# MINUTES OF THE GRAND RAPIDS-KENT COUNTY CONVENTION/ARENA AUTHORITY BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING Wednesday, August 28, 2002

### I. Call to Order

Chairman John Logie called the meeting to order at 7:30 a.m. Chairman Logie presided and Secretary/Treasurer Birgit Klohs recorded.

### II. Minutes of Prior Meetings

Motion: Mr. Frey, supported by Ms. Klohs, moved to approve the Minutes of the June 26, 2002 meeting of the Authority. Motion carried unanimously.

### III. Public Comment

Scott Atchison, 2251 South Saulk Trail, Grand Rapids, Michigan, presented his plan for a City/County information booth. Billed as "something in it for everyone," an all-season, outdoor information booth would be placed by Rosa Parks Circle to assist conventioneers, visitors, and tourists with information on "what to do" and "how to get there." Restaurant information would include a daily menu matrix featuring advertised specials with a price, menus, hours of operation, address, and telephone number. The information would also include a walking tour of downtown Grand Rapids translated into various

languages. Any business paying downtown development tax or a member of the CVB or Chamber of Commerce could have information presented.

Mr. Atchison suggested that *The Grand Rapids Press* publish a new magazine entitled "The Convention Weekly" that would be distributed at the information booth and in the Sunday *Press*. The new magazine would show the layout of the new convention center. The magazine would describe upcoming conventions showing the locations, times and describing the events and speakers. The magazine could contain articles about conventioneers and the history of specific conventions. The magazine could also contain historical articles about Grand Rapids.

Mr. Atchison proposed that a new organization, Michigan Flashcard, process the information and coordinate the activities of the information booth. Mr. Atchison is seeking financial support from the City of Grand Rapids, Kent county, CVB, DDA, Grand Rapids Police, Kent County Sheriff, Chamber of Commerce, *The Grand Rapid Press*, and private contributions.

### IV. Presentation

None.

### V. DeVos Place Construction Update - Matt Barnes, Joe Erhardt

Mr. Erhardt reported that the Grand Gallery structural steel detailing and installation were completed in July. The subcontractors are installing the metal roof decking around the skylight openings. Elsewhere in the Grand Gallery, air-handling units are being installed in the penthouse and subcontractors are preparing to spray fireproofing. Mechanical and electrical trades continue to rough in on all levels and limestone cladding on the east stair tower is progressing well. The roofer has completed the roof membrane and is preparing to start the main roof installation. The Exhibit Hall consists primarily of steel and concrete work. The east box truss has been completed and the west box truss is well underway. Installation of the catwalk system above the floor has begun and preparations are underway to place concrete in the box truss.

Mr. Barnes stated construction documents for phase III were reviewed and are being edited for issuance of bids. Erhardt/Hunt, Progressive AE, and the Owner Representatives are working to establish a release timetable and bidding period. In answer to a question from Mr. Frey, Mr. Barnes stated that the north elevator in DeVos Performance Hall has been updated and approved by state officials. Renovation of the south elevator has begun. In answer to a question from Mayor Logie about wrapping the building for winter, Mr. Barnes stated the contractors plan to get the skin on by snowfall.

Mr. Barnes reported that only one lost-time accident has occurred with over 300,000 man hours worked and 250 trades people on the construction site. The construction manager is working diligently to maintain MBE/WBE interest in new work. Erhardt/Hunt was a sponsor of the annual M/WBE golf outing. In late September, Erhardt/Hunt will be conducting an in-reach program. Erhardt/Hunt will schedule interviews with interested parties to discuss opportunities for participation. Mr. Heacock stated that he has talked with Commissioner James Vaughn and Mr. Roosevelt Tillman about training opportunities for people of color. Mr. Heacock inquired about ways to encourage such training for apprentices. Mr. Barnes responded that currently the mix of workers is split 50/50 between union and non-union. The unions would have their own training programs. Mr. Barnes would be happy to approach the idea with the non-union workers. Mr. Heacock will set up a meeting with Messers. Vaughn and Tillman to explore the idea further. Ms. Klohs suggested that officials from Grand Rapids Community College be included in the meeting. Today, the 90,000 square feet M-Tec center will be dedicated and one-third of the building will be devoted to building trades. One of the College's new programs will include a construction trades pre-apprenticeship program. Mr. Barnes will pursue the suggestion and report back to the CAA.

