#### MINUTES OF THE GRAND RAPIDS-KENT COUNTY CONVENTION/ARENA AUTHORITY **BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING** Wednesday, January 26, 2005

#### II. Minutes of Prior Meetings

Motion: Mr. Chamberlin, supported by Ms. Klohs, moved to approve the Minutes of the November 24 and December 4, 2004, meetings of the Authority. Motion carried unanimously.

#### III. Swearing In of CAA Members

Mary Hollinrake, Kent County Clerk, administered the oath of office to Lew Chamberlin, George Heartwell, and Joseph Tomaselli.

#### IV. Election of Officers

Motion: Mr. Tomaselli, supported by Ms. Klohs, moved to nominate Steve Heacock as chairman for a term expiring in January 2006. The nomination closed and the motion carried unanimously.

#### V. The Economic Impact of Consumer Shows

John Loeks, President of ShowSpan, presented the results of an Economic Impact Study conducted by Kiekover Marketing and Evert Van Der Heide of Calvin College. The results include impacts on the Kent County economy as a direct result of the boat show and the home & garden show. In 2004, the boat show had 26,311 visitors and the home & garden show had 39,709 visitors. The total economic impact of the boat show (direct and secondary impacts) is estimated to be \$26.9 million in expenditures, about \$8.9 million in employee income, 267 full-time equivalent jobs, and \$713,714 in selected state and local tax receipts. The total economic impact of the home & garden show (direct and secondary impacts) is estimated to be \$23.6 million in expenditures, about \$9 million in employee income, 312 full-time equivalent jobs, and \$1.4 million in selected state and local tax receipts.

#### VI. DeVos Place® Construction Update

Mr. Erhardt stated that substantial completion occurred January 24 and the final certificate of occupancy has been issued. The balance of the project will be turned over to SMG on January 31.

Mr. Sewall introduced members of the core construction group. Most likely, this is the last meeting that Mr. Sewall will attend.

CAA members extended their gratitude to Erhardt/Hunt for a job well done!

#### VII. Committee Reports

#### **Building Committee**

Mr. Sommers reported that the Committee's final meeting occurred December 15. The Committee will remain dormant until the CAA initiates another project. The cost of Phase III (ballroom, kitchen, GC renovation) was \$52 million. The entire DeVos Place project was completed early and under budget (original project cost estimate \$219 million; revised cost \$212 million). Minority and women business enterprise (M/WBE) participation was 17% (exceeded 10% goal). More than 135 subcontractors worked on the project and put in over 1.4 million work hours. Mr. Sommers will remain actively involved until project closeout in late June. Any funds remaining after project completion will be transferred to the CAA's capital reserve account.

#### **Operations Committee**

Mr. Chamberlin recommended approval of the guidelines for charitable events.

Motion: Mr. Chamberlin, supported by Mr. Tomaselli, moved to approve the Guidelines for Charitable Events.

After a brief discussion, the Board agreed that the Guidelines would be revised to include a statement requiring an interested organization to describe how the criteria will be met.

The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Chamberlin stated that new spotlights have been installed at the Van Andel Arena®. Kent County has requested that Bob Mihos, Director of Facilities, be appointed to the Operations Committee. Mr. Mihos previously served on the Building Committee.

Mr. Wilson presented the conclusions of a recent Brookings Institute Report. The report found that overall convention marketplace is declining in a manner that suggests that a recovery is unlikely to yield much increased business for any given community, contrary to repeated industry projections. In response to the report, the CVB has adopted a two-fold mission: to build conventions and to support the Michigan's West Coast brand. CVB Board Chairman Joe Tomaselli has appointed a resources task force to review the budget. Mr. Helmstead reported that the CVB has achieved its 2004 goal of booking 112,00 hotel room nights. The CVB has booked 140 conventions through 2011. DeVos Place® recently hosted the Michigan Nursery & Landscape Association which has been in Lansing since the mid-90's. The group was so impressed with the new facility that it booked more space for next year. The CVB has partnered with the CVB in Pasadena, California, to hire a sales representative who is based in Washington, D.C. The CVB and Amway Grand Plaza Hotel have invited 80 meeting planners and their guests to attend the February 1 ballroom grand opening.

