MINUTES OF THE GRAND RAPIDS-KENT COUNTY CONVENTION/ARENA AUTHORITY BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING Wednesday, March 27, 2002

I. Call to Order

Chairman John Logie called the meeting to order at 7:30 a.m. Chairman Logie presided and Secretary/Treasurer Klohs recorded.

II. Minutes of Prior Meetings

Motion: Ms. Klohs, supported by Mr. Tomaselli, moved to approve the Minutes of the February 27, 2002 meeting of the Authority. Motion carried unanimously.

III. Public Comment

None.

IV. <u>DeVos Place Construction Update - Bill Sewall</u>

Mr. Sewall reported that the DeVos Hall lobby reconstruction is substantially complete except for the reception area ceiling grid and the reader board. The fire department has conducted a preliminary walk-through. Kent-Tillman will complete the Grand Gallery concrete by next Friday. Two of six steel sequences have been erected. The bent columns that form the main Grand Gallery corridor will be assembled next week. Drilling for the main elevator shafts is 75% complete. Work continues on columns and underslab, and slab on grade is ahead of schedule. Facts to remember: 500 truckloads of concrete were pumped to fill the voids; 2,000 truckloads of dirt have been removed from the site to Coopersville; 900 truckloads of concrete and rubble have been hauled to a recycling plant. W/MBE contract awards total \$10.5 million to date.

V. Committee Reports

Finance Committee

Mr. Heacock presented the Finance Committee report.

a. Approval of Paid Invoices for the Period February 28 - March 14, 2002

Motion: Mr. Heacock, supported by Ms. Klohs, moved to approve payment of invoices totaling \$6,255,470.52, as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

b. Approval of SMG Financial Statements

Motion: Mr. Heacock, supported by Mr. Tomaselli, moved to approve the SMG Financial Statements for the Van Andel Arena and Grand Center for the period ended February 28, 2002, as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

c. Approval of CAA Financial Report

Motion: Mr. Heacock, supported by Ms. Klohs, moved to approve the Grand Rapids – Kent County Convention/Arena Authority Financial Statements for the period ended February 28, 2002, as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

d. Acceptance of CAA Annual Financial Report Prepared by PricewaterhouseCoopers Covering the Period June 20, 2000-June 30, 2001

Motion: Mr. Heacock, supported by Ms. Klohs, moved to accept the Grand Rapids – Kent County Convention/Arena Authority Annual Financial Statement for the period June 20, 2000 – June 30, 2001, as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Heacock stated that the auditors issued a clean opinion. The auditors found no exceptions regarding separation of duties and no journal entries relating to errors or omissions were required. Mr. Heacock referred to the management report on pp. 1-12, which is mandated under

the new rules of GASB 34. The CAA is the first governmental entity to comply. Mr. Heacock commended Robert White and Jana Wallace of the City for their exceptional efforts in writing the management discussion, compiling the fixed assets, and determining the value of the land transferred to the Authority. Mr. Heacock stated that the Finance Committee would like to report at the next meeting about the interaction of the different financial statements.

e. Approval of Expenditure for Rampage Field System

Mr. Heacock reported that that the Rampage football team is entitled to receive \$130,000 over the course of three years for the purchase of the field system and \$5,000 for the goal post system. These assets are the property of the venue. Mr. Heacock recommended that the Authority, through its contracted representative SMG, reimburse the Rampage in the amount of \$135,000 so that the terms of the contract will be met.

Motion: Mr. Heacock, supported by Ms. Klohs, moved to approve an expenditure in the amount of \$135,000 for the Rampage field system, as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Building Committee

Mr. Sommers reported that the construction manager, Erhardt/Hunt, has committed 50% of the total funds. 90% of the Exhibit Hall subcontract have been issued and 91% of the Grand Gallery is under contract. The project is currently \$300,000 over budget due to mechanical/electrical bulletins that will provide additional meeting rooms over the Exhibit Hall and the addition of an independent roofing inspector. The Committee has been reviewing architectural schemes for the Grand Center and Ballroom remodeling. Construction documents for Phase III Grand Center remodeling and the ballroom are due May 31. In November, the CAA will approve the total budget and contracts should be finalized by the end of the year. The construction manager will know the guaranteed maximum price for construction within the next 30-60 days.

