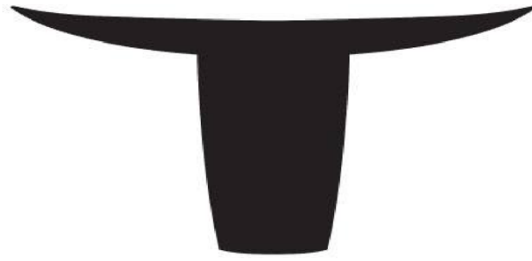

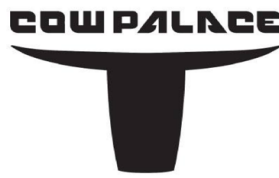

General Rules

Please read the following rules carefully. Any exhibitor found to be violating any of the stated rules may face consequences under management's discretion, which may lead to the disqualification of entries and/or return of all awards/honors and premium money will not be paid. Management is the deciding factor in the interpretation of the following rules. The Cow Palace Grand National Junior Livestock Show is a Jackpot Show and as such will not follow the California State Rules. Any and all complaints will be handled by the livestock office as they see fit. Livestock Management will have the final say on any and all issues presented during and after the Grand National Junior Livestock Show. Livestock Management has the right to adjust premiums pay outs as they see fit based on the number of entries in a division, if there are not more that 10 entries in the division or class, premiums will not be paid and/or divisions may be combined. Premiums may be reduced from what is scheduled in this book if entries money does not meet expectations when these premiums were written.

1. The Grand National Junior Livestock Show is a public event, exhibitors will be required to keep their tack and pen areas clean and presentable for the public at all times.
2. Ethical treatment of all animals and ethical conduct is expected at all times from all parties including but not limited to exhibitors, parents, leaders, assistants, fitters and family. If a party associated to an exhibitor is caught in violation the associated exhibitor will be dismissed from the Grand National Junior Livestock Show, with the possibility of future disqualification for up to 5 years depending on severity of case.
3. There will be NO refunds of entry money. No exceptions whatsoever.
4. The Grand National Junior Livestock Show Management reserves the right to change classes, show order, stalling and the show schedule at any time to improve the show.
5. First Bedding will not be provided- Shavings will not be for sale on site. Please plan accordingly.
6. All animals must be stalled in the location designated by management. Any discrepancies must be brought to the attention of the individual barn manager or livestock office. We try to accommodate stall requests, however, due to space constraint, requests may not be met. The Grand National Junior Livestock Show will have the following options available for stalling:
 1. Working Trailer Spaces (Located on the outside of the Cow Palace Building- exhibitors must specify the size of trailer on their online entries and must reserve a space by paying a \$400 fee.) Spaces are a first come first serve on location exhibitors may not save spaces around them, a space is only reserved with the exhibitor's trailer, no other items or vehicles may be used to save spots. A limited number of spaces will be sold.
 2. Pens and tie outs: If an exhibitor does not purchase a working trailer space they will automatically be assigned pens/tie out spaces. The ONLY way to request pens/tie outs to be located next to another exhibitor is during your original online entry under the "Stall Request" field by typing the EXACT same phrase in. For

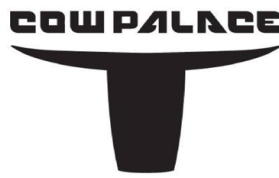


example, if 3 families with different last names would like to be stalled together they should all write “EXAMPLE GROUP” that way when stalling is being assigned we can easily locate those exhibitors who wish to be together, if one family writes “Example” another “Ex group” they will not be stalled together, if you want your pens together please take the time to be sure to enter the exact phrase identically for all parties wanting to be stalled together.

