MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF GONZALES CONVENTION AND VISITORS BUREAU

Thursday, March 9, 2017 City Hall ~ 820 St. Joseph 12:00pm

Call to Order and Certification of Quorum

Chairman Crozier called the meeting to order at 12:00pm. A quorum was declared present.

Members present: Barbara Crozier, Dawn O'Donnell, Clint Hille, Ann Covert, Ken Morrow, Holly Danz, Paul Frenzel; Members absent: Alison Rodriguez, Chris Kappmeyer; Ex offico present: none; Staff present: Anne Dollary, JB Wells; City Officials present: Barbara Friedrich, Mayor Connie Kacir, Gary Schurig, Tim Patek; Guests: none

Public Comments: Mayor Kacir wants to make sure we don't lose any lodging, we need to seize the moment in regards to tourism and keep visitors coming in. If we are going to be spending reserves based on how budgets have been written, Mayor would like to see reserves spent on someone who can do the work to promote our city, in a tourism director. She also noted that there isn't a current contract between the Visitors's Center and the Tourism Board/City. We need to outline a scope of work and get something in place. A museum board has also been created.

1. Approval of Minutes: The minutes of the February 9, 2017 meetings were approved, pending the change of "all but 2 billboards were cut".

Action Items:

 Discuss and Consider Meet Me in Gonzales advertising. Ann Covert received lots of good input, but received it too close to the meeting, so this is an ongoing project. Will report at next month's meeting.

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- 3. **Discuss and Consider Visit Widget for Gonzales, Texas.** Setup fee of \$2500, plus a basic plan of \$200/month. Clint Hille moved to table this item until next meeting, Holly Danz seconded; motion carried.
- 4. **Discuss and Consider 10-point plan for marketing new events.** Chris Kappmeyer has created a plan for bringing new events to the city. A mock post card was distributed to the group, listing the plan. Some of the wording needs to be tweaked, but otherwise a vibrant, useful marketing piece. Dawn O'Donnell questioned how this would be paid for. As long as we can send a portion to out of town addresses, we should be fine paying for it. Chris had mentioned he would pay what wasn't covered. Also suggested to blast it out via email; this may be a more beneficial/cost saving avenue. Dawn O'Donnell moved to table this item to next meeting, Clint Hille seconded; motion carried.

Reports

- 5. Report Regarding Advertising, Billboards, Website, and use and distribution of the video Rick Green has supplied. As of May 11th, we will be down to 2 billboards; one on I-10 and one at 183 & I1-30. No report on the website; if you haven't reviewed the new site, please do so before next meeting. Awaiting to hear from Jill Schauer in regards to the Rick Green video. Barbara Crozier and Genora Young will work with Jill on this to get it done. Gerri Lawing has taken over the Facebook page, and is currently posting. Texas Monthly did have a mention of Belle Oaks Inn in their Hidden Texas Treasures piece. The brochure is in TxDot's hands, as we will need their approval since they will be delivering these brochures to the state entry points. Will have 10,000 copies of these printed in the interim, so we can distribute to local businesses.
- 6. Report on Occupancy Trends. No report for the month.
- 7. Report from Ann Dollery on the Expo Center at JB Wells Park. Honky Tonk Festival was not as well attended as they would have hoped. BBQ cookoff was well represented, 57 teams. But they still want to come back and put on another function. Lights Festival was cancelled for April, but rescheduled for September 2nd. Hoping it will have a good turnout for Labor Day weekend. Magic 95 was cancelled due to immigration concerns. Starting to get ready for Jr. High Finals, and Texas Relay.
- 8. **Report from advisory members on Event Development**. Barbara Crozier will be looking for volunteers for Texas Independence Week 2018; wanting to capitalize on our history to attract people to our city. Grounds and Garden tour will be held in 2018. Chris Kappmeyer working on gun/ammo event next spring.
- 9. **Report on Upcoming Events**. VFW BBQ Cookoff March 17-18th, Texas Independence Relay March 25-26th, Relay for Life March 31st, PBR April 1st, Texas Jr. High Rodeo Finals May 22nd-28th, Anne would like to see volunteers welcoming the participants to the grounds and city; Gonzales Dental Ribbon Cutting March 10th, Master Gardner's plant sale March 25th, Edwards Jones Grand Opening April 7th.
- 10. Financial Report. February breakdown was reviewed, expo bond payment was made so this caused the significant change in balance funds. Still looking at a year-end revenue of \$200-225,000; need to be diligent and watch our spending while still trying to fill the hotel rooms. Ann Covert questioned the Main Street numbers; those are allocated to the summer concert series.

