## Eligible 4-H Project Areas: Animal Sciences - Sheep

\*\*Due to the unknowns associated with COVID-19, ALL information listed in the Dane County Fair Premium Book is subject to change at the Fair Board's discretion.\*\*

#### Regulations:

- Exhibitors are responsible for having read State and County Fair Regulations and Animal Health Regulations as printed in the front of this book.
- All exhibitors must read and adhere to the Youth Animal Exhibitor Code of Practice as stated on page 12.
- All exhibitors are responsible for the general housekeeping and clean-up in their area. Livestock exhibitors must clean up after their animals and dispose of waste in an appropriate manner. Please provide your own tools and equipment for clean-up.
- 4. All breeding sheep must be owned on or before May 31 of exhibit year. Market lambs must be owned by May 1, 2022. Market lambs will be tagged on May 7, 2022 at the Stoughton Fairgrounds from 9:00 11:00 a.m. Exhibitors may tag up to 10 lambs at \$2.00 per head. Market lambs must have attached scrapie tags by May 7, 2022.
- Exhibitors are limited to not more than 11 animals from all breed lots (including market and feeder lambs).
- All purebred sheep must have breeder's and association tags (for the breeds that have them) in the ear. The superintendent will check papers on Wednesday. Mouth must be right with papers.
- 7. Pens will be assigned by the superintendents.
- Management health suggestion (not mandatory): Exhibitors are encouraged to vaccinate their exhibits for contagious sheep diseases. Check with your 4-H leader, FFA advisor, local veterinarian or Dane County UW-Extension Office for information. All sheep MUST have scrapie tags in order to exhibit, including Market Lambs.
- No muzzles on sheep.
- 10. No icing, drenching or toweling of market lambs.
- 11. No blankets or sweaters may be worn at weigh-in. All sheep will be checked for lamb fungus. Any sheep showing signs of lamb fungus will not be allowed to exhibit and must be removed from the Fairgrounds. An on-grounds vet will check to determine if an animal may stay or must be removed.
- All sheep exhibitors (breeding and market) must meet YQCA requirements. Youth must complete a training program each year by either attending an in-person session or completing

Exhibitors must also attend one additional sheep educational qualifying meeting. A copy of the sheep education requirement form must be on file with the Extension Office by June 15. Youth must upload YQCA and Education Requirement Forms online. No mailed forms will be accepted. Exhibitors who have not met these requirements will be ineligible to exhibit sheep projects at the Fair.

- 13. Market animals entering the show ring for selection of Grand and Reserve Grand Champion must be eligible for and meet the qualifying conditions for the Dane County Meat Animal Sale.
- 14. Market lambs over 150 pounds are eligible to show, but are <u>NOT</u> eligible to sell. Lambs returning for champion selection <u>must</u> be eligible to sell. Lambs over 150 pounds are ineligible for champion selection.
- 15. If the number of animals consigned exceeds 50 head for the Meat Animal Sale, selection of the 50 sale animals will be based on:
  - a. Grade of market animal and placing (see Meat Animal Sale information).
  - b. Intact ram lambs cannot be shown/sold as Market Lambs.
- 16. All qualified sale lambs must be led to the sale ring.
- 17. Base Dates:
  - a) Spring Lamb Born on or after Feb. 16, 2022 for all breeds
  - b) Winter Lamb Born Jan. 1 Feb 15, 2022 for all breeds.
  - c) Fall Lamb Born Sept. 1 Dec. 31, 2021.
  - d) Yearling Born in 2021 outside the date of birth limitations for Fall lambs.
  - e) Mature Ewe Born before Jan. 1, 2021.

## **CLASS B. Breeding Pairs & Flocks**

#### Terms:

<u>Flock of Three</u> - A flock shall consist of three (3) animals: a ram (yearling or lamb), a ewe lamb, and a yearling ewe owned by exhibitor.

## **CLASS C. Market and Feeder Lambs**

#### Regulations

A market lamb may be either a ewe or a wether lamb. Intact ram lambs and feeder lambs do not qualify to show or sell as market lambs.

- 1. If two or more animals are entered under the same Lot number, each animal must be entered separately (example: Lot 1, first animal 1 1, second animal 1 2).
- Exhibitor may show up to three (3) animals in Market Lots. Only one (1) may be sold. A feeder lamb is **not** a market lamb and is not eligible for the Meat Animal Sale.
- All feeder and market lambs must have the RFID tag that was applied at the time of spring weigh-in present in their ear in order to be eligible to show.
- Following the weigh-in, Lots will be divided into weight categories by the superintendents.

#### Lots:

- 1) Market Lamb 105 150+ lbs.
- 2) Feeder Lamb under 105 lbs.

## CLASS E. Clean Barn Exhibit

### Regulation

Awarded on club basis. Entry by club only. Will be judged during the Fair on the following:

- 1. Cleanliness and neatness of the exhibit.
- 2. Attractiveness of feed, bedding and equipment storage.
- 3. Regular disposal of waste.
- Cleanliness and neatness of aisles.
- Safety and courtesy of club members to each other, leaders, judges, superintendents and spectators.
- Added consideration will be given to clubs/chapters with identification cards and award stickers posted.
- An award will be presented for Large and Small Club Clean Barn Exhibits.
