ONLINE REGISTRATION PROCESS

For All Open Class Entries

In a continuing effort to streamline the Open Class entry process, the Douglas County Fair is pleased to announce that we have partnered with Fair Entry to offer an Online Registration/Entry process. **Reminder: Pre-registration is required for all Entries.**

Online registration can be completed in just a few easy steps.



Tips for success with the online registration process:

- » You will need a valid email address to complete your registration process online.
- » Online Accounts do not carry forward from year to year, so your first step is to set up an account.
- » Read the directions on the screen, they will guide you through the process.
- » If you miss registering for an exhibit you are welcome to log back in any time and add items.

ONLINE REGISTRATION STEP 1

Review the premium book and jot down or circle the Division, Class and Lot of the item you wish to enter.

ONLINE REGISTRATION STEP 2

Browse to: <http://www.dcmnfair.com/openclass> and click on the Online Registration Button. Follow the directions on the screen to set up your account and then register your entries. When complete, make sure you review your entries and checkout. There is no cost for registration in Douglas County, the checkout just confirms your entries.

OPEN CLASS RULES & INFORMATION

Everyone, regardless of age, is encouraged to participate. Do not need to be a Douglas County resident to enter.

ENTRY DAY *(Pre-registration is **REQUIRED** at www.dcmnfair.com or by mail)*

- » Entry Day is **MONDAY, AUGUST 14 from 1pm to 7 pm**. This is the only entry day for Open Class.
- » Entries must be entered in the name of actual owner/creator and all exhibits must have been raised or made by the exhibitor since the Douglas County Fair in August of 2022.
- » The fair will take every precaution to preserve all articles on exhibition, but will not be responsible for the loss or damage that may occur in the delivery, exhibition or removal of exhibits.

JUDGING

- » No article shall compete for more than one premium.
- » One entry per lot is allowed in Division 1, 2, 3 Classes and Other Contests unless otherwise specified.
- » Each entry must correspond to a Class number and Lot number description from the premium list. Entries must be in their proper class to obtain a premium.
- » A Professional is anyone who receives income on a regular basis by providing or teaching skills and/or selling their DIY or Fine Art products pertaining to a specific class and lot
- » Each entry must have the entry tag securely attached to the entry itself.
- » All awards shall be made by comparison of the individual merits of the entry.
- » Decisions of the Judges are final.
- » Any interference by exhibitors to influence the decision of the judges will be sufficient cause to exclude the entry from the competition and will cause forfeiture of any premium offered.
- » Premium Awards in each Lot may be awarded as follows: 1st Place (Blue) \$5.00, 2nd Place (Red) \$4.00, 3rd Place (White) \$3.00, unless otherwise specified.
- » One Grand Champion \$15.00 and One Reserve Champion \$12.00 may be awarded in each Class.

RELEASE OF EXHIBITS

- » All articles entered will remain on exhibit until 10:00 pm on the final day of the fair.
- » Open Class entries need to be picked up between 8:00 am and 1pm on Sunday, August 20, unless alternate arrangements have been made prior to the fair. Entries not picked up on designated pickup day will be donated or destroyed.
- » Exhibitors may be asked to show proof of name before exhibits or premiums are released.
- » Premium checks will be available for pickup in the DIY Building, Sunday, August 20 from 8:00 a.m. to noon. Do not go to the fair office located in the Grandstand. Checks not picked up during this time will be mailed.
- » All cut flowers will be composed.

DIVISION 1 | GARDENING & FARM CROPS

Entry Tips

- » Follow the directions shown below for exhibiting fruits and vegetables.
- » Take care not to break the natural protective skin or outer layer.
- » Stems should be left on unless otherwise specified in directions.
- » Keep entries free of soil as it detracts from the appearance.
- » Use a soft cloth or brush when preparing fruits and vegetables for entry.

Sweet Corn: Ears filled out to tip. Kernels should be milky. Leave 2 banner leaves on husks. Trim silks to 1".

Potatoes: Firm, medium size, uniform color. Do not wash, brush clean.

Root Crops: (Beets, Carrots, Parsnips, Turnips, Rutabagas) Firm, smooth, uniform color. Tops trimmed to 1" to 1 1/2". Tap root trimmed to 1". Do not wash, brush clean.

Broccoli: Firm heads, uniform color, tender, crisp, tight bud stage. Remove leaves, stems trimmed to 5" total.

Cabbage: Heads solid and firm, heavy for size, tender and crisp. Leave 2 or 3 outside wrapped leaves.

Cauliflower: White, orange, or purple depending on cultivar. Crisp and solid, jacket leaves left on and trimmed even with the top of the head.

Celery: Crisp, firm, thick and uniform stalks. Trim leaves and roots uniformly. Place in jar.

Kale/Swiss Chard: Whole plant with crisp, fresh leaves and clean stems. Remove discolored outer leaves. Place in jar.

Beans: Uniform in color and size, straight, small seeds. Leave ends on.

Peas: Bright green, well-filled pods with seeds in eating stage. Pick with stem.

Cucumbers: Slicing - Straight, firm, uniform length with dark green skin. Leave 1/2" stem.
Pickling - Firm, uniform in color with thin skin. Wipe clean.

Eggplant: Firm, shiny, medium to large size. Uniform color depending on cultivar. Wipe clean.

Kohlrabi: Ball 2 - 3" in diameter. Tender, good color. Cut leaves and roots to 1 - 2".

Ornamental Gourds: Rind should be hard, exhibit 3 of any variety. Trim stem to 1/2". Wipe clean.

Pumpkins: Thick flesh, heavy for size. True to type in size and color. Trim stem to 2". Wipe clean

Rhubarb: Tender stems, uniform color. Pull from plant, not cut. Trim leaf blade to 1" above stalk

Peppers: Color appropriate for variety. Uniform in size. Trim stems to 1/2 - 1". Wipe clean.