Operations and Marketing Committee

Mr. Tomaselli reported that the Committee received an operations report from SMG. Mr. MacKeigan is working hard on capital programs and building maintenance. In February 2003, NBC will begin to televise arena football games. The Rampage season will begin two months early and overlap with the Griffins hockey season. The new season will impact public shows and concerts. Mr. MacKeigan is working with the tenants on scheduling issues. A subcommittee has been established to make recommendations regarding a DeVos Place logo. More information will be available next month. The CVB is working vigorously on its national marketing efforts. Reaction to the new convention center by meeting planners from Chicago and Washington, D.C. has been very encouraging. The hotel-motel assessment passed by a 3-1 margin. Beginning June 1, the assessment will generate an additional 1% for the CVB. Mr. Wilson did a great job of explaining the importance and benefits of the assessment.

Mr. Wilson reported that the CVB launched a regional brand marketing program on March 7. The goals of the program include increasing awareness of west Michigan on the national level, leveraging \$15 million in new direct expenditures annually, and ratio of return on investment \$15 to \$1. The CVB has retained Longwoods International, a world-renowned expert in destination marketing. Grand Action, The Right Place Program, the Chamber of Commerce, the

Holland CVB, the Saugatuck-Douglas CVB, the Muskegon County CVB, and the Grand Haven/Spring Lake Area Visitors Bureau will join with the CVB as key stakeholders.

The CVB has been working to secure national groups: the National Institute of Government Purchasers (year 2005 and/or 2006; 4500 room nights); the National Association of County Agricultural Agents (year 2007; 3500 room nights) and the Lions Club International Forum (year 2007; 6100 room nights). National groups tend to book in the summer, when the season is usually slow. The CVB is looking into the possibility of scheduling groups that may be compatible with public shows. For example, a florists trade show may be held in conjunction with the home and garden show. Peter Hyland of The Hyland Group will be making a presentation to the C/AA Board on April 24. In answer to a question from Mr. Tomaselli regarding marketing efforts during construction, Mr. Wilson stated he is able to sell the building with limitations. Mr. Tomaselli stressed the importance of maintaining flexible pricing during construction. Mr. Heacock asked whether groups who book during the interim receive any priority. Mr. Wilson responded that the CVB offers them preferred dates.

VI. SMG Report

Facilities Calendar

Mr. MacKeigan stated that February was the best financial month at the Arena since it opened. The Grand Center was extremely hectic the first week of March. Between DeVos Hall and the Welsh Auditorium, 18 performances were held in a 7-day period. The Rampage season begins April 5. Upcoming events at the Van Andel Arena include N'SYNC concert, Starts on Ice, U.S. Womens Volleyball Team –v- China, comedian Bernie Mac, Nickelodeon Rocket Power, Incubus, Green Day, and the Who.

VII. Other Business

Mr. Dan Barcheski, CEO of Axios, Inc. provided a description of his company's human resources services. Axios helps organizations with:

- •Attracting employees (recruit, screen, interview, test, hire),
- •Retaining employees (talent assessment, benefits packages),
- •Increasing employee productivity (customer defined value, lean enterprise, variance elimination, supply chain management, culture change, deployment).

Axios has provided employees to the Van Andel Arena since the Arena opened. Faith, Inc., Axios' nonprofit alliance partner, assists with hiring Heartside residents for the Arena. These employees work as ticket takers, ushers, waitresses/waiters, maintenance personnel, banquet servers, and some concessions. Benefits to the Arena include: flexible workforce, professional onsite management team, consultative approach, and working with an experienced HR organization. In 2000 Axios staffed 147 events and in 2001 Axios staffed 139. Axios has hired 810 associates for the Arena, 591 from the Heartside area. Faith, Inc. has provided 354 employees. Axios filled 17,640 assignments in 2000 and 16,680 assignments in 2001. In 2000, Axios had a 93.20% fill rate and in 2001 achieved a 99.92 % fill rate. In answer to a question from Ms. Klohs, Mr. Barcheski predicted an economic upturn in the fall. In answer to a question

from Mr. Logie, Mr. Barcheski responded that Axios, Inc. is the employer of record for the employees.

