

ATV Rodeo Rules

1. Must follow ATV Fit Laws
2. Everyone competing and/or operating an ATV is required to wear a DOT helmet, eye protection (glasses, goggles, face shield), long-sleeved shirt, long pants and closed-toed shoes. Other protective gear is strongly recommended.
3. All participants are expected to compete in a fair manner and abide by all rules. Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated and can result in immediate disqualification and forfeiture of any entry fees or awards.
4. A contestant may only enter once per class
5. Classes will be determined by engine size and performance of entries. Must be three entries to have a class.
6. Events - Barrel Race, Key Hole
7. Kids will receive a trophy. Youth and Adult events 100% payback.
8. All ATVs must be always kept in the pits. Anyone who leaves the grounds will be eliminated from competition.
9. ATVs cannot be driven outside of arena, and nowhere on the midway of the grounds, there are no exceptions.
10. ATVs cannot be ridden outside of the track area and pits. Speed limit 5mph strictly enforced.
11. No person under the age of (5) will be allowed to compete.
12. Any rider under the age of 18 on the day of the rodeo will need the signature of a parent or guardian on the day of the event. This parent or guardian must be present to make the approval and provide a signature at the registration/check-in table at the event
13. No vehicles shall be equipped with paddles, chains or spikes. No nitrous or nitro methane will be used.
14. No alcohol or drugs of any kind are allowed on the fairgrounds property. Any person who appears to be chemically impaired will not be allowed to compete. Their registration will be forfeited.
15. The Dakota County Fair Board and Directors are not responsible for accidents, injury or theft of property.
16. Anyone who fails to abide by these rules will be asked to leave the grounds and is subject to be ineligible in further competition. A representative of the fair board or a deputy will be on hand before, during and after ATV rodeo to enforce these rules.