### VI. Committee Reports

### **Building Committee**

Mr. Sommers reported that the Committee has requested SMG to provide consulting services for FF&E as established by the Management Agreement. Last week the Committee reviewed the graphics/signage package for Phases II and III. Additionally, the Committee approved amendments to the consulting services agreement with Robert Duff Consulting, Inc. and Jim Hiashutter and Jerry Fellinger.

### Operations Committee

Mr. Chamberlin reported that the Committee received a legal opinion from Richard Wendt regarding scheduling the 2004 Auto Show. Mr. Wendt concluded that the only parameters required were those set forth in the CAA Booking policy. The booking policy provides that the CAA is responsible for final determinations regarding the booking and use of CAA facilities. In Mr. Wendt's opinion, the CAA is not restricted in its determination. The Committee referred the matter to Mr. MacKeigan since SMG operates the facility and has the most expertise dealing with these types of issues.

The Committee also discussed possibility of hosting charitable events at the Arena, such as "Breakfast with Santa" where children come to the Arena for breakfast at Christmastime. Down the road, the Committee may form a nonprofit foundation or link up with a local charity. Mr. MacKeigan will continue to develop the idea and report back with additional information.

SMG Assistant General Manager Jim Watt provided the Committee with an update on capital issues. Most significantly, the hockey league has required that protective netting be hung around the curved ends of the bowl. The netting will stretch 140 feet from corner to corner on each end of the rink. The netting will be attached to the top of the boards, just below the glass, and will rise 20 feet high. The price could range from \$35,000 to \$150,000, but Mr. Watt estimates that a netting system for the Arena will cost between \$60,000 - \$90,000.

Mr. Wilson announced that the CVB has booked 47 conventions for DeVos Place from 2003 through 2007, for an estimated economic impact of \$21.5 million. Recently booked is the Handweavers Guild for June 2006, which will bring in 2,500 participants from over 30 counties. The conventioneers will use 3,755 room nights and have an economic impact of more than \$1 million. Also newly committed are the National Rural Letter Carriers for August 2007. This group will bring in more than 3,2000 delegates and use more than 8,000 hotel rooms. Mr. Wilson introduced Lynn Swets from the Handweavers Guild, Dan and Jean Werner of the National Rural Letter Carriers Association, and the CVB sales team. In early September, the CVB is hosting a familiarization tour for 25 meeting planners. Rich DeVos will kick-off the tour with a welcome reception at the DeVos Performance Hall lobby.

### Finance Committee

Mr. Heacock presented the Finance Committee report.

a. Approval of Disbursements for the Period June 14 - August 14, 2002

Motion: Mr. Heacock, supported by Ms. Klohs, moved to approve payment of disbursements totaling \$11,695,124.11, as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

b. Approval of SMG Financial Statements for Periods Ending June 30, 2002 and July 31, 2002

Mr. Heacock indicated the June 30, 2002, year-end statement was preliminary pending completion of the audit. Mr. Heacock congratulated SMG on the tremendous outcome for the Grand Center. Construction was expected to interfere with events at the facility and the budget initially anticipated a loss in excess of \$500,000. Because SMG was successful in booking the venue, the loss was just \$70,000. Performance for July was much better than budgeted, as the Grand Center continued to host the airport training event. The Van Andel Arena year-end statements show 2002 to be the second most successful year for the building.

Motion: Mr. Heacock, supported by Mr. Tomaselli, moved to approve the SMG Financial Statements for the Van Andel Arena and Grand Center for the periods ended June 30, 2002, and July 31, 2002, as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

c. Approval of CAA Preliminary Financial Statements
Prepared by Beene Garter LLP

Motion: Mr. Heacock, supported by Ms. Klohs, moved to approve the Grand Rapids – Kent County Convention/Arena Authority Financial Statements for the periods ended June 30, 2002, and July 31, 2002, as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

### VII. Approval of Resolution Authorizing Execution of Agreements

Mr. Wendt recommended approval of a resolution authorizing execution of Van Andel Arena Premium Seat Agreements and Corporate Suite Agreements. Mr. Wendt explained that resolution provides general authority for the Chairman of the CAA, or his or her designee, to sign such agreements.

Motion: Mr. Heacock, supported by Mr. Frey, moved to approve the Resolution Authorizing Execution of Van Andel Arena Premium Seat Agreements and Corporate Suite Agreements. Motion carried unanimously.

VIII. Resolution Approving Amendment to Agreement for Consulting Services with Robert Duff
Consulting, Inc. and Resolution Approving Amendment to Agreement for Consulting Services
with Jim Hiashutter and Jerry Fellinger

Mr. Wendt recommended approval of a resolution approving amendment to agreement for consulting services with Robert Duff Consulting, Inc. Mr. Duff provides consulting services to the CAA in connection with the development of an information technology system for DeVos Place. In lieu of a total maximum compensation, Mr. Duff would be paid a consultant fee of \$95 per hour covering a specific period of time and approved in advance by the CAA's owner's representative.

