## General Rules

- Entries are released on Monday after the Fair closes. Any entry not claimed by Monday becomes the property of ETSF.
- All entries must remain on display throughout the fair.

- During the show, exhibitors may enter the grounds between 8:00 and 10:00 a.m. by prior scheduling with Fair Staff to water and groom plants. The Fair Staff will water Landscape Designs at least once a day.
- Every precaution will be taken in the handling and exhibiting of work; however, the East Texas State Fair will not be responsible for loss or damage, which may occur from any cause. Submission of entries implies acceptance of all conditions stated in these rules.
- The decision of the judges is final.
- There are no entry fees in the Landscape division.

### Landscape Design Rules

- A team may consist of 3 to 8 students.
- **Schools may register up to two teams. The Fair is limited to 13 landscape boxes so the first 13 teams entered will receive a spot in the competition.**
- Teams must register online by September 2, 2022.
- Each team must submit a design plan before judging starts.

### Procedures

- Teams will provide the landscape plants for the design of a 2' tall x 4' wide x 7' long and any props to be used in the landscape box.
- The exhibitor is responsible for bringing all tools needed to prepare their landscape box.
- The team will submit a Landscape Plan prior to judging. The plan should include a planting plan, plant legend, sketches, and project budget.
- The location of the landscape boxes will be **in front of Building A** on the fairgrounds. The unloading will take place at gates located at 410 Fairpark Drive Tyler, TX.
- Soil **will be** provided for each team.
- Planter boxes will be provided for each team.
- Each team **MUST** supply their own plants.
- At the designated time during the day, the team will begin putting the design together in the box in the designated location. **Parents and adult leaders may assist with moving in supplies and planter materials to the competition area but must vacate the area once the competition begins.**
- **The planting and design of the landscape must be performed by the exhibitors only.**
- The team will have until 12:00 to complete their design.

### Judging and Scoring

- Judging will be based on several criteria areas.
- A score will be given by each judge for each of the criteria. Each judge's score will be totaled and then averaged with the total scores given by other judges to determine placings.

- Score sheets will be distributed to each advisor following the competition.

**Judging Criteria:**

- Project Planning (15 points) – evaluated from the Landscape Plan submitted prior to the contest.
- Project Creativity (25 points) – creative use of the space, relationship between elements in the design, and expression of local characteristics
- Overall Design (25 points) – proper application of design principles including proportion, organization, repetition, unity of elements, form, texture, and color.
- Technical Merit (20 points) – workmanship, use of mulch, materials, attention to details.
- Planting (15 points) – appropriate plant selection for the project area; good use of texture, color, and grouping
