## RIPLEY'S "BELIEVE IT OR NOT" FALL 2019 BOOK TO FEATURE THE BIG FRESNO FAIR'S TRACTOR TREE EXHIBIT

FRESNO, CALIFORNIA, March 7, 2019...At the 2018 Big Fresno Fair, the uniquely odd and mesmerizing Tractor Tree was unveiled as a tribute to Fresno County and the broader San Joaquin Valley's rich agricultural heritage. Inspired by the Smithsonian declaring 2018 the "Year of the Tractor," Big Fresno Fair CEO came up with the idea to construct a 32 foot tall tree comprised of nearly 1,200 tractor parts – some more than 100 years old. At completion, the structure weighed a total of 32.8 tons! Sound unbelievable? That's exactly what executives at *Ripley's Believe It or Not!* thought and selected to feature the Tractor Tree in their Fall 2019 book.

"The Tractor Tree grew from inspiration – the inspiration to tell our <u>own</u> tractor story of how these incredible pieces of machinery molded the agricultural landscape of our region and help propel us into a worldwide agricultural powerhouse," said John C. Alkire, CEO of The Big Fresno Fair and visionary behind the Tractor Tree. "To have this piece of art that is a tribute to our agricultural heritage be selected to appear in the pages of an internationally distributed book is incredible. We are so grateful for all the people and businesses that were not only onboard with the vision, but passionate about the creation of the Tractor Tree – this is a great accolade for all of us."

By sheer numbers the Tractor Tree is an unbelievable structure. The foundation alone is 18.5 feet deep and weighs 17.2 tons. The tree has a total of 23 large, medium and small tractors and there are more than 1,156 tractor parts that range from 1 to 110 years old. To create a "tree" from tractor parts, it took 988 pounds of welding rod and more than 3,300 hours of labor to construct the iconic "Tractor Tree." Integrated into the design are two tractor cabs in which kids (and adults) can sit and steer the tractor, pose for pictures and more importantly learn about the incredible impact of tractors on agriculture in the Central Valley. There is an audio loop that plays telling the story of tractors, their impact on the region and the families who have worked the land for generations.

"Ripley's is excited to feature the Tractor Tree exhibit in our book!," exclaimed Jordie R. Orlando, Editor at Ripley Entertainment, Inc. "The incredible structure is right at home inside









the pages of *Beyond the Bizarre!* thanks to its impressive size, remarkable workmanship, historical significance and artistic detail. It is truly unbelievable!"
