Agricultural Exhibition Center Events

First Sunday: Parent-Child Baking Contest with Oatmeal Raisin Cookies as the category. Judging Starts promptly at 1:00 PM Remaining cookies will be sold to benefit the Senior Centers and Nursing Homes that participate at the fair.

For kids: Decorate a pumpkin. Sign up from 9:00 AM to 2:45 PM Ages 5 to 12. Limited to first 18 kids to sign up. Starts at 3 PM

Agricultural Demonstration: How to make ice cream in a bag. Make your own to sample (we will also have add ins like oreo cookie crumbs, M & M's etc.) Our staff will be distributing samples made with a hand cranked ice cream maker. (If you want to try your hand at hand cranking too, by all means...be our guest.) Recipes will be available. Ongoing throughout the day

Monday: Whoopie Pie Contest Judging starts promptly at 1:00 PM After the contest the remaining Whoopie Pies will be sold with the monies being divided between the Nursing Homes and Senior Centers that participate at the fair.

For Kids: Buttermaking demonstration. Fairgoers can try their hand at butter churning with a little bit of heavy cream and a covered plastic cup. For those less adventurous we will have a hand cranked butter churn and will be distributing samples with a few crackers. We will have some add in such as cinnamon/sugar and honey. (Yum!) Recipes will be available. Ongoing throughout the day.

Tuesday: Blueberry Dessert Contest. Judging starts promptly at 1:00 PM Samples of the entries will be available for sale after the contest with the monies being divided between all the Nursing Homes and Senior Centers that participate at the fair.

The pies not auctioned will be sold in slices after the judging. All the monies will again go to the Senior Centers and Nursing Homes that participate at the fair.

In keeping with the Apple theme for the day we will be making and distributing samples of applesauce (in a crock pot) Recipes will be available. Ongoing throughout the day.

Thursday: Anything Made with Pumpkin Contest Who knows what we'll get? But we will be distributing samples after the contest, so come on down and try something.

We're going to attempt to dehydrate some apples for the fairgoers to try. Erlon has a food dehydrator and we have arranged to borrow a commercial slicer so the chips will be nice and uniform. We will begin making them early on in the week so we will have enough to distribute to fairgoers. Recipes will be available

Friday: Kids are off from school so we are going to have our Decorated cupcake contest with "Monsters" as the theme. Judging begins at 1:00 PM Samples will be available for sale after the contest
