \$20,000 within the 2022-2023 fiscal year in Account #100-7-101-501 for the City's elections.

#### TYPE AGENDA ITEM:

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Annually the City of Gonzales has Frost Insurance, an independent insurance agency reviews the current coverage for health, dental, vision and life insurance. Frost Insurance will look at our current provider (Blue Cross Blue Shield) and the coverage they offer and compare it to many other providers that can offer similar coverage. Frost Insurance schedules the open enrollment that the City has each year where the employees can enroll online. They create benefit books that the employees can view online during open enrollment. They also help employees with claim issues throughout the year and assist us in many other matters.

Frost provided the City of Gonzales their premium and claims summary report and found that the premiums paid from September 2021 through August 2022 was \$888,832.00 versus the actual claims that were paid in the amount of \$1,281.591.00. The total loss ratio was 144.2%. The City of Gonzales received their new rates from Blue Cross Blue Shield that would start January of 2023. With the extremely high total loss ratio we saw small increase in our rate. Currently the City pays 100% of the health insurance for each full-time employee, but pays no part of dependent coverage. The City of Gonzales pays Blue Cross Blue Shield \$571 per month, per full-time employee. If the City renews the existing plan with no changes with Blue Cross Blue Shield, the premium for 2022 would be \$625.95, which comes out to \$54.95 more a month per employee. The City of Gonzales went from 106 to 108 full-time employees budgeted. With the 108 full-time positions that are budgeted, there would be a \$71,215.20 increase for 12 months if the city renewed the existing medical insurance plan. If the City wishes to go with the Alternate 1 Option plan with UHC-Choice Plus BCYE RX C55Y which is very comparable to the current plan the increase would be \$40,500.00 just in medical insurance. The significant changes employees would see if the City were to choose the UHC plan are the following: (1) the calendar year deductible for family is \$1,500 less, (2) the maximum out of pocket for family is \$3,500 less, (3) the emergency copay for the emergency room is \$250, (4) the primary care physician copay for children would be \$35 less, (5) the primary care physician copay for adults would be \$10 less, (6) the specialist copay would be at least \$20 less, (7) the prescription drug copay for mail order would be less. Staff provided Frost Insurance with a list of 31 medications that were obtained from several city employees to do a cost comparison between Blue Cross Blue Shield and United Healthcare which will be presented at the Council meeting. There would also be a cost savings of \$492.48 to the City with moving forward with United Healthcare because the

basic life and AD&D is \$0.015 less per \$1,000. The employees would experience a cost savings since the dependent life is \$0.13 less per month. The employees would also experience a cost savings for voluntary life and AD&D for the employee and spouse, a decrease in the dental insurance premiums for the entire family and a decrease for voluntary vision for the entire family. A budget amendment will not be needed because staff budgeted a 25% increase as per the instructions from Frost Insurance. The City of Gonzales received other plan options from TML and Humana which are attached for Council's consideration.

#### **POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:**

This is consistent with what has been done in the past.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

Fiscal impact will be an increase of \$40,500.00 for the medical part if Council chooses to go with UHC which seems to be the best plan option, no budget amendment needed.

WHEREAS, although there was an extremely high total loss ratio the City was presented options that increased the monthly rate in amounts from 5.5% to 14.7% with the best option being from United Healthcare with an increase of premiums in the amount of 5.5%; and;

**WHEREAS**, the City Council finds that selecting the best value coverage for City employees for Health, Dental, Vision, and Life is in the best interest of the City of Gonzales.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

This agenda item was approved at the October 13<sup>th</sup> City Council meeting with annual payments of \$129,760.54. The financing company, Government Capital Corporation was unable to fund the purchase before the 30 day lock on the interest expired. Staff is bringing this item back to Council due to an increase in the annual payment of \$2,442.21, which brings the total annual payment to \$132,202.75.

The Fire Department needs to replace Engine 37 which is a 2008 Pierce Sabor due to increased maintenance costs and liability. The engine has to be taken to the shop for repairs several times a year, leaving the Fire Department short on fire engines. The repairs are extremely costly and more than \$100k has been spent for repairs since 2016. Most recently, the truck caught fire twice and had to be towed to San Antonio for repairs. This engine is unreliable and as stated the repairs have become an ongoing extremely costly expense. This particular engine takes up a majority of the maintenance to vehicles line item within the budget annually. Staff is proposing to purchase a new Pierce Enforcer Pumper with an approximate delivery time of between 29-30 months from the date of order. Pricing was obtained for a new Pierce Enforcer Pumper fire engine from Houston-Galveston Area Council (HGAC) Purchasing Program in the amount of \$853.093.00. Staff is proposing to finance the equipment for eight years.