3. Cattle ONLY- Outdoor Stalls will be available for purchase during your online entry for \$150.00. There are 10 of these pens available that are all 24’X28’ that will be for purchase, once all are sold, we will close the division online regardless if it is before entries close. Please enter early if you would like one of these outdoor pens.
7. All Personal Generators must be placed on the outside of the Cow Palace building, exhibitors may run extension cords into the building to access their power. All Generators must be accompanied with a permit purchased through the Showwork’s Entry Portal.
8. Due to limited space, the Grand National Junior Livestock Show reserves the right to take away excess stalls, if necessary, regardless if the exhibitor entered excessive head to achieve getting this space. Management will assign stalls and areas determined by the number of head the exhibitor brings on grounds.
9. Exhibitors must only exhibit their own animals in all showmanship, breeding and market classes, unless prior arrangements have been made with show management or if the original exhibitor is in another ring on show grounds.
 - If an exhibitor has two animals in the same class, another 2023 Grand National Junior Livestock Show exhibitor may show the second animal.
10. Any animal exhibiting signs of infectious diseases or any unsightly conditions will not be permitted to show at the Grand National Junior Livestock Show as determined by show Management and will be required to be removed from Grand National Junior Livestock Show Pens immediately.
11. Permitted Bedding Includes: Shavings, Wood pelleted shavings, hay, straw, AstroTurf or artificial grass and shade cloth covered shavings. No sawdust as the use of bedding will be permitted on grounds. Exhibitors may bring AstroTurf artificial grass, shade cloth, but must take these items with them at the end of the livestock show. Leaving on premises following the end of the show or disposing on site is prohibited.
12. Livestock will be released as exhibitors finish their last class not at the end of the show. We kindly ask that you are mindful while loading out and take as little time as possible to pack your belongings and load your animals.
13. All dogs on the fairgrounds must be on a leash and manageable at all times. Management staff reserves the right to ask any dog and/or their owner to leave the grounds if it seems unsafe or a bother to animal exhibits on grounds.
14. Per Fire Marshal code, exhibitors are welcome to utilize tarps and heat lamps. However, the use of both tarps and heat lamps or other sources of heat, will only be permitted if the top of the stall is uncovered and the heat lamp is at least 5 feet from the tarp in all directions. Stalls found to be in violation will be asked to remove one or both items, if exhibitors are not present management reserves the right to correct the problem as they see fit.



15. Hogs under 125lbs may be intact in the market show. No sheep, goats, or cattle may be intact in the market shows.
16. Animals deemed uncontrollable by Management will not be allowed to show, and will be asked to leave grounds immediately. Animals and their exhibitors will be given 3 strikes of an exhibitor losing control, or not being able to manage their animals before the animal will be disqualified from the show entirely, no entry money will be returned.
17. **Unethical fitting:** Animals showing any signs of being unethically fit will be disqualified. Examples of unethical fitting include, but are not limited to, the following
 - Application of paint, dye, or any other substance to any part of the animal's body that attempts to change the color pattern or alter any other aspect of the apparent breed characteristic of an animal;
 - Cosmetically altering the form or function of an animal's foot or feet by the application of resin, epoxy, or other foreign substance.
 - Injection, drenching or application of any substance per the animal's rectum;
 - Draining of fluids by means of needle or syringe;
 - Artificially filling by stomach pumping or airing injections.
 - Additions of hair or hair-like substances will not be permitted on ANY species. This includes naturally occurring hair from the animal being removed, or clipped and attached or glued to another area of their body to alter their appearance.
18. Exhibitors must be entered into Show A to be eligible to show in Show B.
19. Exhibitors whom wish to late enter must at least have one animal entered in their name online prior to day of entries on site.



Camping

The Grand National Junior Livestock Show will offer camping through our online portal only. Spaces will be sold until we are sold out and the division will close when they are full regardless if it is before the entry deadline. Camping spaces are good the night of Thursday October 5th- check out by Sunday October 8th Campers must be off grounds no later than Midnight October 8th. If campers wish to stay Sunday night, they may come to the livestock office and purchase a one night \$50 permit to stay Sunday night.

1. VIP Camping- Spaces located under the sign marque on Genova St. Closest camping to the South Hall side of the Cow Palace building. VIP spaces are \$350.00/Space. Limited to 4 Spaces.
2. Dry Camping Spaces- Spaces are located in the South Lot. \$150.00/ Space Limited to 30 Spaces.

