# **BACKGROUND:**

At its November 28, 2022, meeting, the Gonzales Economic Development Corporation (GEDC) approved renewing a Grazing Lease agreement with Mr. Bobby Tomas for the property GEDC owns at 2521 Harwood Rd. The lease term is for one year ending on December 31, 2023. Mr. Tomas agreed to pay GEDC \$750 per year and be responsible for paying the monthly water bill. Mr. Tomas also agreed to be responsible for maintaining the fences and mowing the property for brush once a year. If GEDC moves forward with the development of the property each party has 30 days to terminate the lease.

## **POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:**

GEDC is authorized to enter into consulting services agreements. Further, the GEDC may engage in economic development activities within the City limits, Gonzales County or regionally consistent with the Development Corporation Act, and with the approval of the GEDC Board of Directors and City Council.

## FISCAL IMPACT:

GEDC will receive \$750 per year in income. Mr. Tomas will take over the water utility account from GEDC because the water is only on to benefit his livestock. GEDC will no longer be responsible for the water at the property.

Section 1. The City Council of the City of Gonzales, Texas, does hereby approve the Lease Agreement between the Gonzales Economic Development Corporation and Bobby Tomas, a copy of which is attached hereto as *Exhibit A*, and is incorporated herein for all purposes.

Section 2. The recitals contained in the preamble hereof are hereby found to be true, and such recitals are hereby made a part of this Resolution for all purposes and are adopted as a part of the judgment and findings of the City Council.

Section 3. All resolutions or parts thereof, which are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Resolution shall be and remain controlling as to the matters resolved herein.

Section 4. This Resolution shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and the United States of America.

Section 5. If any provision of this Resolution or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be held to be invalid, the remainder of this Resolution and the application of such provision to other persons and circumstances shall nevertheless be valid, and the City Council hereby declares that this Resolution would have been enacted without such invalid provision.

Section 6. **NOW, THEREFORE**, for good and valuable consideration, including, but not limited to, Ten Dollars (\$10.00) which Lessee has this date paid to Lessor, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged and confessed, the Parties agree as follows:

1. Lessor hereby leases the Premises to Lessee for the sole and exclusive purpose of grazing cattle. Lessee shall not use the Premises, nor permit the same to be used, for any other purpose.

2. The term of this Lease shall be for a period of one (1) year commencing on the Effective Date and ending on **December 31, 2023**. Thereafter, the Lease shall automatically renew for successive terms of one (1) year each, unless this Lease is terminated by Lessee or Lessor in accordance with this Lease. Lessor or Lessee may terminate this Lease at any time during the initial term or any additional terms upon not less than thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other Party.

3. Lessee agrees to pay on the Effective Date of this Lease or the anniversary of the Effective Date the sum of **Seven Hundred Fifty and No/100 Dollars (\$750.00)** for each one (1) year term of this Lease, as provided in Section 2 of this Lease. In addition, Lessee agrees to pay the water utility bill for the Premises and mow the Premises at least one time per year.

4. Lessor reserves, and shall continue to have throughout the term of this Lease, the privilege and right to enter upon the Premises, but Lessor agrees to use reasonable efforts to not disturb Lessee's use or enjoyment of the Premises. Lessor shall not, however, be liable for any claims, demands, or causes of action raised on account of any loss, damage, or injury to persons or property caused by Lessee's use of the Premises, except to the extent such damage or injury is caused by Lessor's negligence or willful misconduct.

5. Lessee agrees to maintain all gates and fences and repair any damages that occurs on the Premises.

6. It is expressly understood and agreed by and between the Parties hereto that this Lease may not be assigned and/or sublet by Lessee.

7. The Parties agree that this Lease is and shall be subject to the provisions of Subchapter I, Chapter 271, Texas Local Government Code.

