



Junior Division Camping and Parking Rules for 2023 Fair

1. Only 1 Camper, camp trailer, or tent per space.
2. Camper, camp trailer, or tents are to be placed/parked in the designated area only.
3. Livestock trailers are to be parked in the designated trailer parking area only. No livestock trailers are allowed in the camping area.
4. Campers must be in place by noon, Tuesday, August 1, 2023, and remain in place for the duration of the Fair unless designated above as a Horse Participant only. During the animal check-in hours, access to the camping area will be restricted. This will allow the livestock trailers to access their check-in areas without excessive congestion.
5. No vehicle parking exists in the camping area after noon on Tuesday, August 1, 2023.
6. Campers, camp trailers, or tents may be brought to the Fairgrounds after 8:00 am on Sunday, July 30, 2023, and must be in place by noon on Tuesday, August 1, 2023. Due to ongoing events, access to the designated camping space may be temporarily blocked after Friday.
7. Removal of campers, camp trailers, or tents on the final Sunday of the Fair – must be done **before 10:00 am or after 6:00 pm**. All other campers, camp trailers, or tents must be removed by noon on Monday, August 7, 2023.
8. Only Gate E on the east side of the Fairgrounds will be used for vehicle access to the camping area on a temporary basis for a limited amount of time. All occupants of the vehicle must have a 4-H or family wristband.
9. The road around the Fairgrounds cannot be blocked anytime during the Fair. Access is to be maintained as a fire lane.
10. Fair Management will issue designated camping permits once the camping sites are assigned after registration.
11. The designated camping permit will be required to be displayed in the window of all campers, camp trailers, or on tents at all times during the Fair.
12. All campers, camp trailers, and tents shall be self-contained. **No electric or water hook up available.**
13. REMINDER: Alcohol will be sold in designated areas on the Fairgrounds during County Fair. Otherwise, alcohol cannot be consumed or carried anywhere else on the grounds.
14. Camper Code of Conduct will be enforced as follows:
 - a. Conduct themselves in a courteous, respectful manner, using appropriate language, exhibiting good sportsmanship, and providing positive role models.
 - b. Adhering to program regulations & requirements, curfews, dress codes, policies, and guidelines.
 - c. Comply with designated QUIET TIMES: Midnight to 5:00 am daily. No generators running during this time.
 - d. Abstaining from illegal and immoral behavior.
 - e. Fully participating in scheduled activities.
 - f. Refraining from physical or emotional child abuse or neglect.
 - g. Applying regulations of safety to individuals, groups, and property.
 - h. Accepting personal responsibility for behavior. Consequences may include penalties as outlined in the Douglas County Fair & Rodeo General Competition Rules.
15. Each camper, camp trailer, or tent must have a designated Parent/Guardian OR Adult (21 years of age or older) that must stay overnight and be responsible for the minors staying in the camper.
16. Each camper is responsible for knowing and abiding by ALL rules listed in the 2023 Douglas County Fair & Rodeo Competition Rules, including but not limited to:
 - a. Personal golf carts, ATVs, and bicycles will not be allowed on the Fairgrounds during County Fair.
 - b. Dogs are not allowed on the Fairgrounds during the Douglas County Fair & Rodeo. Service animals and the following are permitted:
 - i. Dogs that are competing or performing during the Douglas County Fair & Rodeo.
 1. Owners/Handlers must keep dogs under constant control, and dogs ARE NOT allowed into any Livestock Barns, Kirk Hall, or the Events Center.
 - c. Sleeping in Livestock and Horse Barns is strictly forbidden.
 - d. Fireworks are NOT allowed.
17. No fire or open flame will be allowed on the grounds. This includes campfires, fire pits, etc. Only gas grills with a full metal lid will be allowed.
