MINUTES OF THE GRAND RAPIDS-KENT COUNTY CONVENTION/ARENA AUTHORITY BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING Wednesday, January 23, 2002

I. Call to Order

Chair Steve Heacock called the meeting to order at 7:30 a.m. Chair Heacock presided and Director Klohs recorded.

II. Minutes of Prior Meetings

Motion: Director Frey, supported by Director Tomaselli, moved to approve the minutes of the December 5, 2001 meeting of the Authority. Motion carried unanimously.

III. Public Comment

None.

IV. DeVos Place Construction Update - Matt Barnes/Larry Erhardt

The Hall of Justice has been demolished and is just a pile of rubble awaiting removal. Sixty percent of the budget has been committed to contracts. Work continues on the DeVos Hall Lobby addition and remains on course for the April grand opening. Out of 250 work days, there have been no lost time accidents. The dollars committed to M/WBE contractors have almost tripled, moving from \$3.7 million to \$10 million. The percentage of M/WBE increased in the areas that had opportunity from 13% to 15%. Due to lower interest earnings than anticipated, the revenue shortfall will be approximately \$13 million.

V. Grand Center Five-Year Rate Proposal - Rich MacKeigan

Mr. MacKeigan recommended approval of a five-year rate proposal for the Grand Center. After thorough discussion, the Finance and Operations Committees approved the plan. Concerns were expressed that the rates would remain frozen moving forward. Mr. MacKeigan responded that the listed rates are appropriate because they are subject to change, the booking policy gives priority to the arts groups, and DeVos Hall is in the middle of a construction zone. The CVB and Amway Grand Plaza Hotel are working to retain and grow business. The rates will be reviewed annually during the budget process.

Motion: Director Tomaselli, supported by Director Charles, moved to accept the Grand Center Room Rental Rates as presented.

Discussion followed. Mr. Kimball stated that the Transition Team reviewed the rates, as well. The Team wanted assurance that the rates would be reviewed annually. Director Logie stated that he would support the rates, but cautioned that the rates would remain flat for three years. Director Logie suggested a modest annual increase would be better than playing catch-up in the fourth year. Chair Heacock called the question.

Motion carried unanimously.

VI. Committee Reports

Finance Committee

Director Charles presented the Finance Committee report.

a. Approval of Paid Invoices

Motion: Director Charles, supported by Director Tomaselli, moved to approve payment of invoices as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

b. Approval of SMG Financial Statements

Motion: Director Charles, supported by Director Logie, moved to approve the SMG Financial Statements for the Van Andel Arena and Grand Center for the periods ended November 30, 2001, and December 31, 2001, as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

c. Approval of CAA Financial Report

Motion: Director Charles, supported by Director Klohs, moved to approve the Grand Rapids – Kent County Convention/Arena Authority Financial Statements for the periods ended November 30, 2001, and December 31, 2001, as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Building Committee

Director Frey reported that compaction grouting and caisson installation has been completed for the Grand Gallery. Elevator shafts have been drilled. Pier footings, columns, and walls have been installed in various areas of the Grand Gallery. The plumbing contractor has begun under slab utilities. Concrete work continues for the stair walls, perimeter walls and box truss piers. Excavation for the Exhibit Hall began upon vacancy of the court and police buildings and continues along the west and east sides of the demolished buildings. Caissons and the north set of box truss foundations are in process in the areas previously occupied by the police building and parking areas. The structural steel contractor is beginning the fabrication phase of the project and has been meeting regularly with the construction manager and design team. Review of enclosure and interior finish package bids has been completed and contracts have bee issued to purchase the following phases of work: pre-cast panels, masonry, glass curtain wall, roofing, metal siding, drywall, fireproofing, and skylights.

Operations and Marketing Committee

Director Tomaselli reported that work is progressing well on the VSA capital improvements. The food court remains open for business during reconstruction. New stands have been introduced featuring Mexican food and microbrews. Both have been very well received. SMG has signed an agreement with McGraw Construction to refurbish 40 suites. The renovation will include new carpeting, painting, wall papering, cabinet re-facing, and countertop rebuffing. SMG is working with suiteholders to minimize impacts. Steve Wilson reported on convention activities. The Midwest Woodworkers association has given the CVB a January 31 deadline to guarantee the convention center for December 2003. Mr. Wilson is working with the client to extend the deadline through the end of April. The CVB had considered a cancellation insurance policy, but since September 11 it has been virtually impossible to obtain. Due to building construction timelines, it is doubtful the convention will be booked. Loss of the convention in 2003 will not affect future bookings since Grand Rapids is the group's first choice.

Director Tomaselli stated the Committee took action regarding the administrative manager's pension plan. Director Tomaselli recommended approval of resolutions to establish a 401 Money Purchase Plan and a 458 Deferred Compensation Plan to fulfill the C/AA's commitment under the Employment Agreement.

Motion by Klohs, support by Frey, to recommend that the C/AA Board approve the Suggested Resolution for a Legislative Body Relating to a 401 Money Purchase Plan and the Suggested

Resolution for a Legislative Body Relating to a 457 Deferred Compensation Plan. Motion carried.

Mr. Steve Wilson reported that the CVB just booked the International Association of Jim Beam Bottle Collectors convention for the summer of 2003. The convention will host 500 delegates and use 1,500 room nights. The CVB has hired an additional national sales manager. A DVD version of the virtual tour is now available. A familiarization tour has been added for spring. The CVB has created a national database of 1,500 meeting planners and will begin sending monthly sales messages. Tom Schultz, Chair of the CVB Board, has accepted a position with West Side Beer in New Jersey. Tom Schultz, Chair of the CVB Board, has accepted a position with West Side Beer in New Jersey. Mr. Wilson invited the Board to a reception on Monday, January 28, at GP Sports in the Amway Grand Plaza, from 4:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.

