MINUTES OF THE GRAND RAPIDS-KENT COUNTY CONVENTION/ARENA AUTHORITY **BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING** Wednesday, October 26, 2005

I. Call to Order

Chairman Steve Heacock called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m. Chairman Heacock presided and Susan Waddell recorded in the absence of Birgit Klohs. Mr. Heacock revised the order of the agenda to include presentations from Dale Sommers and Mary Ellen Rogers.

II. Minutes of Prior Meeting

Motion: Mr. Heartwell, supported by Mr. Tomaselli, moved to approve the Minutes of the September 28, 2005, meeting of the Authority. Motion carried unanimously.

III. Presentation by Dale Sommers

Mr. Sommers attended the Associated Buildings & Contractors, Inc. Construction Awards Program held October 25, 2005. The purpose of the awards is to recognize outstanding projects completed by members of the Western Michigan Chapter. DeVos Place® received three awards for Brigade Fire Protection, Renovation \$1-\$3 million for DeVos Performance Hall, and Special Construction Over \$50 Million for

Phase III. Mr. Sommers presented the CAA Board with glass trophies to commemorate the awards. Mr. Heacock expressed appreciation and stated that the CAA was honored and pleased to receive such prestigious recognition.

IV. Special Purpose Financial Statements for Years Ended June 30, 2005 & 2004

Mary Ellen Rogers, Deloitte & Touche, attended the meeting to present the SMG audited financial statements to the CAA Board. Ms. Rogers commended SMG for its strong internal controls and stated that Deloitte & Touche issued a "clean" opinion. Mr. Heacock asked how SMG managed separation of duties with so much cash and credit card transactions flowing through the box offices. Ms. Rogers reassured the Board that SMG has strong controls in the box office. Either Chris Machuta or Rich MacKeigan handles the show settlements while a second person verifies the numbers. Mr. Heacock inquired whether there were any concerns given the size, frequency, and familiarity with promoters. Ms. Rogers responded, quite the contrary, that SMG has an excellent working relationship with the best national promoters. News travels quickly in the industry and SMG would not harm its reputation. Ms. Rogers added that SMG's controls are very acceptable.

V. Presentation by Broadway Theater Guild

Jack Lane and Nancy Brian attended the meeting to present an update on the Broadway Theater Guild (BTG). BTG entered its 18th season in September and opened with Little Shop of Horrors. The season continues with Hairspray in November, Blast! in January, Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat in March, Movin' Out in April, and concludes with Doctor Doolittle in June. Over the past 18 years, BTG has presented 137 productions with 11,000 performances. Over 1.3 million patrons have enjoyed those performances, with 75,000 patrons attending annually. Each year, BTG provides free tickets to school children, nonprofit agencies, the Sheriff's Honor Camp, and St. John's Home. The BTG spends over \$300,000 in annual local advertising and has a substantial \$3.5 million impact on the local economy. Mr. Lane presented a videotaped message from BTG Board Chairman, Harvey Gainey, who stressed the need to work towards a more equitable schedule under the booking policy. Nancy Brian reiterated that we must work together for available dates when productions are available. Ms. Brian stated that the Wharton Center in East Lansing is able to book shows before the BTG because they can host the shows for 4-8 weeks, draining millions of dollars from the west Michigan economy. Ms. Brian proposed that we work to bring the musical Wicked to Grand Rapids before the Wharton Center or Miller Auditorium in Kalamazoo is able to book the show.

VI. Committee Reports

Operations Committee

a. Capital Budget Request

Mr. Chamberlin requested an amendment to the capital budget to include an appropriation not to exceed \$32,000 to upgrade the DeVos Performance Hall doors and install a seating curb under the stairs. Mary Ann Keeler has generously agreed to assist financially with the project and will cover the costs for the Alexis Smith mural to be extended. Mrs. Keeler's costs are estimated at \$35,000. The CAA's expense would be covered through savings realized over the course of the year and previously approved budgeted amounts would not increase.

Motion: Mr. Chamberlin, supported by Mr. .McInerney, moved to approve the amendment to the capital budget to include an appropriation not to exceed \$32,000 for the purpose of upgrading the DeVos Performance Hall doors and installing a seating curb under the stairs. Further, the expense will be covered through savings realized over the course of the year and previously approved budgeted amounts will not increase. Motion carried unanimously.

b. CVB Update

Mr. Helmstead confirmed that the American Rabbit Breeders has booked DeVos Place® for its convention in October 2007. More than 3,000 attendees will bring 24,000 rabbits to town and have an economic impact of \$1 million. The American Rabbit Breeders held its first convention in Grand Rapids in 1917. The Rural Letter Carriers Association, which has not been in Grand Rapids since 1949, has booked its convention for 2007.

