MINUTES OF THE GRAND RAPIDS-KENT COUNTY CONVENTION/ARENA AUTHORITY **BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING** Wednesday, August 27, 2003

I. Call to Order

Chairman John Logie called the meeting to order at 7:35 a.m. Chairman Logie presided and Secretary/Treasurer Birgit Klohs recorded.

Π. Minutes of Prior Meetings

Motion: Mr. Frey, supported by Ms. Klohs, moved to approve the Minutes of the June 25, 2003, meetings of the Authority. Motion carried unanimously.

III. **DeVos Place Construction Update**

Members watched videotape of the Welsh Auditorium roof implosion. The roof was demolished with 21 pounds of C-4 plastic explosives planted on the trusses. The street was reopened within five minutes after the detonation. Sorting and hauling off of the debris is 95% complete. Mr. Erhardt reported that

construction continues to progress on time and within budget. The Exhibit Hall will be finished in time for the Woodworkers Expo in November. Testing has occurred on the Grand Gallery electrical systems. Final testing and system balancing of the HVAC is in process. The phase 3 contractor found an old fuel oil tank 12'-15' below grade. The tank has been removed and contaminated soil will be hauled to the Ottawa landfill.

IV. Committee Reports

Building Committee

Mr. Frey reported that final polishing has begun on the terrazzo floor system. Grand Galley painting is complete, along with the installation of the snake light. In the meeting rooms, drywall finishing, painting, and ceiling grid installations are complete. Carpet is in process on the meeting level, along with wood doors. The enclosure of the exhibit box is complete. The temporary floor will be taken apart within the next month.

The Building Committee recommended approval of a Memorandum of Understanding with Grand Action related to DeVos Performance Hall Interior Renovation. Grand Action has agreed to fund the entire \$4.4 million cost. The scope of work includes refurbishment of existing theater seating; provide new interior finish for walls, flooring, and painting of balcony ceiling; enhance lighting in side circulation and balcony overhang areas with color wall wash and accent fixtures; replace balcony light fixtures; redesign all balcony fronts to create a refreshed look and improve sight lines; address ADA issues in house seating areas, orchestra, mezzanine, balcony; and coordinate the introduction of a multi-media video system.

Motion: Mr. Frey, supported by Ms. Klohs, moved to approve the Resolution Approving completion of the DeVos Performance Hall Interior Renovation Project and Approving and Authorizing Entering Into Certain Agreements Related Thereto. Motion carried unanimously.

Operations Committee

Mr. Chamberlin stated the Operations Committee met with MDOT and City officials regarding plans to refurbish bridges on I-196 east of US-131. MDOT must complete an environmental impact study of the entire corridor before construction begins. MDOT would like to begin the work in 2005, but the environmental impact study may not be approved until 2006 or 2007. The restoration work will include bridges on Ottawa Avenue, Ionia Avenue, and Division. The work will be done in stages so that two lanes are maintained at all times. The bridge restoration will be completed within one construction season (April-November), although prep work could start before April and finish work completed after November.

The Operations Committee recommended approval of M/WBE Police and Administrative Guideline revisions as requested by the City of Grand Rapids. Specific revisions to the Policy were summarized in a memorandum included with the agenda packet.

Motion: Mr. Chamberlin, supported by Mr. Frey, moved to adopt the City of Grand Rapids M/WBE Policy and Administrative Guideline Revisions. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Helmstead reported that the CVB sales team is 80% ahead of its goal for the year. New bookings for DeVos Place include the National Association of County Agricultural Agenda, the National Fishing Lure Collectors, and the Michigan Townships Association. The CVB hosted 19 meeting planners for a FAM tour August 7-10. The CVB will welcome 17-21 travel journalists for a press tour in September. In October, the CVB will co-sponsor an educational event in Washington, D.C. for 65 meeting planners.

