Due to the unknowns associated with COVID-19, ALL information listed in the Dane County Fair Premium Book is subject to change at the Fair Board's discretion.

Education Requirements for Horse & Pony Exhibitors:

To exhibit any equine at the 2022 Dane County Fair, exhibitors must submit a completed educational requirements card, **specific to their organization**, following the submittal rules printed on the educational requirements card. The form must be submitted online by the June 15 deadline; postmarks do not count. If this requirement is not met, the exhibitor will not be eligible to show. NO exceptions will be made.

REGULATIONS (No Cloverbuds)

1. All exhibitors must read, sign and adhere to the Youth Animal Exhibitor Code of Practice as stated on page 12 in the front of the Fair Book.
2. Exhibitors are responsible for complying with State and County Fair Regulations contained in this fair book and the Horse and Pony Rules & Guidelines. A complete set of guidelines, rules and descriptions can be obtained through your club, Dane County Extension Office (website: <http://fyi.uwex.edu/dane4hyouth/4-h-projects/horse-pony>) or Dane County Fair Office (website: <http://www.danecountyfair.com/pages/Youth-Exhibits.php>).
3. Any Dane County Fair Department 6 Horse and Pony questions are referred first to the Dane County Fair Book. If they can not be answered there, they are then referred to the Department 6 Horse and Pony Rules & Guidelines and finally to US Equestrian Federation Rule Book.
4. Formal disputes and/or appeals should be referred to the front of this book under Rules & Regulations or contact the Fair Office.
5. **It is a privilege to participate at the Dane County Fair**, however, this privilege can be revoked by no less than three (3) Department 6 Superintendents. Exhibitors, parents, guardians, leaders and volunteers are expected to conduct themselves in an appropriate manner at all times.
6. **Abuse of any animal will be grounds for disqualification.**
7. Each horse and pony exhibitor, including horseless horse, must submit a Project Animal Declaration Form for their project animal(s) they intend to show. Only two animals may be shown. This must be submitted via online form no later than **May 1, 2022. If it is not received by 11:59 p.m. May 1, you will not be allowed to show. This rule will be strictly enforced.**
8. Animal Substitution Policy: If a declared animal dies or becomes lame or injured, you may request a substitution as follows:
 - a) Submit a written request prior to July 17, 2022 with a letter from your veterinarian as to the reason the animal will not be able to attend.
 - b) Send requests to Horse and Pony Dept. 6, Dane County Fair, PO Box 287, Oregon, WI 53575 or email to danecountyfair2900@gmail.com.

- c) All substitutions are evaluated on an individual basis and are subject to the superintendent's approval.
9. All horses/ponies are required to stable and remain on the fairgrounds Wednesday through Sunday. Animals that have a chronic health issue that does not allow them to be stalled for the duration of the Fair must submit a completed Trailing-In Request form, which can be obtained from the Dane County Fair website. This form must be submitted to the Fair Office for approval by July 17, 2022.
 10. On-Site Veterinarians may examine any horse at any time. Those found lame or posing a health hazard to themselves, other animals or people may be ordered off the fairgrounds.
 11. The age of an animal is determined as of January 1 of the current year. Stallions must have been born in the current year to be exhibited at the Fair.
 12. Exhibitors, including Horseless Horse, must electronically submit the appropriate information into FairEntry by June 2, 2022. Cancellations can be made by calling the Fair Office at (608) 469-2428 by 5 p.m. the Monday prior to the start of the Fair.
 13. All stalls will be assigned by the superintendents. All horses must exhibit in at least one lot in Department 6. Tack stalls are assigned depending on availability.
 14. Stall decorations can be taken down after 5:30 p.m. on Sunday. Horses cannot be removed before 6:30 p.m. on Sunday. If not followed, the Fair Office requires that the premiums for the entire club be forfeited.

CHECK-IN

All Animals and Exhibitors, including Horseless Horse exhibitors, must be checked in on Wednesday the week of the Fair between the hours of 12 - 8 p.m.

The following must be completed at check-in:

1. Complete a veterinary examination either by presenting your animal for inspection on Wednesday at horse check-in outside of Pavilion 1 or turning in an Intrastate/Interstate Certificate of Veterinary Inspection completed no sooner than July 13, 2022.
2. A negative EIA (Coggins) test is required for all equine. The test must have been conducted after July 19, 2021. A copy of this test is required to be turned in at check in. Horses may not enter the pavilion until this coggins has been turned in.
3. If multiple horses are listed on the Intrastate/Interstate Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, an individual copy of the form must be provided for each exhibitor's folder.
4. Review your class entries, verify they are correct and sign your folder.
5. Provide emergency contact information while at the Fair.
6. All equines entered as a pony (56" and under) will be measured at time of check in.

No animals or exhibitors will be checked in to the Fair after 8 p.m. Wednesday. If you are not checked in, you may not show.

EVENTS AND CLASSES

1. An animal may not be shown in more than 10 lots unless it is being shared by family members or with a horseless horse member. The animal may then be shown in up to 12 lots.
2. Ten total lots are allowed per exhibitor.
3. Showmanship is mandatory for ALL exhibitors in Grades 3-8.
4. An animal may be shown in up to two (2) showmanship classes of different disciplines per exhibitor.
5. Hippology events are open to anyone on the fairgrounds. Time and location will be posted in Pavilion 1.
6. Fun Show will be held Thursday. Look for postings in Pavilion 1 for more information.
7. Some trail obstacles may be set up for practice prior to the show.
8. Exhibitor meeting, including elections for the Fair Superintendents and youth Superintendent will be held on Thursday. Time and location will be posted in Pavilion 1. All arenas will be closed during the meeting time. Project members, their parents or guardians and Horse Project Leaders are encouraged to attend, provide feedback, and vote. Any person interested in running for

a superintendent position should make their intentions known to a current superintendent at least one hour prior to the meeting.

9. **Club Showcase Award.** Awarded on a club/chapter basis. Award will be based on:
 - The cleanliness and neatness of project animal and stall area.
 - The immediate disposal of waste.
 - The cleanliness and neatness of aisles. Chores must be done by 9 a.m. daily during Fair.
 - Good sportsmanship among exhibitors, leaders, superintendents, judges and spectators.
 - Added consideration will be given to clubs/chapters with educational displays on Learning Lane and additional volunteer efforts during the Fair.
10. The Dane County Fair Horse and Pony Superintendents reserve the right to combine or divide lots in accordance with ATCP 160.04 and ATCP 160.07 in the front of this book. If a question arises, the judgment of the superintendents shall prevail.
11. **Lot Splitting:** If a riding lot has more than 18 exhibitors it will be split. The splits will exhibit separately and the top placings from each split will be brought back for a ride off. The split will be determined by the order listed in Pavilion 1. You must be checked in prior to the start of the lot even if you are in the second split to be able to show in this lot.
12. **Lot Combining:** Lots may be combined to a maximum of 18 exhibitors, but each lot will be judged separately.
13. Premiums will be awarded on the Danish System
