MINUTES OF THE GRAND RAPIDS-KENT COUNTY CONVENTION/ARENA AUTHORITY **BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING** Friday, November 5, 2010

I. Call to Order

Steve Heacock, Chairperson, called the meeting to order at 8:20 a.m. Secretary/Treasurer Birgit Klohs recorded the meeting minutes.

H. Presentation by Grand Rapids Griffins

Tim Gortsema, Senior Vice President of Business Operations, presented a report on the Grand Rapids Griffins, the primary tenant of the Van Andel Arena®. The Griffins are 15 years old this year with 10 years in the American Hockey League. Since the Griffins' inception in 1996, 111 different players - 16 goalies and 95 skaters - have gone on to play at least one game in the National Hockey League.

Some of the more accomplished members of the Griffins' alumni class include 13 Stanley Cup champions. A Griffins alumnus has had his name engraved on the Stanley Cup each of the last three years (2008-2010) and five times in the last six seasons. Fifteen former Griffins were on the playoff roster of the 2008 Stanley Cup champion Detroit Red Wings, nine of whom now have their names engraved on the Cup. Forty-two Griffins alumni logged ice time with 18 different NHL teams during the 2009-10 regular season. At season's end, Chicago's Tomas Kopecky became the first former Griffin to win his second Stanley Cup.

All 30 NHL teams have had a former Griffin play for them at some point. 53 players have made their NHL debuts after first playing for the Griffins, including 32 who made their debut during the same season they played in Grand Rapids.

Last year, the Griffins won the fan experience award. During the 2008/2009 season, the Griffins won awards for most attendance and community service. The Griffins established a youth foundation in 1995 that allows 300+ underserved children to participate in skating and hockey activities.

This year, hockey nights are branded individually to drive attendance: Winning Wednesday; dollar beer dollar dogs on Friday; Saturday night giveaways; and Sunday is Fun day. While group sales are increasing, full season ticket sales present a strong challenge due to time and money. Individual sales are driven by concessions and continue to be solid because of dollar beer dollar dog night.

Chair Heacock stated that the CAA appreciates its partnership with the Griffins.

III. Minutes of Prior Meeting

Motion: Mr. Heartwell, supported by Ms. Klohs, moved to approve the Minutes of the October 1, 2010 meetings of the Grand Rapids-Kent County Convention/Arena Authority. The motion carried unanimously.

IV. Committee Reports

a. Operations Committee

Mr. Chamberlin stated that the Committee's next meeting is Friday, December 3.

Mr. Helmstead presented the CVB report. Restaurant week is November 4-November 13. September and October were the first back-to-back \$10 million revenue months in three years. From the recent the Rejuvenate convention (competitor of RCMA), CVB staff booked 65 appointments and obtained 15 leads. The Connect hobby convention resulted in 35 appointments and 4 leads.

b. Finance Committee.

Ms. Klohs stated that she would make one motion to cover all four items, since they were discussed at length during the Finance Committee meeting held beforehand.

- i. SMG Financial Statements for DeVos Place® and Van Andel Arena® for the periods ended September 30, 2010.
- ii. CAA Financial Statements for the period ended September 30, 2010.
- iii. Special Purpose Financial Statements as of and for the Years Ended June 30, 2010 and 2009.
- iv. Amendment to FY 2011 Capital Budget.

Motion: Ms. Klohs, supported by Mr. Tomaselli, moved to accept the Finance Committee action items. The motion carried unanimously.

V. <u>Booking Policy Recommendation</u>

This past January, Mr. MacKeigan requested feedback from the frequent users on the present booking policy. All expressed an interest in maintaining the current policy with the exception of the Broadway Grand Rapids, which voiced a desire to receive more favorable dates. The current policy has the Broadway working with the other arts tenants and in a fourth priority positions. The policy provides a higher priority to the other arts tenants primarily due to the fact that the talent is mostly local and the majority of the revenue for the ballet, opera, and symphony stays in west Michigan, while Broadway shows are paid a fee with the overage retained by Broadway. Mr. MacKeigan recommended that no change be made to the booking policy at this time. Mr. MacKeigan also recommended another review next year, if necessary. SMG will insert itself into the date negotiations for the next scheduled season (2012/13). This will provide SMG first-hand involvement in the scheduling practices for a better position to assess the policy's strengths and weaknesses.

Meg Goebel, Board Chair, and Mike Lloyd, Executive Director, of Broadway Grand Rapids addressed the CAA Board for support of its position to change the booking policy to be on equal status with the other arts tenants. Mr. Lloyd declared that Broadway's second-tier status makes it difficult to book top-level shows because it has access to lousy dates once the other arts tenants have filled their calendars. Broadway's partnership with the MSU Wharton Center has given it leverage to secure popular shows, such as Legally Blond. MSU will also bring additional educational programs to Grand Rapids in conjunction with its performing arts programs.

