Entry Fee: \$25.00 allows entries throughout the Erie County Fair. A promo code redeemable for three (3) admission passes will be emailed to the exhibitor on Monday, July 29th .

Judging: Sunday, May 19th at Hamburg Brewing Company

Drop Off: Entries must be dropped off by May 10th at either of the following locations:

Hamburg Brewing Company during business hours (Please check availability ahead of time) at 6553 Boston State Rd, Hamburg

Erie County Fairgrounds Main Offices (9:30 AM – 4:30 PM) at 5600 McKinley Pkwy, Hamburg

Resurgence Brewing Company during business hours (Please check availability ahead of time) at 155 Chandler St, Buffalo

General Home Brew Competition Department Rules

1. Open to any amateur home brewer, 21 years or older, who is a resident of New York State.
2. No exhibitor shall be involved in commercial beer making or use the services of a commercial beer making facility.
3. All beers must be produced and bottled in New York State by the exhibitor. Any beer entered in competition becomes the property of the Erie County Agricultural Society.
4. Each brewer will be limited to 5 entries.
5. Two (2) bottles per entry. Each bottle must be labeled (paper label attached to the bottle with a rubber band, do **NOT** stick or tape labels to the bottles) with the following: (1) name of beer, (2) class number, (3) variety, (4) beer maker's name, (5) beer maker's address. (One bottle will be used for the first pour of the competition. The second bottle will be used for Best of Show) A fillable template can be found along with class list.
6. The decision of the judges shall be final.
7. All exhibitors will receive a standard BJCP score sheet for each beer entered from at least two judges (with at least one BJCP Certified or higher).
8. Some recipes are more challenging to make commercially, the Erie County Fair reserves the right to bypass the Best of Show based upon recipe. Beer must be dropped off for judging **NO LATER THAN** May 10th If you are mailing your entry you must mail the entry to: The Erie County Fair, Attn: Home Brew Competition, 5600 McKinley Parkway, Hamburg, NY 14075.

For Your Information:

- We prefer 12-16 ounce brown bottles, but will accept 11-22 ounce bottles of any color (all bottles must be free of paper labels). Obliterate any lettering or graphics on the cap with a permanent black marker. Bottles not meeting these requirements may be disqualified. Our primary concern is to ensure the anonymity of the entries when they are being judged.
- We would like to emphasize that the 2021 BJCP guidelines listed in the style chart are just that – guidelines. We have provided the chart so you can decide the category in which your brew will perform best because judges will use these guidelines when evaluating your entry. You will not be disqualified if your beer falls somewhat outside of the category guidelines listed, but your overall score may suffer.