Mr. Wendt also recommended approval of a resolution approving amendment to agreement for Consulting Services with Jim Hiashutter and Jerry Fellinger. These consultants provide services to the CAA in connection with the development of fire safety and security systems for DeVos Place. In lieu of a total maximum compensation, Messrs. Hiashutter and Fellinger would be paid a consultant fee of \$100 per hour covering a specific period of time and approved in advance by the CAA's owner's representative.

Mr. Heacock expressed concern about removing limitations on the total compensation. Mr. Sommers reassured the CAA that a work plan would be submitted to the Building Committee and scrutinized closely by the owner's representative. Mr. Logie stated that the CAA would like a regular report of fees paid to these consultants.

Motion: Ms. Klohs, supported by Mr. Tomaselli, moved to adopt the Resolution Approving Amendment to Agreement for Consulting Services with Robert Duff Consulting, Inc. and the Resolution Approving Amendment to Agreement for Consulting Services with Jim Hiashutter and Jerry Fellinger. Motion carried unanimously.

### IX. SMG Report

### Facilities Calendar

Mr. MacKeigan reported that The Who concert last night was very successful. The Who recorded the concert for charity and the CD is already available. More information can be found at the following website: <a href="www.themusic.com">www.themusic.com</a>. Styx and REO are playing tonight. September begins the busy season and many events have been booked, such as the Bill Gaither Homecoming concert, Redwings Red & White game, Dragon Tales, "I Still Do," and the Ringling Brothers Circus. Next Wednesday, the Department of Justice will hold a disaster preparedness exercise at the Arena. Representatives from the Symphony and the museum have approached Mr. MacKeigan to donate the Welsh Auditorium for a memorial event on September 11. Mr. MacKeigan recommended that the CAA approve waiving the rent. Expenses would be recouped.

Motion: Mr. Heacock, supported by Ms. Klohs, moved to waive the rental fee for the September 11, 2002, event as recommended. Motion carried unanimously.

### XII. Adjournment

There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:40 a.m.

### **BUILDING COMMITTEE REPORT**

### Grand Rapids-Kent County Convention/Arena Authority September 18, 2001

The month of August saw good progress of the Grand Gallery enclosure activities. Modern Roofing has completed the penthouse and mechanical level roof areas, leaving only the curved roof section, which will be completed following the skylight installation. Presently the upper skylight section is installed and the lower vaulted unit is due in early September. The East and West tensil truss and curtainwall components have arrived and Architectural Glass & Metal, Inc. has begun installation.

Thru-out the interior of the Grand Gallery, air-handling units are being hooked up in the penthouse, and Bouma Corp. and Cleveland Construction have continued spray fireproofing and metal studwork respectively. Spray Fireproofing is approximately 80% complete, and Cleveland is framing exterior studs, interior walls, and is hanging sheathing board on the Marque Wall.

The Exhibit Hall work still consist primarily of steel and concrete work. AZCO has completed the East Box Truss and the West Truss. They have also successfully detailed and decked out the east third of the roof over the Exhibit floor space. The Catwalk System installation above the floor continues and preparations are underway to place concrete in the West Box Truss. The East Box Truss floor slab was placed earlier this month.

Steel Service and AZCO continued erecting the West side Exhibit Hall roof section while roofing began on the East side. Lynn Masonry is installing concrete block walls on the East elevation beginning the critical enclosure element of the Exhibit Hall. Kent/Tillman placed another 13,200 sf of show space floor and a similar quantity of parking space floor.

Phase 3 work includes the continuation of the following elevator modernization. The first of two passed state inspection the first week of August, and the 2<sup>nd</sup> elevator is progressing well for a September inspection.

Construction documents for Phase 3 were reviewed and are being edited for issuance for bids. E/H, PAE and C.A.A. have established a release timetable and bidding period.

Committee approved contract with Mid-State Security for card access, alarm system, CCTV system, and security office console system.

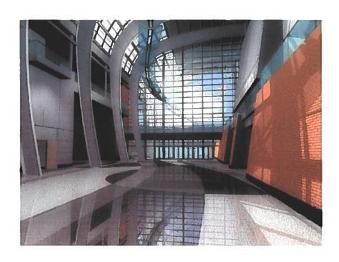