#### Finance Committee

Mr. Heacock presented the Finance Committee report.

a. Approval of SMG Financial Statements for DeVos Place® and Van Andel Arena®

Motion: Mr. Heacock, supported by Mr. Chamberlin, moved to approve the SMG Financial Statements for DeVos Place® and the Van Andel Arena® for the periods ended November 30 and December 31, 2004. Motion carried unanimously.

b. Approval of CAA Disbursements and Financial Statements

Motion: Mr. Heacock, supported by Mr. Heartwell, moved to approve the CAA Disbursements and Financial Statements for the periods ended November 30 and December 31, 2004. Motion carried unanimously.

c. Revised Capital Improvement Budget

Motion: Mr. Heacock, supported by Ms. Klohs, moved to approve the Revised Capital Improvement Budget as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

#### VIII. Exception to Parking Policy

Mayor Logie asked the CAA Board to allow free parking in the DeVos Place® parking lot for the February 1, 2005, ballroom gala.

Motion: Ms. Klohs, supported by Mr. McInerney, moved to approve an exception to the parking policy to waive parking fees for the February 1, 2005, ballroom grand opening event. Motion carried unanimously.

#### IX. SMG Report

#### Facilities Calendar

Mr. MacKeigan reported upcoming events at Van Andel Arena® include Sting, Yanni, Josh Groban, George Straight, Stars on Ice, Globetrotters, Pepsi Jam at the Van, monster trucks, Rampage football, and Griffins hockey. Over at DeVos Place®, the consumer show season will kick off this weekend with the Auto Show. Mr. MacKeigan thanked Mayor Logie for supporting the SMG staff over the past eight year and extended his personal appreciation for welcoming him to the community.

#### X. Farewell Tribute to Mayor Logie

Mayor Logie thanked the CAA and SMG for the get-well flowers and basket. Mayor Logie's term on the CAA Board expired today when his successor, George Heartwell, was sworn in. Mayor Logie has served on the CAA Board since its inception and was instrumental in convincing the City and County to form a partnership to own and operate the Van Andel Arena® and DeVos Place®. Steve Heacock praised Mayor Logie for his leadership and presented Mayor Logie with a recognition plaque in honor of his service to the CAA Board.

#### AGREEMENT FOR INTERRUPTIBLE STEAM SERVICE

Agreement made this 18<sup>th</sup> day of February , 2005, by and between the County of Kent, acting through its Department of Public Works, a Michigan municipal corporation, of 1500 Scribner Avenue, N.W., Grand Rapids, Michigan 49504 (hereinafter referred to as the "County") and the Grand Rapids/Kent County Arena Authority, 3 Market Avenue NW. (Arena Skywalk), Grand Rapids, Michigan 49503 (hereinafter referred to as the "Customer").

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County is involved in the business of operating steam generation and distribution facilities in Grand Rapids, Michigan; and WHEREAS, the Customer desires to obtain, and the County is willing to furnish, steam generated and distributed by the County in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED BETWEEN THE PARTIES AS FOLLOWS:

1. Supply and Purchase of Steam. The Customer hereby agrees to purchase steam for the Customer's use at the Arena Skywalk, 3 Market Avenue, N.W., Grand Rapids, Michigan 49503 (the "Premises"). The County agrees to supply to Customer up to 5,000 pounds of steam per hour, which is the portion of the County's steam generation and distribution capacity reserved for the Customer's use. The County shall, upon the written request of the Customer made at least thirty (30) days in advance, permit an increase in the capacity reserved for the Customer to the extent the County determines it has excess steam available to it. The Customer agrees not to displace steam supplied by the County with steam or other form of energy, supplied from any other source, including inhouse boiler, for the term of this agreement.