Finance Committee

a. SMG September 2005 Financial Statements for DeVos Place® and Van Andel Arena®

Motion: Mr. Chamberlin, supported by Mr. Tomaselli, moved to approve the SMG Financial Statements for DeVos Place® and the Van Andel Arena® for the period ended September 30, 2005. Motion carried unanimously.

b. CAA September 2005 Disbursements and Financial Statements

Motion: Mr. Chamberlin, supported by Mr. Tomaselli, moved to approve the CAA Disbursements and Financial Statements for the period ended September 30, 2005. Motion carried unanimously.

c. Long-Term Capital Plan

Information was included in the agenda packet regarding the long-term capital plan update.

VII. Revenue Enhancement Update

Mr. McInerney has been working with Mr. MacKeigan and others in exploring opportunities to realize new revenues to fund ongoing capital and maintenance needs for the venues. The ideas include:

- a. Development of a Premium Seating Concept at DeVos Performance Hall. SMG has indicated there is a strong likelihood that such a program could be effective. Although inclusion of the arts tenants' events may not be feasible, a number of other events are hosted in the theater. Mr. McInerney foresees 400 seats in the orchestra level for this opportunity. There are more than 800 seats in the orchestra level overall. Mr. McInerney recommended that the Board approve SMG to refine the plan through the Operations Committee and set a goal of initiating prior to the calendar year.
- b. Permanent Advertising at DeVos Place®. Presently there is no such advertising and we must be sensitive to donor recognition. The SMG corporate office has identified a couple of programs that have been successful in other markets. Mr. McInerney recommended that the CAA Board authorize SMG to initiate a plan for advertising opportunities at DeVos Place®, as well as forecasting some numbers to assess the impact on the bottom line. Mr. McInerney recommended that SMG continue this process with the Operations Committee and with his continued involvement. Mr. McInerney expects to have a business plan for review by mid-2006.
- c. Development of Event. While the calendar grows at our convention center, dates are still available. There seems to be strong support for a locally-initiated wine and food festival. SMG has researched the concept and is very optimistic. This optimism is shared by a number of potential local supporters. Mr. McInerney recommended that SMG initiate a business plan for such an event. Mr. McInerney would continue to be involved with the

process and take the business plan to the Operations Committee once complete. Mr. McInerney would set a deadline of December 2006 for completion of the business plan.

d. Assessment of Current Ticketing/Facility Fee Structure. Our current ticketing agreement with Ticketmaster expires June 2006. The Board should consider whether a portion of the existing fees should be allocated towards the capital fund. The Board should also consider if these fees should be increased to achieve this goal and what option the CAA has for ticketing services.

Motion: Mr. McInerney, supported by Mr. Tomaselli, moved to approve the recommendations as presented.

Discussion followed. Mr. MacKeigan explained that the Board would be voting in favor of the concepts. Once the details for fee structures, business plans, marketing, etc., are finalized, they will be brought back to the CAA Board for approval.

Amended Motion: Mr. McInerney, supported by Mr. Tomaselli, moved to approve the recommendations, provided that final details will be brought back to the Board for approval. Motion approved unanimously.

VIII. SMG Report and Facilities Calendar

Mr. MacKeigan presented an update on the upcoming concerts and shows that will be held this season at DeVos Place® and the Van Andel Arena®.

IX. Public Comment

Mr. MacKeigan reported the new roofing at DeVos Place® has been installed. Sidewalk repairs and the lighting control project at the Van Andel Arena® are near completion.

X. Next Meeting Date

The next CAA Board meeting will be held Wednesday, December 7, 2005.

XI. Adjournment

There being no other business, the meeting adjourned at 9:15 a.m.

^{*} Note: the CAA Board did not take action on the Special Purpose Financial Statements for Years Ended June 30, 2005 & 2004 - DeVos Place and Van Andel Arena, as Managed by SMG. Per the management agreement between the CAA and SMG, annual audits are required to verify the management fee calculation. Action by the CAA Board is required before SMG receives the incentive fee. Subsequent to this meeting, staff sent an e-mail to CAA Board members requesting that they approve a motion accepting the Special Purpose Financial Statements for Years Ended June 30, 2005 & 2004 - DeVos Place and Van Andel Arena, as Managed by SMG. As evidenced by the attached responses, a majority of the CAA Board members approved the motion.



