Local Rules & Information

Residence: Open to all juniors under the age of 19 in Fresno County (must be a member of appropriate club or chapter to enter those divisions).

<u>Iudging Results</u>: all judging results are confidential until the opening day of the fair, October 6, 2021. Violation of this can lead to loss of awards given. There will be no expectations. Results will NOT be given over the phone, email or text.

Age Requirements: Junior Exhibitors must be between the ages of 9 and 19 as of January 1, 2021

<u>Designs per Class</u>: There may be no more than 15 entries with the same design per class per FFA teacher.

Entry Forms: All entries must be made ON-LINE except teach and group entries which should be submitted on the official entry forms furnished by fair management located in the back of the book. Entry forms must be signed by exhibitor and the instructor (parent/Guardian if independent).

Feature Exhibits: The Big Fresno Fair expects all 4-H and FFA members exhibiting at the fair to be actively involved in the design, construction & installation of all Feature Exhibits (booths) Instructors and adults may supervise only. Technical professionals will not be allowed during the installation. No cell phones allowed & no wandering about the building during construction and installation. Non-compliance with this rule will result in the following.

- First Concern Verbal Warning
- Second Concern Written Warning
- Third Concern Withholding of Premiums

American System of Judging: The judging process to rank exhibits against one another and award one first placing, one second placing, etc.

<u>Danish System of Judging:</u> The judging process to compare each exhibit on its own merit against the scorecard or recognized standard and award as many first places, etc. as merited.

<u>Disqualification</u>: The Big Fresno Fair reserves the right to exclude any entry which is not in the best interest of the Fair & reserves the right to disqualify any exhibitor(s) who conducts themselves in an inappropriate manner or who enters in an inappropriate Division, without discussion or justification. No

payment of any awards will be made to individuals so disqualified.

Completion of Entries: All work must be completed prior to delivery.

Independent Exhibitors: Independent exhibitors must be age 9 or in the 4th grade by January 1, 2020 and may compete thru December 31 of the year in which they turn 19 years of age. Independent exhibitors must have parent or guardian sign entry form. An independent exhibitor does not have to belong to any club or school.

Pick-Up of Exhibits; any exhibit not picked up by October 22, 2020 at 5 PM will be disposed of by the Fair. All checks will be distributed at the time of exhibits pick up. Checks not picked up will **NOT BE MAILED**. Checks that are not claimed by the exhibitor or leader will be deemed a donation and will be returned to the department.

All Fruit: should have original bloom. Nothing should be polished

Quality of Exhibits: The quality desired in agricultural and horticultural product exhibits is the quality that brings the best financial return in the commercial market, & such exhibits must be at least equal in maturity as that state of ripeness required by Section 42513 of the California Agricultural Code in order to be considered for cash awards.

Maturity Section 42515: "Mature" means having reached that stage of ripeness which will insure the completion of the ripening process to a degree which will insure palatability, after the removal of the product from the tree, plant or vine.

Overripe Section 42515: "Overripe" means having an advanced state of maturity which causes the product to be undesirable for human consumption in a fresh state.

Production of Exhibit: Agriculture & Horticulture products MUST have been produced by the exhibitor.

Varieties: All varieties must be named on entry form. No substitutions will be allowed at time of entry or the entries will be disqualified.

Non-Listed Varieties: Varieties for which there are no classes listed in the Exhibitors Handbook cannot be entered for competition. Feel free to make suggestions.

Disqualification: Any entry not properly entered will not be judged.

Rules: Rules as to quality or quantity will be strictly adhered to.

Grains: All grains entered shall be untreated.

Vegetables: Vegetables may be waxed for preservation.







<u>Size Restrictions:</u> Collection must not exceed an area of 3 feet in width, 8 1/2 inches in depth and 1 1/2 feet in height. If display exceeds above limitations, it may be considered for special display. State amount of space needed on entry form.

<u>Collections:</u> The same collection regardless of change can only be entered once.

<u>Books/Dolls:</u> If the display includes books or dolls bring easels or stands to showcase them.

Quality: Select the best of the collection to exhibit at the Fair.

Exhibit Time Frame: Any collection may be exhibited in the Fair only once, regardless of change.

<u>Iudging Criteria</u>: Judging criteria includes Identity-fiction and labeling (i.e. breeds, origin, dates, special interest information); originality; arrangement; and neatness. Overall presentation is considered an integral part of judging.

<u>Examples of Collections:</u> Animals/Fossils, Stamps, Belt Buckles, Pens/Pencils, Bells, Baseball Cards, Dolls, Buttons/Badges, Thimbles, Shells, Insects, Kitchen Utensils, etc.



Purpose: The feature exhibit booth provides members an opportunity to acquaint the public with a specific phase of their club program. The booth can show what they have learned, the activities in which they have participated, or the contributions of their organization to the community.

Quality: Judges will insist upon a high quality of products and materials used in the exhibit. A high scoring exhibit will be artistically arranged, colorful, attractive and well lit. 4-H club name must be on exhibit.

Size Feature Exhibit Booths is 8' x 8' base with 4 ½ triangle walls.



Rule Exception: Booths are exempt from State Rule 9-8 and VII-14.

Construction: Booths MUST be designed, constructed and installed by organization members. Leaders may supervise only.

<u>Leader Signature:</u> Leaders may not sign entry form as agents for a club, but the club president or secretary may sign. Leaders will sign on the designated line of the entry form.

Perishable Displays: Exhibitors must make arrangements to replace all fruits and vegetables which deteriorate during the fair. Artificial are preferred for display.

<u>Frame Proof:</u> Exhibit materials must be flame proofed & are subject to inspection by the fire marshal

Electrical Cords: All electrical extension cords shall be installed properly and in accordance with the electrical code of the State of California. Please specify on entry form if power is needed.

Booth Presence: No booth shall extend above the back wall and side partition, or interfere with other booths.

Restrictions: No music, sound tracks or food samples are allowed.

Incomplete: Failure to complete exhibit will cause forfeiture of entry fee.



<u>Completion of Work:</u> All projects must have been completed within the last 12 months preceding the fair by students in grades 9, 10, 11, and 12, plus those who graduated last June.

<u>Matting</u>: all work must be matted or framed in neutral colors, (white, grey, black, beige, brown, or cream).

ANY IMPROPERLY PREPARED PICTURES WILL BE REJECTED

Display; All photographs MUST be mounted, matted, or framed.

No Glass Policy; No Photos with glass will be accepted. If any entry is found or suspected to have glass coverings, it will be neither judged nor displayed.

<u>Hanging</u>: all exhibits must have a secure backing and a wire/hanger on the mat or frame. Any improperly prepared pictures will be rejected.
