#### ONLINE ENTRY REGISTRATION STARTS JUNE 1st, 2021

Entry Fee: \$15 fee allows for unlimited entries throughout department (unless otherwise specifically noted). Fee includes one (1) promo

code for an admission ticket to the fair, parking included. Monday, August 9, 2021 between 1:00 PM and 8:00 PM

#### **General Fruit Department Rules**

- 1. When bringing entries in, use Vehicle Gate "A" (the UPS Delivery Gate) at the south end of the Event Center Parking Lot (Route 62, South Park Avenue).
- 2. When and where possible variety names should be included to help educate the consumer.
- 3. To minimize errors, exhibitors must affix the correct entry tag with the exact variety name written on the front, securely to every entry. If an article is not brought in, the entry tag for that article must be returned to the Superintendent. Upon arrival, ANY class changes to the entry tags need to be made by the superintendent at the table where it is received.
- 4. All perishable produce becomes the property of The Fairgrounds and will be donated to the local food pantry at the close of the Fair.
- 5. Exhibitors are allowed only one entry in each class, except in the "any other variety" classes, where 2 entries are allowed.
- 6. All fruit exhibited must be grown by the exhibitor.
- 7. Awards will be made only for first quality produce.
- 8. All articles for exhibition must remain on the grounds according to the rules of each department, or forfeit their premium unless excused by the Fair Manager of the Society.
- 9. Any item receiving a placing can pick-up ribbons at the Main Office with their premium check beginning August 19<sup>th</sup>

#### **Judging Criteria:**

- 1. When an exhibit is not labeled with correct name of variety or varieties, it is disqualified.
- 2. Collections will be judged upon the excellence of the varieties for the purpose intended as well as for the quality of the fruit. Varieties which are known to be inferior will be discounted.
- 3. In placing awards the Judge will be guided by the following standard of excellence, and exhibitors would do well to select their fruit on the same basis.
  - (a) Freedom from blemish. Show fruit should be absolutely free from marks of fungus or physiological trouble, including steepen and watercore, insect injuries of all kinds, and mechanical injury such as loss of stem, burn, russet, limb rub, and bruises.
  - (b) Color. All specimens in an entry should be of a uniform color. With red apples the more color the better, provided it is to be used as typical for the variety. In yellow or green apples, the color should be clear and even all over; the presence or absence of a blush will not count except in uniformity of color.
  - (c) Size. The specimens in any one plate or exhibit should be uniform in size and of the size that is most acceptable on the market for variety.
  - (d) Form. The shape and conformation applies in any one plate or exhibit and should be typical for the variety. All specimens should be uniform in shape.
  - (e) Condition. This refers to the degree of ripeness. An apple to be in perfect condition should be mature, and firm for the variety.

Uniformity is not listed as a separate item, but is considered under each of the headings, color, size & form. Uniformity refers to exact resemblance in color, size, and form of the specimens making up a plate or exhibit.

#### **NUTS**

Must be grown in the previous year

Entries of nuts must consist of 1 quart of ripe nuts, picked from the stem and exhibited in a clean quart basket, furnished by the exhibitor. Be sure you know the exact variety of the nuts and include this information on your entry form and tag(s). **Entries will not be returned.**
