## General Flower Show and Horticulture Specialty Show Rules

The Design Division, Botanical Arts Division, and the Horticulture Division of the NGC Flower Show are open only to members of $8^{\text {th }}$ District Garden Clubs. Entries in the Horticulture Specialty Show are open to all $8^{\text {th }}$ District Garden Club members and all Erie County Residents. Garden Clubs entered in the Fair are members of National Garden Clubs, Inc., Central Atlantic Region of State Garden Clubs, and $8^{\text {th }}$ District Federated Garden Clubs of New York State, Inc.

Please read and abide by all the Erie County Fair and Creative Arts Department rules and regulations which can be found online at ecfair.org.

1. All entries must be pre-registered with the Fair office by Friday, July 12, 2024. Entries not pre-registered will not be accepted.
2. Award checks will be issued at the Office in the Creative Arts Exhibit Area and should be checked for accuracy immediately.
3. No exhibit shall be removed without the consent of the Committee.
4. The Flower Show Classification Chairman for Design, Horticulture, and Botanical Arts reserves the right to exclude any exhibit that does not conform to the schedule.
5. Only one exhibit is permitted by an exhibitor in each class.
6. DECISION OF THE JUDGES SHALL BE FINAL. THE STANDARD SYSTEM OF AWARDING WILL BE USED (see 2017 Handbook for Flower Shows page 5). Awards may be withheld if not merited.
7. Plants named on the New York State List, "Protected Native Plants", cannot be exhibited in competitive classes. Commercially developed named hybrids or cultivars (NOT NATURAL VARIETIES) of plants on "Protected Native Plants", list are permitted in competitive classes, but ONLY when their DISTINGUISHING feature is evident.
8. Federated Garden Clubs of New York State forbids the use of ferns and fern parts native to New York State.
9. All exhibitors exhibiting in Horticulture Division and the Horticulture Specialty Show must label specimens with genus, species and/or variety or cultivar. Common names may be added.
10. Only Flower Show Staff will be present on the Flower Show floor during judging.
11. The emphasis is on FRESH plant material. NO ARTIFICIAL PLANT MATERIAL IS ALLOWED IN ANY DIVISION.
12. American and other national flags may not be incorporated into any competitive designs, nor be used as underlays, swags, or the like. Refer to chapter 7 page 812017 Handbook for Flower Shows for more information.
13. The Erie County Agricultural Society will strive to assure the safety of all items after arrival and placement but is not responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits.
14. Items will be watered by Flower Show Personnel from Wednesday, August $7^{\text {th }}-$ Sunday, August $\mathbf{1 8}^{\text {th }}$. Watering before and after these dates is the responsibility of the exhibitor.
15. Special Awards offered for each Section of both shows will be posted online @ ecfair.org by June 3, 2024.

The National Garden Club Standard System of Awarding will be used in all divisions.
Blue: First - scoring 90 or more; Red: Second - scoring 85 or more; Yellow: Third - scoring 80 or more; White: Honorable Mention scoring 75 or more. One or more Honorable Mention Awards may be given if merited. See page 2 for Erie County Fair Sweepstake Award information.

# NATIONAL GARDEN CLUB STANDARD FLOWER SHOW DESIGN DIVISION I <br> Section FD 

## NATIONAL GARDEN CLUB TOP AWARDS

AWARD OF DESIGN EXCELLENCE (one may be awarded) - This is a National Garden Club Division Award for Design. In sections where Top Exhibitor Awards have been placed, only those winners, entered by a single exhibitor who receives a 95 or more, are eligible for the Award of Design Excellence. One may be awarded to the highest scoring blue ribbon exhibit in the entire Design Division.
Top Exhibitor in Sections FDA, FDB, FDC, FDD are eligible.
Award - Rosette of gold ribbons.
DESIGNER'S CHOICE AWARD (two may be awarded) - This is a section award in the Design Division. It may be awarded to the highest scoring exhibit in that section. Exhibit must score 95 or above. Exhibitor has complete freedom to choose plant material and other components within National Garden Club policies.
Entries in Sections FDB, FDD are eligible.
Award - Rosette of purple ribbons.
PETITE AWARD (one may be awarded) - This is a section award in the Design Division. It may be awarded to the highest scoring exhibit in a section of petite designs. Exhibit must score 95 or above. Decorative unit of fresh and/or dried plant material and/or treated dried plant material.
Entries in Section FDC are eligible.
Award- Small rosette of blue and white ribbons.
TABLE ARTISTRY AWARD (one may be awarded) - This is a section award in the Design Division awarded to the highest scoring exhibit in that section of table exhibits. Exhibit must score 95 or above. Decorative unit to be of fresh and/or dried plant material and/or treated dried plant material.
Entries in Section FDA are eligible.
Award - Rosette of burgundy ribbons.