8. Any notice required or permitted under this Lease must be in writing and served by depositing same in the U.S. Mail, addressed to the party to be notified, postage pre-paid and registered or verified with return receipt requested. Notice given in accordance herewith shall be effective upon receipt of the addressee. For purposes of notice, the addresses of the Parties shall be as follows:

# **BACKGROUND:**

The voters of Gonzales voted to adopt the sales tax for economic development in 1997. The corporation's primary objective is to recruit and retain companies that create primary jobs. A primary job is defined as a job that is available at a company for which a majority of the products or services of that company are ultimately exported to regional, statewide, national or international markets infusing new dollars into the local economy. The TX ED Connection is a firm that focuses on attracting small to medium-sized manufacturers to Texas. The Texas Economic Development Connection is made up of a team of economic development professionals whose business goals align with GEDC's goals of attracting companies that create primary jobs.

At the November 28, 2022, Gonzales Economic Development Corporation meeting, the GEDC board unanimously approved renewing its annual contract with the Texas ED Connection.

# **POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:**

GEDC is authorized to enter into consulting services agreements. Further, the GEDC may engage in economic development activities within the City limits, Gonzales County or regionally consistent with the Development Corporation Act, and with the approval of the GEDC Board of Directors and City Council.

# FISCAL IMPACT:

The cost of the service is \$4,250. The GEDC has funds available in Professional Services line item for 2022-23 Fiscal Year. We also have funds for increased marketing efforts to meet our objective of new business recruitment.

# **BACKGROUND:**

Each month the City of Gonzales has an average of thirty utility accounts that are on the disconnect list. The disconnect list is printed and given to the City technician. The technician goes to each location, turns off the main breaker and puts a seal on the breaker box which locks the customer out of the electric meter. Every utility customer must have a main disconnect. The City has to disconnect them at the pole if a main disconnect is not available. Before the City will reconnect the customer, they must have a main disconnect installed. The City of Gonzales Code of Ordinances Section 13.207 describes the following for a meter: requirement, installation, maintenance, ownership, and tampering.

Staff has reviewed this section and would propose the following language in red to clarify some confusion on tampering. Staff feels that describing in more detail what the City considers as meter tampering will provide clarification and eliminate any misinterpretation regarding the matter.

### 13.207 Meters

(a) <u>Required</u>. Meters shall be required to measure the consumption of each utility service furnished by the city, except garbage collection and sewerage service.

(b) <u>Installation, Maintenance</u>. All meters required by this article and used to measure the consumption of utility services furnished by the city shall be installed and maintained by the city. (c) <u>Ownership</u>. All meters used for the measurement of the consumption of any utility service furnished by the city shall be the property of the city. It shall be unlawful for any person to install or maintain any meter for such purposes anywhere within the city which is not owned by the city.

(d) <u>Tampering With</u>. For purposes of enforcement under this section, tampering shall include any unlawful diversion of service, unauthorized use or consumption, or evidence of attempted unauthorized use of the city's utility by any person, other than a duly authorized employee of the city. Tampering further includes any manipulation of any meter in any manner that results in damage to the meter, or to manipulate or attempt to manipulate any meter in any manner so as to affect its registration or measurement of the metered utility service. Any violation shall result in the immediate discontinuation of utility service by the City without notice by the City. The following will be billed for meter tampering:

- (1) A minimum charge for meter tampering as stated in the Master Rate and Fee Schedule or actual damages, whichever is greater;
- (2) The cost of estimated or actual amount of utility service used without city authorization; and
- (3) An additional meter review fee as stated in the Master Rate and Fee Schedule for each trip made by city personnel to investigate, evaluate and correct the meter tampering or diversion.
- (4) All costs and fees regarding this account must be paid prior to reconnection.

### **POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:**

Amending the ordinance will amend the definition and provide clarification regarding what is considered meter tampering and the billing associated with the violation of the meter tampering section of the ordinance.

### FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no additional fiscal impact due to the costs already being charged and included within the Master rate and Fee Schedule. However, the amendment to the ordinance provides clarification of the charges that will be assessed.