- 2. <u>Description of Steam Lateral Connection</u>. The County shall supply steam to the Customer pursuant to paragraph 1 hereof by means of an existing steam service line located in Lyon Street. The steam service line and related items including, but not limited to, the service valve, are hereinafter referred to as the "Steam Service Line." All connected lines and related equipment extending beyond the Steam Service Line and the meter is the responsibility of the Customer for any maintenance and improvements.
- 3. <u>Relocation of Steam Service</u> Line. If during the term of this Agreement, Customer's use of the Premises makes necessary the relocation of the Steam Service Line, the County shall relocate the Steam Service Line at the Customer's request, and the Customer shall reimburse the County for all costs, both direct and indirect, incurred in connection herewith.
- 4. Terms and Conditions of Service. In addition to the provisions of this Agreement, the steam supplied by the County to the Customer pursuant to paragraph I hereof shall be governed by the Schedule of Rates, Terms and Conditions Governing the Sale of Steam Service adopted by the County Board of Public Works and as may be amended from time to time. A copy of the Schedule of Rates, Terms and Conditions Governing the Sale of Steam Service shall be furnished to the Customer. In the event of any express conflict between this Agreement and the Schedule of Rates, Terms and Conditions Governing the Sale of Steam Service, the provisions of the Schedule of Rates, Terms and Conditions Governing the Sale of Steam Service shall control. The Customer qualifies and the County hereby grants a service rate during the initial term hereof which includes a flat rate of \$8.60/M lb. plus or minus a fuel cost adjustment charge as determined under Section 4.I, Revised Page 3.02, as amended March 19, 2003, of the Schedule of Rates, Terms and Conditions Governing the Sale of Steam Service effective August 1, 1987.

- 5. <u>Title to Steam Service Line</u>. The parties hereto acknowledge and agree that title to and control of the Steam Service Line shall be and at all times remain in the County.
- 6. Access to Premises. The Customer hereby grants the County, its agents, contractors, and employees the full right and authority of ingress and egress at all times on and across the Premises for the purpose of constructing, operating, inspecting, maintaining, replacing, repairing, relocating, moving, and removing the Steam Service Line. This right of ingress and egress shall, however, not unreasonably interfere with Customer's use of the Premises.
- 7. <u>Maintenance of Steam Service</u> Line. The County shall be solely responsible for the maintenance and operation of the Steam Service Line.
- 8. <u>Condensate</u>. Any condensate resulting from the steam supplied under paragraph 1 hereof shall be the property of the Customer, who shall be solely responsible for its disposition.
- 9. Metering of Steam. The County shall furnish, install, and maintain the appropriate meter to determine the amount of steam delivered to the Customer. The County shall conduct periodic tests of the meter and shall maintain it within "accepted standards of accuracy."

  The Customer shall afford adequate protection to the meter to avoid any damage thereto, or tampering or interference therewith. In the case of the partial or complete failure of any meter installed by the County to register the amount of steam delivered to the Customer during any period, the amount of steam delivered to the Customer shall be determined by estimate of the County, based upon comparable periods and/or other "appropriate" factors.
- 10. Payment for Steam. The Customer agrees to pay for the amount of steam delivered to it in accordance with and at the times specified in the Schedule of Rates, Terms and Conditions Governing the Sale of Steam Service established by the County Board of Public Works and as may be amended from time to time.

- 11. Sole Use of Customer. The steam provided to Customer hereunder shall be for the sole use of Customer as set forth in paragraph 1 hereof, and shall not be retransmitted, redistributed, shared, or resold by the Customer except with the written consent of the County. When resale of steam service is approved by the County, such resale by Customer shall be made in accordance with the County's established steam rate schedule for the same class of service.
- 12. <u>Delivery of Steam</u>. The County will endeavor, but does not guarantee, to furnish a continuous supply of steam at the service valve of the Customer's Premises under the terms of this Agreement. The Customer shall be supplied steam from the low pressure distribution system of the County.

- 13. <u>Limitation of Liability</u>. The County and its designee shall not be liable for interruptions in the service, variations in the pressure, or variations in the service characteristics due to acts or omissions of the County or its designee (other than negligent acts or omissions), or for any loss or damage of any kind or character occasioned thereby, to the extent provided in the Schedule of Rates, Terms and Conditions Governing the Sale of Steam Service.
- 14. Term of Agreement. The term of this Agreement shall run for an initial period of three

  (3) years from the date of the first delivery of steam under terms of this Agreement.