BUILDING COMMITTEE REPORT To Grand Rapids-Kent County Convention/Arena Authority April 24, 2002

The work on Phase 1B, DeVos Performance Lobby addition has progressed well and Punch List was finished on April 23, 2002.

In Phase 2, the Grand Gallery structural concrete subcontractor, Kent/Tillman Construction has completed the street level floor slab. Mechanical and electrical trades are continuing with parking area rough-ins and in-slab activities. Slab on grade, columns and main roof support piers are complete.

The structural steel fabricator, Steel Service Corp., has delivered material to the site for three of six sequences in the Grand Gallery. The erector has meeting rooms under way and the installation of bents that form the Grand Gallery.

Case/Millgard, the deep foundation subcontractor has completed the subsurface void filling and Exhibit Hall caissons and has removed their equipment from the site. This is very significant in that the concrete and the steel contractors now have full access to the site unencumbered by the foundation work.

The east wall of the Exhibit Hall has been poured. The west wall is about 80% complete.

The Building Committee continues to meet with Progressive AE and discuss and refine options for the Ballroom, which is in Phase 3. Demo for Phase 3 will start June 1, 2003. Construction Documents will be complete May 31, 2002.

DeVos Hall continues to be the main source of increased revenue for the fiscal year. March continues that trend with successful runs by the Ballet, Symphony, and Broadway Theater Guild hosting Buddy. DeVos was also the host to 4 shows of David Copperfield, a Diana Krall concert and Welsh hosted 10 performances of Veggie Tales due to the fact that DeVos was too busy to fit the show in. The success of DeVos is helping the Grand Center enjoy. a stronger than expected fiscal year during construction, as the revenue for DeVoy/Hall should come in about 32 - 35% higher than last fiscal

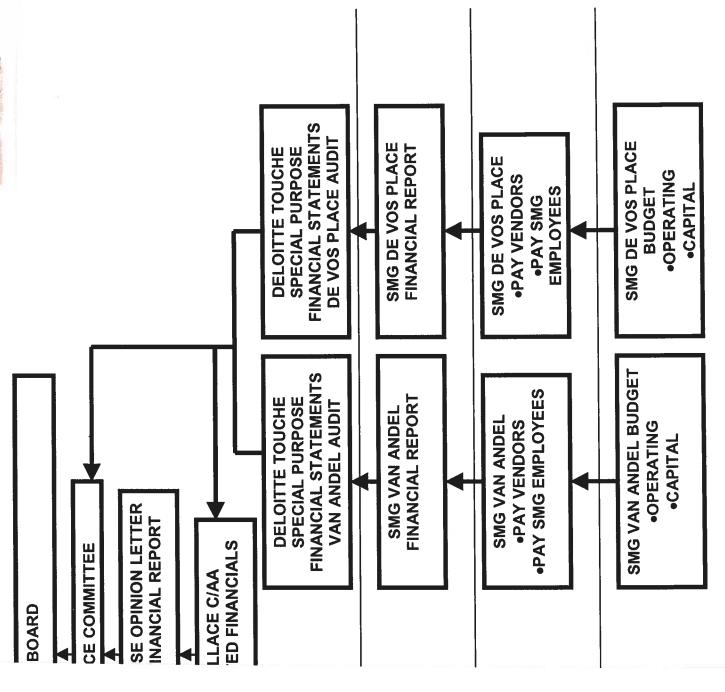

Employment Agreement

THIS AGREEMENT, made as of the 20th day of May, 2002, between the Grand Rapids-Kent County Convention/Arena Authority, located at 130 West Fulton, Grand Rapids, Michigan ("Employer") and Susan M. Waddell ("Employee").

The Employer and Employee wish to enter into an employment agreement governing the terms and conditions of employment; and

In consideration of the contents herein, and the mutual benefits as to each of the parties, IT IS AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

Employment

The Employer will employ Employee as its Administrative Manager and in exchange Employee agrees to all of the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement. Pursuant to this Agreement, Employee agrees to perform, well and faithfully, the duties specified in the attached Exhibit A and such other duties as directed by the Chairperson of the Employer or his/her designee or by official action of the Board of Directors of the Employer.

Employee will not, during the term of this Agreement, be engaged in any other business activity or accept any other employment, whether or not such business activity is pursued for gain, profit, or other pecuniary advantage, without prior approval of Employer.