#### **POLICY CONSIDERATIONS**

As set forth in the City's Fiscal and Budgetary Policy Statements; All City purchases and contracts over \$50,000 shall conform to a competitive bidding process as set forth in Chapter 252 of the Local Government Code of Texas. The pricing was obtained through a HGAC Purchasing Program Contract number FS12-19 which assists local governments in reducing costs through this government-to-government procurement service available nationwide.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

Within the 2022-2023 Fiscal Year, the Gonzales Fire Department budgeted \$138,000.00 within Vehicle/Equipment-Principal Payment GL Account #100-7-301.701 and \$3,462.00 within Vehicle/Equipment-Interest Payment GL Account #100-7-301-702. The total expenditure for the Fire Engine and Equipment is \$853,093.00, which will be financed at 4.895% with Government

Capital for an annual amount of \$132,202.75 for eight years. It has been verified with the Finance Department the availability of these funds.

#### **TYPE AGENDA ITEM:**

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The City received bids for the 2021 Sidewalk Improvement Plans May 12, 2022. These bids were subsequently all rejected due to budgetary issues. The project was rebid and bids were received September 29, 2022. These plans include the replacement of the sidewalk in Texas Heroes Square, along the 400 Block of St. James Street and include drainage and grading improvements to the 400 Block of St. James Street.

#### **POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:**

As funds are available, the city should consider reconstructing and upgrading sidewalks to be accessible and compliant with ADA and TAS regulations.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

This agenda item will expend \$699,633.40 for construction and the previously approved amounts of \$70,000 for engineering, \$30,000 for Grant Administration and \$10,000 for environmental services associated with the grant funding. In addition, staff is requesting a 5% contingency of \$34,981.67 for unforeseen issues during construction for a total fiscal impact up to \$844,615.07. Funding for this project will come from GEDC (\$50,000), TXCDBG Grant (\$500,000), Water Fund (\$35,661), and the General Fund up to (\$258,954.07). The budget to perform the work in this contract was determined two years ago at approximately \$500,000. A budget amendment to reflect this will be presented on a future agenda.

## **TYPE AGENDA ITEM:**

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The City has received bids for the 2022 Street Improvement Projects. These plans include the reconstruction of Saint Lawrence Street from Water Street to Hoskins Street, including replacement of curb & gutter, reclaiming and cement stabilization of road in areas of need and repaving with a 2-inch HMAC overlay. These plans also include an edge mill and overlay of Church Street from Fischer Street to Cuero Street and an edge mill and overlay of Saint Francis Street from Saint Joseph to Saint Paul.

### **POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:**

As funds are available, the city should consider reconstructing and maintaining streets in order to provide safe transportation conditions for the public.

## **FISCAL IMPACT:**

This agenda Item will expend up to \$1,563,788.50 as the base contract amount depending on council decision on scope of project. In addition to the construction amount, the previously approved amounts of \$150,000 for engineering will bring the total fiscal impact to \$1,713,788.50. Funding for this project will come from ARPA funds in the amount of \$935,130.24 and General Fund in the amount of \$778,658.26. Any interest accruing on the ARPA funds will be used to decrease the amount coming from the General Fund. The City Engineer is recommending issuing a Change Order to reduce the scope to include paving of St. Lawrence Street from Hopkins Street to College Street to bring the total contract amount down to \$929,935.55 and is requesting a 1% contingency of \$9,299.36 for unforeseen issues during construction. This would decrease the total fiscal impact to \$1,089,325.86 and the General Fund contribution to \$154,104.67. A budget amendment will have to be completed at a later date once the work is completed.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GONZALES, TEXAS ACCEPTING THE PROPOSALS AND AWARDING THE CONTRACT FOR THE 2022 STREET IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS TO DIAMOND X CONTRACTING, INC.; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

**WHEREAS,** the Capital Improvement Plan for Fiscal Year Budget 2021-2022 included the 2022 Street Improvement Projects to be competitively bid as per Chapter 252 of the Local Government Code; and,

WHEREAS, the advertisements for the Request for Bids were published in the newspaper for three consecutive weeks beginning September 8<sup>th</sup>, 2022; and,

**WHEREAS**, the proposals were due to be received by the City of Gonzales on September 29<sup>th</sup>, 2022 at 2:00 p.m.; and,

**WHEREAS**, proposals were received from, Lester Contracting, Inc. and Diamond X Contracting, Inc., by the due date published; and,

