



# WHITE BUTTE

the highest point in North Dakota

*White Butte is the **highest point in North Dakota**, reaching an **elevation of 3,506 feet**. The route, open year-round, showcases the view of southwestern North Dakota.*

## DIRECTIONS

### Traveling south on Highway 85 (from Belfield):

1. Turn south (left) onto 140<sup>th</sup> Ave SW before you reach Amidon - there is a sign here pointing to White Butte
2. Travel for 5 miles on 140<sup>th</sup> Ave SW
3. Turn west (right) onto 69<sup>th</sup> St and continue for 1 mile to the parking area (not designated)

### Traveling north on Highway 85 (from Bowman):

1. Starting in Bowman, travel north on Highway 85 for about 12 miles
2. Turn east (right) onto 74<sup>th</sup> St SW and continue for 4 miles
3. Turn north (left) onto 140<sup>th</sup> Ave SW and continue straight for 5 miles
4. Turn west (left) onto 69<sup>th</sup> St and continue for 1 mile to the parking area (not designated)

## OTHER THINGS TO NOTE

- When using Google Maps for navigation, type in "*White Butte Trailhead*" for the correct route
- You will have to walk along a rugged path approximately ½ mile from where you park to the start of the trailhead
- Please be respectful of your surroundings – the land by White Butte is all private property
- Be cautious during the summer months for rattlesnakes
- Be sure to sign the directory once you reach the top!
