## ADGA GOAT RULES & REGULATIONS:

- All exhibitors must purchase either a \$75.00 Erie County Agricultural Society Membership or \$15.00 Exhibitor wristband. Each owner of a farm is considered an exhibitor. If your animals do not come, you do not get your exhibitor wristbands.
- Exhibitors have the option to pay the \$5.00 entry fee per class (including groups) if they choose to have their animals on exhibit on the Fairgrounds from Wednesday through Saturday. Those exhibitors who opt not to bring their animals to stay on the Fairgrounds will pay the \$8 entry fee, per class (including groups).
- One entry fee will be charged per group when entered in a group class.
- ADGA rules shall govern. This show is sanctioned by the American Dairy Goat Association.
- The show order is subject to change based on show staff discretion.
- Senior and Junior shows are separately sanctioned
- Does with horns may not enter. All animals must have a legible tattoo. There will be NO pre-show milk-out, over distended udders are subject to discrimination. Judges' decision is final. All dairy goats are entered at the sole risk of the owners. Base date for computing the age of dairy goats is the date of the show.
- Registration or Recordation certificates:
  - A registration or recordation certificate, or a stamped duplicate application showing the date received by the ADGA office, is required for any animal six months of age or older.
  - The registration or recordation certificate or the stamped duplicate application showing the date received by the ADGA office is required for any animal under six months of age.
  - NO COPIES of the registration or recordation certificate or stamped duplicate application shall be accepted by the show officials.
  - The document specified above as the requirement for that age animal to be shown MUST be presented to the show secretary before the judging shall begin.
  - Proof of ownership shall be the name on the registration or recordation certificate or on the stamped duplicate application.
  - Information obtained from the ADGA office via telephone, telegram, etc shall not be accepted in lieu of any of the documents specified above.
- Rules of the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets Standards for the Conduct of Agriculture and Markets for Fairs and Summary of Livestock Health Requirements shall apply.
- Absolutely no milk is to be dumped in the Fairgrounds storm sewer system. PLEASE USE DUMP BARRELS IN BARN
- All exhibitors are required to make sure that their showmen are properly attired in either all white or white shirts with black pants (no jeans) while showing in the ring. Clothing must be clean and professional/presentable. Adequate footwear required (i.e. no flip-flops or sandals). Exhibitors with inappropriate attire will be excused from the ring.
- All animals must remain on exhibit until they are released.
- Initial sawdust bedding will be supplied to exhibitors staying on the grounds. However, if the exhibitor wishes to have additional shavings or straw they must bring it or buy it from a purveyor on the grounds. The Fair will not be providing straw or shavings. **Please note exhibitors showing off their trailer must bring their own bedding, as bedding will not be provided in the available pens.**
- Entry fees do not guarantee "tack pens". In divisions where entries do not exceed available space "tack pens" will be assigned by the superintendent.
- Premium checks will be mailed.
- No substitutions/entries accepted day of show. Scratches ONLY**
- If you are planning on camping in the livestock lot, please note that payment does not guarantee a spot. You will be notified & refunded if camper lot is full.

**ADGA GOAT RULES & REGULATIONS CONTINUED:**

17. Definition of Herd: A group of animals owned and exhibited by an individual. Proof of ownership shall be shown by the name of the animal's owner as listed on its registration papers. A herd residing at one farm may be shown as a unit.
18. Exhibitors must be at least 4 years of age to exhibit livestock at the Erie County Fair.
19. The decision of the judge shall be final in all cases, except where error, mistake, fraud, misrepresentation, or collusion, not discovered at the time of the award, is proven. In such cases, the decision of Show Management, or such referee appointed shall be final.

1<sup>st</sup> place: \$62.50 and a banner

2<sup>nd</sup> place: \$37.50

3<sup>rd</sup> place: \$18.75

Fair & Show Management will judge the exhibitors daily on the following criteria:

1. Cleanliness & neatness of aisles, pens, bedding and animals, and exhibitor's living quarters.
2. Courtesy to fellow breeders, spectators and others during the exhibit.
3. Personal appearance, including neatness and cleanliness of clothing in and out of the show ring.
4. Systematic and neat arrangement of feed, feed pans, bedding, tack, etc.
5. Educational materials on display