Premium Seats at DeVos Performance Hall

Concept

Premium seat leases at Van Andel Arena® have been a successful revenue generator since 1996 when the building first opened. Now that we have a fresh newly remodeled DeVos Performance Hall it is time to offer the same opportunity to increase revenue at DeVos Place®

SMG will offer 400 seats to Van Andel Arena® Premium Seat leasers (VAA PSLs) on a first come, first serve basis. After VAA PSLs receive the offer, any remaining seats will be offered to the general public. Seats will be positioned as a benefit to VAA PS licenses ("Because you are a loyal customer of the Van Andel Arena®, you have the first chance to add DeVos Performance Hall seats to your lease!"). Non VAA PSL will then have the opportunity to purchase Premium Seats if they are not sold out to VAA PSL.

We will be able to offer them tickets to SMG shows only and will guarantee the DVH PSLs a <u>minimum</u> of 10 shows per year, providing a percentage refund of their lease if that number is not met. As shown on the attached event list, this possibility is far removed.

Rates

For current Van Andel Arena® Premium Seat License holders, the fee per seat is locked in at \$200 per seat for a 1, 3 or 5 year contract. Suggested rates for any remaining seats for the General Public are as follows:

There will be a \$200 per seat deposit that is refunded or applied to the final year of the contract.

Benefits

- Raise additional non-traditional revenue (up to \$400,000 assuming all 400 seats are sold on a 5 year lease at \$200 per seat for VAA PSL, more if seats are purchased by the general public)
- Increase DeVos Performance Hall attendance
- Provide VAA PSL with an additional benefit to their Van Andel Arena® seats (locked into "introductory" rates on their DVH Premium Seat lease)
- There is a market for this. For the three events that we offered DVH tickets to VAA PSL (David Copperfield, Dora the Explorer, and Grease), they purchased 1,282 tickets. Copperfield 320, Dora 670, and Grease 292. Overwhelmingly positive feedback from these contacts, there is an opportunity to get them to pay for this added convenience before they get used to having this be a "free" benefit to their Van Andel seats. Customers have also been asking about DeVos events as we sell new VAA PSLs.

<u>Timeline</u>

Mail, email and phone calls to VAA PSL late November with a December 16 deadline to purchase seats before they are made available to the General Public.

WHEREAS, said Lease authorized WMH to use certain designated space at the Van Andel Arena as a retail store (the "Retail Store Leased Space") subject to the terms and conditions of the Lease; and

WHEREAS, WMH desires to sublease such Retail Store Leased Space to Perfect Game, Inc. ("Perfect Game") subject to the terms of a sublease dated September 1, 2005 between WMH and Perfect Game and has requested the CAA to consent to such sublease of the Retail Store Lease Space.

RESOLVED:

- 1. That the CAA consents to the sublease by WMH to Perfect Game pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Sublease in the form presented at this meeting and authorizes the Chairman or any other officer of the CAA to acknowledge such consent in the Sublease.
- 2. That all resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith shall be, and the same are hereby, rescinded to the extent of such conflict.

SUBLEASE

THIS SUBLEASE is dated September 1, 2005, by and between WEST MICHIGAN HOCKEY, INC., a Michigan corporation ("Sub-Landlord") and PERFECT GAME, INC., a Michigan corporation, ("Sub-Tenant").

Sub-Landlord entered into a Lease with the Downtown Development Authority of The City of Grand Rapids ("DDA"), dated October 11, 1995, which was subsequently assigned to the Kent County Convention Arena Authority ("CAA")(collectively, the "Lease") pursuant to which Sub-Landlord leased from CAA approximately 2,500 rentable square feet ("RSF") located in Van Andel Arena as more particularly described in attached Exhibit A (the "Premises").

- 1. <u>Sublease</u>; <u>Premises</u>. Sub-Landlord hereby allows Sub-Tenant access to the Premises.
- 2. <u>Term.</u> The term of this Sublease will commence on September 1, 2005, and will expire on May 31, 2007, or one (1) week after the last Arena Football game played by the Grand Rapids Rampage or the American Hockey League game played by the Grand Rapids Griffins.
- 3. Rent for above-mentioned Term shall be \$3,416.04 payable in monthly installments of \$284.67. The first month's rent and security deposit, in the amount of \$569.34, is payable upon execution of this Sublease and sent to Sub-Landlord.
- 4. <u>Compliance With Lease</u>. Sub-Tenant subleases the Premises from Sub-Landlord, on the terms and subject to the covenants and conditions contained in the Lease that are applicable to the Premises, except as otherwise provided in this Sublease. Sub-Tenant and Sub-Landlord agree that all of the terms, covenants and conditions (except as modified by this instrument or inconsistent herewith) related to the Premises which are to be observed or performed by Sub-Landlord as tenant under the Lease are incorporated herein by reference and imposed on Sub-Tenant with the same force and effect as though fully set forth herein. Except where inconsistent with this Sublease, wherever the word "Landlord" appears in the Lease, the word "Sub-Landlord" shall be substituted; and wherever the word "Tenant" appears in the Lease, the word "Sub-Tenant" shall be substituted. Sub-Tenant covenants and agrees for itself and its successors and assigns that it shall perform and observe all of said terms, covenants and conditions related to the Premises, and that it shall do nothing which will have the effect of creating a breach on the part of Sub-Landlord of any of said terms, covenants or conditions.
- 5. Additional Rent. Sub-Tenant shall pay \$369.91 per month for gas, water and electric. Sub-Tenant shall be solely responsible for any telephone and/or cable expenses.
- 6. <u>Use Of Premises</u>. Sub-Tenant shall use the Premises for the resale of sports merchandise or other logo merchandise including the merchandise of performers or acts that appear at the Arena. This resale of other logo merchandise is at the sole discretion of the Sub-Tenant and subject to the approval of the Grand Rapids-Kent County Convention/Arena Authority ("CAA") and/or SMG.