## Design Division Rules, Section FD Open To 8th District Garden Club Members Only

1. Please read and abide by all the Erie County Fair and Creative Arts Department rules and regulations which can be found online at ecfair.org.
2. One entry may be made in each class. Due to the limited reservations for each design class, all design reservations must be made by emailing Monica Hansen at johnmonica@ verizon.net and Nancy Kalieta at nancyk212@aol.com. Advance reservation must be made in classes as indicated on schedule and confirmed in writing. Exhibitors STILL NEED to register and pay online by July 12, 2024. NO CANCELLATIONS will be accepted after Ju1y 1, 2024. Exhibitor must provide a substitute if unable to fill reservation.
3. Some plant material must be used in every exhibit.
4. Landscapes, Scenes or anything representing an actual item of clothing, person, animal, etc., are not permitted in the Design Division.
5. Living members of the animal kingdom are not permitted.
6. Religious symbols must be displayed in a respectful manner.
7. A design entered in competition must be the work of only ONE exhibitor ( 2017 Handbook for Flower Shows, page 42) and that exhibitor's name must appear on the entry card. Plant material may be from any source. If it is observed by the committee that more than one person is working on a design during set up the design/exhibit will be disqualified.
8. Design may be either traditional or creative unless stated otherwise in the schedule.
9. The use of artificial plant material and the embellishment of fresh plant material is prohibited. Fresh plant material may not be treated in any manner.
10. Dried treated plant material, contrived flowers and/or plant forms constructed of natural plant material which may appear as
"fantasy flower foliage" and is not intended to represent real flowers are permitted in all design classes unless prohibited by the schedule or specific requirements of a Top Exhibitor Award.
11. Section FDA tables are supplied by committee and are judged from the front. All tables may use fine appointments.
12. Accessories permitted in all classes.
13. In order to maintain exhibits in good condition, all perishable plant material must be in water. CONTAINER SHOULD BE ADEQUATE TO HOLD A SUFFICIENT WATER SUPPLY. MECHANICS SHOULD BE HEAVY AND LARGE ENOUGH TO SUPPORT ALL PLANT MATERIAL. ALL DRIED PLANT MATERIALS SHOULD BE CLEAN AND INSECTFREE.
14. While the Committee will provide the best possible care for all exhibits, it disclaims all liability for loss or damage. Containers and accessories should be clearly marked with the designer's name and phone number. The Committee will not furnish containers for any class in the Design Division.
15. Prepared foods may not be used in any class.
16. No cut fruits/vegetables allowed.
17. In order not to offend, American and other national flags may not be incorporated into any competitive designs, nor be used as underlays, swags, or the like.
18. An arrangement already in place may be moved at the discretion of the Staff.
19. A card not to exceed 3 " $\times 5$ " giving name of pattern and manufacturer of the china and glassware may accompany each table exhibit.
20. A card not to exceed $3 " \times 5$ " identifying all plant material must accompany each design.
21. Conformance to the principles and elements of design are paramount. Refer to the 2017 Handbook for Flower Shows chapter 7, pages 63-68.
22. SCALES OF POINTS: Judging will follow the 2017 Handbook for Flower Shows; suggested scale of points, chapter 14.

