Eligible 4-H Project Areas: Animal Science - Dogs

Due to the unknowns associated with COVID-19, ALL information listed in the Dane County Fair Premium Book is subject to change at the Fair Board's discretion.

Regulations:

1. All exhibitors must read and adhere to the Youth Exhibitor Code of Practice as stated on page 12.
2. All dogs showing in Department 9 must be trained by the exhibitor.
3. All exhibitors must meet their educational requirements through the Dane County 4-H Dog Education Committee and abide by their rules for showing.
4. **No dogs** may be left unattended in or tied to cars.
5. All dogs must be leashed at all times.
6. Crating spaces will be available in Exhibition Hall B; crates are to be supplied by the exhibitor.
7. Dogs are only allowed in the show area (Hall B) of the Exhibition Hall.
8. Exhibitors are required to clean up after their dog(s) in any area on the Fairgrounds or the Exhibition Hall. **Failure to do this will result in forfeit of the exhibitor's premiums.**
9. All project animals must be under the supervision of the exhibitor by May 1 of the current year.
10. All exhibitors and dogs must enter through back loading dock.
11. Department Superintendents have the right to dismiss any dog that inhibits safety of the show.
12. All dogs at the agility show must be crated. If this is not followed, this may lead to dismissal from the show.
13. Once a dog/exhibitor combination has moved up a class level, they can not move down.
14. **Obedience:** After the first qualifying score of 170 or above at the Dane County Fair or State 4-H Dog Show, you will be encouraged to move up a class level. After the second qualifying score of 170 or above, the dog/exhibitor will be required to move up a class level.

15. **Agility:** After the first qualifying score of 70 or above at the Dane County Fair or State 4-H Dog Show, you will be required to move to Division B.
16. **Showmanship:** If you receive a blue ribbon in a Novice class, you will be required to move to Open Showmanship.

Exhibitors:

1. **All exhibitors must fill out a Dog Education Form for each dog being exhibited. Form must be turned in by last training day.**
2. Each family, with one or more dog exhibitors, must complete an online Volunteer Registration committing to at least two (2) hours of volunteer time to support the Dog Project at the Dane County Fair.
3. Exhibitors are encouraged to enter Showmanship.
4. Exhibitors should be clean and well groomed. Closed toed footwear (no heels) should be worn. Showmanship attire should be business casual. Jeans and shorts are not considered appropriate attire for showmanship.
5. Shorts are not to be worn for obedience or showmanship classes.
6. Athletic wear is appropriate for the agility show.
7. Exhibitors may exhibit up to three (3) animals. The third dog may only be entered in Showmanship, Brace, Veteran Dog, Rally or Team.
8. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to check-in at the ring they will be showing in before their class begins. Please let the ring stewards know if you have a conflict between two rings.
9. Exhibitor and dog combinations may only enter in one obedience lot.
10. Exhibitor may only enter in one showmanship lot.
11. In the case of tied scores, the exhibitor must be present for a run off, or the award will go to the other exhibitor.
12. **Any exhibitor showing in Team Obedience must have those lots listed on their Fair entries.**

Animal:

1. ****REMINDER**** All dogs must bring a copy of their Rabies Vaccination (good through July 17, 2022) to check in at the Dog Show.
2. 4-H dogs may only be shown at Dane County Fair if they have attended obedience classes offered through the 2022 Dane County Fair 4-H Dog Program.
3. All dogs being shown must have a Dog Education Form completed.
4. All dogs must be taken home after the show.
5. General condition of the dog, excluding shedding or being out of coat, will be considered in judging.

Class Description & Class Exercises

Showmanship Lots

Novice Showmanship Lots: Exhibitor has never received a blue ribbon in any previous years in showmanship.

Open Showmanship Lots: Any exhibitor that has received a blue ribbon in Novice showmanship.

Best in Show: Top blue ribbon exhibitor of each age group will compete against each other for Best in Show.

Obedience Lots

Pre-Novice Trial A: Handler and dog combination that has never previously trained.

Pre-Novice Trial B: Handler or a dog that have previously trained in a Pre-Novice class.

Pre-Novice Trial C: Handler and dog that has trained in Pre-Novice dog and cannot advance to Off Lead classes.

Novice Trial A: Handler and dog combination that have trained in Pre-Novice and have not trained in Novice.

Novice Trial B: Handler or dog that has previously trained in a Novice class.

Novice Trial C: Handler and dog that has trained in Novice and is not ready to advance.

Graduate Novice Trial A: Handler and dog combination that have not previously trained in Graduate Novice.

Graduate Novice Trial B: Handler or dog that has previously trained in Graduate-Novice.

Graduate Novice Trial C: Handler and dog that has trained in Graduate Novice and is not ready to advance.

Pre-Open: Handler or dog that is not ready to move to Open.

Open: Handler or dog that is not ready to move to Pre-Utility.

Pre-Utility: Handler or dog that is not ready to move to Utility.