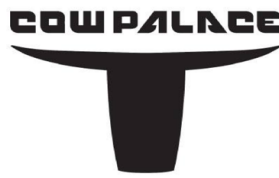

Parking

Working trailer spaces will be provided one parking permit for their vehicle that is towing their trailer. Trailer must be detached from the vehicle and parked in the day use parking area. You are purchasing a spot for your trailer not your truck or the vehicle towing the trailer.

All other vehicles on grounds will need to have a general parking pass on their car, those can be purchased online through the entry portal for \$15 each.

Empty stock trailers that need to be parked while animals are housed in stalls can park free of charge in the South Lot as designated by management.

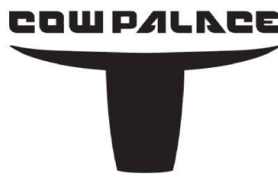

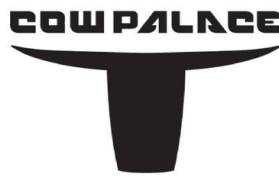

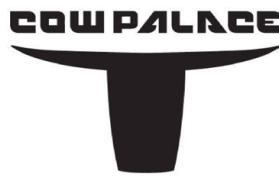

1. All Steer, Hog, Lamb and Goat exhibitors must be 5 to 21 years of age as of January 1, 2023.
2. Exhibitors must show their own animals. The only exception is beginner showmanship, if a beginner showman does not have an animal entered they may show another exhibitors' animal in showmanship only.
3. Exhibitors who are entered in the incorrect division will be disqualified, if not corrected with the office before the start of their show. Exhibitors are responsible for confirming they are entered in the correct showmanship division; management is not at fault for exhibitors' error in entry.
4. Exhibitors are required to notify the office if they plan to scratch from showmanship. These scratches must be reported to the office at least 1 hour before the start of the respected show the exhibitor plans to scratch from.
5. Wether dam does, and Wether dam ewes are eligible to be shown in goat showmanship and sheep showmanship respectfully. Dairy goats, Registered breeding sheep and goats only entered in the ABGA/JABGA shows may not be used in these showmanship divisions unless they are cross entered.
6. Each Species will start with a different age division please, read the schedule to be clear when your exhibitors will show.
7. Showmanship heats will change between Saturday and Sunday shows, please be advised to double check class breaks.
8. Exhibitors may not roll up or down to different heats without preapproval of management, the ONLY acceptable reason to move heats is if the exhibitor is in another show ring with a different species. Exhibitors who miss their heats cannot roll into a different heat. No exceptions whatsoever.

3. Market sheep may not have yearling teeth.
4. Ewes shown in the market show will not be allowed to show in the Wether Dam shows.
5. All black face market lamb classes will be broken by weight into divisions 4 & 5 after weigh in determined by management.
6. Exhibitors will call their own weights on weight cards provided a 7lb+/- weigh back allowance will be permitted.

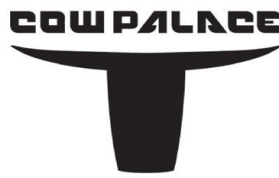

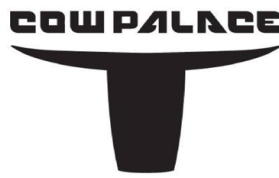

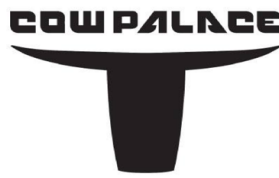

1. The Market Hog Show is open to both gilts and barrows.
2. Exhibitors will call their own weights on weight cards provided. A 15lb+/- weigh back allowance will be permitted.
3. Only hogs under 125lbs may be intact at time of show.
4. Hogs entered in the Breeding Gilt Show may NOT be entered in the Market Hog Show.
5. This is a non-papered show, breeds will be determined by appearance.
6. No snares or snare-like devices will be allowed.
7. Market Swine will be broken by breed, then by weight. The following breed divisions will be offered:
 1. Division 1- Duroc
 2. Division 2- Hampshire
 3. Division 3- Yorkshire
 4. Division 4- Light AOB
 5. Division 5- Dark AOB
 6. Division 6- Light Crossbred
 7. Division 7- Dark Crossbred
 8. Division 8- All Black

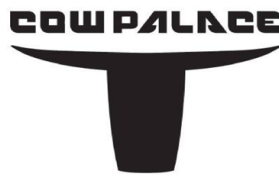

Class Premiums will be paid based on number of entries determined after weigh in.

