# Chairman's Agenda:

- A. Committee Reports
  - 1. **Racing Committee Report**: Mr. Mourning noted that racing had begun successfully. He also stated that there was much success with night racing and pari-mutuel betting. The races have been packed, due to the hard work of the commission's work. Mr. Mourning noted that repairs to the grandstand's stairs had been made.

2. Arena Committee Report: Commissioner Lee had nothing to report. Mr. Mourning stated that a cleaned up report would be made available in the near future. He made mention of the Duke City Gladiators' success in their championship, and that Albuquerque's current Mayor, Mr. Tim Keller thinks positively of the arena and its future.

## State Fair Management Report

## A. 2018 State Fair:

Dan Mourning began his report by stating that the fair is ahead of schedule with regard to scheduling, saying that all concerts are booked, with over \$100 thousand in sales already having been made in concerts alone. Groupon sales have crossed \$15 thousand mark. Mr. Mourning then introduced the theme of the 2018 NM State Fair, "Love is in the Fair" saying that the fair is about love, between family and friends.

Mr. Mourning made the commissioners aware that the 2017 State Fair was awarded the Merrill Award for the creation and implementation of the Sensory Station, which gives those with sensory sensitivities a place to recuperate from overstimulation. Mr. Mourning noted that more planning and coordination has gone in to the Fair's 2018 version of the Sensory Station, and that project defines the Fair's goal of being a part of the community in Albuquerque. The fair is to be more than "corndogs and concerts," and is to represent all that is good in the state of New Mexico. Mr. Mourning explained several changes to the Sensory Station happening this year, such as new sponsors (Holman's) and portable backpacks that families can carry around the fair, if they do not want to stay in the station itself.

Mr. Mourning then discussed inclusion of the LGBTQ community in the fair. This year, the fair will host an event for this community called "Out at the Fair," which will be the first Sunday of the fair at Villa Hispana. This event is meant for everyone, and is to promote a welcoming environment.

From there, Mr. Mourning reviewed some new events that will be featured at the fair this year:

Commissioner Bitsui also complimented the fair and fairgrounds.

Mr. Mourning thanked Commissioner Bitsui, and noted that the key to the fair's success was its ability to hire the right people.

Chairman Kennedy noted the large impact that Park and Ride will have on attendance and revenue for the Fair.