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HOTEL OCCUPANCY TAX USE GUIDELINES UNDER TEXAS STATE LAW AND FUNDING APPLICATION FORM

State Law: By law of the State of Texas, the City of Gonzales collects a Hotel Occupancy Tax (HOT) from hotels, motels, bed & breakfasts and inns. Under state law, the revenue from the HOT may be used only to directly promote tourism and the hotel and convention hotel industry. Chapter 351 of the Tax Code states that the use of HOT funds is limited to:

- a. Convention Centers and Visitor Information Centers: the acquisition of sites for and the construction, improvement, enlarging, equipping, repairing operation and maintenance of convention facilities or visitor information centers, or both;
- b. Registration of Convention Delegates: the furnishing of facilities personnel, and materials for the registration of convention delegates or registrants;
- c. Advertising, Solicitations and Promotions that Directly Promote Tourism and the Hotel and Convention Industry: advertising and conducting solicitations and promotional programs to attract tourists and convention delegates or registrants to the municipality or its vicinity;
- d. Promotions of the Arts that Directly Promote Tourism and the Hotel and Convention Industry: the encouragement, promotion, improvement, and application of the arts that can be shown to have some direct impact on tourism and the hotel/convention industry. The impact may be that the art facility or event can show hotel nights that are booked due to their events or that guests at hotels attend the arts event. Eligible forms of art include instrumental and vocal music, dance, drama, folk art, creative writing, architecture, design and allied fields, painting, sculpture, photography, graphic and craft arts, motion picture, radio, television, tape and sound recording, and other arts related to the presentation, performance, execution, and exhibition of these major art forms.
- e. Historical Restoration and Preservation Activities that Directly Promote Tourism and the Hotel and Convention Industry: historical restoration and preservation projects or activities or advertising and conducting solicitation and promotional programs to encourage tourists and convention delegates to visit preserved historic sites or museums.
- f. Sporting Event Expenses that Substantially Increase Economic Activity at Hotels: Expenses including promotional expenses directly related to a sporting event in which the majority of participants are tourists who substantially increase economic activity at hotels and motels within the city or it vicinity.
- g. Funding transportation systems for transporting tourists from hotels to and near the city to any of the following destinations:
 - 1. the commercial center of the city;
 - 2. a convention center in the city;
 - 3. other hotels in or near the city; or
 - 4. tourist attractions in or near the city.

The law specifically prohibits the use of the local hotel tax to cover the costs for general city transit costs to transport the general public.

h. Signage directing tourists to sights and attractions that are visited frequently by hotel guests in the municipality.

City Policy: The City of Gonzales accepts applications from groups and businesses whose program fits into one or more of the above categories. All requests for funds should be submitted in writing accompanied by the official application two weeks prior to the Tourism Committee Meeting which is held on the second Tuesday of the month. The application will be reviewed by the Gonzales Tourism Committee at the earliest possible regularly scheduled meeting. The applicant may be asked to be present at the meeting to answer any questions regarding the application. Applicants will be notified one week prior to the meeting of the time and place for the review. City Council will have final approval for any application requesting over \$2,500.00. The Gonzales Tourism Committee will make a recommendation to the City Council. The City Council will make the final decision on your request. You will be notified when City Council will address your request. Attendance is required.

Eligibility and Priority for Hotel Tax Funds: Priority will be given to those events and entities based on their ability to generate overnight visitors to Gonzales. The amount that you are requesting should not exceed more than 25 percent of the gross amount of hotel night revenue that you are predicting that will be created or sustained by your event. If an event will not generate any meaningful hotel night activity, it is not eligible for receipt of hotel occupancy tax funds. Events can prove this potential to generate overnight visitors by:

- a) historic information on the number of room nights used during previous years of the same events;
- b) current information on the size of a room block that has been reserved at area hotels to accommodate anticipated overnight guests attending the event requesting hotel tax funds;
- c) historical information on the number of guests at hotel or other lodging facilities that attended the funded event; and/or
- d) examples of marketing of the programs and activities that are likely to generate encourage overnight visitors to local lodging properties.

Use of Local Vendors: The Gonzales Tourism Committee encourages all event organizers to patronize Gonzales businesses for food, supplies, materials, printing, etc.

Use of Revenues from Event: A portion of the revenues from any event and/or project receiving any type of funding assistance from the HOT funds should be channeled back into the future costs of operating that same event or the continued operation of the project. No other outside event(s), project, charity, etc., sponsored by the host organization may profit from the City of Gonzales's funding of a particular event.







Just 17 miles off I-10 you will find a rural setting worth visiting. In the town there is a compelling sense of history, over one hundred- fifty years old. Established in 1825 as the capital of the westernmost Anglo settlement in Texas, Gonzales is nestled in the beautiful Guadalupe River valley in south central Texas. As a frontier settlement, Gonzales was destined to play an important role in Texas history. The first shot in the struggle for Texas' independence from Mexico was fired here October 2, 1835. Texans, with their new battle flag proudly waving, shouted their battle cry, "Come and Take It!" Thirty two men from the Gonzales area left just a few months after this battle to aid the men at the Alamo. History runs deep in Gonzales. Had it not been for the courageous settlers who fought and died in the battle of the Alamo and the valiant volunteers who fought and won at the Battle of San Jacinto, Texas would probably still be a part of Mexico.

Gonzales' rich history can be traced by touring the local Museums and taking a stroll through the downtown area. There are ambassadors for Gonzales that will cheerfully tour you around town and help you revisit the history. They may also entertain you with intriguing stories of the past. It's all about a moment, a place, an experience – a reverence for days gone by. Discover Gonzales.....for History. Meet, mix and mingle. A weekend in Gonzales will be a great getaway.