## SECTION FDA

Eligible for Award of Design Excellence
Eligible for Table Artistry Award

## Class 1: "THE STRATES SHOW"

A functional semi-formal dinner for four with decorative unit of fresh and/or dried plant material and/or treated dried plant material and other components. Staged on a committee provided table 36 " wide by 72 " long, 28 " high (from the floor). Committee will provide underlay to the floor in exhibitor's choice of black or white. An overlay provided by the exhibitor with minimum 12" drop must be used.
4 Reservations - \$32.00, \$30.00, \$28.00, \$26.00

## Class 2: "MIDWAY AFTER DARK"

A functional informal lunch table for four with decorative unit of fresh and/or dried plant material and/or treated dried plant material and other components. Staged on a committee provided $48^{\prime \prime}$ round table covered with a floor length white underlay. The height of the table is $29^{\prime \prime}$. An additional overlay with a minimum $12^{\prime \prime}$ drop may be used.
4 Reservations - \$32.00, \$30.00, \$28.00, \$26.00

## Class 3: "RIDING THE FAIR TRAIN"

A functional table for one with decorative unit of fresh and/or dried plant material and/or treated dried plant material and other components. Staged on a committee provided table $24^{\prime \prime}$ round and $401 / 2 "$ high from the floor. An overlay with a minimum 12 " drop must be used.
4 Reservations - \$32.00, \$30.00, \$28.00, \$26.00

## Class 4: "GAMES OF SKILL"

An exhibition table - not meant to be functional - created artistically to suggest the service of food with no requirements as to the type or number of table appointments. Plant material must be used as needed for the overall design. Design made of fresh and/or dried plant material and or treated dried plant material and other components. Staged on a committee provided white table 30 " from the floor. Space allowed is 30 " wide x by $28^{\prime \prime}$ deep. Staged in front of a staging panel 30 " wide $\mathrm{x} 40^{\prime \prime}$ high. Staging panel and foreground panel must be covered by exhibitor.
4 Reservations - \$30.00, \$28.00, \$26.00, \$24.00

## Class 5:" THE MAGIC OF THE FAIR"

A creative design interpreting the picture provided upon registration, as detailed in Design Division Rules \#2. Design made of fresh and/or dried plant material and/or treated dried plant material and other components should reflect the elements of the picture. Staged on a Committee provided white base 48 " wide x 24 " deep with a white attached staging panel measuring $25^{\prime \prime}$ from the top of the $18^{\prime \prime}$ high white base and $48^{\prime \prime}$ wide. Space allowed is 36 " wide by 20 " deep and 25 " high. 4 Reservations - $\$ 30.00, \$ 28.00, \$ 26.00, \$ 24.00$

## Class 6: "CONSTRUCTION ZONE"

Assemblage design - a three-dimensional abstract design consisting of "found" unrelated objects and plant material. Found objects are non-art objects, not made or manufactured for decorative purposes. "Found" objects may be painted, but should remain recognized and not contrived. Though objects are considered non-art and previously unrelated, the design creatively relates them through their compatible elemental qualities of line, form, color, texure, etc. Three or more "found" objects must be greater in proportion than the other components. An assemblage may be self-supporting, staged on a background panel with components attached, or a combination. Staged on a committee provided white table 30" from the floor. Space allowed is 30 " wide by 28 " deep. Staged in front of a staging panel 30 " wide by 40 " high. Staging panel and foreground panel must be covered by exhibitor. 4 Reservations - $\$ 30.00, \$ 28.00, \$ 26.00, \$ 24.00$

## Class 7: "CLIFFHANGER"

A creative Petite Design of fresh and/or dried plant material and/or treated dried plant material. Design must not exceed 5" in depth, width, or height. Staged in a committee provided 12 " square white frame, on an 8 " deep white shelf, that for two reservations is 43 " from the floor and for the other two reservations is 56 " from the floor, in front of a black or white background. Exhibitor may use underlay.
4 Reservations - $\$ 25.00, \$ 23.00, \$ 20.00, \$ 18.00$