### ORDINANCE NO. 2022-24

### AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GONZALES, TEXAS, AMENDING SECTION 13.207(D) TAMPERING IN THE CITY OF GONZALES CODE OF ORDINANCES; ESTABLISHING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 13.207 of the City of Gonzales Code of Ordinances was adopted in the 1995; and,

**WHEREAS**, the City Council may from time to time choose to amend, supplement, change or modify any section in the Code of Ordinances; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council finds that the proposed amendments of the City's regulations relating to meters are in the best interest of the health, safety, and general welfare of the City.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GONZALES, TEXAS:

Section 1. The City Council of the City of Gonzales, Texas hereby amends Section 13.207(d) Tampering in the City of Gonzales Code of Ordinances as shown on Exhibit A", which is fully incorporated herein by reference.

Section 2. The recitals contained in the preamble hereof are hereby found to be true, and such recitals are hereby made a part of this Ordinance for all purposes and are adopted as a part of the judgment and findings of the City Council.

Section 3. That this Ordinance shall be cumulative of all provisions of the City of Gonzales, Texas, except where the provisions of this Ordinance are in direct conflict with the provisions of such ordinances, in which event the more restrictive shall apply.

Section 4. All ordinances or parts thereof, which are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and remain controlling as to the matters resolved herein.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and the United States of America.

Section 6. If any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be held to be invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance and the application of such provision to other persons and circumstances shall nevertheless be valid, and the City Council hereby declares that this Ordinance would have been enacted without such invalid provision.

Section 7. It is officially found, determined, and declared that the meeting at which this Ordinance is adopted was open to the public and public notice of the time, place, and subject

matter of the public business to be considered at such meeting, including this Ordinance, was given, all as required by Chapter 551, Texas Government Code, as amended.

Section 8. This Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its final passage, and it is so resolved.

### EXHIBIT "A"

### 13.207 Meters

(a) <u>Required</u>. Meters shall be required to measure the consumption of each utility service furnished by the city, except garbage collection and sewerage service.

(b) <u>Installation, Maintenance</u>. All meters required by this article and used to measure the consumption of utility services furnished by the city shall be installed and maintained by the city.

(c) <u>Ownership</u>. All meters used for the measurement of the consumption of any utility service furnished by the city shall be the property of the city. It shall be unlawful for any person to install or maintain any meter for such purposes anywhere within the city which is not owned by the city.

### 13.207 Meters

(a) <u>Required</u>. Meters shall be required to measure the consumption of each utility service furnished by the city, except garbage collection and sewerage service.

(b) <u>Installation</u>, <u>Maintenance</u>. All meters required by this article and used to measure the consumption of utility services furnished by the city shall be installed and maintained by the city.

(c) <u>Ownership</u>. All meters used for the measurement of the consumption of any utility service furnished by the city shall be the property of the city. It shall be unlawful for any person to install or maintain any meter for such purposes anywhere within the city which is not owned by the city.

(d) <u>Tampering With</u>. For purposes of enforcement under this section, tampering shall include any unlawful diversion of service, unauthorized use or consumption, or evidence of attempted unauthorized use of the city's utility by any person, other than a duly authorized employee of the city. Tampering further includes any manipulation of any meter in any manner that results in damage to the meter, or to manipulate or attempt to manipulate any meter in any manner so as to affect its registration or measurement of the metered utility service. Any violation shall result in the immediate discontinuation of utility service by the City without notice by the City. The following will be billed for meter tampering:

- (5) A minimum charge for meter tampering as stated in the Master Rate and Fee Schedule or actual damages, whichever is greater;
- (6) The cost of estimated or actual amount of utility service used without city authorization; and
- (7) An additional meter review fee as stated in the Master Rate and Fee Schedule for each trip made by city personnel to investigate, evaluate and correct the meter tampering or diversion.
- (8) All costs and fees regarding this account must be paid prior to reconnection.