In its 123 years, the Gonzales Court House bears witness to our town's history and even its own evolution. Gonzales has built 4 court houses. From a clapboard building in early 1800s, others that burned, to a Romanesque brick monument for justice built in 1894, the Court House stands regally in the center of town.

POINTS OF INTEREST.....places that make Gonzales unique

A trip to Gonzales' past......Original pre-1900 pioneer log homes, fixtures and artifacts can be seen at the Gonzales Pioneer Village. This rural campus exposes you to the days gone by – when Texas first began. Early Texas houses authentically restored. This is a living history center. Reflect on pioneer life at a restored blacksmith shop, a broom factory an 1830s log cabin and an 1870s cypress-sided church. The Gonzales Memorial Museum chronicles the days of the rough, tough days of the 1800s. Hundreds of exhibits delight the eye and a sense of our history is captured. Centerpiece is the historic "Come & Take It" cannon. The tour of the **Old Jail Museum** begins with a video that will brief you on law enforcement in the old west. The gallows and the collection of guns and weapons will show you up close and personal the way of justice back when. The State Association of Pioneers' Museum is housed in one of the first schools in the area. This exhibit is from the Witte Museum. You will find hidden surprises of history there. Touch the Great Outdoors in Palmetto State Park. Open every day, this tropical adventures offers bird watching, strolling and camping. **SIDE TRIPS FROM GONZALES** include the fun little brewery in Shiner. Go by and have a cool one. There is the Wolters' Museum where you can catch the history of Shiner. The Catholic Church has notable art painted in it from wayfarers traveling through in the 1800s. The painted churches in Schulenburg are about 45 minutes from here.

SHOPPING.....away from the busy Malls.....there's one- of- a- kind stuff here. So many stops for shopping — you cn spend an afternoon working your way down our shops. You must come early. Angels and Outlaws is an exciting clothing store where you will find chic western wear, women's clothes, jewelry and wearable art. Metal art and fun yard pieces can be found at **Halamicek's** housed in the former first post office for Gonzales. The Main Street Market and Carriage House Collectables is a little like Round Top Days – or Canton.....lots of antiques, one- of- a- kind. Along with the Saddle Shop the scent of leather is found in other places here. Surely you can find a treasure to take home to remember us by! POST EVENT REPORT FORM

HOTEL OCCUPANCY TAX FUNDING

By law of the State of Texas, the City of Gonzales collects a Hotel Occupancy Tax (HOT) from hotels, motels, and bed & breakfast inns. The revenue from the HOT may be used only to directly promote tourism and the convention and hotel industry. The use of HOT funds is limited to:

- a. Convention Centers and Visitor Information Centers: the acquisition of sites for and the construction, improvement, enlarging, equipping, repairing operation and maintenance of convention center facilities or visitor information centers, or both;
- b. **Registration of Convention Delegates:** the furnishing of facilities, personnel, and materials for the registration of convention delegates or registrants;
- c. Advertising, Solicitations and Promotions that Directly Promote Tourism and the Hotel and Convention Industry: advertising and conducting solicitations and promotional programs to attract tourists and convention delegates or registrants to the municipality or its vicinity;
- d. **Promotions of the Arts that Directly Promote Tourism and the Hotel and Convention Industry:** the encouragement, promotion, improvement, and application of the arts that can be shown to have some direct impact on tourism and the hotel/convention industry. The impact may be that the art facility or event can show hotel nights that are booked due to their events or those guests at hotels attend the arts event. Eligible forms of art include instrumental and vocal music, dance drama, folk art, creative writing, architecture, design and allied fields, painting sculpture photography, graphic and craft arts, motion picture, radio, television, tape and sound recording, and other arts related the presentation, performance, execution, and exhibition of these major art forms.
- e. Historical Restoration and Preservation Activities that Directly Promote Tourism and the Hotel and Convention Industry: historical restoration and preservation projects or activities or advertising and conducting solicitation and promotional programs to encourage tourists and convention delegates to visit preserved historic sites or museums.
- f. Sporting Event Expenses that Substantially Increase Economic Activity at Hotels: Sporting related expenses if the majority of the participants are tourists. The event must substantially increase economic activity at hotels within the City or its vicinity.
- g. Funding transportation systems for transporting tourists from hotels to and near the city to any of the following destinations:

- 1. the commercial center of the city;
- 2. a convention center in the city;
- 3. other hotels in or near the city; or
- 4. tourist attractions in or near the city.

The law specifically prohibits the use of the local hotel tax to cover the costs for general city transit costs to transport the general public.

h. Signage directing tourists to sights and attractions that are visited frequently by hotel guests in the municipality.

The City of Gonzales accepts applications from groups and businesses meeting the above criteria and wishing to receive HOT funds. All entities that are approved for such funds must submit a Post Event Report Form within 60 days of each funded event. The report will be reviewed by the GCVB to determine how well the entity met its goals and be used in consideration of future hotel occupancy tax funding requests. Priority will be given to those events that demonstrate an ability to generate overnight visitors to Gonzales.