## Class 8: "MERRY GO ROUND"

A creative Petite Design of fresh and/or dried plant material and/or treated dried plant material. Design must not exceed 5" in depth, width, or height. Staged in a committee provided 12 " square white frame, on an 8 " deep white shelf, that for two reservations is 43 " from the floor and for the other two reservations is 56 " from the floor, in front of a black or white background. Exhibitor may use underlay.
4 Reservations - $\$ 25.00, \$ 23.00, \$ 20.00, \$ 18.00$

## Class 9: "ROLLER COASTER"

A creative Petite Design of fresh and/or dried plant material and/or treated dried plant material. Design must not exceed 8" in depth, width, or height. Staged in a committee provided 12 " square white frame, on a 12 " deep white shelf, that for two reservations is 43 " from the floor and for the other two reservations is 56 " from the floor, in front of a black or white background. Exhibitor may use underlay. Please refer to page 3, number 17.
4 Reservations - \$25.00, \$23.00, \$20.00, \$18.00

Eligible for Designer's Choice Award

## Class 10: "THE JOLLY CATERPILLER"

A Cascade Design - A design with an emphasis on a downward rhythmic movement. The downward lines may be curved, straight, zigzag, interrupted or may be a combination. The design is supported by a container or other device. A minimum of components may extend upward. Staged on a committee provided black column 24 " square and 36 " high. Minimum height of design is 24 ". Exhibitor may use an underlay within the frame of reference.
4 Reservations - \$30.00, \$28.00, \$25.00, \$23.00

## Class 11: "DOUBLE GIANT WHEEL"

A Large Creative Floor Design using dried plant material and/or treated dried plant material and other components. Staged on a blue, brown, and beige patterned rug with a white background that is 72 " high. Space allotted is $48^{\prime \prime}$ wide x 36 " depth. Exhibitor may use an underlay within the frame of reference.
4 Reservations - \$30.00, \$28.00, \$25.00, \$23.00

## Class 12: "SIDE BY SIDE"

A Parallel Design - A Creative Design consisting of three or more groupings of plant material and optional components with a strong parallel placement in a single container and/or base. Multiple containers may be used if combined to appear as one unit. Parallel direction may be vertical, horizontal or diagonal within the allotted space. The overall effect must appear parallel. Groupings need not be equidistant from each other. A connective may be used at the base of the design. Design using fresh and/or dried plant material and/or treated dried plant material and other components. Staged on a committee provided white cube $18 \frac{1 / 2 "}{} \times 24^{1 / 2 "}$ and $36 "$ in height. Design will be able to be viewed from all sides. Exhibitor may use an underlay within the frame of reference.
4 Reservations - \$30.00, \$28.00, \$25.00, \$23.00

# HORTICULTURE DIVISION II <br> Section FH 

## NATIONAL GARDEN CLUB TOP AWARDS

AWARD OF HORTICULTURAL EXCELLENCE - (One may be awarded.) This is a Division Award. In sections where Top Exhibitor Awards are offered, only the winning exhibit is eligible for this award. In sections where National Garden Club Top Awards are not offered, the highest scoring named blue ribbon winner, scoring 95 or more, is eligible.
Entire Horticulture Division is eligible. Award - Rosette of green, orange and blue ribbons.
COLLECTORS SHOWCASE AWARD- (Two may be awarded.) This is a section award for a Collection or Display which consists of a minimum of 5 (five) different cut or container grown specimens, exhibited in individual containers. It may be awarded to the highest scoring, named blue ribbon winner of fresh plant material. Each specimen within the exhibit must score 95 or more. Scores for the specimens in the exhibit are NOT averaged; the final score is determined by the lowest scoring specimen in the exhibit. Sections FHA, FHB are eligible. Award - Rosette of brown and green ribbons.

GROWER'S CHOICE AWARD - (Three may be awarded.) This is a section award for a container grown plant or combination plantings and maybe awarded to the highest scoring, named blue ribbon exhibit. It must score 95 or higher. Sections FHC, FHD, FHE are eligible. ward - Rosette of dark green ribbons.