WHEREAS, Local Government Code Section 252.043(a) states that if the competitive bidding requirement applies to the contract for goods or services, the contract must be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder or to the bidder who provides goods and services at the best value for the municipality; and,

WHEREAS, the City Engineer evaluated the proposals and recommends to award the contract to Diamond X Contracting, Inc. who is the lowest responsible bidder with a base bid amount of \$1,563,788.50; and,

WHEREAS, the base bid amount is greater than the amount budgeted for this project, City Council may choose to issue a change order to reduce the scope of the project up to 25% without the consent of the contractor, or may reduce by more than 25% with the consent of the contractor; and

WHEREAS, the contractor has consented to a reduction in the project by more than 25%, the City Engineer recommends reducing the scope to include paving of St. Lawrence Street from Hopkins Street to College Street which would require a change order in the amount of (\$633,852 95) to arrive at a contact amount of \$929,935.55 which along with the addition of the requested 1% contingency would decrease the total fiscal impact to \$1,089,325.86, and the General Fund contribution to \$154,104.67; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that entering into an agreement for the 2022 Street Improvement Projects in the best interest of the City and its citizens and will further promote the public health, safety, and general welfare of the City.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

As part of the 2022-2023 Capital Improvement Program, monies are budgeted to replace a waterline in the 100 and 200 blocks of St. Peter Street and to replace approximately 1900 linear feet of wastewater line from Theo Street to Cone Street. This contract is for surveying, engineering design, bidding, construction administration and construction materials testing.

#### **POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:**

As funds are available, the city should consider replacing aging water and wastewater lines in order to provide for the safety and welfare of the community.

## **BUDGETARY CONSIDERATIONS:**

This Agenda Item will expend up to \$44,500 for engineering, surveying, CMT and project management services. This fee is included in the CIP budget estimates for the proposed St. Peter Street Waterline and Theo to Cone Streets Wastewater Line and will be paid from the water and wastewater funds

#### **BACKGROUND:**

On Friday May 13<sup>th</sup>, 2022, the GEDC received a request for funds from Main Street regarding a Beautification Project-The Gonzales Butterfly Garden. The Butterfly Garden was planted in February 2012 after a City Council Resolution was passed. The Butterfly Garden is located at the corner of St. Louis and St. Paul Street and falls in the Historic Gonzales Main Street District. The property has fallen to Gonzales Main Street, Inc for restoration, beautification, and ongoing upkeep. The Gonzales Main Street District is currently in need of funding for the initial restoration of this project.

This item was presented to City Council on July 14<sup>th</sup> for discussion. After discussion it was determined that staff needed to complete additional research regarding this project. The item was then brought back to City Council on October 13<sup>th</sup> as a full discussion regarding all options for downtown beautification. The consensus from that discussion was that the City Council wished to either vote for or against the original proposal that was presented on July 14<sup>th</sup> for the butterfly garden improvements.

## **POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:**

Sec. 505.152. PROJECTS RELATED TO RECREATIONAL OR COMMUNITY FACILITIES. For purposes of this chapter, "project" includes land, buildings, equipment, facilities, and improvements found by the board of directors to be required or suitable for use for professional and amateur sports, including children's sports, athletic, entertainment, tourist, convention, and public park purposes and events, including stadiums, ball parks, auditoriums, amphitheaters, concert halls, parks and park facilities, open space improvements, museums, exhibition facilities, and related store, restaurant, concession, and automobile parking facilities, related area transportation facilities, and related roads, streets, and water and sewer facilities, and other related improvements that enhance any of the items described by this section.

Added by Acts 2007, 80th Leg., R.S., Ch. 885 (H.B. 2278), Sec. 3.01, eff. April 1, 2009.

## **FISCAL IMPACT:**

Asking for \$25,000 which is in this year's budget. The ongoing sustainability of the Butterfly Garden is critical to its success. Main Street will request funds in their City Budget to cover the

cost of hiring a third-party landscaping company to perform the ongoing maintenance and upkeep of the Butterfly Garden. Main Street believes that having a professional landscaper who is familiar with the delicate nature of the plants will provide the best possible outcome for its sustainability.

This **PERFORMANCE AGREEMENT** by and between the **GONZALES MAIN STREET, INC.**, a Texas non-profit corporation (hereinafter referred to as "Main Street"), and the **GONZALES ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION**, a Texas non-profit corporation (hereinafter referred to as the "GEDC"), is made and executed on the following recitals, terms and conditions.

