MINUTES OF THE GRAND RAPIDS-KENT COUNTY CONVENTION/ARENA AUTHORITY BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING Wednesday, April 28, 2004

I. Call to Order

Chairman John Logie called the meeting to order at 7:35 a.m. Chairman Logie presided and Susan Waddell recorded in the absence of Birgit Klohs.

II. Oath of Office

Mary Hollinrake, Kent County Clerk, performed the oath of office for Board member, Gary J. McInerney. Governor Jennifer Granholm appointed Mr. McInerney for a term commencing March 25, 2004 and expiring February 29, 2008.

III. Minutes of Prior Meeting

Motion: Mr. Heacock, supported by Mr. Charles, moved to approve the Minutes of the March 24, 2004, meeting of the Authority. Motion carried unanimously.

IV. <u>DeVos Place® Construction Update</u>

Mr. Sewall and Mr. Erhardt presented a construction update. The ballroom area steel, concrete, and excavation are progressing on schedule. The ballroom roofing is 75% complete. The aluminum curtain wall material has been received and layout is in process to begin installing the enclosure components next month. The final completion date for the ballroom is March 31, 2005. Masonry work in the kitchen is almost complete. Subcontractors are working on the catwalks around the perimeter of DeVos Performance Hall. New window openings have been created on the exterior of the Grand Center and preparations to apply new face brick are underway.

V. Committee Reports

Building Committee

Mr. Sommers reported that there were no action items submitted to the Committee in April. Mr. Sommers added that bids were received for both the DeVos Performance Hall interior project and the riverwalk. The proposed subcontractors have been interviewed and material purchase orders are being prepared. Both the DeVos Performance Hall and the riverwalk buy-out fit within the total guaranteed maximum price budget.

Operations Committee

Mr. Tomaselli stated that the Committee received an operations report from Sandy Thomley. SMG recently held two customer service training classes for more than 60 employees. Subcontractors were invited to participate and three-fourths of them sent representatives. Ms. Thomley presented a synopsis of event days at DeVos Place® from December 1, 2003 through May 31, 2004. Out of 184 calendar days, there were only 13 dark days. During this period, the facility welcomed 136 different clients. In its first six months of operation, DeVos Place® hosted 355 event days with a total estimated attendance of 453,000. The peak number of event days for an entire year at the Grand Center was around 450. SMG staff met with Iliana Ordaz-Jeffries, Executive Director of the Arts Council, to walk through DeVos Place® and identify potential sites for art displays. The Arts Council is excited about the opportunity and should have an initiation report ready by the end of May.

Mr. Helmstead presented the CVB marketing report. Mr. Helmstead introduced Joseph Lathrop, President of OCG. OCG is working on a strategic plan for the CVB. No decision has been made on the US Green Building convention.* The CVB has booked the Model A Restorers Club for July 2006. The CVB is creating a website to promote the Art Pro convention. The Chamber of Commerce will be hosting a technology showcase at DeVos Place on May 12. The CVB won the Best Special Section award from the Michigan Press Association.

*As of April 30th, the US Green Building convention decided on Denver, Colorado.

Finance Committee

Mr. Heacock presented the Finance Committee report.

a. Approval of Disbursements and Payroll for the Period March 16 - April 12, 2004

Motion: Mr. Heacock, supported by Mr. Chamberlin, moved to approve payment of disbursements and payroll totaling \$261,659.64. Motion carried unanimously.

b. Approval of SMG Financial Statements for DeVos Place® and Van Andel Arena®

Motion: Mr. Heacock, supported by Mr. Chamberlin, moved to approve the SMG Financial Statements for DeVos Place® and the Van Andel Arena® for the period ended March 31, 2004. Motion carried unanimously.

c. Approval of CAA Preliminary Financial Statement Prepared by Beene Garter LLP

Motion: Mr. Heacock, supported by Mr. Chamberlin, moved to approve the Grand Rapids – Kent County Convention/Arena Authority Financial Statement for the period ended March 31, 2004. Motion carried unanimously.

d. Revised DeVos Place® Capital Improvement Budget

Mr. White presented the revised capital improvement budget and summarized the sources and uses of funds statement and projected monthly cash balances report. The budget was revised primarily to include the DeVos Performance Hall interiors project. Of particular note, the current budget assumed \$1 million transfer from the operating reserves during fiscal years 2001-2004. Given the overall status of the project, staff has included a \$1 million reduction in the transfer. This reduction will bolster the operating reserve balance of the CAA. Mr. Logie stated that the Board would need to develop a strategy to meet future competitive market challenges.