Squash (Winter): Rind should be hard and glossy with fully developed color. Leave 2 - 3" stem. Wipe clean.

Squash (Summer): Rind should be soft. Select small to medium fruit. Leave 1 - 2" of stem attached. Wipe clean.

Tomatoes: Firm fruits that are heavy in relationship to size. Smooth and well-shaped. Remove stems. Wipe clean.

Onion: (Dry) Firm, mature, well-shaped bulbs, small necks, heavy for size. Trim tops to 1" and roots to 1/4". Do not remove outer scales.

Garlic: Clean, smooth, brightly colored bulbs with dry necks. Trim neck to 2" and roots to 1/4".

Muskmelon: Pick at full maturity when stem easily separates from the vine. Medium size and fragrant. Do not wash.

Watermelon: In best eating stage, medium to large size, shape, and color typical. Leave 1 - 2" stem. Wipe clean.

Berries: Uniform in color and size. Leave calyx on Strawberries.

Apples: Firm, uniform color and size dependant on cultivar. Wipe clean.

Grapes: Bunches should be uniform in size, shape, and color.

Entry Tips

The maturity, form, color, stem length, botanical name and clean foliage are all points that should be considered.

- » All flowers/plants must be grown by exhibitor for at least 6 weeks prior to entry day.
- » Potted plants must be in exhibitor's possession for at least 3 months prior to entry day and containers should be limited to 14" diameter.
- » The Douglas County Fair provides vases for flowers and stems along with designated area for exhibitors to arrange their entries.
- » Each lot must be one color and three separate uniform stems unless otherwise specified.
- » Exhibitor must know type or variety of flower or plant to be eligible for entry.
- » All exhibits will be judged on quality and judge may withhold award if entries are not worthy.
- » No single entry may be exhibited under more than one class.
- » Judge's decisions are final.
- » Specimens maybe disqualified if it has more or less stems, sprays, stalks, blooms, etc. than the spike or stalk in its natural grown form, unless indicated in the premium book.
- » A bud showing color is classified as a flower.
- » Specimens should be clean, free of insect damage with an attractive amount of foliage attached unless otherwise specified.
- » Remove all foliage below the waterline.
- » Dahlia to be displayed with 2 sets of leaves only and no buds. One bloom on stem.
- » Any other variety lot - Exhibitor must specify variety of entry
- » Hydrangeas will be judged on their peak season color
- » Release of exhibit day - All cut flowers will be composted!

All entries must be packaged before exhibiting in order to qualify for prizes. Canned items in sealed jars only. Lids will be marked upon entering the item.

Pies - baked 6" whole double crusted fruit pie (Contest Pies should be 9 inch - see contest section)

Canning:

- » Exhibits must be in standard pint or half pint jars unless otherwise specified, with new lids and rings. Best of 4 Jars must be in a small container or tied together
- » Jars must be clear and manufactured for canning.
- » All foods must be processed according to the extension service of Minnesota. (<https://extension.umn.edu/food-safety/preserving-and-preparing>) A boiling water bath is used for processing jams and jellies, fruit, tomatoes, and pickles and a pressure canner must be used for low acid vegetables. **Your processing time must be written on lid or label.**
- » Jams and jellies must be sealed using a 2-piece lid. Paraffin seals are not allowed.
- » **All jars must be marked with the current year on lid to ensure against entry of same jar at fair next year.**

Breads - Quick or Yeast: Enter one small loaf for Quick Breads and 1/2 of a regular sized loaf for Yeast Breads, wrapped in a see through, plastic bag with twister or self sealing bag.

Cookies: Enter four cookies on a 6" disposable white plate, wrapped in a see through plastic bag with twister or self sealing plastic bag.

Bars: Enter four 2"x2" squares on 6" disposable white plate, wrapped in see through plastic bag with twister or self sealing plastic bag. ****NO REFRIGERATED BARS ACCEPTED****

Cake: Enter one 4" square on 6" disposable white plate, wrapped in see through plastic bag with twister or self sealing plastic bag. Decorated Cupcakes, enter four regular sized cupcakes in a clear plastic disposable container.

Candies: Enter six pieces on a 6" disposable white plate, wrapped in see through plastic bag with twister or self sealing plastic bag.

Homemade Beers: Each entrant needs to enter two bottles of beer for type entered into contest. Each entry must be bottled in a clean bottle of at least 10 oz. Capacity. We prefer no identification markings on the bottles. All entrants must be 21 years of age or older. Entries may be disqualified if these entry tips are not followed. *Drop off at DIY building on entry day for judging*

Homemade Wines: Each entrant needs to enter two bottles of wine for each type entered into contest. Each entry must be bottled in a clean bottle of at least 750 mil. We prefer no identification markings on the bottles. All entrants must be 21 years of age or older. Entries may be disqualified if these entry tips are not followed. *Drop off at DIY building on entry day for judging*

Review DIY classes carefully. Classes and Lots have been added and/or updated.

YOU CAN NOW ENTER UP TO 2 ITEMS PER LOT

DIY Classes **WITHOUT** specific ages are open to ALL ages.

Ages have been adjusted in several areas to be consistent with the rest of open class:

- » Youth Class: 0 - 17 years old
- » Adult Class: 18 - 69 years old
- » Senior Class: 70 plus years old

All entries must be ready for display

- » Any item that is to be hung must have hooks, wire, etc.
- » Clothing and Costumes must be on hangers.
- » Jewelry & Ornaments need to be on display racks (no plastic bags).
- » Puzzles must be matted and sealed as to not break apart.
- » Photos must be on stand, hooks, or wire.

Lots requiring more than one item:

- » Need to make sure the lot number is visibly displayed.