  Notwithstanding any provision of this paragraph, the County may discontinue service to the

  Customer in accordance with the Schedule of Rates, Terms and Conditions Governing the

  Sale of Steam Service adopted by the County Board of Public Works, as amended from time to time.
- 15. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by, construed under, and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Michigan.

16.	Complete Agreement. The parties hereto have set forth herein their complete
agre	ement with respect to the provision of steam by the County to the Customer. The
parti	ies hereto acknowledge and agree that there are no other understandings or agreements,
whe	ther or not in writing, between them with respect to the provision of steam.

- 17. <u>Assignment</u>. This Agreement shall not be transferred or otherwise alienated by the Customer without the County's written consent.
- 18. <u>Benefit and Binding Effect</u>. Subject to paragraph 17 hereof, this Agreement shall be binding upon and benefit the parties hereto, as well as their respective successors and assigns.

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### Convention and Arena Authority -- State of the CAA February 23, 2005 Steve Heacock

### 2004 Review

Larry King once said, "Those who have succeeded at anything and don't mention luck are kidding themselves." The CAA, together with its many partners, was very successful and very lucky during 2004.

Let me note a few highlights from 2004:

1. Stretching the year just a bit, we began in December 2003 by hosting at the brand new DeVos Place convention center the 8,000 delegates of the Woodworkers' convention and 20,000 community members for the Grand Opening celebration. And we ended the year with the official christening of the new ballroom on February 1, 2005 -- 2,500 people were our guests for the \$100-a-plate community dinner held in the new 40,000 square foot, \$52 million Steelcase Ballroom. Wow! Either of these projects would be monumental – both in one year is astounding.

In total, 135 different sub-contractors worked on project, which exceeded 1,400,000 man hours. Minority business enterprises represented 17% of the total labor contracted for the project – over \$17 million. The National Average Incident Rate for the Construction Industry in 2003 was 6.8%. Our project and all subcontractors achieved an average Incident rate of 3.24% each year DeVos Place was under construction. Thanks in large part to Dale Somers's competence, relationships with the contractors and architects, communication and political skills and demeanor, both projects were ahead of schedule and under budget. The CAA was lucky to have Dale Somers on staff.

- 2. In between the opening of DeVos Place and the Steelcase Ballroom, the CAA hosted a number of events, which included:
  - At the Van Andel Arena -- the Harlem Globetrotters, Gordon Food Service's annual meeting, monster trucks, a rodeo, 2 college commencements, a world title boxing match, the Eagles, Metallica, Shania Twain, the Blueman Group and, of course the Griffins and Rampage.

- At the DeVos Performance Hall -- Bill Cosby, Jerry Seinfeld, Sesame Street Live, Chinese Acrobats, Wynton Marsalis and, of course, the Ballet, Opera, Symphony and Broadway Theater Guild.
- At the DeVos Place the Blueberry Growers association, the Michigan Republican State Committee, Weslyan Church, Jim Beam Bottle Collectors, the Women's Expo and, of course, the auto, boat, sport fishing and home & garden shows.
- In total, during 2004, the Van Andel Arena was used by about 750,000 patrons and DeVos Place was used by about 600,000, which is a total of about 1.4 million people.

Once again, SMG brought top-notch entertainment and events to the Arena and Performance Hall and together with the CVB, the Amway Grand and Showspan, attracted thousands of people to DeVos Place. Rich MacKeigan's strong management skills, wisdom and personal relationships with promoters, has made the CAA facilities venues-of-choice. The CAA is lucky to have Rich MacKeigan in Grand Rapids.

