*All exhibitors **MUST** enter Showmanship in the species they exhibit at the DCF. Exhibitors who are not entered in showmanship will automatically be entered prior to the Fair. If an exhibitor does not wish to participate in showmanship, they can scratch on-site at the Fair.*

Regulations

- Youth planning to show OR sell a small animal at the Dane County Fair **MUST** attend at least one educational meeting pertaining to the species of animal they intend to show or sell. Youth intending to sell an animal **MUST** attend a Small Animal Market Sale Meeting. They will then fill out an Educational Card to show they attended these meetings.
 - If an exhibitor plans to sell their animal at the Small Animal Market Sale, they **MUST** attend a qualifying meeting specifically targeted to those participating in the sale. This meeting is also considered an educational meeting.
- All poultry exhibitors (breeding and market) must meet YQCA requirements. Youth must complete a training program each year by either attending an in-person session or completing an online course.** Visit <https://www.danecountyfair.com/p/youth-exhibitors/education-requirements--opportunities/small-animal-departments> for more information. Exhibitors must also attend one additional poultry educational qualifying meeting. A copy of the poultry education requirement form must be on file with the Fair Office by **June 1**. ****NEW THIS YEAR** Youth must provide YQCA Certificate number and Education Card uploaded in FairEntry by June 1, with entry submission.** Should you have any questions on what events qualify or to confirm you have met the stated requirements, contact the Dane County Fair Entries at entries.danecountyfair@gmail.com. NO exceptions will be made.
- All exhibitors must read and adhere to the Youth Animal Exhibitor Code of Practice as stated on page 13.
- Exhibitors with birds in the Small Animal Market Sale will be required to sign a form stating proper withdrawal times have been observed for any drug used, to be turned in at check-in. (Poultry - **7 days withdrawal**).
- Up to 20 Lots may be entered per exhibitor, excluding Class A. Showmanship and Class J. Eggs.
- All show coats shall be white and are to be free of patches, names and any sponsors.

- All entries must be owned or managed by the exhibitor by May 15 of the exhibit year, except market birds. Exhibitors may show two managerial animals as long as the form is filled out and on file at the Fair Office by May 15 of the exhibit year. Exhibitors showing managerial animals may not own or show any other Poultry. Questions? Contact the Dane County Fair Entries Department, entries.danecountyfair@gmail.com.
- Entries must have a numbered leg band. Record number on online entry form.
- Exhibitors are responsible for daily feed and care of entries. In addition, exhibitors are responsible for bringing their own bedding, such as wood shavings. Exhibitors not providing adequate food and water or neglecting to perform housekeeping duties may forfeit their premiums for said birds.
- All exhibitors** are responsible for the general housekeeping and clean-up in their area. Exhibitors must clean-up after their animals and regularly dispose of waste in an appropriate manner. Exhibitors must completely clean out their spaces at release time. Example: cages, clean off boards, fold cages and stack on pile. **Please provide your own tools and equipment for clean-up.** Department superintendents will explain proper procedure for the department.
- All exhibitors are encouraged to enter Poultry Showmanship.
- For the poultry health rules and regulations see Animal Health Regulations at the front of the book.
- Market birds (chicks, poults, ducklings, goslings) must be hatched by exhibitor or purchased at less than 2 weeks of age and be raised on the exhibitor's premises. This requirement will be strictly enforced.
- Market birds must be washed prior to check-in and if necessary, spot washed prior to judging and the sale. Failure to have presentable market birds on sale day may cause ineligibility.
- See further sale requirements under Small Animal Market Sale.

- Cock: Hatched before January 1 of exhibit year.

Old: Hatched before January 1 of current year
Breed: A group of birds of similar shape and size.
Variety: Various plumage colors and comb types within a breed.

1. **Eggs must meet the same health requirements as live poultry.** For the poultry health rules and regulations see Animal Health Regulations at the front of the book.
2. Eggs should be brought to the Poultry Judging Table on the day of the show, Thursday. **DO NOT BRING THEM TO CHECK-IN.**
3. Eggs must be laid by the exhibitor's flock
4. **ALL EGGS MUST BE DISPOSED OF AT THE FAIR AFTER JUDGING.**

Clean Barn Exhibit - CLUB/CHAPTER ENTRY ONLY

Regulation

1. Clean Barn Exhibit birds must be fed, watered and pens cleaned by 9 a.m. each day of the Fair.
2. Cleanliness and neatness of the exhibit.
3. Attractiveness of feed, bedding and equipment storage.
4. Regular cleaning of pens and disposal of waste.
5. Cleanliness and neatness of aisles.
6. Safety and courtesy toward exhibitors, leaders, superintendents and spectators.
7. Official identification cards and award stickers posted.
8. Having decorations displayed

13th Annual Rooster Crowing Contest

Saturday, July 18 at 12 p.m.
Pavilion 2 - Showing C

This fun event is sure to provide a friendly, entertaining contest for exhibitors, their friends, family and fair attendees.

What you need to know:

1. Open to Poultry exhibitors who entered a rooster in a breed or showmanship class at the Dane County Fair.
2. Bring your rooster to the crated area in Showing C by 12 p.m. on Saturday, July 18. No need to register.
3. Each exhibitor may enter one rooster. Only one rooster per cage is acceptable.
4. One to two judges (non-participating exhibitors or parents) will be assigned to each cage to count crows.
5. Over the time span of 20 consecutive minutes, the crows of each rooster will be counted. A declared "go time" will be given to start counting crows. The rooster with the most crows during that time will be the winner.
6. Participants may not touch animals to make them crow.
7. Cruelty to the animals will NOT be tolerated and will result in automatic disqualification from the contest.
8. Prizes will be awarded to the top crowing rooster and the top three participants.