**WHEREAS**, GEDC is a Type B economic development corporation operating pursuant to Chapter 505 of the Texas Local Government Code, as amended (also referred to as the "Act"), and the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act, as codified in the Texas Business Organizations Code, as amended; and

WHEREAS, Section 505.152 of the Texas Local Government Code, in pertinent part, defines the term "project" to mean "land, buildings, equipment, facilities, and improvements found by the board of directors to be required or suitable for use for professional and amateur sports, including children's sports, athletic, entertainment, tourist, convention, and public park purposes and events, including stadiums, ball parks, auditoriums, amphitheaters, concert halls, parks and park facilities, open space improvements, museums, exhibition facilities, and related store, restaurant, concession, and automobile parking facilities, related area transportation facilities, and related roads, streets, and water and sewer facilities, and other related improvements that enhance any of the items described by this section"; and

**WHEREAS**, Main Street has applied to the GEDC for financial assistance necessary to fund improvements to the Gonzales Butterfly Garden generally located at 309 St. Paul Street, City of Gonzales, Texas; and

WHEREAS, the GEDC's Board of Directors have determined the financial assistance to be provided to Main Street pursuant to this Agreement is consistent and meets the definition of "project" as that term is defined in Section 505.152 of the Texas Local Government Code; and the definition of "cost" as that term is defined by Section 501.152 of the Texas Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, Main Street agrees and understands that Section 501.073(a) of the Texas Local Government Code requires the City Council of the City of Gonzales, Texas, to approve all programs and expenditures of the GEDC, and accordingly this Agreement is not effective until City Council has approved this project at a City Council meeting called and held for that purpose.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, for and in consideration of the agreements contained herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the GEDC and Main Street agree as follows:

#### SECTION 1. FINDINGS INCORPORATED.

The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated into the body of this Agreement and shall

be considered part of the mutual covenants, consideration and promises that bind the parties.

#### **SECTION 2.** TERM.

This Agreement shall be effective as of the Effective Date, and shall continue thereafter until **September 30, 2023**, unless terminated sooner under the provisions hereof.

#### **SECTION 3. DEFINITIONS.**

The following words shall have the following meanings when used in this Agreement.

- (a) Act. The word "Act" means Chapters 501 to 505 of the Texas Local Government Code, as amended.
- (b) **Agreement**. The word "Agreement" means this Performance Agreement, together with all exhibits and schedules attached to this Performance Agreement from time to time, if any.
- (c) City. The word "City" means the City of Gonzales, Texas, a Texas home-rule municipality, whose address for the purposes of this Agreement is 820 N. St. Joseph Street, Gonzales, Texas 78629.
- (d) **Effective Date.** The words "Effective Date" mean the date of the latter to execute this Agreement by and between Main Street and GEDC.
- (e) **Event of Default**. The words "Event of Default" mean and include any of the Events of Default set forth below in the section entitled "Events of Default."
- (f) **GEDC**. The term "GEDC" means the Gonzales Economic Development Corporation, a Texas non-profit corporation, its successors and assigns, whose corporate address for the purposes of this Agreement is 820 N. St. Joseph Street, Gonzales, Texas 78629.
- (g) **Gonzales Butterfly Garden.** The words "Gonzales Butterfly Garden" mean the Gonzales Butterfly Garden generally located at 309 St. Paul Street, City of Gonzales, Texas.
- (h) **Main Street.** The words "Main Street" mean the Gonzales Main Street, Inc., a Texas non-profit corporation, its successors and assigns, whose address for the purposes of this Agreement is 820 N. St. Joseph Street, Gonzales, Texas 78629.
- (i) **Qualified Expenditures.** The words "Qualified Expenditures" mean those expenditures consisting of improvements and landscaping made to the Gonzales Butterfly Garden generally located at 309 St. Paul Street, City of Gonzales, Texas, and those expenses which otherwise meet the definition of "project" as that term is defined by Section 505.152 of the Act, and the definition of "cost" as that term is defined by Section 501.152 of the Act.
- (j) **Term.** The word "Term" means the term of this Agreement as specified in Section 2 of this Agreement.