### 3. Other highlights include

- DeVos Performance Hall closed for the summer so that we could complete a \$5 million makeover, paid for by Grand Action. All of the seating was removed, recovered, and reinstalled; restrooms were redone; and the lobby was carpeted, handrails repainted, and a new ADA elevator was installed. Cameras and large flat video screens were installed and the box seating areas were restyled.
- Our administrator, Sue Waddell voluntarily and energetically accepted an expanded role and now provides the necessary bookkeeping in addition to her other roles.
- During 2004, David Frey, the first appointed member of the CAA, ended his 4-year term on the CAA. David served this entity well, providing a needed connection to Grand Action and leading the Building Committee in its oversight of construction of DeVos Place. And at the January 26, 2005, CAA Board meeting, Chair Logie retired. A one-sentence tribute is obviously inadequate but as Mayor John was one of a handful of key players in the formation of the CAA and also ably served us as our Chair the past 2 years. He did well by the City he so dearly loves. The CAA was lucky to have David Fry and John Logie.
- We welcomed as David's successor, Gary McInerney and John's successor, Mayor George Heartwell. We all look forward to working with each of them. They each bring a wealth of talent and experience to the CAA.

2004 was a good year but its time to move on. George Bernard Shaw wrote, "I dread success. To have succeeded is to have finished one's business on earth, like the male spider, who is killed by the female the moment he has succeeded in his courtship. I like a state of continual becoming, with a goal in front and not behind."

While Shaw's analogy is a little harsh, I too believe that we need to be in a "state of continual becoming, with a goal in front and not behind."

### Agenda for '05

Here's what I would like to see us accomplish during 2005.

- 1. Review the booking policy While I had hoped never to look at the booking policy again, the policy requires a review after 3 years. Under the theory that anything new is inherently, at least in part, experimental, the policy asks us to now use the benefit of hindsight to ascertain that the policy is operating as planned. I would like Rich (through interviews, informal surveys and otherwise) to determine and report to a committee of the board as to whether the policy is working and to propose any necessary or recommended changes for the board's consideration.
- 2. 5-year and long-term capital plan Bill Gates noted that "Success is a lousy teacher. It seduces smart people into thinking they can't lose." In fact, lean time could come - there may actually be a year when Cher does not have a farewell tour. While it is difficult to talk about future repairs while confetti from the opening celebration is still falling, it is necessary. Our unique arrangement with Grand Rapids and Kent County demands that we carefully plan our financial future. Our long-term financial planning needs to include discussion of an outdoor amphitheater. It becomes increasingly clear that West Michigan is a market that can and will soon support a large outdoor amphitheater. The implications of such an amphitheater to the CAA are significant. Any reduction in CAA concerts reduces our ability to support the investment our community has made in CAA facilities. Conversely, any increase in CAA concerts makes the necessary operating margins easier to achieve. I would like SMG and appointed committee members to undertake a study to determine what, if any, involvement the CAA should have in a West Michigan outdoor amphitheater. In addition to the amphitheater discussion and the work on "enhancing revenues" that Gary McInerney is leading, I would like Birgit and the finance committee, with Chris and

Rich's help, to prepare a long-term capital plan for the board's consideration and adoption.

- 3. CAA relationship with the City of Grand Rapids and Kent County To a large extent, the CAA is a unique joint venture between Grand Rapids and Kent County. While we are an independent body with responsibilities and accountabilities defined by State law, the City and County together appoint a majority of our board and could ultimately be responsible for the entities' financial survival. While the CAA acts independently of the City and County, I believe that communications between the CAA and each local government must be open with both depth and breath. I would like Mayor Heartwell and Birgit, the City appointees, and Joe and me, the County appointees, to design a process that assures that timely and open communications occur on a routine basis.
- 4. People of color The CAA's facilities are community assets, dedicated for the benefit of all citizens. The CAA and SMG desire to provide a diversity of activities and to serve all communities within Grand Rapids and Kent County. During 2005, I will be appointing a committee of CAA members, staff and community representatives to examine the reach of our efforts and to suggest financially viable actions we could undertake to better address the needs of our diverse communities.

So how do we measure success? Just look at our facilities -- thanks to our staff and partners, on March 12, 2005, the CAA will have every single room in use at both buildings for the first time.