From time to time, Employer will provide Employee with a written job evaluation based on Employee's job description, mutually determined objectives, and Employee's effectiveness as Administrative Manager. The Employer will not guarantee that this will occur annually, but expects that it will.

Term of Employment

The term of employment under this Agreement will be for three (3) years, beginning on the date specified above and expiring on May 20, 2005. Following the three-year term, this Agreement will automatically renew for succeeding one-year terms unless a party gives written notice of termination to the other at least sixty (60) days prior to the end of any year.

Employee may terminate this Agreement at any time. However, if Employee gives the Employer's Chairperson at least sixty (60) days' prior written notice in the event Employee is resigning voluntarily, Employee will be given any unused accrued pay for time off not taken. If Employer receives Employee's notice of voluntary resignation, the Employer may, in its sole discretion, accept the resignation immediately. Any voluntary termination of this Agreement by Employee as described in this paragraph will terminate the rights and obligations of each of the parties, except as otherwise provided in this paragraph.

Employee's employment is "at will." According to the law this means the Employer may terminate Employee at any time, without cause or for no cause, and without prior notice to Employee, except as provided above. However, if the Employer terminates Employee's employment for no reason or for some reason other than for conduct, which the Employer believes to be intentional and not in the best interest of the Employer, or for what the Employer believes to be seriously deficient performance that continues after warning, the Employer will provide severance benefits.

If Employee is eligible for severance benefits pursuant to this paragraph, the Employer will continue Employee's base salary for one (1) week for every six (6) months of Employee's employment with Employer to a maximum of four (4) weeks and will pay the Employer's portion of Employee's current benefits during the severance pay period or until other employment begins, whichever occurs earlier. Vacation and holidays will be prorated to date of termination.

To receive the severance benefits package, Employee will be required to provide Employer a general release in a form to be determined and provided by the Employer.

In all other instances, Employee will not be eligible for severance benefits.

Compensation

In consideration of services to be provided by Employee during the term of Employee's employment, Employee shall be paid a base salary of \$52,000 in equal bi-weekly installments, less applicable statutory deductions. Employer agrees that Employee will be considered for an annual wage adjustment based on overall performance and a cost of living increase. The cost of living increase will be determined by reference to The United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, Consumer Price Index. In addition, Employer will provide Employee with benefits as outlined in Exhibit B.

Assignment; Governing Law

This Agreement will constitute the complete agreement and shall supersede any previous agreements as between the parties. There shall be no modification to this Agreement without a vote of the Employer's Board of Directors and the written consent of both parties. The terms and conditions herein shall be binding on and inure to the benefit of the parties and their heirs, personal representatives, successors, and assigns. The laws of the State of Michigan shall govern this Agreement.

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VAN ANDEL ARENA NAMED #3 ARENA VENUE FOR TICKET SALES

DEVOS HALL MAKES THEATRE LIST AT #22

Grand Rapids, MI - The Van Andel Arena was ranked third in the April 22, 2002 edition of Pollstar Magazine's listing of the Top 40 Arena Venues based on first quarter ticket sales, coming in just behind the First Union Center in Philadelphia and the Palace of Auburn Hills, both larger venues. The Van Andel Arena placed ahead of many venues in considerably larger markets (see attached for complete listing).

The Van Andel Arena's first quarter achievement can be attributed to the many successful events that they hosted in the first three months of 2002. Tremendously well attended events such as the National Arenacross Series; Creed; Crosby, Stills, Nash and Young; Janet Jackson and Kid Rock all contributed to the arena's third place ranking.

DeVos Hall ranked twenty-second in Pollstar's Top 40 Theatre Venues, owing its success to events such as Broadway Theatre Guild's Beauty and the Beast and Buddy: The Buddy Holly Story, as well as Luther Vandross, David Copperfield and Diana Krall.

"These two rankings, specifically the Van Andel's, is a further testament to the people of West Michigan and their continued support of our facilities," said John Logie, Chairman of the Grand Rapids-Kent County Convention/Arena Authority, which owns both buildings. "It is very apparent that those in the entertainment industry are growing to learn what many of us here are already aware of; Grand Rapids is a great place to do business."