1. Transportation slips must be turned in at the time of weigh in.
2. Weight Cards must be picked up at the office before animals can cross the scale.
3. The Market Show will be broken into the following divisions:
 1. Division 1- Black/Black Cross
 2. Division 2- All Other Colors
 3. Division 3- British (Angus, Shorthorn, Hereford)
 4. Division 4- Market Heifers
4. Market Heifers will NOT be broken by breed, only by weight.
5. An overall Division Champion will be selected for each Division (Prospect, Progress and Market), those Champions will then advance to the Supreme Drive.
6. Blocking chutes will be allowed in areas designated by Management ONLY. These areas will be allotted on a first come, first served basis.
7. Use of artificial tail heads, switches or unnatural substances such as twine in the fitting of cattle is prohibited. Exhibitors found to be using any unnatural substances in the fitting of their animals will be disqualified. NO EXCEPTIONS.

1. Exhibitors must check-in with original registration papers or be able to pull up information on a Breed Association website. Animals must be registered in the exhibitor's name. NO EXCEPTIONS. Heifers without registration papers will be moved to the Commercial division.
2. ALL HEIFERS MUST BE CHECKED IN AT THE LIVESTOCK OFFICE BY 9PM ON FRIDAY
3. Heifer Divisions are as follows:
 1. Division 1- Angus
 2. Division 2- Hereford
 3. Division 3- Shorthorn
 4. Division 4- Main Anjou/ Mainetainer
 5. Division 5- Charolais
 6. Division 6- Chi-X/Chi Maine
 7. Division 7- All Other Breeds
4. Appendix Shorthorn Females (green registration papers) will be shown in the All Other Breeds division.
5. The Maine Anjou Division combines Maine Anjou and Mainetainers. Mainetainer registration papers are noted as "Mainetainer" registration.
6. Commercial heifers will be shown according to weight and must be weighed in by the time the scale closes on Friday at 9PM Commercial heifers will not be eligible to compete for Supreme Champion Female.
7. Breeding Heifer Age Limits: Must be born on or before June 30, 2023 and cannot be born before January 1, 2021.



Open Cattle Show

1. All registered purebred breeding females 24 months of age or older opening day of the show must: (1) have a calf; or (2) show obvious signs of pregnancy; or (3) have a vet certificate of pregnancy; or (4) have a vet certificate stating that the animal is or has been an embryo producing female.
2. Nose rings are required on all bulls 12 months and older.
3. Note: Show may combine divisions if number of entries falls below 3 breeders and 20 head. If there are more than 12 animals in a class then the class will be split

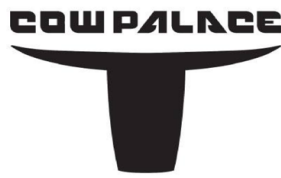

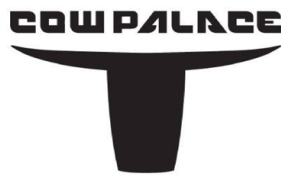

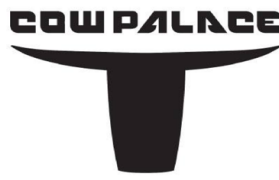

ABGA & JABGA Show

This show will be ABGA/JABGA sanctioned and will follow the association rules listed below. For a complete list of JABGA/ABGA rules visit: <https://www.abga.org/events>