Finance Committee

Mr. White presented the Finance Committee report.

a. Approval of Disbursements and Payroll for the Period June 13 – August 14, 2003

Motion: Mr. Charles, supported by Ms. Klohs, moved to approve payment of disbursements and payroll totaling \$8, 629,100.88. Motion carried unanimously.

b. Approval of SMG Financial Statements for the Grand Center and Van Andel Arena®

Motion: Ms. Klohs, supported by Mr. Frey, moved to approve the SMG Financial Statements for the Van Andel Arena® and Grand Center for the periods ended June 30 and July 31, 2003. Motion carried unanimously.

c. Approval of CAA Preliminary Financial Statements Prepared by Beene Garter LLP

Motion: Mr. Charles, supported by Ms. Klohs, moved to approve the Grand Rapids – Kent County Convention/Arena Authority Financial Statements for the periods ended June 30 and July 31, 2003. Motion carried unanimously.

d. General Liability Insurance Renewal

Mr. White asked the Board to validate action taken by the Finance Committee to bind coverage for renewal of the general liability insurance coverage. The policy expired August 23. The renewal proposal is basically the same terms and conditions as the expiring policy. The primary limit is \$1 million and the endorsed excess liability limit is \$9 million. The renewal premium was \$3,846, while the expiring premium was \$3,799.

Motion: Mr. Frey, supported by Ms. Klohs, moved to validate the action of the Finance Committee to approve renewal of the general liability insurance policy. Motion carried unanimously.

V. Resolution Approving and Authorizing Execution of a First Amendment to Sublease

Mr. Wendt recommended approval of an amendment to the Sublease Agreement with Kent County in connection with the issuance by the City-County Building Authority of additional bonds in the amount of \$10 million needed to complete DeVos Place.

Motion: Ms. Klohs, supported by Mr. Charles, moved to approve the Resolution Approving and Authorizing the Execution of a First Amendment to Sublease Agreement Related to DeVos Place with the County of Kent in Connection with the Issuance by the City-County Building Authority of Additional Bonds to Finance a Portion of the Costs of Improvement, Expansion and Renovation of DeVos Place. Motion carried unanimously.

BUILDING COMMITTEE REPORT To Grand Rapids-Kent County Convention Arena Authority

September 24, 2003

GRAND GALLERY

Bay Area Interiors, our subcontractor has begun final polishing of the epoxy terrazzo system. Painting is complete along with the installation of the snake light. The exterior sections of the canopies have received paint and lighting. Painting of the high architectural feature wall is complete.

In the Meeting Rooms, drywall finishing, painting and ceiling grid installations are complete. The acoustic wall panel installation is complete on the Meeting Level, and the street level. Carpet is complete on the meeting level along with wood doors. Skyway level carpeting is in process.

Ceramic tile installations are complete in the Meeting Level, Street Level and Parking Level Restrooms. Toilet partitions and fixtures are installed as well. Ceramic tile work is now complete in the concessions and public restroom areas on the first floor adjacent to the Exhibit Hall. Preparations are underway for the arrival of the food service equipment next month.

Andy J. Egan Mechanical Co. and ElecTech are complete with the HVAC systems that serve most of the Grand Gallery. Final testing and system balancing is in process, and nearly complete.

Work is underway for the addition of an additional escalator between the Skyway Level and the Meeting Level.

Overall the Grand Gallery and Meeting spaces remain on track for completion as scheduled.

EXHIBIT HALL

The performance testing of the Exhibit Hall Box Trusses was conducted this month. The testing satisfied the design criteria and allowed for final test and balance of the air and water distribution system to begin.

The enclosure of the Exhibit Box is complete. Soffit trim will continue on the East and West. Roofing, brick and overhead doors at the dock are complete. Exterior windows at the dock area are being framed in for glazing next month.

SITE WORK

Work has progressed well along Michigan Street and in front of DeVos Hall. These areas, along with the Monroe drop off lane are to be completed the fall of 2003. Planter Wall construction along the West side of the Exhibit Hall began in April and continues. The snowmelt slab has been placed in front of DeVos Hall, and finished pavers are installed. The area of new sidewalk in front of DeVos Hall is open to the public beginning September 2, 2003.

PHASE 3

The Welsh Auditorium has been demolished via implosion on 07/19/03. Sorting and hauling off of the rubble and debris has been completed. Nicholson Contracting, the new deep foundation subcontractor has mobilized and begun drilling for their foundation work. Note that an extensive amount of poor soils have been encountered and is in process of being removed via over-excavation.

The DeVos Hall new Scene Shop, along with the new Dressing Rooms was completed during the proceeding 90-day period. The users of DeVos Hall occupied the space beginning in early September 2003.

We have compiled the accompanying statements of net assets and cash receipts and disbursements - budget to actual for the operating account and construction accounts of the Grand Rapids - Kent County Convention / Arena Authority for the two months ended August 31, 2003, in accordance with Statements on Standards for Accounting and Review Services issued by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. These statements do not include the cash receipts and disbursements of the Van Andel Arena and Grand Center which are operated by the Authority.
