MINUTES OF THE GRAND RAPIDS-KENT COUNTY CONVENTION/ARENA AUTHORITY BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

Tuesday, November 7, 2006

I. Call to Order

Chairman Steve Heacock called the meeting to order at 9:20 a.m. Chairman Heacock presided and Susan Waddell recorded in the absence of Secretary/Treasurer Birgit Klohs.

II. Minutes of Prior Meeting

Motion: Mr. Tomaselli, supported by Mr. Chamberlin, moved to approve the Minutes of the September 27, 2006, meeting of the Authority. Motion carried unanimously.

III. Committee Reports

a. Operations Committee.

i. Operations Committee Update

The Committee received a report from Todd Johnson who announced that the new host desk for DeVos Place® has been installed, effectively allowing the grand gallery to be open to the public. The host desk will be staffed by DK Security personnel from 8:00 a.m. -6:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, plus all event hours. The host desk will serve as a focal point for information and directions, as well as a security checkpoint.

The Committee took action on painting the vulnerable areas of the Van Andel Arena® lobby. Currently, the lobby wall above the granite is painted with a product called zolotone. Zolotone is a flat paint containing stucco specks that is extremely hard to repaint and patch, in addition to being costly. The cost to repaint the lobby is \$20,000. SMG requested approval to paint areas of the lobby wall with a flat gray paint. The lobby walls would have a 3-layer effect: granite at the bottom, flat gray paint in the middle, and zolotone at the top. The Committee approved the request, provided that the design professionals at Progressive AE to review the concept.

ii. CVB Report

Mr. Wilson announced that the CVB has booked the American Jail Association convention for the year 2013. Convention delegates will utilize 5,700 room nights and have an economic impact of \$1.6 million.

b. Finance Committee

i. SMG September 2006 Financial Statements for DeVos Place® and Van Andel Arena®

Motion: Mr. Charles, supported by Mr. Heartwell, moved to approve the SMG Financial Statements for DeVos Place® and the Van Andel Arena® for the period ended September 30, 2006. After review and discussion, the motion was unanimously adopted.

ii. CAA September 2006 Financial Statements

Motion: Mr. Charles, supported by Mr. Heartwell, moved to approve the CAA Financial Statements for the period ended September 30, 2006. After review and discussion, the motion was unanimously adopted.

iii. Special-Purpose Financial Statements for the Years Ended June 30, 2006 and 2005 – DeVos Place® and Van Andel Arena®, as Managed by SMG

The special-purpose financial statements are issued to test the validity of the SMG incentive fee calculations. Deloitte & Touche has found the SMG operations to be well controlled and has provided "clean" audits for both facilities. Mr. Machuta added that the information in the audits is very similar to that provided in the June 2006 preliminary financial statements.

Motion: Mr. Tomaselli, supported by Mr. Heartwell, moved to accept and approve the Special-Purpose Financial Statements as of and for the Years Ended June 30, 2006 and 2005, and Independent Auditors' Report – DeVos Place® and Van Andel Arena®, as managed by SMG. The motion was unanimously adopted.

iv. SMG Food & Beverage September 2006 Revenue and Commission Report

Mr. Machuta presented the report and referred to the per cap comparison. A fiscal year 2006 concert average was used as a comparison for the Eric Clapton concert, since this was his first visit. Otherwise, the month-to-date totals are consistent with the budget figures.

IV. CAA Initiated Events

Mr. McInerney is spearheading an effort to identify additional potential streams of revenue. One idea presented was a wine and food festival that would be sponsored by the CAA. A contingent of industry professionals traveled to the Ottawa Wine & Food Festival held last weekend with the intent of assessing the viability for our marketing. The group concluded that such an event would be worth the risk and investment would benefit the community. A full report will be presented at the January 2007 meeting.

V. Ticket Policy Discussion

Mr. McInerney stated that he has received complaints from patrons who were standing in line to purchase tickets for the upcoming Bob Seger concert and received less-than-favorable seating. Mr. McInerney wondered if the CAA should adopt a ticket policy to either encourage or discourage people from standing in line or to set aside a certain number of premium tickets for those waiting in line.

Mr. MacKeigan explained that the artists own the tickets, except for the premium seating and suites. In this instance, Bob Seger's manager requested that tickets be set aside for all patrons standing in line and the issue was more pronounced because of the demand for Seger tickets. Because of health, public safety, and sanitation issues, SMG tries to discourage lines for all concerts. The best way to purchase tickets is on-line through TicketMaster.

Mr. MacKeigan addressed the issue of ticket scalping inasmuch as he has received complaints that Seger tickets are being offered at on-line auctions for hundreds of dollars. Currently the practice of selling and purchasing tickets above cost on-line is legal. In fact, some artists hold on-line auctions at their websites to prevent scalping and to gauge the true return on the tickets. SMG will cancel a ticket if it becomes known that a scalper has a ticket belonging to a premium seat holder.

VI. SMG Report and Facilities Calendar

Mr. MacKeigan presented a summary of the upcoming events that will be held at DeVos Place® and the Van Andel Arena®.

