GENERAL INFORMATION:

All animals in this show must comply with Florida state health rules. If your animal has an RFID tag that cannot be read by hand you are responsible to provide a reader. Only females of the four major dairy breeds can be shown. Grade animals must possess characteristics of their particular breed. Crossbred animals are not allowed. No animals are to be moved through the barn **for any reason** during the fair hours, unless authorized and accompanied by a Superintendent.

*Please note, the number of exhibitors may be limited based on available facilities. YOU WILL BE NOTIFIED NO LATER THAN MARCH 20th IF THERE WILL BE ANY CHANGES TO YOUR ENTRY.

APPEARANCE OF EXHIBITOR:

At all times upon exhibiting your animal in the show ring, exhibitors must adhere to the following: Clothes and person must be neat and clean; white long-sleeved shirt with collar and white pants are preferred. Durable protective shoes are required when large animals are exhibited. If you are not in appropriate attire you will not be able to compete.

ELIGIBILITY:

The 4-H/FFA Youth Dairy Show is open to 4-H and FFA members in good standing. Youth must be present to show animals.

DATE OF SHOW:

Friday, March 31, 2023 6:00 PM.

ORDER OF SHOWS:

Mini Moo Show, Jr. Showmanship, Intermediate Showmanship, Sr. Showmanship, Sr. Fitting and Grooming, Holstein, Brown Swiss, Jersey, Guernsey.

CHECK IN:

Wednesday, March 29, 2023– by appointment (please contact the superintendent at 904-755-2467 at least a week in advance) Thursday, March 30, 2023 9:00 AM - 11:00 AM

CHECK OUT TIME:

Saturday, April 1, 2023 11:00 PM - Sunday, April 2, 2023 10:00 A.M.

ANIMAL CATEGORY:

Show will have two (2) Animal Categories:

- 1. Registered Animals
- 2. Graded Animals

A member may enter NO more than three (3) animals in the entire show. A member may bring a fourth dairy animal if it is bred by exhibitor, but will not be eligible to compete in class or show.

All dairy show animals must have been owned and under the control of each 4-H or FFA member on his/her premises (land under his/her control) or FFA Agricultural Barn. Registration papers and/or grade identity papers of all animals must be available upon arrival and presented to the Superintendent and must show the member's name as owner for at least sixty (60) days.

ALL animals must be polled or dehorned. Scurs and a small amount of secondary growth of horns may be accepted or determined to be unsafe based upon the animals' behavior and its ability to be handled. This decision will be made by the Livestock Committee.

Due to the high cost of animals, the practice of leasing animals for the show is permitted, but it must be under the exhibitor's direct care for at least 60 days prior to the opening of the Fair. All animals must be owned by the exhibitor or the family of the exhibitor. No "borrowing" from another breeder will be allowed.

CLASSES:

- 1. Junior calves born September 1, 2022 November 30, 2022
- 2. Intermediate heifer calves born June 1, 2022 August 31, 2022
- 3. Senior heifer calves born March 1, 2022 May 31, 2022
- 4. Winter yearlings born December 1, 2021 February 28, 2022
- 5. Junior yearlings born September 1, 2021 November 30, 2021
- 6. Summer yearlings born June 1, 2021- August 31, 2021
- 7. Senior Yearlings born March 1, 2021 May 31, 2021

A Junior Champion and Junior Reserve Champion in both categories will be chosen from classes 1 thru 7 above.

- 8. Junior two-year old, born September 1, 2020- February 28, 2021
- 9. Senior two-year old, born March 1, 2020 August 31, 2021
- 10. Junior three-year-old, born September 1, 2019 February 28, 2020
- 11. Senior three-year-old, born March 1, 2019 August 31, 2019
- 12. Four-year-old, born March 1, 2018 February 28, 2019
- 13. Aged Cows, born before March 1, 2018

A Senior Champion and Senior Reserve Champion in both categories will be chosen from classes 8 thru 13 above.

An Overall Grand and Overall Reserve Grand Champion will be selected from the grand and reserve of each dairy breed by the judge. The winners will both receive belt buckles.

Moo Open Show

This show is for showmanship only for youth ages 5 -7 and youth age 8 who have not shown in a dairy show. A Mini Moo entry form can be completed online. This show will be judged on the exhibitor's ability to exhibit the animal and their knowledge about the animal. Animals must be between the ages of four months and one year old and a dairy breed. Participants must use an animal of an older exhibitor entered in the 4-H/FFA Dairy Show. Entries may be limited due to available calves.

During the show competitors will be required to wear durable protective shoes, long pants and a show shirt.

4-H/FFA SHOWMANSHIP AND FITTING CONTEST:

Youth exhibitors are judged on how well their animals are fitted for the show and on the exhibitor's ability to show a dairy animal in the ring.

JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP CONTEST:

Ages: 8-10 as of September 1, 2022

INTERMEDIATE SHOWMANSHIP CONTEST:

Ages: 11-13 as of September 1, 2022

SENIOR SHOWMANSHIP CONTEST:

Ages: 14-18 as of September 1, 2022 (not graduated)

SENIOR FITTING & GROOMING CONTEST:

Age: 14 and over as of September 1, 2022

Seniors are expected to take full responsibility for their animals. This includes but is not limited to feeding, watering, walking or grooming. If you need help with your animal check with the superintendent first. If you receive any help in grooming your animal, you will be disqualified from the fitting and grooming and showmanship contest.

With showmanship being held as the first event in the show, the exhibitor is expected to continue showing throughout the entire show accordingly. If you are awarded showmanship, the judge has the ability to pull your award due to lack of showmanship expressed. Therefore, you will have to forfeit the honor and premium money. The next exhibitor in placing will receive the award and so on.

All exhibitors will be judged for this award during the **hours the fair is open** on <u>Thursday</u>, <u>Friday</u> (until 2:00 when we close the barn for the show), and <u>Saturday</u> until the Fair closes.

CLAY COUNTY SPIRIT AWARD:

The Clay County Spirit Award is given to one individual who exemplifies what the Clay County fair is all about. This contest will be judged from check-in to check-out. The winner will receive \$20.00.

SPECIAL AWARDS:

Special Award Money may be made available through private donations and, if available, will be awarded in certain categories as determined by the Superintendent. The Fair Association will not be responsible for these Special awards.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR:

A \$50 exhibitor fee will be paid for an animal classified as bred by exhibitor. This animal is not eligible to compete in classes or show and will be limited to one (1) animal per exhibitor.

All premium award money will be forfeited if not collected by the end of the Fair.