## Horticulture Division Rules, Section FH

Open to $8^{\text {th }}$ District Garden Club Members only

1. All entries must pass through the classification committee before being placed. The following procedure should be used:
a. When entering online print 2 copies of your confirmation e-mail; one copy for your records, the $2^{\text {nd }}$ copy should be presented to the Flower Show Classification Committee with the Horticulture Specimen to be checked.
b. Write genus, species and/or variety or cultivar and common name on entry card and place card on the exhibit.
c. Cut specimen should be placed in water in provided containers and wedged. Wedging material provided by committee. No foliage below the water line.
d. All entries with their completed entry card will be checked by a Horticulture Classification worker for correct identification and conformance with the schedule. Retain claim check stub if specimen passes classification.
2. CLASSIFICATION WILL NOT ACCEPT SPECIMENS WITH VISIBLE INSECTS OR PLANT SHINE.
3. No classes will be added on entry day but may be subdivided.
4. ENTRIES NOT CONFORMING TO CLASS REQUIREMENTS MAY BE MARKED 'NOT FOR COMPETITION" AND PLACED FOR EXHIBIT ONLY.
5. All exhibits must be grown by exhibitor. One entry may be made in each class.
6. Cut specimens will be on display until the exhibit deteriorates at which time it will be removed.

## PLEASE KEEP THE STEMS OF CUT SPECIMENS AS LONG AS POSSIBLE.

7. Exhibitors will furnish containers for cut specimens in Section FHA and FHB. Wedging will be permitted and provided by the Committee.
8. Preference in judging will be given NEW and FINE varieties in each class. Correctly named varieties will be given preference by the Judges.
9. Cultural Perfection and Condition - the physical state of flower or plant at the time of judging. Specimens grown with foliage attached should be exhibited with some foliage attached. Foliage should have good clear color, free of holes, spray residue and insects. No foliage under water.
10. Exhibition Blooms - If exhibition blooms are wanted, remove all side buds EARLY in season, leaving only a single terminal bud on each stem. ALL EXHIBITS MUST HAVE GOOD STEM LENGTH IN PROPORTION TO BLOOM. A bud will not qualify as a bloom if it is not sufficiently open so that its form and character may be observed. No side buds. Flowering plants must be in bloom.
11. Combination plantings, planters, window boxes, terrariums, and container gardens must be in exhibitor's possession for at least three months and grown together for at least six weeks before show date. Double potting allowed.
12. The Committee reserves the right to dispose of any entry that is not fresh or has not been picked up at removal day. Committee is not responsible for under or over-watered exhibits.
13. In section FHA Displays and FHB Collections, each variety or cultivar within the collection must be individually numbered with Corresponding number and correct binomial (genus, species and/or variety or cultivar), written on a 3 "x5" card or chart with exhibit.
14. All exhibitors in Horticulture must label specimens with genus and species and/ or variety or cultivar. Common names may be added.
15. All specimens in a Collection and Display are judged on cultural perfection and should be of superior quality, similar size and maturity. The lowest scoring specimen of the Collection or Display determines the highest possible score for your Horticulture. THEY ARE NOT AVERAGED. Collections must be set up by the exhibitor in the space allotted for ease of judging. In Displays, artistic effect is of equal importance to cultural perfection. Featured plant specimens must dominate.
16. SCALES OF POINTS: Horticulture Judging will follow the 2017 Handbook for Flower Shows; suggested scale of points, pages 129-130.

## HORTICULTURE CLASSES

## EXHIBITORS SHOULD ENDEAVOR TO MAINTAIN THEIR EXHIBITS IN GOOD CONDITION.

Classes 1-9 staged indoors in flower show Exhibit Area, classes 10-13, 15 staged outdoor under protective covering, class 14 staged by the side door unprotected. All classes must be the work of one individual and specimens must be grown by that exhibitor.

## SECTION FHA

Eligible for Award of Horticultural Excellence Eligible for Collector's Showcase Award

Collection: An exhibit of specimens judged for their cultural perfection. See the 2017 Handbook for Flower Shows, Chapter 6 for additional information.

