Animal Sciences - Swine

Swine are limited to one weigh-in per animal at Fair weigh-in

The DCF Swine Show is NON-TERMINAL

All swine must have a PRRS (Porcine Reproductive and Respiratory Syndrome) and PEDv (Porcine Epidemic Diarrhea virus) test of the herd of origin within 90 days of the exhibition. Include test date, type, and results on the CVI. For swine originating from herds with positive tests, include the herd plan number on the CVI. *All exhibitors are responsible for taking pigs home, or to slaughter, including those sold in the Meat Animal Sale, unless other arrangements are made by the buyer.* Animals are released at 6:30 p.m. Sunday. Swine unable to load out Sunday evening due to biosecurity purposes may be left overnight. Remaining Swine must be removed between 6:30 - 7:30 a.m. Monday morning. Families electing this option *MUST designate their intent at Swine registration in April or the overnight hold will not be allowed.*

All exhibitors **MUST** enter Showmanship in the species they exhibit at the DCF. Exhibitors who are not entered in showmanship will automatically be entered prior to the Fair. If an exhibitor does not wish to participate in showmanship, they can scratch on-site at the Fair.

Regulations

- Use of Ractopamine (Paylean) in DCF swine is prohibited. This action was taken to insure a market for all show swine. If use is detected, the exhibitor will face loss of exhibiting privileges (similar to use of other banned or illegal drugs). Exhibitors will be required to certify (at weigh-in) that ractopamine has not been fed to their hogs.
- 2. Exhibitors are responsible for meeting State, County and District Fair Rules and Regulations of Animal Health as printed in the front of this book. **DATCP has recommended all swine should be** vaccinated for influenza; be sure to follow label directions.

- 3. All exhibitors must read and adhere to the Youth Animal Exhibitor Code of Practice as stated on page 12.
- 4. All exhibitors are responsible for daily general housekeeping in their area. Livestock exhibitors must clean-up after their animals and regularly dispose of waste in an appropriate manner. All hogs must be fed, watered and pens cleaned by 9 a.m. each day of the fair. Swine exhibitors are encouraged to have waterers in pens at the Fair. Please provide your own tools and equipment for clean-up. Department superintendents will explain proper procedures for the department.
- 5. An exhibitor is limited to not more than three (3) hogs of which only two (2) per sex are shown. e.g. Two (2) market barrows and one (1) market gilt, or one (1) market barrow and two (2) market gilts. Classes are determined by final weigh-in weights, so there is a chance an exhibitor can have two animals in one class if they are the same breed and close to the same weight.
- 6. Barrow and Gilt information:
 - a) All barrows & gilts will be weighed on check-in day to determine final weight and arrange classes.
 - b) All barrows & gilts must be identified by breed and ear notch identification at the County Spring Swine Registration, April 20 from 9:00 - 11:00 a.m. at the 4-H Extension Office. Failure to provide ear notch information will prevent registration of that animal. Additional details will be announced on the Dane County 4-H Youth Development website. All swine registered will be provided with an RFID tag to be placed in the ear by the exhibitor or their representative. The records of the official ear notch and RFID tag will be verified at the Fair weigh-in. The information at weigh-in must match that provided at registration for the animal to be eligible to show. If an exhibitor is found to be swapping animals he/she will forfeit premiums, Meat Animal Sale income, and be banned from exhibiting at the Dane County Fair for two years. It is illegal, by state law, to remove RFID tags. All registration material must be returned or delivered (not postmarked) to Richard Straub, 292 Glenway Road, Brooklyn, WI 53521 on or before May 3, 2024. Failure to provide this will result in loss of exhibiting privileges. For point of reference, the suggested minimum weight is 60-90 pounds at the Spring Swine Registration. Be aware of and use your own herd data to predict the rate of gain to insure that you meet the required weights listed in (c).
 - c) All hogs must meet the weight requirements of 230 300 pounds on the final weigh-in day to be eligible for the Meat Animal Sale.
 - d) Elimination from the sale will be based on the lightest weight in the 230 to 300 weight range.
 - e) Breeding gilts may not be shown as both a market gilt and a breeding gilt. *Breeding gilts are not eligible for the Meat Animal Sale.*
 - f) All gilts must be farrowed prior to March 1.
- 7. All swine exhibitors must meet YQCA requirements. Youth must complete a training program each year by either attending an in-person session or completing an online course. Visit https://www.danecountyfair.com/p/youth-exhibitors/education-requirements--opportunities/livestock-departments for more information. Exhibitors must also attend one additional swine educational qualifying meeting. A copy of the swine education requirement form must be on file with the Fair Office by June 15. Youth must upload YQCA and Education Requirement Forms online. No mailed forms will be accepted. Exhibitors who have not met these requirements will be ineligible to exhibit swine projects at the Fair. Questions? Contact the Dane County Fair Office at info@danecountyfair.com.
- 8. Animals in the championship drive will be evaluated for the top five placings.
- 9. A Swine Department Superintendent must inspect all health papers and animals **<u>before</u>** unloading.
- 10. Swine exhibits must be <u>owned</u> by the exhibitor prior to April 15 of exhibit year.

- Hurdles will be furnished by the Dane County Fair Association. However, exhibitors may use their own hurdles if no farm name is used.
- 12. Purebred and crossbred barrows & gilts may be shown. Purebreds must represent the breed. For all purebreds (barrows and gilts) original pedigree forms, from the purebred organization, must be presented in the name of the exhibitor and/or the exhibitor's family. If a pig does not have pedigree papers, it will default to the appropriate crossbred class.
- 13. Barrows & gilts will be shown in separate lots.
- 14. The Exhibitor must designate their sale animal on Wednesday at weigh-in. Performance information will be available.
- 15. No straw will be used for bedding. Wood shavings are required.
