### RULES

1. All Meat Pen Rabbits are subject to the Fort Bend County Fair Association General Rules & Regulations and the Livestock General Rules and Regulations.
2. This is a Meat Pen Rabbit Show. Toenails and teeth will be disregarded. Bunnies must meet the weight requirement to show. This is **NOT** an ARBA-sanctioned show.
3. **Housing and Leaving the County**
  - i. All animals shall remain in Fort Bend County, at the address listed on the exhibitor's registration form, under the daily care of the exhibitor. Eligible Katy I.S.D. students that do not live in Fort Bend County but are zoned to a Fort Bend County school must house their projects in Fort Bend County or the Katy I.S.D. school barn. Fort Bend County Fair projects are subject to random facility checks by Fort Bend County Fair officials. If an animal is found to be out of the county *or not at the designated address* during an official check, it will result in the project being disqualified from the Fort Bend County Fair. Animals will be allowed to leave the county overnight for shows, grooming or hoof trimming.
  - ii. Any animal needing to be absent from Fort Bend County for more than 72 hours must notify the Fair Office in writing using the **official form at least five (5) business days in advance** to obtain approval from the Species Captain and Livestock Chairman. The form must be completed by the exhibitor and/or parent/guardian in its entirety. Animals may not be out of county for more than 4 days.
  - iii. **IF AN ANIMAL IS IN NEED OF EMERGENCY CARE AND MUST LEAVE THE COUNTY, NOTIFY THE FAIR OFFICE THE SAME DAY OR THE NEXT BUSINESS DAY**
4. All meat pen Rabbits may be either kindled & raised by the exhibitor or purchased from a breeder. Exhibitors purchasing Rabbits from a breeder must buy and **take possession** of the Rabbits prior to the Tattoo date. All Meat Pen Rabbits must be the legal property of the exhibitor.
5. The Official start date of the meat pen Rabbit project will be the designated Tattoo date. Exhibitors must own and be caring for their Rabbits at this time and throughout the feeding period. The feeding period ends upon check-out from the show. Exhibitors are to care for their own Rabbits at the show. **DO NOT** feed and water any other exhibitor's Rabbits. If an exhibitor needs someone other than an immediate family member to feed and water their Rabbits at the show, a written request must be given to the Rabbit Captain for approval. If approval is granted, **ONLY** Rabbits stated in the request will be allowed to be fed by someone other than the immediate family. If approved, a copy of the

approved request will be on file in Livestock Office.

6. **\*\*\*All exhibitors must submit their division entries and payment ONLINE** at <https://fbcfa.fairwire.com> no later than **August 06, 2026 by 4:00 p.m.** Entry fees are \$50 per division. Entries are not considered complete unless they have been submitted online, payment received and physical copies of the Entry Form with required signatures, EXHIBITOR W9 and Release of Liability have been submitted by the due date to the Fair office. Incomplete entries will automatically be charged a \$50 late fee. Refunds will not be issued. The Fort Bend County Fair Rabbit Committee will tattoo all eligible bunnies on **Tuesday, August 25, 2026 from 5:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m.** The tattooing will be held at the Fairgrounds in Building B. Tattooing establishes animal eligibility for individual and/or family tag-in. Rabbits with incorrect, altered, or no tattoos will be eliminated at the official Fair check-in.
7. The date of the tattoo, August 25<sup>th</sup>, is the official starting date of the project. **An exhibitor may tattoo a maximum of 25 bunnies. Family Orders/Tagging will be allowed with each exhibitor being assigned a set of consecutively numbered bunnies. Exhibitors in the family may exchange sets but no intermingling of bunnies within the sets will be allowed.**
8. Meat pen will consist of three (3) Rabbits, all of the same breed & variety. Eligible breeds are Californian, Palomino, Rex, Satin, and New Zealand. **NO CROSS BREEDS** are allowed. The **suggested** age limit is approximately 75-days old at showtime. The weight limits are five and one-half (5 ½) pounds maximum and three and one-half (3½) pound minimum for each Rabbit.
9. **At Check-in & sift time at the Fair, Rabbits will have one (1) weigh per Rabbit, with a one (1) ounce variance given. The scales will be certified at Fair time.**
10. All Rabbits must be weighed by a member of the FBCFA Livestock Weight Committee in the presence of the Judge. If any, one (1) rabbit in the pen weighs more than the maximum allowable weight or less than the minimum allowable weight, the entire pen is disqualified. If any, one rabbit is deemed "unhealthy" or is disqualified by the Judge, the entire pen is disqualified.
11. The Rabbits presented to the FBCFA Livestock Weight Committee members, and the Judge will be the exhibitor's "Official Entry". **NO ALTERNATES ARE ALLOWED AT OFFICIAL CHECK-IN TIME.**
12. Showmanship will be announced after the conclusion of the rabbit show by the rabbit judge. Only exhibitors showing their own projects are eligible for showmanship. One showmanship award will be given to the exhibitor who has the best presentation of their project, proper handling of their one rabbit, following dress code, and answers the judge's questions.
13. **The Judge's decision is final.**
14. Only the top **two (2)** pens of Rabbits will be required to remain in coops throughout the duration of the Fair for display. All others are required to check out immediately following the Rabbit show.
15. Exhibitor is to furnish his/her own water & feed "crock-type" containers and is responsible for providing feed and water for their Rabbits throughout the duration of the Fair. No outside hanging containers are allowed.
16. If your animal makes the Jr. Livestock Auction or Freezer Sale, you must attend check out on **Sunday October 04, 2026, from 7:30am to 10:00am** to pick up your disposition papers. This will advise you to whom and where to deliver your processed animal. Be sure to check with the buyer for preference of processing – fresh or processed, frozen and bagged. Exhibitors are responsible for processing their own rabbits. Grand and Reserve winners must clean up their pen/stall area to receive their disposition papers.
17. All decisions are subject to change by the decision of the Fort Bend County Fair Board of Directors without prior notice.