Motion: Mr. Heacock, supported by Mr. Tomaselli, moved to approve the Revised DeVos Place® Capital Improvement Project Budget. Motion carried unanimously.

e. Directors & Officers Insurance Policy Renewal

The CAA Board authorized the Finance Committee to bind coverage for renewal of the directors and officers insurance policy. Staff presented renewal quotes. After review and discussion of the options, the Committee approved coverage at the \$5 million dollar limit with a \$15,000 deductible and premium cost of \$13,200.

Motion: Mr. Heacock, supported by Mr. Tomaselli, moved to approve the recommendation for the directors and officers insurance policy renewal at \$5,000,000 coverage with \$15,000 deductible and premium cost of \$13,200. Motion carried unanimously.

f. Authorization to Sign Checks

Mayor Logie recommended that Gary McInerney be added to the list of Board members authorized to sign checks. Members currently authorized to sign checks are John Logie, Clif Charles, Birgit Klohs, and Steve Heacock.

Motion: Mr. Heacock, supported by Mr. Charles, moved to approve the recommendation that Gary McInerney be authorized to sign checks on behalf of the Grand Rapids-Kent County Convention/Arena Authority. Motion carried unanimously.

VI. SMG Report

Facilities Calendar

Mr. MacKeigan reported that upcoming events at the Van Andel Arena® include the Davenport commencement, Metallica, Yes, Eagles, Alabama, Shania Twain, Famous People Players, Phil Collins, American Idol, and Simon & Garfunkel. DeVos Place® has been extremely busy with If These Hips Could Talk, Lord of the Dance, Oliver, the Barber of Seville, and the symphony. Staff is working on the preliminary fiscal year 2005 budgets to be presented next month.

II. Minutes of Prior Meeting

Motion: Ms. Klohs, supported by Mr. Chamberlin, moved to approve the Minutes of the February 25, 2004, meeting of the Authority. Motion carried unanimously.

III. DeVos Place® Construction Update

Mr. Sewall and Mr. Erhardt presented a construction update. The construction manager is finalizing the pricing for the river walk and DeVos Performance Hall interiors project. Renovation continues in the Grand Center, with heavy emphasis on the kitchen. The cooking fume hoods have been installed, and masonry and stud walls throughout the space have begun. The Ballroom structure is progressing well. Despite bad weather, the subcontractors have completed setting six of eight sequences and completed

detailing sequences three and four. Concrete slab on deck has commenced and will continue for the next six weeks. The roofing over the ballroom is 60% complete.

IV. Committee Reports

Building Committee

Mr. Sommers reported that the DeVos Performance Hall seat refurbishing bid was awarded to Irwin Seating. Phase II closeout is complete except for a few minor exterior items. The project continues to remain within budget.

Operations Committee

Mr. Chamberlin reported that the Committee did not meet in March.

Mr. Wilson and Mr. Helmstead presented the CVB marketing report. Mr. Wilson announced that the 100th convention has been booked for DeVos Place®. The Michigan Townships Association has confirmed its 2006 Annual Convention taking place January 20-January 27, 2006. The convention will draw 2,500 delegates and average 1,165 peak rooms. The average attendance for conventions has doubled to more than 2,000 delegates, and the average room block is 1,381. The peak night average is 478 guestrooms. Most are Michigan bookings, but the number of regional and state conventions continues to increase. The Community Media Center is developing a PowerPoint program and website for the Customer Service Task Force, which should be ready in late April. The CVB is expanding the scope and adding categories to its Hometown Heroes program.

Mr. Heacock presented the Finance Committee report.

Building Committee Report To Grand Rapids-Kent County Convention/Arena Authority

April 28, 2004

GRAND CENTER

Work progressed well on the interior renovation of the Grand Center this month. With most of the mechanical and electrical main services roughed into the ceiling spaces, the masonry and drywall partitions were able to begin, dividing up the old street level Grand Hall into what now will become the new kitchen, rehearsal and meeting rooms.

The lower level has been underway for several months now and the partition walls are nearly complete. The new restroom/locker room areas are receiving ceramic tile and ceilings. Piping and wiring of the mechanical equipment in the new central mechanical room is progressing well and is to the point that chilled water for the cooling needs of DeVos Hall can be generated as needed via the new equipment.

Approximately 180' or half, of the new skywalk floor concrete has been placed and the related structure has been fireproofed.

On the exterior of the Grand Center, the east elevation demolition of old stairways and roof edges has been completed to make way for a new concrete exterior wall. New window openings have been created and preparations to apply new face brick are underway.

Finally, the new roof structure that transform the old Monroe Avenue balcony into part of the new enclosed skywalk has been erected.