Rules for ABGA & JABGA Sanction Shows

1. Exhibitors must be in accordance of the ABGA/JABGA bylaws in terms of age and be an active member of the Junior American Boer Goat Association. Must present Current JABGA Membership card at check-in. Copies or digital copies of cards are acceptable.
2. If the child is present and physically able, they must show their own animal unless they have multiple entries in one class; then they must have another ABGA/JABGA **member** to show the animal for them. If not enough JABGA members are present, any youth 18 and under as of January 1 of current year may fill in.
3. If the child is physically unable or not present due to specific circumstances approved by Youth Committee or involving death in the family, family emergencies, or religious reasons, they must have a ABGA/JABGA **member** show for them, and it must be reported to the ABGA Youth Coordinator before the goats arrive at the show.
4. ABGA/JABGA members under the age of twelve (12), as of January 1, or members with physical or mental disabilities are allowed to have a heeler in the class, but the member must help in the presentation of the animal. The heeler must present current membership card upon entering the ring.
5. All goats must be **registered in the JABGA member's name only**. No ranch or family name can be listed in the owner section of the certificate. Any goat that is transferred to a Junior exhibitors name for showing at a JABGA Sanction show cannot be transferred back to the seller and/or seller's agent for a period of 1 year.
6. Showmanship is not required but highly recommended. ABGA will not provide ribbons or awards. The following age breaks are suggested for sanctioned shows. Age for showmanship for regular sanction shows is determined on the day of the show.
7. Exhibitors entering showmanship must use a goat that is registered in his/her name and entered in the ABGA/JABGA show.
8. If the JABGA member has a goat entered in the ABGA/JABGA show, goats in sibling's/step- sibling's names may not be used for showmanship purposes.
9. Participants that do not have an animal entered any ABGA/JABGA competition may borrow an animal for showmanship purposes only. That selected animal can only be used by one exhibitor during the competition and cannot be exhibited by multiple participants.
10. All show results received by the JABGA will be final.
11. **All ABGA rules, breed standards, classes, judges, and entries apply. Please note the new ABGA no Alcohol Policy.** All JABGA Sanctioned shows are required to have a BRED AND OWNED CLASS. One class each for the PERCENTAGE DOES, FULLBLOOD DOES AND FULLBLOOD BUCKS. All ages will compete in one class.
12. The ABGA/JABGA reserves the right to not sanction and/or to not tabulate placing's for points submitted by a show or not yet submitted by a show that didn't follow the ABGA rules, breed standards, classes, judges, and entries.
13. The ABGA/JABGA strongly suggest that JABGA members own and care for his/her own goats. Directors and members of the JABGA discourage unethical ownership and care.
14. Exhibitors and parents should always conduct themselves in a sportsmanlike manner. Infractions of this rule may cause immediate termination of membership by a majority vote of the Board of Directors.



15. Judges for ABGA/JABGA sanction shows are required to be an ABGA Approved Judge. Judge's names should be published thirty (30) days prior to the show
16. Drug Testing & Cheating
 - a. Drug testing cannot be refused if the show deems necessary.
 - b. All JABGA and ABGA Sanction show rules must be followed. Responsibilities of Host Show.

Exhibitors' must have ORIGINAL ABGA REGISTRATION PAPERS AND JABGA & ABGA MEMBERSHIP CARDS.
Division and class birthdates will be computed using October 7th, 2023 as the show date.

No animal bracing allowed at ABGA sanctioned shows: Goats front legs must be **on the ground** during judging. Front feet must remain on the arena floor during Judge's evaluation. Exhibitors may lift feet off the ground for a period not to exceed 10 seconds when posing the goat. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to refrain from presenting any animal owned by the presiding judge within 90 days prior to the show date.

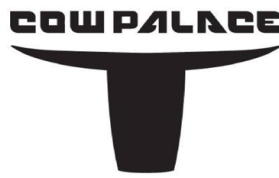
CONSENT: By attending an ABGA sanctioned show or event, the owner warrants that animals shall be presented free of volatile drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a sanctioned show is the giving of consent by the owner for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood or other substance's from the animals to be used in testing. In the case that there is a violation of these rules, the act of entering the animal in a sanctioned show is giving consent to have any disciplinary action taken by the ABGA against such individual published in any publication of ABGA's choosing.