Motion: Director Logie, supported by Director Frey, moved to send a letter of congratulations to Tom Schultz. Motion carried unanimously.

VII. SMG Report

Facilities Calendar

Chair Heacock commended Mr. MacKeigan and SMG on a busy February schedule. From a concert aspect, this February will be the busiest ever. Loss of the Hoops basketball team increased the availability of dates. Mr. MacKeigan highlighted upcoming events. Disney on Ice is taking place this week. Janet Jackson will be in town on January 30. Other concerts include Creed, Crosby, Stills, Nash & Young, Aaron Carter, Barry Manilow, and Alan Jackson. The Arena will be hosting four Clear Channel motor sports events, more than any other market. The Grand Center has been busy with Beauty and the Beast and the golf show. DeVos Hall and Welsh Auditorium will be hosting concerts, as well: Luther Vandross, Steven Curtis Chapman, Diana Krall, Koko Taylor, Roots Rock Society and Indika Reggae Band. Mr. MacKeigan has enjoyed working with Chair Heacock and thanked him for his cooperation and patience, time and guidance.

VIII. Election of Officers

According to the Authority's Bylaws, officers are at the initial organizational meeting of the Board and at the Board meeting in January of every second year. The initial officers were elected at the inaugural Board meeting on April 18, 2000. An election of officers will be held today for terms expiring in January 2004. At the December 2001 meeting, Chair Heacock announced that he was stepping down as Chair and recommended that Vice Chair David Frey assume the responsibility. Chair Heacock said he is greatly honored and humbled to have served as the C/AA's first chair.

Vice Chair Frey declined the Chairmanship at this time and would like to continue as Vice Chair. He would also like to continue as Chair of the C/AA Building Committee. As a member of Grand Action, Director Frey is committed to closing the \$13 million shortfall and fund raising for DeVos Hall interior renovation.

Motion by Director Frey, supported by Director Tomaselli, to nominate John H. Logie as Chair of the C/AA for a term expiring in January 2004. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Director Logie, supported by Director Klohs, to nominate David G. Frey as Vice Chair of the C/AA for a term expiring in January 2004. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Director Logie, supported by Director Frey, to nominate Birgit M. Klohs as Secretary/Treasurer of the C/AA for a term expiring in January 2004. Motion carried unanimously.

IX. Other Business

Director Frey presented Chair Heacock with a gift of appreciation. Chair Heacock has demonstrated extraordinary leadership and talent for team building. Steve is remarkably balanced, energetic, and helped write a great first chapter.

Director Logie thanked Chair Heacock for his service to the C/AA. The C/AA was created under a new statute and is unique to Michigan. Director Logie credited Chair Heacock with guiding the C/AA from its beginning. When Director Logie first took office as Mayor, there were 140 years of history to guide him. There was no such roadmap for Chair Heacock. Director Logie intends to continue the public-private partnership that started the convention center.

X. Adjournment

There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:30 a.m.

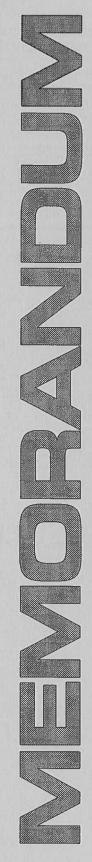

Event income came in ahead of budget due to both the Golf Show (not budgeted), and the Lumber Show (budgeted in February). Beauty and the Beast held in Devos Hall was also very successful as the second highest grossing Devos Hall event.

ANCILLARY INCOME

Ancillary income came in ahead of budget due to the success of the Beauty and the Beast novelties, as well as, the unbudgeted revenue generated by the Golf Show.

INDIRECT EXPENSES

Indirect expenses came in higher than expected due to the continued rise in utility expense. In addition, a large repair was necessary for one of the dock doors that caused repairs & maintenance to come in much higher than expected.

BUILDING COMMITTEE REPORT To Grand Rapids-Kent County Convention/Arena Authority February 27, 2002

Work continued on Phase 1B, DeVos Lobby Addition. Metal stud framing and drywall hanging is nearing completion inside, and on the canopy. Window wall framing is installed, and glass installed. M.E.P. rough-ins and fixtures continue, with heating systems coming on line next month. Wood paneling is being fabricated, as are glass wall panels. Ceiling work is complete in the 2 story area for terrazzo flooring to begin. The lobby remains on track for the April opening.

In Phase 2, the grand Gallery structural concrete subcontractor, Kent/Tillman Construction has placed formwork and reinforcing steel for the first section of street level floor slab. Mechanical and electrical trades are continuing with underground and in-slab activities. Slab on grade, columns and the main roof support piers continue as well.

Demolition of the Police Building and Hall of Justice progressed well in January. The Police Building has been completely demolished and new foundations are in process in this location. The Hall of Justice Building has been demolished to street level and basement demo along with hauling debris and rubble continues.

Case/Millgard, the deep foundation subcontractor has completed approximately 50% of the Exhibit Hall caissons and is progressing well.

On January 29, the Project Management and Design Teams visited the structural steel fabricator's plant. It appears that Steel Service Corp. is organized and ready to begin the mass production phase of our job for shipments as scheduled.

The enclosure and finish subs for the Exhibit Hall and Grand Gallery have all been interviewed, with 90% of the contracts issued. Since last report, Miscellaneous Metals, Painting and Operable Partition selections have been in process.

Long range planning has begun for Phase III work. The existing facilities are being scrutinized for items that need to be scheduled around S.M.G.'s utilization of the spaces to minimize disruptions.

Additionally if early start opportunities are discovered, they will be analyzed for practicality.
