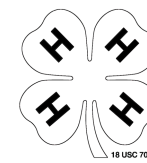

25th Annual Freezer Sale

Saturday, October 2, 2021



New Buyers:

- Please make arrangements with the cashier located in the sale arena prior to the start of this auction.
- As each auction lot is sold, an auction clerk will deliver to you an agreement for your acceptance/signature and disposition declaration of sale item. An auction clerk will also assist you to the photo area for your photo with your project exhibitor.
- Freezer Sale add-ons are welcomed. Please refer to specific guidelines available at the Add-on Table.

Sale Terms and Conditions:

- Payment is due the date of purchase. Note: accounts over 60-days old will be subject to 1.5% monthly service charge. Bank service charges on returned checks and credit-card reject charges will be charged back to the buyer.
- All animals must be removed from the fairgrounds according to the check-out schedule.
- Disposition declaration must be made at the time of sale or large animals will go to resale, and small animals will be donated to the Fair Building Fund.
- All charges for butchering, cutting and wrapping are to be paid by the buyer or donee for large animals.
- Hauling for steers, lambs, swine, and goats will be handled by the FBC Fair or the designated slaughter/processing plant on contract basis unless other arrangements are made by the buyer.
- The steer show is a terminal show and all steers must be slaughtered or go to resale. Other large animals may be sent to slaughter, resale, donated or delivered alive. Auction clerks have additional resale and slaughter information.
- Buyers of large animals that are to be delivered for slaughter will receive a standard cutting order unless the meat processing plant is notified within 7 days of the auction.
- It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to deliver turkeys, broilers, roaster and rabbits (dressed or alive, at the option of the buyer) to the buyer. Processing is also the responsibility of the exhibitor. These animals may also be donated to the Fair Building Fund, Fair Scholarship Fund, or charity of choice.

Resale: Animals designated for RESALE will be sold at market. Buyers will receive a check from the Fair Association.

Donated: All DONATED animals will be sold at market. Donee will receive a check from the Fair Association.

Non-Designated: All NON-DESIGNATED disposition animals will be sold at market. Buyer will receive a check from the Fair Association.

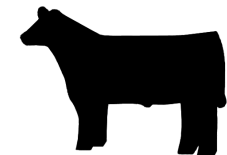
