### Regulations

- All exhibits must be the result of the exhibitor's work in the current exhibit year.
- Photos/images may be used only once across all entries.
- Entry tag must be attached to a hole punched in the upper left hand corner of the exhibit.
- Print Photo Exhibits:
  - a. No entries mounted on foam core will be accepted.
  - b. Must be mounted on white poster board. No matting or decorations allowed. No titles/captions unless otherwise noted.
  - c. Exhibits with 1 4 photos must be mounted on poster board 11"x14".
  - d. Photos should be mounted with rubber cement.
  - e. Individual photos in lots with more than one photo must be numbered
  - f. Photos cropped to improve composition are encouraged.

- 6) Magazine, at least 4 6 pages in length, with a combination of graphics, photos and text, printed in color, using word processing or desktop publishing software.
- Computer Programming project in any programming language. Poster should contain a flow chart and some code (or pseudocode).
- 8) Any original creative animation project using animation software (ex. Adobe Animate, Toonly or Blender)
- \*\*NEW THIS YEAR\*\* Original computer game developed by exhibitor
- 10) \*\*NEW THIS YEAR\*\* Original song or musical composition developed using a computer software program.
- 11) \*\*NEW THIS YEAR\*\* Original mobile app developed by exhibitor