Comments:

The bottom line of DeVos Place performed at expected levels for the month, and has continued to do so through the first part of the fiscal year. Overall, the facility is still running below budget on revenues, however, offset by continued savings in expenses. As the expense savings has more to do with timing, it is still anticipated that DeVos will end slightly behind original expectations. From Abraham to Jesus was originally an October event, however, moved to November. Revenue was offset by the unbudgeted Landscaping tradeshow, which should allow the facility to show a positive variance when looking at the two months combined.

Report to the Board of Directors

Our Responsibility Under Generally Accepted Auditing Standards

As stated in our engagement letter dated September 24, 2006, our responsibility, as prescribed by professional standards, is to plan and perform our audit to obtain reasonable, but not absolute, assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatements, whether caused by error or fraud. Memorandum of Recommendations

Social Security Number Privacy Act

The State of Michigan enacted Public Act 454, Social Security Privacy Act, which was effective March 1, 2005. This law places certain restrictions on the use of employees' social security numbers. With limited exceptions, the Authority is prohibited from displaying more than the last four digits of employees' social security numbers. The Authority does not have a policy limiting the use of employees' social security numbers.

Recommendation

Review the new law and implement a policy to ensure that the Authority is in compliance with this State law. The new policy should be communicated to all employees and monitored to ensure compliance.

Investment Policy

The Authority had funds invested in corporate bonds during the year. Public Act 20 of 1943 specifies the types of investments that are allowable for the Authority. Investments may be in obligations of the U.S. Treasury and related government agencies, commercial paper rated prime and maturing within 270 days, bankers' acceptances, repurchase agreements, obligations of the state of Michigan or any of its political subdivisions rated investment grade and mutual funds composed of the types of investment vehicles named previously.

Recommendation

Monitor the Authority's investments to ensure that they are in compliance with all applicable statutory requirements. In addition, all agents of the Authority who have responsibility for investing the Authority's funds should review the policy and only invest in those funds allowed by the law.

Memorandum of Recommendations

New Pronouncements

There are several new pronouncements that have been issued by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) that could affect future financial reports issued by the Authority. A brief summary of these new pronouncements is listed below:

GASB Statement No. 46, Net Assets Restricted by Enabling Legislation is to help governments determine when net assets are restricted by enabling legislation and how to report them in the financial statements. This will be effective for the Authority for the year ending June 30, 2007.

GASB Statement No. 47, Accounting for Termination Benefits contains guidance on reporting benefits paid to employees who terminate employment. For financial statements prepared on the accrual basis, a liability should be recognized for voluntary termination benefits when the offer is accepted and the amount can be estimated. A liability should be recognized for involuntary termination benefits when a plan of termination has been approved, communicated to the employees and the amount can be estimated. This will be effective for the Authority for the year ending June 30, 2007.

Recommendation

Review the new pronouncements to determine changes necessary to ensure that the Authority is in compliance with applicable financial statement and note disclosures.

The attached two-page report provides a summary (cliff notes) of the financial position of the Convention/Arena Authority. The summary includes a recitation of Revenues, Expenses, and Changes in Net Assets (Unrestricted) for the year ended June 30, 2005 (FY 2005), comparable status at intervals for the Fiscal Year ended June 30, 2006 (FY 2006) and the current status of the Fiscal Year 2007 budget. The term "Net Assets (Unrestricted)" excludes capital assets which are not deemed available to support ongoing operations.

The FY 2007 budget, as adopted, provided for a draw of \$1.76 million from Net Assets (Unrestricted). This "draw" will be significantly reduced by additional revenue increases (over original budget estimates) in the categories of Facilities-SMG, Parking and Investment Income. In addition, the current year (FY 2007) capital budget of \$3.18 million includes a one-time Fiscal Year 2006 capital carryover appropriation of \$2,089,230. The long-range capital replacement schedule, included in the Fiscal Year 2007 budget request memorandum (July 20, 2006), forecasted a Fiscal Year 2008 capital replacement requirement of \$829,600.

It would appear that the Convention/Arena Authority should be able to maintain its "Net Assets (Unrestricted)" balance for the next several years. The long-range capital repair/replacement forecast suggested a need to substantially increase funding in Fiscal Years 2012 and thereafter. The long-range capital repair/replacement forecast will be updated as part of the Fiscal Year 2008 budget cycle.

Re: Sports Commission Funding

I have received a request from Roger Morgan on behalf of the Kent County Board of Commissioners (see attached) to provide funding for a Sports Commission. The request outlines some of the benefits that they see for CAA venues as well as the West Michigan community overall. The request is for a commitment of \$25,000 annually.

Discussions regarding a sports commission have been on and off for a few years now, but under the leadership of Roger Morgan and Peter Secchia, the county and a few key private sector donors are taking a leadership role in an effort to making it a reality. The impact the Sport Commission will have could be significant; however, CAA venues would not be the principle benefactors; rather, the non-downtown community facilities and fields, restaurants, hotels and service sector businesses. I do anticipate some benefit to CAA facilities, but not to the degree of other community assets. For this reason, a request for \$25,000 towards an overall budget of approximately \$400,000 is a reasonable one. Funding at a higher level, would be beyond my expected return. This would be an investment.