Larry Robsen, Board Chair, and Peter Kjome, Executive Director, of the Grand Rapids Symphony addressed the CAA Board in support of maintaining the current booking policy. The current booking policy is in line with the intentions of those who built DeVos Performance Hall by giving first priority to local artists. The policy realizes the vision of those who created DeVos Hall 30 years ago. The policy helps local arts groups create and maintain jobs. Changes would create uncertainty regarding income and scheduling. The policy is flexible and the arts groups already work with Broadway to accommodate its needs.

Motion: Ms. Klohs, supported by Mr. Wilson, moved to establish a task force, appointed by the Board Chair, to review the booking policy issues and develop a solution with a recommendation to be presented to the CAA Board at its February 4, 2011, meeting.

Discussion followed. Mr. Heartwell concurred that there were not enough good dates for everybody and there is no silver-bullet solution. He is delighted with the success of Mike Lloyd and Broadway, which was at a precipice. Broadway is acquiring diverse offerings that are important to the community in attracting and retaining young people. Mr. Heartwell asked the arts tenants to be flexible and stated that inserting SMG at the table is very important.

Mr. Tomaselli stated that a lot has changed in the 20 years since the CAA inherited the original booking policy. It's a great opportunity to review the policy and come up with recommendations. As part of the review, the task force should look at how the rehearsal hall is being used to free up dates. Ms. Klohs added that the CAA Board has a fiduciary responsibility to understand how this works. Conventions and other entertained need to be figured in. Chair Heacock agreed that a task force was worth the effort and would like the work completed within 6-8 weeks. Mr. Chamberlin inquired whether the task force would examine some sort of criteria. Chair Heacock responded that criteria will be established, prioritized, and weighted. Discussion concluded.

The motion carried unanimously.

VI. Parking Operation and Maintenance Agreement

This item was addressed at the Finance Committee held beforehand.

Motion: Ms. Klohs, supported by Mr. Tomaselli, moved to accept the Parking Operation and Maintenance Agreement. The motion carried unanimously.

VII. SMG Report and Facilities Calendar

Mr. MacKeigan presented a summary of the upcoming events that will be held at DeVos Place® and the Van Andel Arena®.

Mr. MacKeigan stated that the SMG Management Agreement and SMG Food and Beverage Agreement expire June 30, 2011. There is a deadline of December 31, 2010 for notice to either party not to extend the agreements. SMG legal counsel has provided preliminary documents. Attorney Wendt and Bob White have reviewed the documents and identified issues that need to be addressed. Mr. MacKeigan requested that Chair Heacock appoint a Board member to act as liaison in the process, which he expects should be completed by January.

Motion: Ms. Klohs, supported by Mr. Wilson, moved to authorize the Board Chair to extend the contract deadlines, if necessary. The motion carried unanimously.

VIII. Public Comment

Scott Atchison of Michigan Flashcard, Grand Rapids, Michigan, attended the meeting to request written support for a Grand Rapids direction and information booth,

The attached Balance Sheet and Income Statement have been reformatted to provide additional information concerning the Convention/Arena Authority administrative account (unconsolidated) – excluding facility manager financial activity (separately reported).

The Balance Sheet includes a two-year comparative financial position at September 30 for fiscal years 2010 and 2011. The Income Statement provides a line item comparison of accounts for the first three months of the current fiscal year as compared to a similar period in the prior fiscal year. In addition, the Income Statement provides a comparison of current year budget to prior year (FY 2010) actual. It will allow the reader to compare first quarter expenditure trends with full-year budgetary allowances.

Items of interest in the two financial statements are explained as follows:

Balance Sheet (Unconsolidated):

- The cash and investments position decreased by \$.71 million from October 31, 2009. Balance decreased by \$1.58 million from the June 30, 2010 position due to a quick start on several capital improvement projects.
- Fund balance decreased by \$.85 million over the October 31, 2009 level.

Three-Month Revenue/Expense:

- Parking revenues have increased by 14%. The July through October time period is a seasonally slow period. Revenues in this time period (4 months = 33%) represent only 16% of total annual.
- Interest income was budgeted (2% rate est.) to increase by 35%, but has declined by 40% (comparative time periods) from actual experience in the first four months of the prior fiscal year. The County Investment Pool is currently paying 1% interest.
- Capital R/R/A spending is increased by 423% over prior year trend. Several major projects at the Arena got off to a quick start.
- Other significant expenditure account variances are primarily due to timing issues.

Hopefully, these reports provide a more on-point analysis of administrative activities over the course of the fiscal year. These reports will be updated on a monthly basis.