## Class 1:

A Collection of 5 or more, cut, named, different specimens of Hosta Leaves at least " 5 " wide (across) in exhibitor provided containers. Staged on a black table 24 " high against a beige colored wall. A staging panel is permitted. Space allowed is $251 / 2 " \times 251 / 2 "$.
4 Reservations - \$30.00, \$28.00, \$25.00, \$22.00

## Class 2:

A Collection of 5 or more cut, named, different specimens of container-grown Foliage Plants in exhibitor provided containers. Staged on a black table $36^{\prime \prime}$ high against a beige colored wall. A staging panel is permitted. Space allowed is 30 "x 30 ".
4 Reservations - \$30.00, \$28.00, \$25.00, \$22.00
Class 3:
A Collection of 5 or more cut, named, different specimens of Coleus in exhibitor provided containers. Staged on a black table 36 " high against a beige colored wall. A staging panel is permitted. Space allowed is $251 / 2 " \times 25 \frac{1}{2}$ ". 4 Reservations - \$30.00, \$28.00, \$25.00, \$22.00

## SECTION FHB

Eligible for Award of Horticultural Excellence Collection: An exhibit of specimens judged for their cultural perfection. Eligible for Collector's Showcase Award

## Class 4:

A Collection of 5 or more, cut, named, different flowering Annuals in exhibitor provided clear containers. Staged on a table 29 " high with black skirting and white underlay. Space allowed is $24 "$ wide x 24 " deep.
4 Reservations - \$30.00, \$28.00, \$25.00, \$22.00

## SECTION FHB, Continued <br> Class 5:

A Collection of 5 or more named, container-grown Succulents in exhibitor provided clear containers. Staged on a table 29 " high with black skirting and white underlay. Space allowed is 24 " wide x 24 " deep.
4 Reservations - \$30.00, \$28.00, \$25.00, \$22.00

## Class 6:

## Botanical Arts Division Rules, Section FB Open to District 8 members only

1. All Botanical Arts Horticulture, Design and Artistic Crafts exhibits must contain some plant material, either fresh or dried.
2. No artificial plant material is permitted in any exhibit.
3. The Scale of Points for judging Botanical Arts Horticulture, Design, and Artistic Crafts are listed in Chapter 14 of 2017 Handbook For Flower Shows.
4. The rules for Botanical Arts Horticulture, Design and Artistic Crafts are printed in the 2017 Handbook for Flower Shows, Chapter 10.
5. For Botanical Arts Designs and Artistic Crafts, a card not to exceed 3 " $\times 5$ " must be provided by the exhibitor listing plant material used in the design.
6. Outdoor Gardens (Section FBA) - all gardens are judged or critiqued for their overall effect of the garden design, which is of major importance. A pleasing design, expressed through a sense of unity among components, plants compatible to the environment and location, theme and appropriate selection and placement of components is also important. Each specimen within the garden must be clearly identified on a chart or diagram listing their correct binomial or genus, species and/or variety or cultivar and location in the garden. Within the garden, place a number label in each variety corresponding to the listed plants on your planting map. The gardens will be judged using the Combination Plantings and Gardens Scale of Points (2017 Handbook for Flower Shows, page 129.

In sections where National Garden Club Top Awards are not offered, the highest scoring named blue ribbon winner, scoring 95 or more, is eligible. Award - Rosette of green, orange, and blue ribbons.


ARBOREAL AWARD - (One may be awarded.) This is a section award for the highest scoring named branch from a tree or shrub. A blue ribbon winner scoring 95 or above is eligible.
Section SHC is eligible.
Award - Rosette of green ribbons in two shades.
AWARD OF MERIT - (Eight may be awarded.) This is a section award and may be awarded to the highest scoring named blue ribbon winner of fresh plant material scoring 95 or higher.

eligible. Award- Rosette of orange ribbons.
COLLECTORS SHOWCASE AWARD- (One may be awarded.) This is a section award for a Collection or Display which consists of a minimum of 5 (five) different cut or container grown specimens, exhibited in individual containers. It may be awarded to the highest scoring, named blue ribbon winner of fresh plant material. Each specimen within the exhibit must score 95 or more. Scores for the specimens in the exhibit are NOT averaged; the final score is determined by the lowest scoring specimen in the exhibit.