While the opportunities the sports commission will provide our community could have a modest direct impact on our facilities, they could have a significant impact on the hotel/motel tax revenue the county receives which in turn benefits the CAA venues to provide for bond retirement.

I would like to request the CAA approve a pledge of \$25,000 for this current fiscal year and that we place a marker in our budget moving forward. There are currently funds available within our current year's budget to accommodate this request. I would recommend the funding for the Sport Commission to be contractual in nature and for the CAA to require our funds to be allocated towards efforts specifically designed to benefit CAA venues. While the funds would be turned over in advance lump sum, the CAA would receive quarterly reports on the efforts of the CAA with appropriate documentation demonstrating how the funds were spent. The money would be contingent upon the Sports Commission becoming a reality; it would be a pledge until the Sports Commission is formed and an agreement is signed between the two entities. Initial conversations with the County indicate such an arrangement would be agreeable.

Should the CAA approve this request, I will work with Dick Wendt to structure a formal agreement between CAA and the Sports Commission. As always, I am available should you have any questions, comments or concerns.

As you know, in July of this year I established a Subcommittee of the Kent County Board of Commissioners to provide a recommendation regarding the creation of a West Michigan Sports Commission (WMSC). Since that time, the Subcommittee studied potential roles of a sports commission and how creating a commission may impact Kent County and West Michigan.

Recently, the Subcommittee reported its findings to the community at a stakeholder/interested party update. One of the key findings is that for a sports commission to be successful, it is essential that it have broad based community support from many sectors including, but not limited to, private & corporate businesses, the public sector, and non-profit organizations.

The Subcommittee has identified the Grand Rapids-Kent County Convention/Arena Authority (CAA) Board as a significant stakeholder in this endeavor due to its governance of the VanAndel Arena and DeVos Place. To that point, the Subcommittee is requesting an opportunity to share its findings with the CAA Board with the understanding that the CAA Board be requested to provide a \$25,000 annual appropriation to support the operation of the WMSC.

For your information, concurrent to the CAA request, the Sports Commission Subcommittee is seeking other funding to support the WMSC which includes:

- Formal approval from the County Board of Commissioners for a \$200,000 annual appropriation for five years
- An annual appropriation from the Grand Rapids/Kent County CVB
- An annual contribution from the private sector of at least \$100,000

Re: Project Homeless Facility Use

Mayor Heartwell and the City of Grand Rapids have requested the use of the VanAndel Arena for an event called Project Homeless. The event is scheduled for January 25, 2007 and would run from 10 am to 3 pm. The arena is available and I do not foresee another possible user requesting the date. They anticipate anywhere between 500-1000 people attending.

This is a national "best practice" model which involves a one day event to provide services and resources for persons who are homeless in our community, and also provides an opportunity for other community citizens to volunteer to help during that day. Ideally this would be housed at one central site, linking people to benefits and services to help lead them on the path to permanent housing and stability. There will also be a meal served as well as a number of informational exhibits for those who are dealing with homelessness.

Within the SMG Management contract, the CAA, City and County have the ability to use DeVos Place and/or VanAndel Arena rent free up to \$25,000/ year provided the use does not limit SMG from renting the space (see attached).

I would like to request the CAA approve this use of the facility as it is within the parameters set aside within the SMG management agreement.

All expenses would still be the responsibility of the event; however, I anticipate expenses to be minimal, if any, as all services and goods are being donated. The City will look to enlist the assistance of the Police Department to assist with security.

Should the CAA approve this request, SMG will work with the Mayor's office and Salvation Army (who is facilitating the event) to execute a facility use contract and assure appropriate insurance coverage is in place. As always, I am available should you have any questions, comments or concerns; as is Mayor Heartwell.

MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT between the GRAND RAPIDS-KENT COUNTY CONVENTION/ARENA AUTHORITY and SMG Dated as of July 1, 2006

ARTICLE XIII MISCELLANEOUS

Section 13.1. Use of the Facilities at Direction of the County, the City or the Authority.

- (a) The County, the City and the Authority shall have the right to use either Facility or any part thereof, upon reasonable advance notice and subject to availability, for such purposes as meetings, seminars, training classes or other uses without the payment of any rental or use fee except that direct out-of-pocket expenses incurred in connection with such uses shall be paid by the County, the City or the Authority, as the case may be.
- (b) The County, the City and the Authority shall not schedule use of either Facility pursuant to subsection (a) above if such use will conflict with paying events booked by SMG and shall in all instances be subordinate thereto in terms of priority of use of either Facility, provided, however, that the County, the City and the Authority shall not be subordinate with respect to any competing use which is first scheduled within the 21 day period immediately preceding the scheduled use of the County, the City or the Authority. If either of the Facilities are to be used at the County's, the City's or the Authority's request or by the County, the City or the Authority pursuant to subparagraph (a) above, a normal rent or use fee which otherwise would be chargeable for such event shall be deemed to have been paid, and any such deemed payments which exceed the amount of \$25,000 in any Fiscal Year shall constitute Operating Revenues for the respective Facility for the purpose of calculating SMG's incentive fee pursuant to Section 4.2 hereof.
