Calling all doodlers! One of the Festival's don't-miss activities is the at the popular BOOM Art! Interactive mural project sponsored by MidAmerican Energy Company, which offers Festival guests (including kids AND kids at heart) the chance to contribute to an enormous coloring-book styled mutal; as each 10-foot section comes to live, the mural is hoisted up to 30 feet in the air by MidAmerican's zero-emission/all-electric bucket trucks. Markers provided, no skills required, and don't be surprised if MidAmerican mascots Sniffie the Sniffasauras and Louie the Lightning Bug drop by to join the fun. After the Festival, the final mural (which can extend up to 100 feet) displays at events around the community, including the lowa State Fair.

spin art

Join Prairie Meadows and the Altoona Lions Club to create your newest masterpiece from everyone's favorite art pastime.

seed balls

The Blank Park Zoo will be creating seed balls as part of their Plant. Grow.Fly conservation initiative. These balls are made of organic clay and contain native lowa prairie seeds that can be planted to create more habitat for lowa pollinators.

create the world from your point of view

become a puppeteer

Be the designer, writer, and director of your own puppet show. Guests will have the opportunity to create small puppets out of recycled materials and will learn how to create a character, storyline, and setting.

Add some color to nature with Iowa Bird Rehabilitation. Guests have the opportunity to create a baby bird's nest with their own creative twist.

If you're in a mood to groove, come over and join lowa Dance Theater in an on-site dance party. Guests can also move over, under and through a creative stretch fabric obstacle course.

Guests may choose from a colorful assortment of pre-cut butterflies and place it within a giant community heart. Once placed, guests have the opportunity to have a butterfly painted on their face.

motion picture movie

Design and create your own motion picture booklet. Guests can create an animated flipbook with a blank booklet and colored pencils, drawing an image on each page to create the illusion of a motion picture. Guest can also snap photos in front of a special green screen.

spread the love

Spread the Love with Please Pass the Love. Guests have the opportunity to decorate their own poster with empowering words or phrases to promote mental health. After creating their poster, guests will pose for a portrait in the photography station. All portraits will be used in a video for the Paint the State with Love Movement and shared online to break the mental health stigma and provide community support.

shadow art

Discover Shadow Art at the Science Center of Iowa booth. Guests will use a variety of materials to create diverse types of art using shadows. Guests can explore different objects that have varying amounts of transparency, translucence, and opaqueness.

The Sunny Porch will provide ink pads, oil pastels, stickers and wax crayons with a watercolor wash for guests to use in their exploration of mixed media as they create their own art journal.