Award - Rosette of brown and green ribbons.
ELFIN AWARD- (Two may be awarded.) This is a section award for a highest scoring, named, cut specimen of dwarf or miniature varieties or cultivars designated as such by nurseries or plant societies. It must be a blue ribbon winner scoring 95 or higher.
Sections SHK and SHL are eligible.
Award - Small rosette of chartreuse and purple ribbons.
GROWER'S CHOICE AWARD - (Four may be awarded.) This is a section award for a container grown plant or combination plantings and maybe awarded to the highest scoring, named blue ribbon exhibit. It must score 95 or higher. Sections SHM, SHN, SHO and SHP are eligible.
Award - Rosette of dark green ribbons.

## Open To All $8^{\text {th }}$ District Garden Club Members AND ALL ERIE COUNTY RESIDENTS <br> Rules:

1. All entries must pass through the classification committee before being placed. The following procedure should be used:
a. When entering online print 2 copies of your confirmation e-mail; one copy for your records, the $2^{\text {nd }}$ copy should be presented to the Flower Show Classification Committee with the Horticulture Specimen to be checked.
b. Write genus, species and/or variety or cultivar and common name on entry card and place card on the exhibit.
c. Cut specimen should be placed in water in provided containers and wedged. Wedging material provided by committee. No foliage below the water line. Please Keep Stems As Long As Possible.
d. All entries with their completed entry card will be checked by a Horticulture Classification worker for correct identification and conformance with the schedule. Retain claim check stub if specimen passes classification.
2. CLASSIFICATION WILL NOT ACCEPT SPECIMENS WITH VISIBLE INSECTS OR PLANT SHINE.
3. No classes will be added on entry day but may be subdivided.
4. ENTRIES NOT CONFORMING TO CLASS REQUIREMENTS MAY BE MARKED 'NOT FOR COMPETITION" AND PLACED FOR EXHIBIT ONLY.
5. All exhibits must be grown by exhibitor. One entry may be made in each class.
6. Cut specimens will be on display until the exhibit deteriorates at which time it will be removed.
7. The committee will furnish containers for cut specimens. Wedging will be permitted and provided by the committee.
8. Preference in judging will be given NEW and FINE varieties in each class. Correctly named varieties will be given preference by the Judges.
9. Cultural Perfection and Condition - the physical state of flower or plant at the time of judging. Specimens grown with foliage attached should be exhibited with some foliage attached. Please note that in some cases notes on foliage have been specified for your guidance. Foliage should have good clear color, free of holes, spray residue and insects. No foliage under water.
10. Exhibition Blooms - If exhibition blooms are wanted, remove all side buds EARLY in season, leaving only a single terminal bud on each stem. ALL EXHIBITS MUST HAVE GOOD STEM LENGTH IN
PROPORTION TO BLOOM. A bud will not qualify as a bloom if it is not sufficiently open so that its form and character may be observed. No side buds. Flowering plants must be in bloom.
11. Combination plantings, planters, window boxes, and container gardens must be in exhibitor's possession for at least three months and grown together for at least six weeks before show date. Double potting is allowed.
12. The Committee reserves the right to dispose of any entry that is not fresh or has not been picked up at removal day. Committee is not responsible for over-watered exhibits.
13. In section SHE, Herb Collection, each variety or cultivar within the collection must be individually numbered with corresponding number and correct binomial (genus, species and/or variety or cultivar), written on a 3 " 55 " card or chart with exhibit.
14. All exhibitors must label specimens with genus and species and/ or variety or cultivar. Common names may be added.
15. All specimens in a Collection are judged on cultural perfection and should be of superior quality, similar size, and maturity. The lowest scoring specimen of the Collection determines the highest possible score for your Horticulture. THEY ARE NOT AVERAGED. Collections must be set up by the exhibitor in the space allotted for ease of judging.
16. SCALES OF POINTS: Horticulture Judging will follow the 2017 Handbook for Flower Shows.
