- Best Gaining Steer – Award will be awarded to the exhibitor whose steer has the best overall weight gain from the official tag-in date, March 30, 2026, to the weigh-in date, September 24, 2026.

RULES

1. All Steer Show entries are subject to the Fort Bend County Fair Association General Rules and Regulations and the Livestock General Rules and Regulations.
2. *****All exhibitors must submit their division entries and payment ONLINE at <https://fbcfa.fairwire.com> no later than March 26, 2026.** Entry fees are \$50 per division. **Entries are not considered complete unless they have been submitted online, payment received and physical copies of the Entry Form with required signatures, EXHIBITOR W9 and Release of Liability have been submitted by the due date to the Fair office. Incomplete entries will automatically be charged a \$50 late fee. Refunds will not be issued.** All steers must be tagged in for entry and weighed on Monday, **March 30, 2026**, at the Fort Bend County Fairgrounds in Barn H between the hours of **5:00 p.m. and 7:00 pm.** Online Entry will only allow the exhibitor to enter one steer online. The exhibitor can still tag-in multiple steers. Each exhibitor will only be allowed to bring one steer to official check-in at Fair time. **NO ALTERNATES WILL BE ALLOWED AT THE OFFICIAL FAIR WEIGH-IN.**
3. No steer may possess any other tag(s) at tag-in or Fair time other than major show validation tag or Texas State Fair validation tag. Breeder tags must be removed or will be removed by the committee.

4. Housing and Leaving the County

- a) All animals shall remain in Fort Bend County, at the address listed on the exhibitor's registration form, under the daily care of the exhibitor. Eligible Katy I.S.D. students that do not live in Fort Bend County but are zoned to a Fort Bend County school must house their projects in Fort Bend County or the Katy I.S.D. school barn. Fort Bend County Fair projects are subject to random facility checks by Fort Bend County Fair officials. If an animal is found to be out of the county or not at the designated address during an official check, it will result in the project being disqualified from the Fort Bend County Fair. Animals will be allowed to leave the county overnight for shows, grooming or hoof trimming.
- b) Any animal needing to be absent from Fort Bend County for more than 72 hours must notify the Fair Office in writing using the official form at least five (5) business days in advance to obtain approval from the Species Captain and Livestock Chairman. The form must be completed by the exhibitor and/or parent/guardian in its entirety. Animals may not be out of county for more than 4 days
- c) IF AN ANIMAL IS IN NEED OF EMERGENCY CARE AND MUST LEAVE THE COUNTY, NOTIFY THE FAIR OFFICE THE SAME DAY OR THE NEXT BUSINESS DAY.

4. All steers must remain in the steer area of the barn. No animal, once checked in at Fair time, may leave the interior gated premises or go to the carnival/vendor areas. Any animal observed out of the fenced area or steer area (i.e., parking lot) is subject to disqualification.
5. Any steer that gets away from the exhibitor more than two (2) times will be tied to the rail and judged from there. In the event that a loose, unmanageable steer cannot be caught by Show Officials in a reasonable amount of time, the steer will be guided to a holding area and judged from the holding area. All show ring rules will apply to the holding area. The steer will not be returned to the arena for any reason. The judge will be informed of Show Officials' decision and asked to continue to judge the steer while in the holding area. As such, the exhibitor will not be eligible for Showmanship.
6. No fans will be allowed on steers anywhere outside of the 6-foot head panels. The only fans allowed are hanging front, side, and rear fans. Not allowed includes butt fans on stands in the aisles and NO personal port-a-coolers
7. Steers will be shown in two division classifications:

AMERICAN

Acceptable Breed Characteristics:

- Any color patterns
- Progression of importance to include Bos indicus head, eye, and ear of moderate length, slightly dropping and opens forward and down
- Crest or slick neck
- Sheath score of 2 or more

Discriminatory Breed Characteristics:

- Bos Taurus head
- Bos Taurus short ear
- Bos Taurus eye
- Sheath score of 1

Absolute Disqualifications:

- A combination of Bos Taurus head, eye, and ear characteristics

AOB Any steer not included in American

8. Steers will be classified at the Fair by the official classifiers of the Ft. Bend County Fair. Judgement of breed classifier(s) is final and not subject to protest.
9. Any steer not classified in the American Division will automatically go to the AOB Division.

10. Judging and sale order will be as follows for the 2026 Steer Show: There will be one overall Grand Champion & Reserve Champion Steer. The two (2) division champions will compete for the overall Grand Champion steer of the show. The reserve division champions are required to be brought into the show arena. After the Grand Champion has been selected, the Reserve division champion of the breed that furnished the Grand Champion competes with the remaining division champions for Reserve Grand Champion. Show order for 2026 shall be AOB, American. The sale order will be determined in accordance with the Junior Auction rules as outlined in rule #4.
 11. Steers will be judged by division classification and for the purpose of judging may be divided into weight classes as determined by the Steer Captain along with a Director in Charge and Livestock Chairman/Livestock Co-Chairman. **The minimum show weight at Fair Check-in is 1000 pounds.**
 12. Showmanship classes will follow rule 10 (h) in the Livestock Department General Rules.
 13. No change of the color pattern of the animal by painting or dying will be allowed.
 14. The 2026 show will be a Slick Shorn show. All steers will not have any hair length longer than ¼” on any part of the body, other than the center of the tail down. If any exhibitor’s steer is found to have excessive hair by the steer officials of the Fort Bend County Fair Association, the exhibitor will be disqualified and asked to remove their steer from the grounds one hour after check-in. An exhibitor will not be allowed to protest a hair length disqualification.
- **There will not be any “touching up” after the steer has **started the check in process** and will not be allowed to return to the weigh-in area.****
15. **The Judge’s decision is final, including classifiers and hair judge.**
 16. Touch-up clipping will only be permitted prior to weigh-in.
 17. Exhibitors must furnish their own shavings.
 18. All steers must be secured with a neck rope and halter when tied in a stall. A rope halter cannot be a slide ring rope halter. It must be a full rope halter.
 19. No grooming material of any kind is allowed at showtime.
 20. The top **forty-two (42)** placing steers making the Jr. Livestock Auction must remain in the barn for the duration of the Fair. The release of non-placing steers will be the next day, **September 27, 2026**, from 12:00 p.m. to 1:30p.m. **Non-placing steers must check out at the posted time on September 27, 2026 and are not allowed back on the premises. Steers are not to leave the fairgrounds without proper disposition paperwork.**
 21. Check out for all Steers making the Jr. Livestock Auction or the Freezer Sale will be on **Sunday, October 04, 2026, from 7:30 a.m. to 10:00 a.m.** as outlined in the Fort Bend County Fair Livestock Schedule. Exhibitors must attend to clean up their pen/stall/area to receive their disposition papers.
 22. All decisions are subject to change by the decision of the Fort Bend County Fair Board of Directors without prior notice.
 23. Upon check out Sunday morning, the exhibitor is responsible for cleaning their stall/pen before being allowed to leave the grounds. Failure to do so will result in a cleaning fee of \$150 being deducted from your auction check for each stall/pen not cleaned.
