

FRYEBURG YOUTH SHOW

There will be a lot of excitement around the Fryeburg Fairgrounds starting this Thursday, April 18 thru Sunday, April 21st as trucks hauling cattle trailers congregate from around the Northeast for the 33rd annual Fryeburg Youth Show. Approximately 135 participants from 6 states and Quebec will show over 250 animals over the course of the four-day show. Children and young adults, from 5 to 21 years of age, learn how to clip and fit (get their animal ready to show) thru workshops and clinics provided by the Youth Show.

A few highlights of upcoming shows:

1. Showmanship (competition of how well the person displays the animal and watches the judge for instruction).

2. Breed classes to determine Champion heifer of each breed of beef animal at the show.

3. Steer show to determine the best steer's conformation and amount of finish the animal has on them.

Diane Gushee has been the leader and driving force behind the Fryeburg Youth Show since its inception in 1991. Diane spends all year finding donations, sponsors, and items for auction. Each participant comes away with a T-shirt and items that they will use showing their animals as well as prize money for the top finishers in each show.

A banquet is held Friday night. Last year 325 people attended the banquet of prime rib, chicken, fish, and pork with all kinds of salads, drinks and desserts.



The Fryeburg Youth Show is the first animal show of the season in Maine. This is the first opportunity for youth to bring their animals to a show and learn through workshops and clinics on how to prepare their animal for show and actually show their animal.

How many animals did you bring to the show? Three.


What do you like most about raising livestock? Teaching other younger members all about what I do. I also like fitting and clipping my cattle and others' cattle.