DEVOS HALL

Work continued in the pre-function areas around DeVos Hall during March. The north hallways have been renovated, new restrooms constructed, and new carpet installed. A problem was encountered here with the new wall vinyl that was being installed. A manufacturing defect was found in the material, and the supplier, unable to ensure that the flaws would not be repeated in the replacement material has agreed to provide an alternate product as selected by the Architect.

Upon completion of the north halls, demolition work moved to the south side pre-function corridor. This renovation work will continue until June 1, at which time the interior of the hall becomes available for renovation work.

The Ballroom area steel, concrete and excavation are progressing on schedule. The Ballroom roofing, is now approximately 75% complete. The aluminum certain wall material has been received and layout is in process to begin installing these enclosure components next month.

ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIVITIES

Bids were received for both the DeVos Hall interior project and the Riverwalk. The proposed subcontractors have been interviewed and subcontracts and material purchase orders are being prepared. Both DeVos Hall and the Riverwalk buy-out fit within the total GMP budget.

The attached materials include a Sources & Uses of Funds Statement and a Projected Monthly Cash Balances report. These reports were prepared by Jana Wallace - City Representative, with the assistance of Dale Sommers - Owners Representative and Robert White - County Representative. The statements update the project budget, which was most recently approved on March 18, 2003.

The current project budget was previously established at \$211.2 million. This project budget envisioned the original and continuing facilities Master Plan. While periodic updates of changes to the project and adjustments, to various lines items within "Uses of Funds" category, have been provided to various committees of the Convention/Arena Authority Board, no comprehensive update has been submitted since March 2003, for consideration and approval by the full Authority Board.

Significant changes from the currently adopted budget may be summarized as follows:

- Sources of Funds Grand Action On August 27, 2003 the Authority authorized the execution of agreements with Grand Action, which provided for an additional \$4.4 million in support of improvements related to DeVos Performance Hall. This is further detailed in the Sources of Funds Statement which discloses a cash contribution of \$4,125,353 and in-kind, (monies expended by Grand Action for preliminary design work) in the amount of \$274,647. In addition, the furniture fixtures and equipment contribution from Steelcase, as delivered, was valued at \$710,000. Grand Action agreed to an additional cash contribution of \$290,000 in lieu of additional furniture contributions from Steelcase.
- Sources of Funds Interest The latest cash flow update for this project discloses higher than originally anticipated interest earnings. The updated forecast now estimates an additional \$285,521 of interest earnings to be generated on behalf of this project prior to closeout in March, 2005.

- Sources of Funds Other The Convention and Visitor's Bureau did pay over to the Convention/Arena Authority a sum of \$240,000 to be utilized in moving forward the opening date for the Exhibit Hall to November 29, 2003. In addition, representatives of the Riverview Building have contributed a sum of \$157,366 intended to reimburse the Authority for the cost to be incurred in connecting this building to the internal overhead walkway network.
- Sources of Funds C/AA Operating Reserve Transfers The most recently adopted budget included an assumed \$1 million transfer from Operating Reserves, each year, during fiscal years 2001-2004 inclusive. Given the overall status of the project, staff has included a reduction of \$1 million in this anticipated transfer. This reduction, in construction appropriation funding, will serve to bolster the Operating Reserve balance of the Convention/Arena Authority.
- Uses of Funds Construction Manager The original project budget included an allowance of \$169.4 million for "Guaranteed Maximum Price". This is now being supplemented by the addition of \$2,456,315. This addition provides for the "construction costs" related to improvements at DeVos Performance Hall. The balance of the \$4.4 million project cost is included under Owner's Projects - DeVos Performance Hall - FF & E at an allowance of \$1,943,685.
- Uses of Funds Other Projects Given the current status of the project, the Owner's Representative is recommending certain line item adjustments, which serve to reduce overall appropriations by a net of \$700,000.
- Uses of Funds Other Projects In addition to other line adjustments, it is necessary to establish a budgetary allowance to provide for a refund to the Convention & Visitor's Bureau in the amount of \$65,000. This is the excess balance remaining on the original CVB contribution of \$240,000. Not of all of that contribution was expended, to achieve the early opening date, and the excess balance was returned to the Convention & Visitor's Bureau.
- Uses of Funds Contingency Given the line item expenditure adjustments noted above and the additional resources recognized as being available to the project, it is recommended that the contingent appropriation be increased by \$318,062. This increase in contingency allowance constitutes the remaining additional funds available to the project after the \$1 million reduction in Operating Reserve transfer noted under "Sources of Funds".

The coauthors of this report would recommend adoption of the revised budget as documented in the attached Sources & Uses of Funds Statements.
