

## 2021 HAY SHOW RULES

Revised, July 2021

1. Entries for the Hay Show must be produced in Smith County or by producers residing in Smith County.
2. An entry consists of **one small sack** (lunch bag size) full of hay. All entries become the property of the Hay Show Committee.
3. Hay can be entered August 5-7 at one of the following locations:
  - In Tyler: United Ag & Turf, Inc.; Red River Specialties; and Lowe Tractor;  
USDA-SWCD Office; AgriLife Extension Office
  - In Bullard: Circle C Farm & Ranch
  - In Lindale: Fleming Farm Supply
  - In Nooday: Feed Store
  - In Troup: Steele's Feed & Seed
  - In Whitehouse: Whitehouse Farm & Ranch
  - In Flint: Nooday Feed Store

Official entry cards must be attached to each entry and will be available at each location listed above, as well as the Smith County Extension office, 116 Smith County Cotton Belt Building, 1517 West Front Street, in Tyler.
4. A \$3.00 fee per entry is to be paid at the time the hay is entered and covers the lab analysis. Make checks payable to the **Smith County SWCD**.
5. Judging of the hay will take place on August 10.
6. Hay will be judged by chemical score as follows: % crude protein + (100 - % ADF) Example: 20% crude protein hay with 25% ADF = 20 + (100 - 25) = 95
7. Hay show results will be announced at the Howdy Neighbors Bar-B-Ques September 23<sup>rd</sup> at 5:00pm under the T-Mobile Tent.
8. Blue, red and white ribbons will be awarded.