- Division 2: Fullblood Doe 93.75% and above

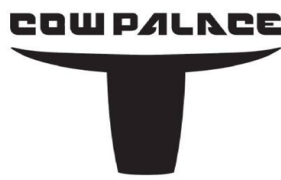
- Junior Division - 12 classes of judging and 1 set of reasons. Age eligibility as of January 1, 2023 youth must be 5-13 years of age.
- Senior Division - 12 classes of judging and 4 sets of reasons. Age eligibility as of January 1, 2023 youth must be 14-18 years of age.
- College Division - Open to all junior and senior colleges. 12 classes of judging and 6 sets of reasons. Eligibility enrolled in a Junior or Senior College and in good standing.

Contest Rules and General Procedures





1. All contestants and coaches will check in to the contest table on the day of contest by 8:00 am, where they will check names, and age of the contestants.
2. All contestants and coaches must attend the contest orientation held at 8:00am. At that time, the contest will be explained, and contest instruction will be given.
3. Contest will be held in a covered area but heating and air conditioning may not be available. Contestants should dress accordingly and professionally.
4. All electronic devices (cell phones, tablets, calculators, etc.) are prohibited. Please advise all contestants to remove these devices prior to the start of the contest. If a contestant's device should make any noise, or if they are discovered using such electronic devices during the contest, the contestant and their team may be disqualified.
5. Contestants will be divided into groups for the contest and will remain with their assigned group throughout the contest and the delivery of oral reasons. While the contest is in progress, there will be no conferring between contestants or between a contestant and anyone else except as directed by the Superintendent or his/her representative. Lunch will be available. Coaches and parents should not approach contestants while the contest is being conducted. If information needs to be relayed from a parent or coach to a contestant during the contest, the parent or coach should contact the Superintendent or his/her representative to relay the information. Offending contestants may be disqualified.
6. Contestants will be allowed to bring a blank notebook, clipboard, or other note taking materials into the contest. Notes taken may be used while preparing for oral reasons. Contestants are not encouraged to use notes while giving oral reasons. Officials are instructed to impose a standard deduction on participants using notes while giving reasons.
7. Two minutes will be allowed to give oral reasons on each class.
8. Contestants will be allowed twelve (12) minutes to place each class.
9. Once time has been called and judging on a class has been completed, contestants must immediately turn in their cards to their Group Leader. Any contestant failing to turn in their card either by the time the Ring Clerk picks up the Group's cards from the Group Leader or the group has rotated to the next class shall receive a zero as a placing score for the class.
10. Breeding cattle and steers will NOT be handled. All judging of cattle classes will be done from a distance of 10-30 feet. Close inspection may or may not be allowed. This will be determined after selection of the classes.
11. Handling of sheep and goats may or may not be allowed. If handling is allowed, contestants will stand in line and will be allowed 15 seconds to handle each animal individually. Lambs and goats will not be re-handled at any time.
12. All rules and regulations are to be interpreted/enforced by the contest Superintendent and his/her assistants. Any situation requiring attention will be addressed by common sense and with the motive of improving the educational opportunities/outcomes for contest participants.



Judging Contest Superintendent

1. It shall be the duty of the superintendent to see that all rules and regulations of the contest are followed. He/she shall determine the answers to all questions, which may arise in connection with the interpretation of the rules governing the contest.
2. The Superintendent may designate assistant superintendents and others to assist with contest management.
3. The Superintendent shall take charge of all records and shall have all scores tabulated and totaled.

Judging Contest Clerks and Assistants

The clerks, assistants and attendants shall be under the direction of the Superintendent. They shall carry out all assignments in a professional and orderly manner.

Judging Contest Scoring and Awards

1. Fifty (50) points shall constitute a perfect mark for placing classes and 50 points constitute a perfect make on oral reasons.
 2. Awards will be presented at the conclusion of the contest once tabulations are complete.
 3. In the event of software/computer failure or other circumstances beyond the control of Contest Officials scores and placings will be tabulated in alternative manners and with the consent of coaches, awards will be mailed at a later date.
- If tied for species awards, a contestant or team having the highest total reasons score on the species shall be listed first.
 - If tied for overall individual or team award, the contestant or team having the highest total reasons score shall be listed first.
 - If still tied, the team or individual with the highest placing in reasons classes will be first.