7. Notice Of Breach Of Lease.

(a) If for any reason, Sub-Tenant is notified by Landlord of any breach of the terms, covenants or conditions contained in the Lease, Sub-Tenant hereby agrees immediately to notify Sub-Landlord in writing of said notice, stating therein the grounds for the claimed breach, said writing to be sent to Sub-Landlord in the most expeditious manner available. Sub-Tenant shall

promptly cure said breach and shall promptly provide to Sub-Landlord written evidence of said cure.

- (b) If for any reason, Sub-Landlord is notified by Landlord of any breach of the terms, covenants or conditions contained in the Lease, which by the terms of this Sublease are the obligations of Sub-Tenant to perform, Sub-Landlord hereby agrees to immediately notify Sub-Tenant in writing of said notice stating therein the grounds for the claimed breach, said written notice to be sent to Sub-Tenant in the most expeditious manner available. Sub-Tenant shall promptly cure said breach and promptly provide to Sub-Landlord written evidence of said cure.
- 8. <u>Sublease</u>; <u>Assignment</u>. Neither the Premises, nor any part thereof, shall be sublet, assigned, leased or occupied by anyone other than Sub-Tenant (nor shall Sub-Tenant's interest in the Premises be encumbered in any way) during the term hereof without the prior written consent of Sub-Landlord.
- 9. <u>Indemnification</u>. Sub-Tenant shall indemnify Sub-Landlord and save Sub-Landlord harmless from and against any and all claims, actions, damages, liabilities and expenses (including costs and actual attorneys' fees) (a) in connection with death or injury to person(s) or loss or damage to property occurring in, on or about, or arising out of, the Premises, the use or occupancy thereof, or the conduct or operation of Sub-Tenant's business, or arising from any cause whatsoever (except to the extent caused by the sole negligence of Sub-Landlord, its agents or employees); or (b) arising out of a default by Sub-Tenant in the performance of any of its obligations under this Sublease.
- 10. <u>Inconsistency With Lease</u>. As between Sub-Landlord and Sub-Tenant, the terms of this Sublease shall govern in the event of any inconsistency between it and the Lease.
- 11. <u>Surrender Of Premises</u>. Upon the expiration of this Sublease, Sub-Tenant will restore the Premises to the same condition in which they were in at the beginning of the Term of this Sublease, remove all of its personal property (including all signs, symbols and trademarks pertaining to its business) from the Premises and repair any damage to the Premises caused by such removal and surrender possession of the Premises to Sub-Landlord or Landlord.
- 12. Notices. Any notice, authorization, consent, or other communication required or permitted hereunder shall be in a writing signed by an authorized officer or representative of the party sending such communication. Except as otherwise expressly provided herein, any such communication shall be deemed effective when personally delivered, sent by telecopy, sent by overnight express delivery service with charges prepaid or when sent (postage prepaid) by certified mail with return receipt requested to the intended recipient at its address set forth above.
- 13. <u>Default</u>. Anything in the Lease to the contrary notwithstanding, (a) all payments or performance not made on their due date shall be in default and no notice or grace period shall be provided; and (b) if Sub-Tenant defaults in its obligations hereunder, Sub-Landlord may, in addition to the remedies set forth in the Lease, without notice or a grace period, accelerate all unpaid rent due until the end of term and call for immediate payment thereof as liquidated damages.
- 14. <u>Cross-Default.</u> A default by either party under this Agreement shall be deemed a default under the Asset Purchase Agreement, the Security Agreement, the Promissory Note and the Merchandising Agreement entered into between the parties of even date herewith ("Related

Documents") entitling the non-defaulting party to all rights and remedies provided herewith and in the Related Documents.

15. <u>Landlord's Consent</u>. This Sublease shall not be effective unless it and Sub-Tenant's proposed use of and modifications to the Premises shall have been approved by Landlord. Landlord shall evidence its approval by executing this Sublease.