Utility: Handler or dog that is ready to show at highest level.

Veteran Dog: Dog must be at least 7 years old. Novice exercise will be judged.

Brace: Two dogs shown in tandem, trained by the same exhibitor or family members. There are two levels in Brace competition: Pre-Novice and Novice. If exhibitor has one or both dogs that is Novice or above, they must enter in Novice Brace.

Team Dog: There will be two levels of team: Pre-Novice and Novice. Only one dog and handler combination can sign up for Team Dog. All dogs in the team must be showing at that level of exercises.

Agility: All agility classes are off leash. Depending on their demonstrated abilities, handler/dog teams may enter JTT and Standard. All dogs will jump at their designated heights, which will be determined by the agility leader using measuring wickets. JTT (Jumps, Tunnels, Table) Class will consist of 7-10 obstacles with a course time of 75 seconds.

- **Jumps, Tunnels, and Table Division A - off leash:** for new members and members that have not received a qualifying score.
- **Jumps, Tunnels and Table Division B - off leash:** for members that have received a qualifying score.

Standard Agility Class will have 10 - 15 obstacles and will include A-Frame (maximum height of 4' 6"), dog walk and teeter, 12 weave poles along with jumps, table, and have a course time of 120 seconds.

Obedience Lot Exercises

All Pre-Novice Trial: All exercises on lead: Heel, figure 8, stand for inspection, long sit (1 minute) and long down (1 minutes).

All Novice Trial: On lead: Heel, figure 8, long sit (1 minute), long down (1 minute). Off lead: Heel, stand for inspection, heeling, recall with finish.

Graduate Novice Trial: On lead: Heel. Off lead: Stand for inspection, figure 8, heel, recall with drop and finish, long sit (2 minutes), long down (3 minutes).

Pre-Open: All exercises off lead. Heel, figure 8, drop on recall, retrieve dumbbell on flat, retrieve dumbbell over broad jump, long sit (3 minutes), long down (5 minutes).

Open: All exercises off lead: Heel, figure 8, drop on recall, retrieve dumbbell on flat, retrieve dumbbell over broad jump, retrieve dumbbell over high jump, long sit (3 minutes), long down (5 minutes).

Pre-Utility: Retrieve dumbbell over high jump, retrieve glove, signal exercise, direct jumping and moving stand.

Utility: Scent discrimination, direct retrieve, signal exercise, directed jumping and moving stand.

Rally

Novice: All exercises are performed with the dog on leash. There is a requirement of 10-15 stations to complete with no more than five stationary exercises. The exercises performed vary from turning 360 degrees to changing paces during the course. Exhibitors at this level may clap their hands and pat their legs through the course.

Advanced: **All exercises are performed off-leash.** There is a requirement of 12-17 stations with no more than seven stationary exercises. Exercises include a jump as well as calling your dog to the front of you instead of to a heel position.

Excellent: All exercises are performed off-leash, except for the Honor exercise. There is a requirement of 15-20 stations with a maximum of 7 stationary exercises. Handlers are only allowed to encourage their dogs verbally. Physical encouragement is not allowed at this level. The Excellent level exercises include backing up three steps, while the dog stays in the heel position and a moving stand, while the handler walks around the dog.

Pet Class

This class focuses on teaching your dog skills to create a more harmonious household. All skills are on leash: Wait at the door, sit to greet, loose leash walking, focus skills and tricks.

Regulations:

1. Exhibits in classes A and B should relate to one phase of a project (e.g.: breeds, care, feeding, management, grooming, health, equipment, careers, or another relevant topic.) The exhibit may be a mobile, model, photos, something moving, actual articles, posters, scrapbook, educational game/puzzle, or a combination of display methods. Posters/foam boards must not be larger than the standard size (22"x28"). Fold out display boards may be used. Please keep exhibits to a manageable size for ease of handling. Exhibits may be hung using staples for display purposes.
2. Entry tag **MUST** be attached to the upper left-hand corner of any poster, foam board, or display board. All other exhibits must have all parts labeled with the exhibitor's name and entry tag.
3. Any failure of following rules may result in one lower placing.
4. All animal exhibitors must read and adhere to the Youth Animal Exhibitor Code of Practice as stated on page 12.
5. All animal exhibitors are responsible for caring for their animals and general housekeeping and clean-up of their area. Animal exhibitors must clean-up after their animals and regularly dispose of waste in an appropriate manner. Exhibitors must **COMPLETELY** clean-up their spaces at release time.
6. All animal exhibits should be brought in a cage suitable to display the animal comfortably and safely. Please wire shut your cages. For fish safety place a screen/mesh over the container to keep fingers or other items out of the water. Cages will not be available from the Dane County Fair.
7. All animals will be health checked and any showing signs of disease and/or colds will be sent home. Any animals that are not properly cared for may be sent home.
8. Animal exhibits **MUST** either be raised or purchased by the exhibitor. **NO** exhibits are to be captured from the wild.