#### SECTION 4. AFFIRMATIVE COVENANTS OF MAIN STREET.

Main Street covenants and agrees with the GEDC that while this Agreement is in effect, it shall comply with the following terms and conditions:

- (a) Qualified Expenditures to Gonzales Butterfly Garden. Main Street covenants and agrees to commence construction of the Qualified Expenditures by August 1, 2022. Main Street covenants and agrees to complete construction of the Qualified Expenditures by November 1, 2022. Further, Main Street covenants and agrees to submit to the GEDC invoices, receipts, or other documentation in a form acceptable to the GEDC for the Qualified Expenditures made to the Property in a minimum amount of Twenty-Five Thousand Eight Hundred Fifty-Four and No/100 Dollars (\$25,854.00) by December 31, 2022.
- (b) **Keep Open Gonzales Butterfly Garden.** Main Street covenants and agrees to keep open to the general public during normal operating hours during the Term of this Agreement the Gonzales Butterfly Garden.
- (c) Maintenance and Operating Costs. Main Street covenants and agrees to include within their annual budget as approved by City Council of the City funding for maintenance of the Gonzales Butterfly Garden.
- (d) **Performance**. Main Street covenants and agrees to perform and comply with all terms, conditions, and provisions set forth in this Agreement and in all other instruments and agreements by and between Main Street and GEDC.

#### SECTION 5. AFFIRMATIVE OBLIGATIONS OF GEDC.

GEDC covenants and agrees with Main Street that while this Agreement is in effect, it shall comply with the following terms and conditions:

- (a) Financial Assistance by GEDC. GEDC covenants and agrees to provide funding to Main Street in an amount not to exceed Twenty-Five Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$25,000.00) within thirty (30) days of receipt of invoices, receipts, or other documentation in accordance with Section 4(a) of this Agreement.
- (b) **Performance**. GEDC covenants and agrees to perform and comply with all terms, conditions, and provisions set forth in this Agreement and in all other instruments and agreements by and between GEDC and Main Street.

#### SECTION 6. CESSATION OF ADVANCES.

If GEDC has made any commitment to make any advance of funding to Main Street whether under this Agreement or under any other agreement, GEDC shall have no obligation to advance or disburse any financial assistance if: (i) Main Street becomes insolvent, files a petition in bankruptcy or similar proceedings, or is adjudged bankrupt; or (ii) an Event of Default occurs.

#### SECTION 7. EVENTS OF DEFAULT.

Each of the following shall constitute an Event of Default under this Agreement:

- (a) General Event of Default. Failure of Main Street or GEDC to comply with or to perform any other term, obligation, covenant or condition contained in this Agreement, or failure of Main Street or GEDC to comply with or to perform any other term, obligation, covenant or condition contained in any other agreement by and between Main Street and GEDC is an Event of Default.
- (b) **Insolvency.** Main Street's insolvency, appointment of receiver for any part of Main Street's property, any assignment for the benefit of creditors of Main Street, any type of creditor workout for Main Street or the commencement of any proceeding under any bankruptcy or insolvency laws by or against Main Street is an Event of Default.
- (c) Other Defaults. Failure of Main Street to comply with or to perform any other term, obligation, covenant or condition contained in this Agreement, or failure of Main Street to comply with or to perform any other term, obligation, covenant or condition contained in any other agreement by and between GEDC and Main Street is an Event of Default.

#### SECTION 8. EFFECT OF AN EVENT OF DEFAULT.

In the event of default under Section 7 of this Agreement, the non-defaulting party shall give written notice to the other party of any default, and the defaulting party shall have thirty (30) days to cure said default. Should said default remain uncured as of the last day of the applicable cure period, and the non-defaulting party is not otherwise in default, the non-defaulting party shall have the right to immediately terminate this Agreement, enforce specific performance as appropriate, or maintain a cause of action for damages caused by the event(s) of default.

#### SECTION 9. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.

The following miscellaneous provisions are a part of this Agreement:

- (a) Amendments. This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding and agreement of the parties as to the matters set forth in this Agreement. No alteration of or amendment to this Agreement shall be effective unless given in writing and signed by the party or parties sought to be charged or bound by the alteration or amendment.
- (b) Applicable Law and Venue. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, and all obligations of the parties created hereunder are performable in Gonzales County, Texas. Venue for any action arising under this Agreement shall lie in the state district courts of Gonzales County, Texas.
- (c) **Assignment.** This Agreement may not be assigned without the express written consent of the other party.

- (d) **Binding Obligation.** This Agreement shall become a binding obligation on the signatories upon execution by all signatories hereto. Main Street warrants and represents that the individual or individuals executing this Agreement on behalf of Main Street has full authority to execute this Agreement and bind Main Street to the same. GEDC warrants and represents that the individual executing this Agreement on its behalf has full authority to execute this Agreement and bind it to the same.
- (e) **Caption Headings**. Caption headings in this Agreement are for convenience purposes only and are not to be used to interpret or define the provisions of the Agreement.
